To THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In the absence of any stirring events during our term of office, our Report will in consequence be narrowed down to a statistical analysis of the expenditure of the Institution, the management of which you did us the honor to place in our charge.

That we have endeavored faithfully, and successfully, to discharge the responsibility, may be seen in the fact that the expenditure of the Asylum for the year just ended, shows a decrease of no less than £1062 11s 2d.

While this large reduction has been partly caused by good and cheap contracts, to a falling-off also in the number of in-door and out-door recipients, yet we may justly claim that the pleasing result has accrued also to the care and economy that we have endeavored to exercise over every item of expenditure.

The income has been well maintained, being well up to the average of previous years.

You will remember that at the close of 1884 your debt was no less than £1140 18s 7d; your present position is as follows:— Balance

due Bank, £2125 14s 9d; assets, £1500, due from government; leaving a debit of £625 14s 9d, a reduction of £515 3s 10d, in the amount of your indebtedness.

Your position, however, is, in fact, better than this, as the Hon. the Treasurer, in response to an appeal from us, gave a distinct promise to increase the maintenance grant, and also to allot £500 towards building a Hospital Ward separate from the main building, an urgently required work, and there can be no doubt that the sooner this work is carried out the better, not only on account of the health of the sick inmates, but also for the beneficial and healthful ventilation of the Asylum.

In connection with the £500, for building, a similar sum will have to be raised to claim it.

A special appeal will have therefore to be made to the residents of Ballarat and District, and no doubt, as of old, will be liberally responded to. Your Vice-Presidents and Secretary have had, in addition, a scheme prepared for a considerable time on a large scale to assist in raising the required sum, but the delay in allotting the grant has prevented them from carrying out their intentions up to the present.

When the time arrives for working out the proposal your earnest and active co-operation will be solicited, and no doubt willingly and promptly accorded.

The daily average number of inmates was 237, or 10 less than 1884.

You will also be gratified to learn that the average per head shows a considerable fall, being only £17 10 9d, as against £192s 10d for the previous year, a reduction of no less than £1 12s 1d.

We think that even the most captious critic must admit this to be most satisfactory, as proving the watchful economy that has been exercised.

At the end of 1884 there remained in the Asylum 235 inmates. During the year there have been admitted 191 cases, making in all 436 resident.

Of these, there have been discharged or died 202 cases, leaving 234 in the Asylum on December 31st.

The garden produce is estimated to amount to £151 13s 6d.

The profit upon the dairy amounts to £154 0s 3d, and £68 10s 6d was realised from sale of produce.

OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The cost of out-door relief amounts to £2181 19s 3d, a decrease of £364 9s 7d upon the previous year.

The numbers relieved show a decrease of 9 adults and 48 children per week.

The cost of each individual ration given once per week was 1s 2½d, a reduction of ¾d upon 1884.

The Institution has had so many kind friends who have done humane and substantial work on its behalf that it is really impossible to chronicle all their good deeds. The kind efforts of the Ballyarat Mutual Improvement Associations, in entertaining the inmates every two weeks with concerts of a high order, cannot be too highly commended. What are we to say also of the efforts made by the Charity Sunday Committee; of the officers and members of our fine Militia Force, who brought off so successfully their Drum Head Service in aid of the Charities; of the Old Identities, who worked so hard and successfully on our behalf; of Mr Martin Loughlin, for his

splendid donation of £100, for which we can only wish him long life, happiness, and prosperity; of the gentlemen who so well supervise the cases at a distance; of the Honorary Medical Officers, always ready as they are to assist the Non-Resident Surgeon, and many others, all of whom we thank most sincerely.

The Annual Report of Captain Evans, the Inspector of Charities, was in every sense most favorable; whether as regards the clean and well ordered state of the Asylum, or the neat and efficient work of the Secretary's department.

During the year the Matron, Mrs M. Walsh, resigned, and Mrs H. Caulfield was appointed to the position, and unfortunately, after serving a few short months, during which she gained the respect and esteem of all, the poor lady was attacked by an illness that proved fatal, to the great regret of inmates, officers, and of your committee. Mrs H. Payer was then appointed to the position, and though not long in office, we believe that we have made a wise and judicious selection.

We consider the time has arrived when your Annual Meetings should be held in July instead of January, so as to bring the Asylum's financial year in accord with that of the Government. We therefore recommend that this be done, and that, contingent upon your accepting the same, Rules No. 3, 5, and 11 be altered to fit in with the change.

The announcement made by Mr Service, that he would alter the terms for claiming the Grant-In-Aid from £3 for £1 to £2 for £1, caused us much anxiety, it being very clear that under such conditions the Institution could not be carried on upon its present basis.

We commenced by arranging a large deputation to Mr Service, at which some sixty representatives of the charities took part.

It proving unsuccessful, we at once combined with several kindred Institutions, notably the Sandhurst Benevolent Asylum, whose interests were precisely identical with ours, and after much labor, voluminous correspondence, and the energetic assistance of the members for the district, to whose efforts you are greatly indebted, we succeeded in inducing Mr Service to let things remain as they were until the close of the government year.

We cannot, however, but express our regret that such extensive efforts and labor should have been required to claim a simple act of positive justice, and trust that it may be long ere such sudden and

hurtful steps shall again be taken, steps which can only result in injury to the poor, and vexation to your Committee, when they consider the gratuitous time, labor, and expense they devote to the management of this great Institution.

And now our time is up, and our labors at an end.

We sincerely trust you will never receive a more unfavorable report than that we have the honor and pleasure to present on this occasion. While we have used due economy, in no case has it been exercised at the expense of humanity, and may Heaven forbid this should ever be otherwise.

There can be no question that the Committee of this splendid Institution has an exceptionally difficult task to perform.

The different branches of relief to be dealt with, the wonderfully varying circumstances connected with the cases, especially as regards Out-door Relief, attempts at imposition, the discretion required to stem the same, without inflicting hardship and suffering, the extent of the work and its responsibility, often in fact, personal, requires great care and acumen on the part of your representatives.

We have now simply to thank the Almighty dispenser of events for the success which has attended our efforts on behalf of the poor and suffering, and from the bottom of our hearts to wish our successors in office a prosperous and happy

R U L E S

OF THE

Ballarat Benevolent Asylum,

ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNORS 24th JANUARY, 1867.

OBJECTS:—

To Relieve the Aged, Infirm, Disabled, and Destitute, and to Minister to their Necessities, according to the Ability of the Institute.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upward from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first named in any will, by which bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the Institution shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution, shall be a Life Governor.

ANNUAL GOVERNORS

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a Shire Council, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, President or Chairman of the body donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every subscriber of £1 and upwards, annually, shall be an Annual Governor,

to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided, in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, three Honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen Governors, all of whom, except the Trustees, shall be elected annually by and from the Governors in the month of July in each year.

4. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee of Management, the said Committee shall have the power to fill up the vacancy for the unexpired term, except in the case of a Trustee or Honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a general meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of July in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so, on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the annual or other special meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of Management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules; appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall appoint

Sub-Committees for all necessary purposes, and Auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting but not a deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, shall be members, *ex officio*, of all committees.

10. All Sub-Committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of July in each year.

12. Any member of the Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medical Officers) absenting himself for two months, without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution shall be paid into the bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

SECRETARY.

15. The Secretary shall attend all annual, special, and committee meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases giving receipts, and shall, within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each

meeting to the General or House Committee an account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department ; keep the accounts of the Institution under the direction of the several Committees ; compile all reports of the Committees ; fill the cheques and perform all the clerical duties connected with the office of Secretary.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified Medical Practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves ; shall have access to the Institution at all times ; perform all surgical operations and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the Rules shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
