# The Blood Transfusion Service

Many are the occasions during each year when, due to accident or illness, it becomes essential to arrange a Blood Transfusion for a patient.

This perhaps does not mean much to those not immediately concerned, but a vital organization does exist and is an important factor in the complete hospital service.

Included in this Report is a series of illustrations depicting the various aspects of the Blood Transfusion Service. It functions all day and every day, ever ready to meet the needs of each individual if, and when, the occasion arises.

Some hundreds of men and women are registered at the Hospital as voluntary blood donors. When an emergency occurs, or in order to supplement supplies of blood to be forwarded to Melbourne for processing by the Red Cross Society, one or more donors are called by rotation.

This valuable community service is worthy of more than passing interest—it is praiseworthy indeed!

The combined efforts of doctors, nurses, technicians, Red Cross workers, ambulance drivers and others in this important service, is indicative of the daily routine at the Ballarat and District Base Hospital.

However, the value of the Service cannot be measured in £ s. d. —it is a public necessity.

It is right and proper that we should have an appreciation of the organization of the various departments of the Hospital. Whatever happens, we cannot be permitted to become complacent, without even a thought of what is being done to give us the right to live.

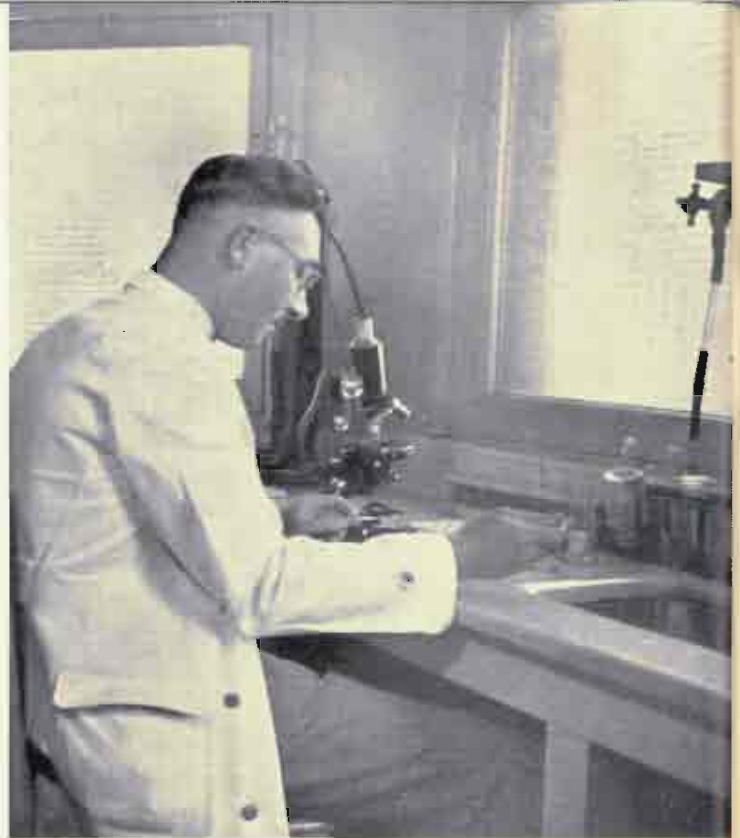

## THE NINETY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT  
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH, 1950



The Committee of Management of the Ballarat and District Base Hospital has the honour to present to the Contributors the Ninety-third Annual Report and the Financial Statements for the year ended 31st March, 1950.

**BUILDING DEVELOPMENTS :** The new Nurses' Home is now in the final stages of completion. It is hoped that the building will be opened towards the end of this year, thus ending existing make-shift conditions for members of the Nursing Staff. The new Home will provide accommodation of which we will all be proud and in keeping with present-day standards.

The erection of the new 100-bed Infectious Diseases and T.B. Building is progressing satisfactorily, notwithstanding the multiple problems of the day. It is anticipated that this building will be completed during 1952.

The Committee is now planning for the erection of a new Service Block, incorporating a vital boiler installation, kitchen, stores, workshops and accommodation for key non-nursing personnel. This building is of fundamental importance to the general development of the hospital, and when completed (approximately four years hence) will permanently solve many existing and recurrent problems.

**ACCOMMODATION :** The daily average number of patients for the year under review was 216.12, as compared with 201.82 for the previous year.

Departments, too, experienced an exceedingly busy year, and the hospital services generally have been fully availed of.

Detailed figures available elsewhere in this Report are indicative of the urgent need to press forward with the general developmental plan.

Hospital services are accepted today, much more so than ever before, and, in addition, Ballarat is developing in every way; hence the need for greater hospital facilities.

**MAINTENANCE OF BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT :** Thanks to the co-operation and financial support received from the Hospitals and Charities Commission, much has been done to overcome the war-time lag in maintenance.

Existing buildings, plant and equipment are in good condition, and the transformation which has occurred in Wards 5 and 7 is worthy of special mention.

**NURSING :** Providing adequate trained nursing staff is of international magnitude, but we are pleased to report that all wards and departments have functioned to full capacity.

At this year's Graduation Ceremony the Guest Speaker was Miss N. Long, Dean of the Northern District School of Nursing—an ex-trainee of this Hospital who very successfully completed Post-Graduate studies abroad.

The function was made public for the first time and held in the Alfred Hall. Some 750 people attended and added to the importance of the occasion.

Miss E. Burford arrived from Wales in October, 1949, to accept the position of Sister Tutor. Her wide knowledge and experience in the teaching aspects of nursing are widely recognised and she is a welcome addition to the Staff.

The teaching equipment has been greatly augmented, thanks to a splendid donation from the Railway Auxiliary, who provided a 16 m.m. sound on film projector, a strip projector and all accessories.

**FINANCE :** Indicative of how rising costs, over which it has no control, affect hospital finances, the maintenance expenditure this year has increased by 18.5%.

Inevitably nowadays, the hospital must rely largely upon the State Government for its finance, and it is desired to express sincere thanks to the Government and the Hospitals and Charities Commission for their assistance and understanding of our difficult problems.

A Radio Drive conducted in October last over Station 3BA resulted in 5,888 people subscribing the sum of £9,000/10/11. This was a really magnificent effort and illustrated the interest of Ballarat and District residents in their hospital. The nett result (£8705/7/9) has been placed in a trust account and will be paid into the Maintenance Account in three equal instalments of an amount equal to that normally raised by Gala Day.



The Committee fully appreciates the unstinted co-operation of 3BA in making this Appeal possible.

As usual the Ballarat Travellers held their Annual Gala Day in November, and the effort proved to be a record. We gratefully acknowledge our share of the proceeds, viz., £377/10/-.

The effort of the Ballarat City Bowling Club is worthy of special praise. This virile organization raised the sum of £602 at their Bowling Tournament for local Charities, and this hospital benefited to the extent of £187.

Employees of the Life-Guard Milk Products Pty. Ltd. have had deducted from their wages a total amount of £48/4/-, which amount is to be used for purchasing Pack Trolleys for the operating theatre.

This practical gesture is much appreciated and those concerned are commended for their community effort.

THE COMMITTEE: Mr. J. V. Robertson, who was a member of the Committee of Management for fourteen years, and Treasurer since 1943, resigned during the year because of ill-health. Mr. Robertson is deserving of our thanks for his constant interest in all hospital matters, and it is sincerely hoped that his recovery to good health will be speedy and complete.

Dr. W. A. Sloss is on leave of absence and is abroad.

Messrs. M. B. John, E. G. Ludbrook, J. H. Heinz and S. E. Abraham retire by effluxion of time, and Mr. H. C. Tippet, who was appointed by the Committee to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. J. V. Robertson. All members are eligible for re-election and offer themselves accordingly.

BENEFACTION: The Victorian Mining Accident Relief Fund was wound up during the year and the share received by this Hospital was £3,600. This amount has been placed on trust and will be used at a later date to assist in providing a Children's Ward as a memorial to those who lost their lives in the Creswick Mining Disaster.

GENERAL: Your Committee realizes that little could be achieved in the Hospital if it were not for the generous and whole-hearted co-operation received from the Honorary Medical, Dental and other Staffs, Auxiliaries, contributors and supporters generally.

During the year Dr. J. S. T. Stevens was appointed Honorary Diabetic Physician and Dr. R. J. Riddell full-time Clinical Pathologist. Both these specialist appointments will enable the Hospital to expand and give greater service. We are grateful to all concerned for their loyal co-operation.

A recent innovation is the appointment of a public committee to control and develop a new Ambulance Service. Your Committee has been pleased to co-operate with the newly-constituted body and transfer to it the several vehicles and other assets which were entrusted to the Hospital when it accepted responsibility for the ambulance service some years ago. The new committee will devote all its efforts to the Ambulance Service.

Many and varied are the Hospital activities and it is right and proper that in this civilized world of today there should be a modern hospital service in every community. It would also appear right that each and every one should assist in furthering that ideal and in providing for the future. We enjoy a legacy handed down to us from our fore-fathers, which is not without obligation.

Finally, we gratefully acknowledge all assistance given to the Hospital during the year. Especially do we mention the many kindnesses of 3BA, the Ballarat "Courier," the Red Cross Society, the school children of Ballarat and district (who collected 2,423 dozen eggs), all who helped to brighten Christmas for the patients who were in hospital during the festive season, and all those who directly or indirectly assisted in one way or another.

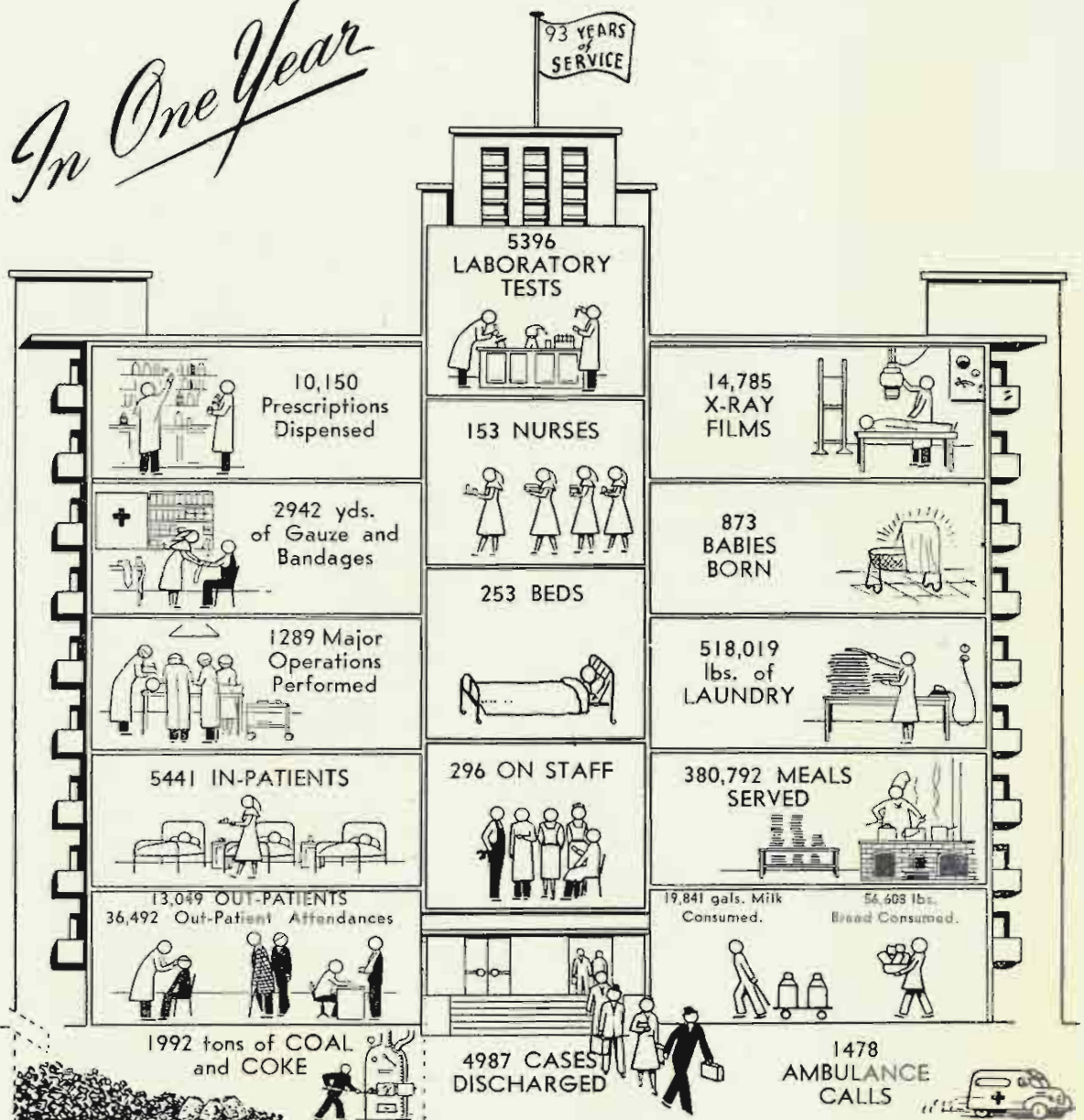
