## *Annual Report*

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30th JUNE, 1961

To the Life Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen—

On behalf of the Committee of Management I have the honour to present the Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1961.

In the year under review, Melbourne was the privileged venue chosen by the International Council of Nurses for their 12th Quadrennial Congress. After this Congress we were indeed pleased to receive a visit from a number of overseas guests, and have them inspect our hospital. Also, we had the pleasure of providing facilities at the hospital for a Branch Meeting of the Victorian Division of the British Medical Association.

Some very important discussions took place with representatives of other major charitable institutions and 3 BA on the future method of conducting public appeals in Ballarat. It is too early yet to record any final decisions; however, it does appear likely that future appeals may follow a community chest pattern.

A considerable amount of building planning and development has taken place this year, as revealed elsewhere in this report. In this regard we are grateful for the assistance that has been given to us by the members of the Hospital and Charities Commission and their executive staff officers.

### **SERVICE :**

The hospital has again had an extremely busy year providing treatment and attention to the sick and injured of our community. This situation was aggravated by the fact that accommodation was severely restricted for five months whilst remodelling works were being carried out to the Queen Victoria Ward Block. During this period the Committee had to close Ward 10 in Yuille House as an intermediate ward and use it, together with part of Ward 3, to accommodate public medical patients.

A total of 5,591 inpatients and 29,594 outpatients received treatment, and the daily average was 187.2.

Unfortunately, due to lack of staff, the Regional Physiotherapy Service was forced to close down during the year. The Committee is greatly concerned with this matter and, as a long term solution, is now offering bursaries to assist selected applicants to train as physiotherapists, after which they will be bound to serve the hospital for a specified period. Immediate vacancies in the physiotherapy staff have been advertised interstate and overseas, so far without result.

In all other departments full services have been available to the public and regional hospitals through the year.

## **BUILDING DEVELOPMENT :**

At a cost of £30,000 the male and female medical wards in the Queen Victoria Block were remodelled this year. These wards have been subdivided into six bed and smaller ward units. All beds are equipped with overhead screening, scrub-up facilities are provided in each unit, new pantries, work-rooms, sterilizing facilities, sister's station, toilets and bathrooms were provided on each floor. The Committee is very proud of the standard of accommodation now available in these wards.

At the time of writing this report remodelling works to the old kitchen block are about to commence. This building will house splint room, pay office, meeting and recreation room, Resident Medical Officers' dining room, and new scullery and food preparation area for the nurses' dining room. The reorganization of this building will enable us to provide a much needed improved service to all staff dining rooms, and will provide a suitable room for auxiliaries' meetings and other functions which will fill a long felt need at this hospital.

The first floor of Rusden House is at present being remodelled to provide a residence for the medical superintendent. These quarters are conveniently placed on the site and are admirable for this purpose. Also during the year, alterations were carried out to the ground floor of this building to provide new accommodation for Speech Therapy Department and the Red Cross Library.

Specifications and plans have been drawn up for carrying out major repair works to the roof and feature walls of Yuille House. Depending upon finances available from government sources, we hope that this work can be implemented early in the new financial year.

Quotations have been received for air conditioning the theatre block and ward nurseries. These have been approved by the Hospitals and Charities Commission and the work should be carried out before next summer.

In planning the remodelling of the Casualty and Outpatients Block, the Committee has been faced with the extremely difficult task of fitting all the facilities required within the bounds of the existing building and the limits of available finance. We feel that the problem has now been solved and are at present awaiting approval from the Hospitals and Charities Commission to proceed to working drawings and calling of tenders. The Committee is most anxious for this work to proceed without delay and provided government finance is available, this work should be nearly completed before the end of the next financial year.

## **STAFF :**

It was with great regret that in January this year the Committee accepted the resignation of Dr. J. W. Hill as Medical Superintendent. Dr. Hill was appointed to this position early in 1958 and filled the post with energy and enthusiasm. He was responsible for many improvements to the service we give to the patient, and his advice on hospital matters was always most helpful to the Committee. I would record here the Committee's thanks for the loyalty and co-operation displayed by Dr. Hill during his term of office.

To fill the vacancy so caused, the Committee appointed Dr. J. H. Begg, who had formerly been the Medical Superintendent at the Queen Victoria Maternity Hospital, Adelaide, and also of the Mildura Base Hospital. Dr. Begg brings with him a wealth of experience in hospital administration and medical matters. Apart from being a medical practitioner, he also has gained the Diploma in Hospital Administration and we look forward to his help and guidance in the running of our hospital.



I would also record here our appreciation of the work of the hospital's staff during the year. The medical staff under Dr. Begg, the nursing staff under Miss Langham, and the administrative and general staff under the Manager have all contributed to the smooth running of the hospital. Without their co-operation and devotion to duty it would be difficult to maintain the high standard of service offered by the Ballarat and District Base Hospital.

#### **HONORARY PROFESSIONAL STAFF :**

The Honorary Medical and Dental Staffs are most generous in the giving of time and ability, and fully deserve the sincere thanks of all concerned. We are grateful to them for their effort for the hospital.

Dr. C. E. Richardson retired as Honorary Pediatrician at the beginning of this year and was appointed to the Consulting Staff. The Committee was most happy to tender him a reception in recognition of the many years of untiring service he had given to this hospital.

#### **COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT :**

During the year the Committee was unfortunate in losing the services of two of its valued members. Mr. L. Maddern retired after twenty-one years of service. He had held the position of President from 1946-48, and from 1941 to date of retirement had been the Government Nominee on the Committee of Management. Mr. H. White was elected to the Committee in 1953 but due to pressure of business was forced to resign this year. The Committee appointed Messrs. I. F. Tweedie and J. B. Vernon to these casual vacancies.

Messrs. F. E. Duncan, W. R. Griffiths, F.R.C.S., R. A. Must, R. P. Strickland, I. F. Tweedie, J. B. Vernon and Dr. A. C. H. Salter, retire this year through effluxion of time and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

#### **FINANCE :**

The total cost of running the hospital for the year was £413,836. This is a 5.1 per cent. increase over last year's cost of £396,489.

The problem of financing the hospital is ever current with the Committee. During the year, in an effort to cope with these rising costs, the Committee approached the Hospitals and Charities Commission for additional assistance. We are happy to record that a special maintenance grant of £10,000 was made available to us towards the end of the financial year and to express to the Commission our grateful thanks for this assistance.

As a result of this grant we were able to close the year with a net overdraft of £71,032, compared with £81,494 last year. Also the year has ended with a small surplus of £3,732 which, considering the expenditure figure quoted above, is extremely good.

## **DONORS AND VOLUNTARY HELPERS :**

There are many who, during the year, contributed one way or another towards the welfare of the hospital and its patients. It is fitting that I should record herein the Committee's appreciation of this generous help from the voluntary workers and donors.

In particular, mention must be made of the splendid support received from our auxiliaries. The "Mary-Helen", under the leadership of the President, Miss E. Simpson; Treasurer, Mrs. H. S. Trevenen; and Secretary, Mrs. R. J. Buchanan; has raised funds this year which assisted in the purchase of equipment items to the value of £1,692. The Railways Auxiliary, under their President, Mr. J. F. Townsend, conducted their annual Christmas raffle which raised the sum of £473. The "Younger Set", ably led by Miss P. Muir, purchased an air cooler for the Children's Ward and added a further amount to their Cot Fund. The ladies of the "Sunshine Circle" carried out their regular visits to the wards with magazines and reading material for the patients.

A most impressive ceremony was held in the Board Room on 21st August at which the "Gideons" dedicated and donated individual Testaments for all patients and staff in the hospital, and I extend to them our sincere thanks for this gift.

I also record our thanks for the assistance received from the Ballarat Hospital Past Trainees Association in purchasing ward equipment; the Red Cross Society for their continued help in Blood Bank and Library Services; the Ballarat Travellers' Social Club; the M. B. John Employees Charities Group; the Ballarat "Courier" for the very ready co-operation they have extended to us; and all others who have assisted during the year.

Unfortunately I must also record the fact that during the year, through lack of active membership, the Railways Auxiliary was forced to cease functioning as a hospital auxiliary. This is indeed a great loss to the hospital. It is to be regretted that an organization that has, over a period of 34 years, been responsible for providing so much in the way of equipment and comforts for patients should cease to function through lack of active support.

"Voluntary service" is the foundation stone upon which our hospital system is built. If this voluntary service fails then, inevitably, the standard of service this hospital can offer must suffer or else the present system must change. In the opinion of the Committee the present system is good, and we urge the community, in their own interests, to take an active part in supporting the hospital and its auxiliaries.

In conclusion I would say that much progress has been made during the year in improving the hospital buildings and equipment and in developing the services available to the community. There is much that still remains to be done. Of this the Committee is well aware and is constantly striving to the end, that our hospital will provide the best possible accommodation for the people of Ballarat and district.

Finally, I extend my sincere thanks to the Committee members and the Manager for their loyal support throughout the year.

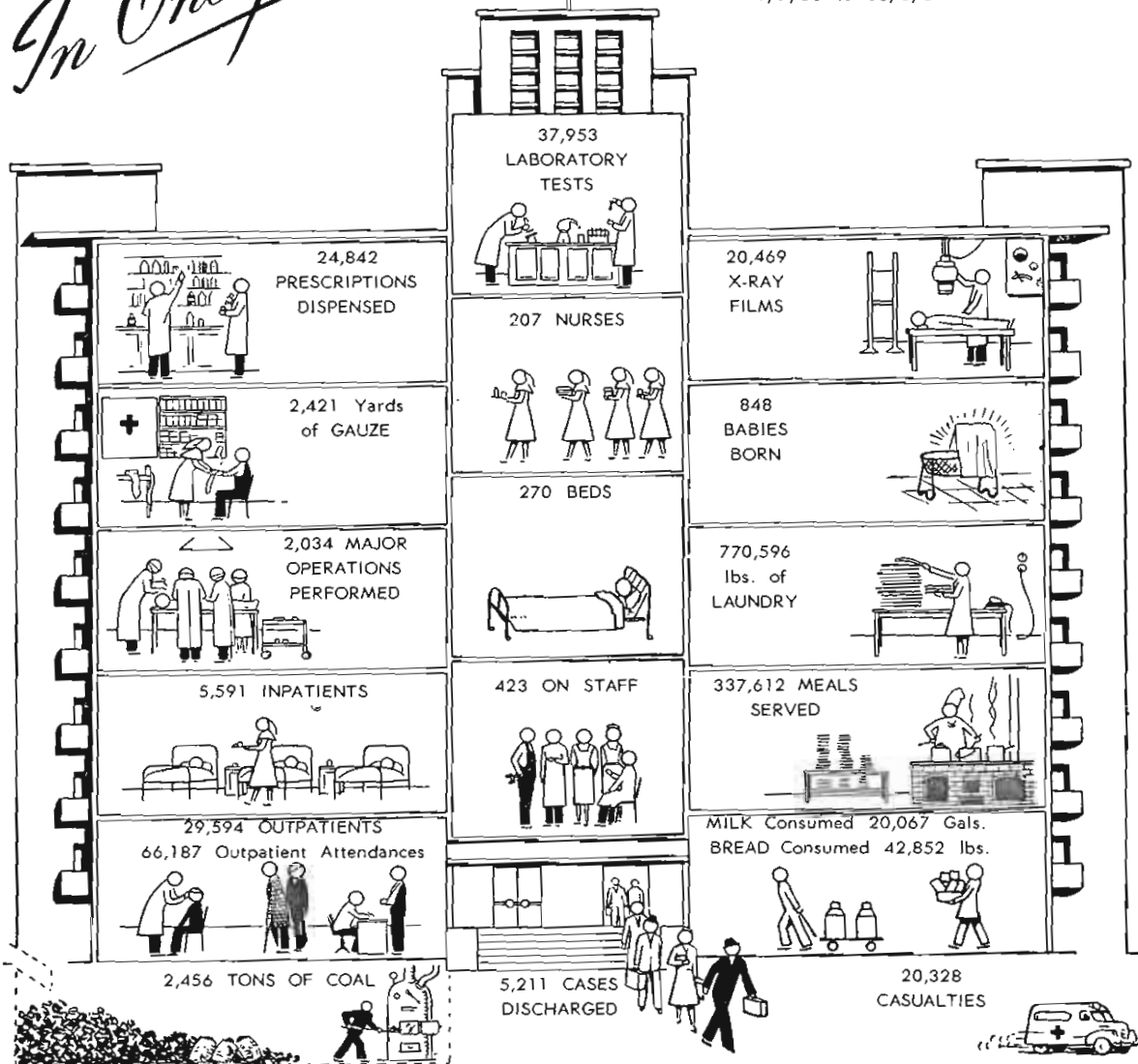
