ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE TWELVE MONTHS ENDED 30th JUNE, 1965



To the Life Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Committee of Management I have the honour to present the Annual Report and Financial Statements of the hospital for the year ended 30th June, 1965.

SERVICE : The importance of this hospital to the community may be gauged from the following annual statistics:—

Inpatients treated	6,096
Outpatient attendances	63,225
Casualties treated	20,356
Daily average of inpatients	187.1

The number of casualties treated reduced to a daily basis, shows that on the average the hospital treats 56 casualties per day for seven days each week. The Committee is proud indeed of the service the hospital offers and of the fact that the door to Casualty Department is always open to any person in need of treatment at any time of the day or night.

Most departments of the hospital were particularly busy this year and on some occasions we have had to ask patients to accept transfers to one of the annexe hospitals in order to free beds for more acute cases.

On a regional level, to assist the Daylesford Hospital we have undertaken the processing of their laundry and in addition the administration services to annexe hospitals at Beaufort and Skipton have been continued. Also, the physiotherapy and pathology services have continued to function effectively.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT : Much detailed investigation and planning was carried out on the New Central Block project. A delay in having some sections of the planning accepted prevented tenders being let this year. However, it is pleasing to report that it now appears possible for tenders to be called by the end of 1965. This building, which will house Theatres, Central Sterile Supply and Casualty Departments, has been long awaited and will be a welcome addition to the hospital.

The five flats for accommodation of married resident staff were completed according to schedule and occupied in January, 1965. In recognition of the considerable assistance that the hospital has received from the Joe White Bequest, the flats have been named the "Joe White Flats."

The Committee is also developing plans covering major alterations to the midwifery floor to provide for improved nursery facilities for babies, additional shower and toilet facilities and generally improved accommodation for mothers.

STAFF: There have been numerous senior staff movements during the year, these are recorded in the preceding sections of this report. Some difficulties are

being experienced in filling certain posts in the medical ancillary staff, but it is anticipated that this will eventually be overcome through the hospital's bursary programme.

To all the staff the Committee expresses its sincere appreciation for the manner in which they have carried out their duties and in particular the Committee's thanks is expressed to the Honorary Professional Staff for the services they have rendered to the hospital.

COMMITTEE: My personal thanks is extended to the members of the Committee of Management for their co-operation and support during this busy year in which a considerable number of general and sub-committee meetings was held.

This year Messrs. H. C. Tippet, J. H. Heinz, M. B. John and E. G. Ludbrook retire through effluxion of time and being eligible offer themselves for re-election.

FINANCES: Reference to the financial statements shows that the hospital has succeeded in matching its income with expenditure this financial year. This has been achieved chiefly through a marked increase from patients' fees and through exercising strict control over expenditure. It is worth noting that the average cost per day to treat a patient in this hospital is £6/4/8 (an increase of 1/11d. over last year) as compared to a state average cost of approximately £7/10/- per day.

However, the most significant aspect of our financial statement is the ever increasing total cost of running the hospital. It is apparent that the Ballarat Base Hospital is big business indeed, costing in excess of half a million pounds a year to run. A business of this magnitude demands and is in fact run with the assistance of budgetary control techniques, but difficulties are encountered through the very nature of the business conducted — no person is refused treatment because of his inability to pay. This leads to the hospital providing a very large proportion of "free" and "below cost" treatment to uninsured and indigent patients. For this reason therefore it is necessary for the Committee to seek the continued financial support of the community for the hospital.

GENERAL : Finally, I record our sincere appreciation of the most generous help in cash and kind that the hospital has received from its many supporters in the community.

To our auxiliaries in particular, I say thank you for another year of service to the hospital. It is indeed sad to record that during the year through lack of support, the Hospital Younger Set found it necessary to wind up its affairs and cease working as one of our auxiliaries. Over many years the Younger Set worked diligently for the Children's Ward and its absence from the hospital scene is to be greatly regretted. The "Mary-Helean" Auxiliary under the leadership of Mrs. J. Chamberlain is to be congratulated on another successful year and the "Sunshine Circle" presided over by Miss A. Driffin is thanked for another year of loyal service.

In conclusion, our thanks is extended to the members of the Red Cross Society, the Ballarat Travellers' Social Club, the M. B. John Employees Charities Group and to the management and staff of the Ballarat "Courier" for their continued help and assistance during the year.
