



The Ninety-Sixth Annual Report
of the
Board of Management

For the Year Ended 30th June, 1953

TO OUR CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Board welcomes the opportunity of conveying to you a report on the activities of the Queen Elizabeth Benevolent Home for the year just closed. Another year of service to the aged, infirm and chronic sick has been added to the proud record of your Home. New social legislation and benefits, mounting costs, the increasing number of aged sick requiring hospital treatment, have all increased to the many problems the administrative difficulties associated with a large charitable institution.

STATISTICAL INFORMATION. The reports for the year ended 31st March, 1953, disclose some interesting facts. The daily average of occupied beds was 600.5, the highest on record. The number of deaths was 117, or 59 less than that of the previous year. 65 of the 117 patients who died were aged over 80 years, and the average length of residence of those who died was 2 years, 3 months and 21 days.

ACCOMMODATION. Medical attention, modern life-saving drugs and serums, and experienced and skilled nursing tends to prolong life, and the steadily falling death rate has slowed down the intake of new patients. There are hundreds of urgent and deserving cases awaiting admission, and your Board feels alarmed at the general lack of appreciation of this position. Every year there are fewer vacancies available for an increasing number of applicants. The State should be providing at least 200 beds annually to meet the growing need but, unfortunately, the position is being allowed to drift. Your Board has strenuously and consistently sought authority to add an additional 250 bed block, but without success. It is still prepared to embark on a major building plan. Additions to existing buildings with complete services (steam, kitchen, laundry, etc.) would be vastly less costly and far quicker to build.

FINANCE. The anticipated flattening out of the cost spiral did not eventuate. The average daily cost of maintaining a patient rose to 16/4. The weekly wage cost of nursing a patient in an infirmary ward is £2/12/- Your Board has exercised the greatest care and expenditure but, regrettably, the year closed with a deficiency of £13,637. A few months ago the Board was confident that with the expected income from the Commonwealth Government's Hospital Benefit Payments, the finances of the Home would be placed on a sounder foundation. Two thirds of our patients are pensioners and the Commonwealth Government's refusal to pay the additional 4/- per day for pensioners, as allowed to hospitals, reduced last year's income by £12,000. The Commonwealth has approved of the Infirmary wards of the home as "a public hospital" for non-pensioners, insured non-pensioners and insured pensioners, but it regards the institution as a "State benevolent home" in respect of pensioner patients in infirmary wards. Your Board has vigorously fought this unjust discrimination.

The great majority of our infirmary patients are pensioners. The Commonwealth Government retains £2/4/- per week of their pensions; the balance is paid to the pensioner as pocket money. The Commonwealth pays 8/- per day Commonwealth Hospital Benefit for all infirmary patients, but as the cost of their maintenance is more than double that amount it is impossible for your Board to make up the deficiency without greater financial support from either the State or Commonwealth.

BUILDINGS. Although funds were not available for any major building works, your artisan staff has maintained the buildings in good repair, and has also constructed a new annex to the workshops, added to the laundry, reconditioned the No. 3 Dormitory, and installed a new toilet block.

PLANT, EQUIPMENT and FURNISHINGS. Funds provided by generous benefactors and organisations enabled your Board to purchase a badly needed autoclave, a dishwasher for the women's dining room scullery, new beds, small tables and chairs and floor coverings for the Edward Wilson Ward dining room, and a hot press for the women's dining room.

GROUP LAUNDRY. The site for the proposed Group Laundry has been cleared, but no further progress has been made. In order to cope with the increased volume of wash the Hospitals and Charities Commission met the cost of a new Single Roll "Amazon" Ironer, which has been installed in our existing laundry until the new Group Laundry is established.

CHARITABLE DONATIONS. There was a pleasing increase in the number of individual donors and the total amount contributed. One very generous lady, who wishes to remain anonymous, donated £1700 during the year ended 31/3/53, and a further £3,000 during the past three months. Your Board records its grateful thanks to Miss Isabel Bird for her very welcome donation of £500, and also the many generous people for their contributions which are listed on pages 19 to 33 of this report.

LEGACIES. Legacies amounting to over £12,000 were received during the year, and your Board records its gratitude to these benefactors who provided so generously for the welfare of the Old Folk in your Home.

ENTERTAINMENTS. The return from entertainments this year was particularly satisfactory, and your Board expresses its grateful thanks to the promoters and organisers.

BALLARAT CHARITY SUNDAY FUND. This Home's share of the collections was £110, and to His Worship the Mayor (Cr. Arthur W. Nicholson) Chairman, Mr. L. F. North (Treasurer), and Mr. John Keith (Hon. Secretary) we convey to them and to the contributors and churches our sincere thanks for their continued interest and annual help.

PRESBYTERIAN FELLOWSHIP ASSOCIATION. The Annual Concert and High Tea was again successfully organised by the Fellowship. The Concert was greatly appreciated, and the splendid repast provided was enjoyed by all the patients. This annual fixture is one of the happiest functions which take place, and the patients look forward to it with pleasurable anticipation.

LADIES' AUXILIARY. The Queen Elizabeth Home Ladies' Auxiliary is to be congratulated and sincerely thanked for yet another year of kindly service to the patients. Special occasions, such as Coronation Day, were marked by special menus provided by the Auxiliary. The Annual Christmas Tree was enjoyed immensely and the Picnic was, as usual, a happy and well organised event. During the year the Auxiliary presented a Stainless Steel Hot Press for the Women's Day Room.

The entertainment of the inmates was not overlooked. The Auxiliary arranged fortnightly concerts, talkie shows were held on alternate Wednesdays, and a number of concert and revue parties staged enjoyable entertainments. To all these kindly people your Board expresses its grateful thanks.

EGG APPEAL. The Annual Egg Appeal showed an improvement on last year's collections, but your Board hopes for greater support in the years to come as the number of eggs required annually totals 9,000 dozen.

OVERNIGHT SHELTER. For some years homeless itinerant men (and occasionally women) have been given a night's shelter. Unfortunately the majority of these people showed neither gratitude for comfort nor ordinary respect for the accommodation, bedding or furniture. On account of the misconduct of these people the Board reluctantly decided to discontinue this service as it was felt that it was not a function of a Home for the Aged.

BOWLING CLUB. The Club members enjoyed a very successful season. Several Clubs invited them to visit and entertained them most hospitably. The Queen Elizabeth Club members were delighted to return the hospitality. Unfortunately illness prevented several members from playing through the season, and also forced them to miss the President's Night at the wind up of the season. The Honorary Coach (Mr. E. J. Evans), who for three years has given much time to instructing and coaching members, resigned. He was given a presentation by the Club members and was appointed an Honorary Life Governor by the Board.

VISITATIONS. The Red Cross Hospital Visitor (Miss Marjorie Glenny) and the Handcrafts' Officer (Miss Brown) have visited the Home regularly and done much to brighten the lives of the inmates and interest them in handcrafts, etc. The Christian Endeavourers have also visited regularly and their visits have been most welcome.


SCHOOL FOR STUDENT NURSING AIDES. Several nursing aide students were given part of their training at The Queen Elizabeth Home, but the results this year were not nearly as satisfactory as those of the previous year.

INSTITUTIONAL MANAGEMENT STUDENTS OF THE INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY, GEELONG. Five students of the Institute spent a fortnight at the Home gaining practical experience in institutional management. This is the fourth occasion that a group of students has come to the Home, and your Board feels sure, from the reports and notes on their work, that they will achieve the same success as those girls in the earlier groups.

CATERING. The appointment of a Caterer two years ago has proved beyond doubt that good management on the catering side is extremely important. Not only has there been an improvement in the meals, but better buying and the elimination of waste has reduced costs. We compliment our Caterer, Mr. Gilbert Baker, on his election as President of the Victorian Hospitals' Caterers' Association. The management of the Kiosk has also been brought under the control of the Caterer with satisfactory results and an improved service to patrons. The profits of the Kiosk are devoted to special comforts for inmates.

RADIO APPEAL. The Directors of Ballarat Broadcasters Ltd. (3 BA Ballarat) have generously allocated Sunday, 20th September, for a Radio Appeal for The Queen Elizabeth Benevolent Home. A strong Appeal Committee has been established and a substantial return is expected. Your Board feels that this being Coronation Year, the Coronation Radio Appeal for The Queen Elizabeth Benevolent Home will receive enthusiastic and generous support.

CORONATION OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II. The inmates of the Home, with all loyal citizens, followed the Coronation announcements, reports and broadcasts with intense interest. Wards, lounges and dining rooms were appropriately decorated, and the exterior illuminations at night were particularly effective. The Coronation Celebration was marked by a special dinner provided by the Board and a High Tea provided by the Ladies' Auxiliary. The President of the Ballarat Travellers' Social Club, Mr. J. Boddinnar, presented each male inmate with tobacco or cigarettes, according to their individual tastes, and the Ballarat Branch of the Red Cross remembered the ex-servicemen inmates by presenting each with sweets and fruit. At its first meeting after the Coronation your Board pledged its loyalty to the throne and its affection to our Sovereign Queen Elizabeth II.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT. The meetings of the Board and the various Committees have been regularly attended. During the year Mr. F. J. Hurren a Past President and a most energetic Board Member, resigned on account of his departure from Ballarat. The Board has

recommended Mr. Hurren's appointment as a Life Governor in appreciation of the valuable services he has given to the Home. The vacancy has been filled by the election of Mr. Geo. Torney. Mr. L. F. North, a member of the Board and its Immediate Past President, was elected to the Executive of the Country Hospitals' Association, and also a member of the Victorian Hospitals' Association.

STAFF. Your Board has pleasure in recording its appreciation of the loyal and efficient services of the Staff. The several departmental heads have faithfully carried out their duties and the institution has functioned smoothly and efficiently. During the year the Annual Staff Social was held. The function was well attended and was undoubtedly a social success. Board members and their wives who attended were happy to become acquainted with individual members of the Staff. Mr. Wm. Woodruff, Foreman, retired on 30th August, 1952, after thirty-seven years' service. He retired with the Staff's goodwill, the inmates' affection and the Board's appreciation of long and faithful service. Other members of the Staff who reached retiring age were Mrs. Amy Harrison and Mrs. S. Rigney, and to all three your Board expresses good wishes for a happy retirement.

TRAINING WITHIN INDUSTRY. During the year the Board arranged for departmental heads to attend a series of sessions on Training Within Industry. Mr. A. J. Betheras, M.Ed., B.A., of the Industrial Training Division Department of Labour and National Service, was leader and obtained gratifying results. Mr. McMillan, of our Staff, attended an Institute for Trainees in Job Instruction. Your Board feels that the development of personal interest, efficiency and confidence brought about through this special training will be of great benefit to the Home.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES. The Chaplains and visiting clery and lay workers of the various denominations have been assiduous in their attention to the religious needs of our old people. They have been a wonderful comfort to those who are ill or lonely or depressed, and their ministrations have done so much to foster that homelike and peaceful atmosphere which is your Board's desire and which is so often remarked upon by visitors.

BEGONIA FESTIVAL. Ballarat celebrated its first Begonia Festival in March, 1953, and your Board co-operated as fully as possible in this very successful series of events. Open House at The Queen Elizabeth Home was declared on Wednesday, 11th, and Sunday, 15th March. The number of visitors who arrived on the Wednesday exceeded the most optimistic estimates, but with the willing assistance of the staff all were conducted through the Home in small parties. To many the Home was a revelation, and they left rather envious of Ballarat's good fortune in having such an institution for its chronic and aged sick.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES' COMMISSION. Your Board records its thanks to the Chairman (Mr. C. L. McVilly), the Deputy Chairman (Mr. C. R. Frencham) and Dr. J. G. Hurley, of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, for their helpful advice and encouragement. The Commission's staff has been most co-operative and courteous at all times.

INMATES. This report would not be complete without some reference to our large family of 600 people, ranging in ages from thirteen years to ninety-eight years. Many of them spend all their days and nights in bed, some are absolutely helpless; but throughout the whole Institution there is a feeling of contentment, interest and pride in the Queen Elizabeth Home.

HONORARY OFFICERS. Valuable honorary professional services have been given by our Honorary Dentist, Dr. S. A. Wilson; and by Mr. G. B. Cutter of Messrs. Wastell and Cutter, Honorary Optometrists. Mr. G. S. Richards, our Honorary Architect; Mr. H. G. Morrow, of Cuthbert, Morrow, Must & Shaw, Solicitors; Messrs. W. J. and A. W. Meinhardt, Consulting Structural Engineers; and the Board, on your behalf, expresses grateful thanks for the advice and help so generously given.

MEDICAL SERVICES. The Medical Officer, Dr. Mervyn Robinson, has given attention to the patients and necessary directions to the staff in order that the patients may be made as comfortable as possible. During Dr. Robinson's absences his deputy, Dr. D. Alexander, has acted for him.

NURSING SERVICE. The Home is fast becoming a hospital for chronic and aged sick, with a steadily decreasing ratio of ambulant patients, and your Board records its appreciation of the efficient and kindly services of the nursing staff under the capable guidance of Matron G. Mandeville Halls and the staff of trained nurses. Many letters have been received stressing the wonderful kindness of the staff.

CONCLUSION. There are so many kind and generous friends who have helped in various ways by gifts of vegetables and fruit, cakes, sweets and other foodstuffs, magazines and periodicals, furnishings and ornaments, that it is impossible to mention them all; but your Board expresses to them all its grateful thanks and appreciation for their practical interest and help.




