

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th JUNE, 1934.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS—

Financial.

Your board has pleasure in submitting its seventy-seventh Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1934.

The income for the year was £13,400/8/5, and the expenditure £13,518/12/8, leaving an overdraft of £538/7/7, against that of £420/3/4 on 30th June, 1933.

Home.

The daily average of indoor relief for the year was 271.638, and the number of inmates in the Institution on 30th June, 1934, was 272, an increase of 12 on last year's figures.

Average Annual Cost.

The average annual cost per head for maintenance was £34 13/4 $\frac{1}{4}$, against £34 19/1 $\frac{1}{4}$ on the previous year—a decrease of 5/9.

Out-Door Relief.

The amount expended on out-door relief was £189/5/-, compared with £409/19/4 last year, being a decrease of £220 14/4. The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June, 1934, was 76,673, against 150,961 the previous year. The total number of visits for the year ending 30th June, 1934, was: Adults, 1,145; children, 1,750. Total, 2,895.

In the previous year the total was 6,601, a decrease of 3,706.

During the year a large number of men passing through Ballarat have been supplied with Bread, Sugar and Tea. These, a total of 1,092, are in addition to the out-door relief cases assisted locally.

Office-Bearers.

At the Annual Meeting it will be necessary to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, and four members of the Board, who retire by effluxion of time, and offer themselves for re-election, and to elect the Hon. Solicitor, Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Dentist, Hon. Oculist, and two Auditors.

General.

During the year many improvements and additions to the interior of the Institution have been made. Several of the dormitories, the library, and vestibule have been re-painted. The ventilation of these portions of the building has been greatly improved by inlet and outlet vents. Much still remains to be done so that the old portions of the building may be brought up to the required standard for an institution such as this.

Front Garden.

The front garden has been remodelled and the paths regraded and remade. We are indebted to Mr. T. B. Toop, Curator of the Botanical Gardens, for the fine effect he has produced in the lay-out of the front garden. Mr. L. Finch, City Engineer, and his staff have also greatly assisted in preparing plans, levels and supervising the paths. All this work entailed considerable labor and technical skill, for which we have to thank the gentlemen named.

Film Projector.

Mainly owing to the interest and kindly goodwill of the Management of Regent Theatres and Hoyts Prop. Coy., we have been able to entertain our old folk with silent pictures each month. Our thanks are due to Mr. Percival, of the Ballarat Theatres staff for installing the projector, kindly loaned to this Home by Hoyts Prop. Ltd. Mr. Percival has voluntarily attended to the screening of the films, and his generous practical help, in conjunction with the goodwill of all concerned, has been the means of providing our inmates with most agreeable entertainment.

Ladies' Committee.

Following the custom of several years, the Ladies' Auxiliary has been of invaluable help in many ways. This band of ladies, under the direction of their President (Mrs. R. McClure), hon. secretary (Mrs. J. Cole, J.P.), and hon. treasurer (Mrs. John Fraser), provided the money for the necessary equipment and costs of installing the projector, as well as purchasing nine ceiling fans for the hospital wards for men and women. It is customary to express in these annual reports the appreciation of this Committee of Management of the fine work done by the Ladies' Auxiliary. This is not merely a matter of form. I am deeply conscious of the unassuming and considerate care bestowed on our old folk by the band of ladies who comprise the Auxiliary.

Visits of Subscribers, Etc.

Many of the public and semi-public organisations took advantage of my invitation to visit our Institution. It was my pleasure to entertain these representative citizens accompanied by their ladies, and the opportunity this afforded to inspect the improvements carried out throughout the Institution met with the quite unanimous approval and admiration of the visitors.

Community Singers.

As a graceful appreciation of the splendid work of our Ladies' Auxiliary, and as an expression of goodwill towards our aged charges, the committee of the Community Singers allotted the whole of the net proceeds of their entertainments, viz., £36/4/2, to our Ladies' Auxiliary Committee during the year. In conjunction with myself, Mrs. Cole, J.P., and Mrs. J. Fraser accepted seats on the committee of the Community Singers. We are grateful to the president (Mr. A. Mackenzie), hon. secretary (Mr. W. Ramage), and hon. treasurer (Mr. F. Miliani), together with their committee for this fine gesture of goodwill.

Bowling Club's Carnival.

The Ballarat East Bowling Club held an Electric Light Bowling Carnival in aid of the funds of our Home during last February and March. This effort resulted in the presentation of ten beds (£50) to the Infirmary Wards. All the bowlers of Ballarat took part in the carnival and I had pleasure in showing a large party of the bowlers of Ballarat and their ladies through the Institution on two occasions and expressing our appreciation of the splendid gift.

Sub-Matron.

Owing to the increasing responsibilities of the duties of Matron, your Committee felt it was desirable to assist Matron Gent in her heavy duties by appointing a Sub-Matron. We were fortunate in obtaining Nurse J. Bull for this position, and I feel that in this appointment we are but recognising the valuable work of our Matron whose unremitting and ceaseless care of all the old folk in the Home has been the subject of appreciative reference by all who come into contact with Matron Gent and her life work.

Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Hoare.

It is with feeling of sincere pleasure that I am able to report the improved health of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Hoare. Our Home has for years past benefited largely by the keen and sympathetic interest shown in many practical ways by these good folk, and I am sure that I express the wish of you all that Mr. and Mrs. Hoare may be able for years to come to continue in the enjoyment of health and prosperity.

Out-Door Relief.

When this Committee undertook a more thorough examination of the problem of out-door relief, Messrs. J. Keith and W. J. Carthew volunteered to undertake this responsible and exacting duty. They have been most successful in their self-imposed task with the result that we are quite sure that the recipients of relief are in every way worthy. Incidentally, these gentlemen have taken off the shoulders of the members of the general committee a trying and most unpleasant duty. I wish to extend my personal thanks to Messrs. Keith and Carthew for the splendid work they have done and are doing.

Conclusion.

In conclusion, please accept my deepest appreciation of the loyal support and co-operation of all associated with the administration of the affairs of this large Home. The Superintendent and Secretary, Mr. A. Gale, is indefatigable; the Matron, Miss Gent, is kindness and consideration; Miss E. Jopling is always helpful; the Medical Officer, Dr. A. H. Guymer, is most attentive, and all of these and the Staff are imbued with the ideal of service.

Our Honorary Staff does excellent work for this Home and the well-being of our old folk. To single out any one of these gentlemen would be invidious, but I must refer in terms of deep gratitude to our Hon. Solicitor, Mr. H. G. Morrow. This gentleman is always at our service, and we have had to seek his valuable advice and help very often during the year.

To my Committee, I have nothing but thanks to offer. The control of The Ballarat District Benevolent Home is a task of no light concern. I have no hesitation in saying that every call I have had to make on the patience and goodwill of our General Committee has been responded to most generously.




