# RESIDENT SURGEON'S REPORT.

Notwithstanding the limited accommodation consequent upon the building operations which have progressed during the past year, 583 persons have been treated in the house. The mortality has been slightly in excess of the preceding 12 months, chiefly on account of the large number of incurable cases admitted, but no doubt partly in consequence of the crowded state of the wards during a portion of the year, rendered necessary by the constant and urgent appeals for admission.

As an example of the fatal nature of the cases received, it may be well to state, that of the total number who died, 15 were the victims of accidents beyond the reach of surgical skill; 26 were cases of Phthisis, Aneurism, Cancer, Gangrene, Abscess, Ovarian Dropsy, and diseases of the Brain, Heart and Liver, in such an advanced stage that nothing could be done to ameliorate the symptoms. In addition to these cases, the large number of 25 were moribund on admission; 11 died within 24 hours after being received, 7 within 48 hours, and 7 in less than 4 days, from accidents and diseases which might in all probality have been successfully combated had relief been sooner sought. The improvement in the sanatory condition of the house since the opening of the new wing, has however been most apparent, as an illustration of which, it may be stated that within the last two months, 5 capital operations have been performed with the utmost success, and that the patients are all progressing most favorably towards recovery.

# SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF

THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

# BALLARATDISTRICTHOSPITAL.

In presenting to the governors and subscribers to the Hospital the sixth annual report of its transactions, the committee of management have much pleasure in congratulating them upon the present efficient state of the institution, and beg leave to call their attention to a few of the chief features which have marked its progress since their election.

Notwithstanding the restricted accommodation caused by the building operation, 588 persons have received the benefits of the institution during the year. Of this number, 439 have been cured or relieved, 88 have died, and 61 remained in the house on the last day of December. In addition to the above, 2400 out-patients (attended to upon 8987 different occasions) have received advice and medicine gratuitously during the same period, on the recommendation of governors and subscribers to the Hospital, making a total of 2988 cases treated.

In consequence of the many important improvements which have been carried out, the expenditure during the year has been very considerable, although the outlay immediately connected with the domestic management of the house has been materially diminished. This latter result is chiefly referrible to the indefatigable attention of the members of the house committee, who have met the many claims upon their time and consideration, with a cheerful alacrity deserving of the warmest thanks of the subscribers. The balance sheets contain detailed particulars of the receipts and expenditure, and show a balance of £1023 5s. 9d. remaining to the credit of the general account, and a debit of £1395 4s. against the building fund for money advanced on loan, to enable the committee to erect the new centre. This position, all things considered, is most satisfactory, and your

committee would avail themselves of the present opportunity to return thanks to the public of this and the surrounding districts, for the liberality with which they have responded to their appeal. Nothwithstanding the frequent claims upon their benevolence from other quarters, the large sum of £2167 2s. 6d. has been contributed from private sources during the year, and your committee trust that the generous support accorded to them during their term of office, may long be extended to their successors.

Reviewing the many important improvements which have been carried out under the supervision of your committee, the new centre now approaching completion first claims attention. It will be remembered that in their last report they stated, that on the removal of the old female ward the north wall was found to be in such a dangerous condition that immediate steps had to be taken for its support, the course of events however, soon showed that the back wall was in an equally insecure state, and the necessity for prompt and active measures, not only to preserve the south wing of the building, but to guard the lives of the inmates, forced itself upon your committee.

The propriety of re-erecting the whole of the centre, which had been at one time strongly advocated by a section of the late committee, was now once more brought under consideration, and, acting on the advice of Messrs. Webb, Doane, Caselli, and their own architect, Mr. C. D. Cuthbert, who agreed that although the building might be secured for the time by taking down the north-east corner, and supporting it with buttresses, the wisest course undoubtedly was to rebuild it; the building was, after protracted deliberation ultimately condemned. Arrangements having been completed for a temporary loan from the Colonial Bank of Australasia, and the promise of a grant of £1000 having been obtained from Government, tenders for the re-building of the centre were invited, and on the 28th of April that of Messrs. Francis and Buley for £2593 being the lowest, was accepted. This contract is now on the eve of completion, and the building, when open, will afford convenient accommodation for the treatment of out-door patients, as well as accommodation for the resident staff, and domestics, and offices, bath rooms, and store rooms, &c, hitherto much required. Looking upon the pile of building as it now stands, your committee feel that the public have much reason to congratulate themselves upon the noble institution which has arisen in their midst, however much the untoward causes which led to such a heavy and unexpected outlay must be regretted.

The north wing, consisting of two spacious wards, with closets and washing-rooms attached, now occupied by about forty patients, has also been completed at a cost of £2640; and a laundry, drying-rooms, and boiler-house, hitherto much required, and now rendered absolutely necessary by the increased demands of the establishment are in process of erection.

It has been found necessary to alter the arrangement of the garden, so as to make it correspond with the front of the building, and the work has been carried on under the supervision of a committee appointed for the purpose. A useful fence has also been erected around the yard and garden.

The serious attention of your committee has been called time after time, to the defective drainage of the institution, and a system for the inoffensive disposal of the sewerage, similar to that so highly approved of at the Melbourne Lying-in Hospital, and strongly recommended by the Central Board of Health is now under consideration.

With the additional accommodation afforded by the new wing, your committee have been enabled to submit the old wards to a thorough process of purification, and they are glad to learn from the medical and surgical staff, that the benefits of the recent improvements are already most clearly shown in many instances. Cases in which they would scarcely have dared to operate under the old regime, when the wards were of necessity crowded to an injurious extent, have lately been successfully treated, and are progressing rapidly towards recovery, in consequence of the improved ventilation of the wards, and the greater facilities for obtaining a constant supply of pure air.

In the month of November, the members of the Commission appointed to enquire into the position and conduct of municipal and charitable institutions throughout the colony visited this institution, and your committee took advantage of the opportunity to impress upon them the necessity for a liberal system of land endowment,

urging upon their notice the evils likely to arise in future years from the present system of voluntary donations, and that private subscriptions would in all probability decrease exactly as the general prosperity diminished, the demands upon the hospital becoming greater in proportion to the extent of the depression, so that the efficiency of the institution might very probably be impaired at a period when it was most necessary that it should be at the highest point. The report of the commission has not yet been officially published, but your committee have been led to believe that it will recommend the establishment of such institutions as ours, upon a totally different basis to that now in vogue, so far as their support and Government is concerned.

In consequence of alterations in the internal management of the house, necessitated by the changes referred to in the present report, your committee have devoted much time and attention to the compilation of a new code of rules and regulations, better adapted to meet the present condition of affairs. These rules will be submitted for your approval this evening, and the committee are sanguine that they will be found to act satisfactorily so far as the requirements of the institution in this direction are concerned.

In conclusion, your committee would acknowledge the attention. courtesy, and skill exhibited by the honorary medical and surgical officers in the discharge of their arduous duties, and the perseverance with which the House and Building Committees have devoted themselves to the business of the institution. They would further record their appreciation of the very valuable services rendered to the institution by their indefatigable secretary, Mr. Moore, and their sense of the satisfactory manner in which the resident surgeon, and dispenser have managed their respective departments, under the many disadvantages they have had to contend with consequent upon the alteration in the building above referred to. And now having briefly reviewed the chief occurrences of the year, your committee resign their trust, grateful for the success which has attended their exertions, and in the earnest hope that as the necessities of the Hospital increase, so the sympathies of the public may expand towards the unfortunate victims of accident and disease, who are compelled to seek shelter beneath its

# Object of the Institution.

1. The object of the Institution is to afford Medical and Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it; irrespective of country, color, or creed, and for casualties, but no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

# Abuse of the Institution.

2. In the event of any person, in a position to pay for Medical or Surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged at the rate of £2 per week for each week from the date of admission, if an in-patient—or shall pay to the Hospital the sum of 10s. for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the Hospital, if an outpatient. But the Committee may order the removal of any such persons from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

## Constitution.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Honorary Treasurer, three Honorary Medical and three Honorary Surgical Officers, and sixteen Members of Committee, who, with the exception of the Trustees and Treasurer, shall be elected annually from the Governors.

4. Every benefactor of £20 or upwards shall be a Life Governor, and every Annual Contributor of £2 an Annual Governor, with liberty of voting at all general meetings, and of having one in-patient or one out-patient always on the books of the Institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, provided there are vacant beds, and the funds of the Hospital admit of the reception of such patients.

5. Every executor (first named) under any will, paying to the Institution a bequest of £50 or upwards; any minister raising by one or more collections in his church, in any one year, the sum of £50 or upwards, and every other person elected at a general meeting of governors and subscribers, at the recommendation of the committee of management in consideration of special services rendered to the institution, shall be respectively honorary governors, with all the rights and privileges of life governors; any society or company contributing the amount of £30 or upwards in one year, shall have the privilege of appointing one of their number a life governor; and any person

(with the exception of the paid collector) collecting by subscriptions in any one year the sum of £20 or upwards, shall have the right and privileges of a governor for that year only.

6. Every benefactor of £10 or upwards shall be a life subscriber and every contributor of £1 per annum, an annual subscriber, with, liberty of recommending six out patients in every year, and voting at

all public meetings.

7. The annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no governor or subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

8. No person shall vote as a governor or subscriber, while he is a salaried officer, or pupil of the Hospital, nor any new governor or subscriber, unless his subscription shall have been paid six months

previous.

9. It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more governors or subscribers by a writing under their hands, to require the president to summon at the expiration of seven days, a special meeting of governors and subscribers—the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting to be called by the president by advertisement in one or more of the newspapers published in Ballarat, at least four days before the day of meeting.

10. In the event of any vacancies in the offices of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, trustees, honorary medical or surgical officers, or committee of management, the election of a successor shall take place at a general meeting of the governors and subscribers to be convened by the committee of management, which election shall be according

to the act.

# Admission and discharge of patients.

11. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the honorary medical or surgical officers, or the resident surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients in ordinary cases on the recommendation of a governor or subscriber, shall be restricted to Mondays and Thursdays, between the hours of 10 a.m., and 1 p.m. No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, or any person who, in the opinion of one of the medical or surgical officers and resident surgeon, or house committee is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances, and the cause of the refusal of any patient so refused admittance, shall be stated to the next meeting of the house committee by the resident surgeon.

12. No patient shall be discharged without a reference to the

honorary medical officer in charge of the case, with the exception of patients guilty of gross misconduct, who may be summarily dismissed by the resident surgeon, such dismissal to be reported to the house committee at its next meeting.

13. Previous to the departure of patients who may leave the Hospital at their own desire, they shall sign a declaration to that

effect.

14. All recommendations must be in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the institution. [See schedule page 28]

### Committee of Management.

15. The committe of management shall direct the general business of the institution, shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution. They shall meet on the first Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint. They shall have the power to admit patients and to make regulations respecting them: the chairman of committees to have a casting vote but no deliberative vote.

16. The president shall be a member ex officio of all committees, and the vice-presidents, trustees, treasurer, and honorary medical and surgical officers, shall be members ex-officio of the committee of

management.

17. The committee of management shall choose from among themselves a house committee of seven, three to form a quorum, who shall meet on such day and hour in each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts, engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

18. The house committee shall at each of their meetings, examine all recommendations for patients received since their last meeting, and shall have power to discharge any patient, who in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the

institution.

19. The committee of management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution at the annual meeting of subscribers and governors, in January of each year.

20. No member of the committee of management, or officers of the Hospital, shall become security for any contractor, directly or in-

directly.

21. Any annually elected member of the committee of management neglecting his duty for three successive meetings, without reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member.

# Treasurer.

22. All monies received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the committee of management.

23. Previously to making any payment, the treasurer shall require a warrant of the committee of management, authorising such payment, which shall be signed by the president, one of the committee, and countersigned by the secretary.

# Paid Officers.

24. There shall be a resident surgeon, secretary and collector, dispenser and house steward, and matron.

### Honorary, Medical and Surgical Officers.

- 25. They shall consist of three legally qualified medical and three legally qualified surgical officers, who shall be elected for one year.
- 26. One of the honorary medical and one of the honorary surgical officers shall attend the Hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by those officers respectively.
- 27. The honorary medical and surgical officers shall have access to the Institution at all times.
- 28. The honorary surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the surgical staff, except in cases of emergency. And the honorary medical and surgical officers, respectively, shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the house.
- 29. Any honorary medical or surgical officer neglecting his duty for one month without reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Institution, and another officer shall be appointed in his stead.
- 30. They shall make a daily report, to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose.

### LIBRARY.

The friends of the Institution are informed that there is a Library forming for the use of the patients, and that the committee will thankfully receive donations of books, periodicals, &c.

FORM OF BEQUEST TO THE BALLARAT HOSPITAL, WHICH MAY BE INTRODUCED INTO A WILL.

I give and bequeath to the Ballarat Hospital the sum of £ to be applied as the committee of management for the time being thereof may direct; for which sum the receipt of the treasurer for the time being of the said Institution shall be a sufficient discharge.

RULE 1.—"The object of the Institution is to afford medical and "surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, color "or creed, and for casualties. But no person who shall meet with "casualties and shall be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall re"ceive further than temporary assistance."

RULE 2.—"In the event of any person in a position to pay for "medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of "the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged at the "rate of £2 per week for each week, from the date of admission, if an "in-patient, or shall pay to the Hospital the sum of 10s, for each occa-"in-patient, or shall pay to the Hospital the sum of 10s. for each occa-"sion upon which advice may have been received at the Hospital, if "an out-patient; but the committee may order the removal of any such "persons from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emer-"gency."
