RESIDENT SURGEON'S REPORT.—It is hardly necessary to make any comments on the accompanying tables of cases treated. Of the 1071 patients admitted, 244 or 22.78 per cent were cases of accident, and 827 of disease. 105 patients died, 882 were discharged, cured, relieved, or at their own request, and 84 remained under treatment on the 31st of December. The per centage of deaths to treated (9.8) has been rather less than during 1866, when it amounted to 10.5 per cent. The hygienic state of the House has, with the exception of a slight outbreak of erysipelas, been very good throughout the year.

THE ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

THE Committee of Management of the Ballarat District Hospital, in conformity with the usual custom, place before the Governors and Subscribers a brief retrospect of the year's proceedings. Its term of office having expired, the members resign their charge with the pleasing satisfaction of having exerted themselves to maintain the charity in the state of completeness, generally acknowledged by the community to be its great characteristic.

1071 persons have been admitted as in-patients, and placed under treatment in the various wards. Of this number, 882 were discharged cured, relieved, or at their own request; 105 died, and 84 remained in the Hospital at the expiration of the year. 3751 out-patients have received medical advice and medicine, the number of visits amounting to 15,948. The accidents admitted have been more than usually numerous and severe.

As showing the steady increase in the number of cases treated, it may be stated that the in-patients for 1867, are 136 in excess of last year, and 305 for the year previous; the increase in the number of out-patients for the past two years, has been 230 and 435 respectively.

In comparing the expenditure for the year with that of 1866, a considerable decrease will be observable. This, to a certain extent, is accounted for by the favorable prices at which the various contracts were accepted, but also, in a great measure, to

the strict economy practised, the present excellent arrangements of the kitchen enabling such reform to be the more easily accomplished.

The completion of the building erected in place of the old kitchen, store-rooms, &c., has proved a great boon, both to officers and servants, the former premises having been so limited as to defy all attempts at discipline or order. This is entirely obviated in the present offices, which are spacious, lofty, and well arranged.

The old palings surrounding the northern portion of the reserve have been removed, and the open wooden fence continued along the Drummond Street frontage; the remaining portion is enclosed with corrugated iron, forming an excellent shelter for convalescent patients, when taking exercise in the grounds. The work done is of the most substantial kind, and reflects credit on the contractors.

During the month of September, the Rev. J. M. Strongman tendered his resignation as a member of the Hospital Committee, which was accepted by his colleagues with a general feeling of regret, his many and valuable services to the institution having extended over a period of ten years. The Committee availed themselves of the opportunity to embody these sentiments in an address, which was presented at a subsequent meeting, and which we feel will be prized by the recipient as an expression of esteem from those with whom he has cheerfully labored in a good cause. It has been unanimously resolved to recommend to you that his name be placed on the list of Honorary Governors for special services rendered.

Upon the retirement of Mr. Strongman, the Rev. J. Moore was unanimously elected a member of Committee of Management.

An addition of recent valuable works of reference has been made to the medical library.

The Committee may, perhaps, be permitted to quote the opinion of Mr. Arthur Drury, as recorded in the visitors' book of the institution, after an absence of three years:—"I cannot express the satisfaction I feel at the many and invaluable improvements made in this hospital since I had the honor of being connected with it. I must congratulate the Committee on their success in making the institution second to none in the colony." This is powerful testimony from one having occupied the position of President of the Ballarat District Hospital for four consecutive years, and who, undoubtedly, had the welfare of the charity thoroughly at heart.

The Committee, while gratefully acknowledging the very substantial support accorded to the Hospital funds, cannot but endorse the remarks of their predecessors in last year's report when alluding to the small proportion of annual subscribers in so large and wealthy a district. The population of Ballarat West, Ballarat East, and Sebastopol, was, at the close of 1866, estimated at 36,000, yet, during that year, the total of annual subscribers in Ballarat and the district, only amounted to about 300. This cannot be too frequently or forcibly brought before the public.

Mining Companies, Accident Funds, Benefit Societies, and other Associations, continue to act towards the charity in a most liberal spirit, thereby admitting the necessity of maintaining, in the highest state of efficiency, an establishment that has for so many years proved its usefulness to the afflicted who seek its aid.

The Committee begs to acknowledge, with thanks, the receipt throughout the year of the local newspapers, also copies of *Argus*, *Herald*, *Australasian*, and *Talbot Leader*, some volumes of books from Mr. C. D. Cuthbert, and a monthly packet of the *Illustrated London News*, *Punch*, &c., from Mr. W. L. Mullen.

The onerous duties connected with the details of domestic management have been conducted in a thoroughly efficient manner, the internal organization and discipline attained being highly creditable to the officers concerned.

The Committee desires to record its appreciation of the services rendered by the honorary medical and surgical staff, whose prompt and valuable aid has ever been available when needed.

To the House Committee great praise is due for their constant supervision in all matters relating to the domestic economy of the establishment.

The Committee has much pleasure in concluding its report by bearing testimony to the very efficient services rendered by Mr. Owen to the institution, and believes he has proved himself a worthy successor to Mr. Whitcombe, who has ever had the confidence of the public as of the Committee.

RULES

OF

THE BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

1. The object of the institution is to afford Medical and Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, colour, or creed, and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

2. In the event of any person, in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person shall be charged at the rate of £2 per week for each week from the date of admission, if an in-patient; or shall pay to the Hospital the sum of 10s. for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the Hospital, if an out-patient. But the Committee may order the removal of any such persons from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

3. The institution shall be governed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, an Honorary Treasurer, three Honorary Medical and three Honorary Surgical Officers, and sixteen Members of Committee, who, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be elected annually from the Governors.

4. That every benefactor of £50, or upwards, be a Life Governor, and every annual contributor of £20, an Annual Governor, with liberty of having two in-patients, or six out-patients, always on the books of the institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management hereinafter mentioned, and provided that the funds of the institution admit of the reception of such patients; and any public institution, corporate body, or company, contributing £50 in one year, shall be entitled to the privilege of a Life Governor.

5. That the executor, or if more than one, the first named executor under any will, by which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall be made to the institution; and every minister raising, by one or more collections in his church, in any one year, the sum of £20 or upwards; and any other person contributing a similar amount from any other source, shall have the rights and privileges of a Governor, for one year only, commencing from the time of payment.

6. That every benefactor, or representative of mining companies, of £25 or upwards, in one sum, be a Life Subscriber, with liberty of having two in-patients and six out-patients admitted annually; and every contributor of £1 1s. and upwards, annually, an Annual Subscriber, with liberty of having patients admitted as follows:—Annual Subscribers of £1 1s. to have two in-patients' tickets, and four out-patients' tickets; Annual Governors of £2 2s., four in-patients' and eight out-patients'; of £3 3s., six in-patients' and twelve out-patients'; of £5 5s., eight in-patients' and sixteen out-patients'; of £10 10s., ten in-patients' and twenty-four out-patients'. Recommendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and to be made by tickets only, to be issued by the Secretary or Collector, to the subscribers, at the time of their becoming such, and provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room, or other cause appearing to the Committee, the ticket used by such recommendation shall be reclaimable by the subscriber issuing the same. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Collector, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and *vice versa*, one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; and they shall only be available for the twelve months succeeding the payment.

7. The Members of Committee and Honorary Medical Officers shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients, and out-patients, subject to the approval of the Committee.

8. The annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

9. No person shall vote as a Governor or Subscriber while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Hospital, nor any new Governor or Subscriber, unless his subscription shall have been paid six months previous.

10. It shall be competent, at any time, for the Committee of Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Governors or Subscribers, by a writing under their hands, to require the President to summon, at the expiration of seven days, a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting to be called by the President by advertisement in one or more of the newspapers published in Ballarat, at least four days before the day of meeting.

11. In the event of any vacancy in the office of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, or Members of Committee, the election of a successor or successors shall take place at a meeting of the Committee; but the election of Trustees shall take place at a general meeting of the Governors and Subscribers, to be convened by the Committee of Management, which election shall be according to the Act.

12. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Honorary Medical or Surgical Officers, or the Resident Surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients in ordinary cases, on the recommendation of a Governor or Subscriber, shall be restricted to Mondays and Thursdays, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, or any person who, in the opinion of one of the Medical or Surgical Officers and Resident Surgeon, or House Committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances; and the cause of the refusal of any patient so refused admittance shall be stated to the next meeting of the House Committee, by the Resident Surgeon.

13. No patient shall be discharged without a reference to the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case, with the exception of patients guilty of gross misconduct, who may be summarily dismissed by the Resident Surgeon, such dismissal to be reported to the House Committee at its next meeting.

14. Previous to the departure of patients who may leave the Hospital at their own desire, they shall sign a declaration to that effect.

15. All recommendations must be in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the institution.

16. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the institution, shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution. They shall meet on the second Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint. They shall have the power to admit patients, and to make regulations respecting them. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting vote, but no deliberative vote.

17. The President shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees, and the Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be members *ex officio* of the Committee of Management.

18. The Committee of Management shall choose from among themselves, a House Committee of seven, three to form a quorum, who shall attend to financial, medical, and domestic arrangements, and shall meet on such day and hour in each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts, engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

19. The House Committee shall, at each of their meetings, examine all recommendations for patients received since their last meeting, and shall have power to discharge any patient who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution.

20. The Committee of Management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, at the annual meeting of Subscribers and Governors, in January of each year.

21. No member of the Committee of Management, or officer of the Hospital, shall be a contractor, or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly.

22. Any annually elected member of the Committee of Management neglecting his duty for three successive meetings, without reasonable cause, shall, after receiving notice in writing of such absence, cease to be a member.

23. All monies received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purposes of the institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

24. Previously to making any payment, the Treasurer shall require a warrant from the Committee of Management, authorising such payment, which shall be signed by the President, or a Vice-President, and a member of House Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary.

25. There shall be a Resident Surgeon, Collector, Dispenser, House Steward and Secretary, and Matron.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL OFFICERS.

26. They shall consist of three legally qualified Medical and three legally qualified Surgical Officers, who shall be elected for one year.

27. One of the Honorary Medical and one of the Honorary Surgical Officers shall attend the Hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by those officers respectively.

28. The Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall have access to the institution at all times.

29. The Honorary Surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a

previous consultation of the surgical staff, except in cases of emergency ; and the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, respectively, shall regularly consult in all cases of importance, or protracted continuance in the house.

30. Any Honorary Medical or Surgical Officer neglecting his duty for one month without reasonable cause, shall, after receiving notice in writing, cease to be a member of the institution, and another officer shall be appointed in his stead.

31. The Honorary Medical Officers shall make a daily report, to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose.

LIBRARY.

The friends of the institution are informed that there is a library forming for the use of the patients, and that the Committee will thankfully receive donations of books, periodicals, &c.
