RESIDENT SURGEON'S REPORT.

During the year 1870, 994 Patients were treated in the House. Of these 98 (9.8 per cent.) died ; 813 were discharged, and 83 remained under treatment on December 31st.

The number of Mining Accidents treated have been fewer, and the percentage of deaths from violence (accidents) less than during either of the years 1869, 1868, or 1867.

A considerable number of alterations and repairs to the buildings have been completed during the year, which will I trust prove conducive to the welfare and comfort of the future inmates.

FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF
The Ballarat District Hospital.

THE Committee of Management of the Ballarat District Hospital, before resigning their position, desire to submit the following brief outline of the position and progress of the Institution during their term of office.

Foremost in importance is the financial position of the Institution, and your Committee are gratified at being enabled to state that its usefulness has not been circumscribed to the extent that might have been anticipated from the much to be deplored depression in mining and mercantile affairs generally, which has undoubtedly affected, more or less, all classes of this community; the giving power of the public has necessarily been somewhat restricted from these causes, and it speaks highly for the liberality of the residents in the district that the contributions have only decreased to the extent of a little over £300.

(Since this report was written, as you are already aware, the defalcations of the late collector, Mr. George Moore, have been discovered, and we are now unfortunately compelled to attribute the decrease in the amount of contributions received, principally to *this* cause, but are happy to say that comparatively little loss will be sustained by the Hospital, as the late collector's fidelity guarantee will cover the losses during 1870, and for first month of 1871.)

994 patients have been received into the wards for medical and surgical treatment during the past year, and 4557 have attended as out-door patients; the number of visits amounting to 25,524. Reference to the Resident Surgeon's Report will afford all requisite particulars upon this subject.

The completion of the portion of the Alfred Memorial Wing was celebrated on May 24th by a soiree and amateur concert, the entertainment was a gratifying success, although the expenses incurred and the small charge made for admission prevented any great pecuniary benefit resulting from it. The Committee desire to express their sincere thanks to those friends of the Charity whose willing and valuable assistance caused the opening celebration to be so pleasantly appreciated. The building has not yet been publicly opened for the reception of patients, in consequence of the Central Board of Health requiring some slight alterations in the ventilation of the wards, not as yet particularized, but, in consequence of the contractors for general repairs, painting and alterations requiring possession of portions of the old main building, the lower ward of the new wing was furnished and used for the temporary accommodation of patients. Fire Insurances have been effected on the building to the extent of £7000 in the National, London and Lancashire, and Victoria Offices.

Again have the Committee the pleasure of acknowledging the support accorded by the Friendly Societies to the charities of Ballarat, in connection with the Boxing Day Fete at the Botanical Gardens; it has been proved to demonstration that these annual gatherings are of the greatest pecuniary assistance to our institutions, and that the amount received, although large in the aggregate, is to a great extent derived from a section of the community who in all probability could not become annual subscribers, yet feel anxious to support the cause as far as their means will permit. The Hospital has, up to the present time, been benefited to about the extent of £1050 by these truly named Friendly Societies.

The additions, alterations, and improvements of buildings for the past year may be enumerated as follows: a new morgue has been built, upon the most approved system; the former building, after necessary cleansing and repairs will be utilised as a store and lumber room; the unsightly wooden shed next to boiler-house has been removed, the site properly levelled, and converted into a commodious wood yard; a stable has been erected opposite the new morgue for the convenience of the medical staff and visitors; the steam pipes of drying rooms in the laundry have been raised, and a good cement floor laid, which has rendered this department far more effective than hitherto; the interior of old main building, both wards and offices, have been painted throughout, lime-washed and effectually purified; all beds and ward furniture painted and cleansed; the old board-room has been converted into a bath-room for the patients, and being spacious and lofty, is well adapted for the purpose; a portion of the

exterior of old main building (viz., the centre with portico and pediment) has been painted, and a contract has since been accepted for completing the painting of the entire building; the servants' mess-room has been enlarged, and is now both roomy and comfortable; the supply of bedding and house linen has been greatly increased; many minor improvements have been carried out; the fence around the reserve, as well as the dividing fences have been thoroughly repaired and painted; in addition to the above, the Committee has accepted a tender for a new multi-tubular boiler, this was rendered necessary, owing to the fact of the old boiler having become unfit for use, as reported by Mr. W. Errington (who kindly placed his services at the disposal of the Committee.)

The Royal Commission on Charitable Institutions visited the Hospital during November, and took evidence from the President, Members of Committee, and paid officers, regarding its financial position, and internal economy.

During the past year the following resignations of Members of Committee have been accepted with regret: Mr. T. D. Wanliss, in consequence of ill health, Mr. M. Young and Mr. J. Victor, owing to change of residence. The vacant seats at the Board were filled by Messrs. E. C. Moore, E. W. Stephens, and Dr. Hudson.

With the view of giving greater publicity to subscriptions and donations received by the Collector, the Committee have arranged with the local press to acknowledge all monies received every week, instead of monthly, as formerly; the length of time intervening between payment of subscriptions, and acknowledgment of the same in the published monthly list, has induced this alteration.

Meetings of Sub-Committees of Hospital and Benevolent Asylum have been held for the purpose of discussing a question raised by the latter, as to the desirability of providing medical attendance upon the sick poor, who may be unable to leave their homes; no conclusion could be arrived at, and it was ultimately decided to bring the matter before the Governors and Subscribers at the annual meeting of each Institution.

Several new rules, and alterations in the existing rules, are recommended for your consideration, and will be submitted this evening.

Your Committee have to report receipt of a letter from Mr. A. Mitchell, solicitor, stating that Mr. B. S. Hassell had, through

him, presented the Institution with twelve and a half Colonial Bank shares, to be vested in the Trustees for the benefit of the Hospital.

In addition to the cash donations received, the Committee have also to thankfully acknowledge receipts of the following, viz. : from Mr. L. L. Campbell, a valuable astronomical telescope ; from Messrs. Rowlands and Lewis, a regular supply of aerated waters ; a cask of ale presented by Mr. T. Sheppard of Bnninyong ; and a cask of porter from Messrs. Tulloch and McLaren ; and a quantity of illustrated papers, periodicals, &c. from Mr. W. L. Mullen and other kind friends.

They would further record their sense of the attention paid by the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff in the discharge of their duties, and the very satisfactory manner in which the Resident Surgeon, Secretary and House Steward, and Matron have acquitted themselves during a year of more than ordinary difficulties.

The Committee, before retiring from office, can justly congratulate the Governors and Subscribers upon the present effective condition in which they leave the Hospital, and desire to assure them that they have used every effort in their power to arrive at so desirable a result.



R U L E S

OF

The Ballarat District Hospital.

GENERAL RULES.

1. The object of the Institution is to afford Medical and Surgical Aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, colour, or creed, and for casualties; but no persons who shall meet with casualties, and be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance. Objects of the Institution.

2. The Institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-presidents, five Trustees, Treasurer, Governors, and Subscribers. Constitution.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

3. The following shall be the qualification and privileges of Governors and Subscribers:—

with the privilege of voting at all general and special meetings of Governors and Subscribers, and with power to recommend patients, according to the undermentioned scale:—

Governor for one year—10 in-patients and 20 out-patients annually.

*N.B.—Nominations must be made, within the financial year, by the proper party, and be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management. Firms subscribing may nominate one of their members as a Governor or Subscriber.

Subscriptions payable in advance. 4. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

Voting. 5. Life, Honorary, and Annual Governors, Life and Annual Subscribers, all Honorary Officers and Contributors of £1 1s. and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of Governors and Subscribers to the Hospital,

Limitation of voting. 6. No person shall vote as a Governor or Subscriber while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Hospital; nor any new Governor or Subscriber unless his subscription shall have been paid one month previously.

Power to make rules. 7. No new rule, nor any repeal, or alteration, in the existing rules, shall be valid, unless the same shall have been passed at a general or special meeting of Governors and Subscribers.

Special meetings. 8. It shall be competent for the Committee of Management, at any meeting at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Governors or Subscribers, by a writing under their hands, to require the President, or, in his absence, a Vice-president, to summon, at the expiration of seven days, a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers, the object of such meeting to be stated in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting to be called by advertisement, in one or more of the newspapers published in Ballarat, for at least four days consecutively before the day of meeting.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

Constitution & election. 9. The Institution shall be managed by a President, two Vice-presidents, five Trustees, Treasurer, three Honorary Medical and

three Honorary Surgical Officers, and sixteen Members of Committee, who, with the exception of the Trustees and Treasurer, shall be elected, from the Governors, at the annual meeting; such election to be taken in the above order, and, when contested, to be decided by ballot.

10. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting, unless he, or some one duly authorised on his behalf, shall have given notice in writing to the Secretary, three clear days before the date of such meeting, of his intention to stand for one or more of the annual offices. Provided always that, in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent in to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of. Notice of candidature.

11. In the event of any vacancy in the offices of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Honorary Professional Staff, or Members of Committee, the election of a successor or successors shall take place at a meeting of the Committee; but the election of Trustees shall take place at a general meeting of the Governors and Subscribers, to be convened by the Committee of Management, which election shall be according to the Act. Vacancies.

12. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the Institution, frame bye-laws for its internal regulation (the same not being contrary to the general rules), and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the Institution. Powers.

13. They shall meet on the second and fourth Wednesdays in each month, and on such other days as they may appoint—five to form a quorum. The Chairman of Committee shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting, but no deliberative, vote. The first meeting in each month to be called the Monthly meeting. Days of meeting

14. The General Committee shall depute two or more of their number to be present at the admission of in-patients for one hour on Tuesdays and Thursdays in each week, with full power to consider, and decide on, each application, after referring, when necessary, to the Resident Surgeon, and also with full power to discharge any patient who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the Institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for refusing any application, or ordering any discharge. Admitting and discharging in-patients.

15. The President shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees, and the Vice-presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Ex officio members.

Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be members *ex officio* of the Committee of Management, provided they be qualified as Governors.

Pecuniary interest. 16. No member of the Committee of Management nor officer of the Hospital, shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly, nor shall any member of the Committee of Management be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

Forfeiture of seat. 17. Any member of the Committee of Management absenting himself from three successive meetings, without showing sufficient cause, shall cease to be a member. (This rule not to apply to Trustees, Treasurer, or Honorary Professional Staff).

Annual report & balance sheet. 18. The Committee of Management shall present a general report of the affairs of the Institution, together with a duly audited balance sheet, at the annual meeting of Governors and Subscribers, in January of each year, such balance sheet to be printed and circulated amongst the Governors and Subscribers at least seven days prior to each annual meeting.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

Appointment. 19. The Committee of Management shall choose from among themselves a House Committee of seven, three to form a quorum, who shall attend to the internal management of the House, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the Collector's, Dispenser's, and House Steward's, books, and such other matters (except the final acceptance of tenders) as may be delegated to them by the Committee of Management.

Permanent chairman. 20. They shall, at their first meeting, (or at any subsequent meeting, in the event of a new appointment being necessary), elect their Chairman, who shall remain permanently in that office during the year, subject, however, to removal by a vote of the House Committee; but the other six members shall retire in rotation, two at each monthly meeting of the General Committee, and, if not re-elected, their places shall be filled by the appointment of other members of Committee, the arrangements for rotation to be left to the House Committee themselves.

Meetings. 21. They shall meet once in each fortnight on such days and at such hours as they may appoint, and the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers for the week shall be members, *ex officio*, of the House Committee.

Honorary staff members present.

22. They shall appoint two or more of their number to be a Finance Committee, who shall, at least once in each month, compare the Collector's books and receipt butts with the advertised lists of subscriptions and donations for the preceding four weeks, and shall see that the addition of the items is correct in each, entered in ink, and that the totals correspond with each other, as well as with the amounts acknowledged by the Treasurer in the Collector's acquittance book.

Checking collector.

23. They shall, also, once at least in each month, audit the house accounts, compare the balances in the Secretary's ledger with the bank pass book, and examine the books, relating to provisions, wines and spirits, &c., kept by the House Steward, and Dispenser, respectively.

Checking House Steward and Dispenser.

24. They shall watch the entire expenditure of the Institution and shall carefully scrutinise the Monthly Analysis of such expenditure, with a due regard to the number of patients in the House, reporting to the Committee of Management any matter of importance.

Watching Expenditure.

25. They shall depute two or more of their number to be present (without notice), once in each fortnight, at the receipt and distribution of stores, wines and spirits, and, twice in each year, shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores, wines and spirits, with the House Steward's and Dispenser's books, two members shall also be appointed a Finance Committee.

Supervising receipt and distribution of stores, &c.

Verifying stock-on-hand.

26. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by them, the signature of some member of the House Committee shall be appended, with the date of examination, in token of the correctness of such books or vouchers to that date.

Verifying books and vouchers.

TREASURER.

27. All monies received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer, and be deposited by him in such Bank as the Committee of Management may from time to time appoint.

Receipt of monies.

28. On receiving any moneys from the Collector, he shall sign the Collector's acquittance book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

Acquittance to collector.

29. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the President (or a Vice-president), the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary.

Payment.

30. Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the Treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

Authority for payments.

31. He shall cause to be prepared by the Secretary, for submission to the Committee, at the first meeting in each month, a

Progress balance sheet.

progress balance sheet, in prescribed form, showing the actual position of the Hospital funds on the previous Monday, with an estimate of the surplus or deficiency at the end of the financial year; such balance sheet to be signed by him, and to be laid on the table by the Secretary, with the bank certificate or pass-book made up to the same date.

AUDITORS.

- Quarterly audit.** 32. The Accounts of the Charity shall be verified quarterly, in the months of January, April, July, and October, by two Auditors, appointed for the purpose by the Governors and Subscribers.
- Yearly audit for governors.** 33. The January audit shall be the Yearly audit, at which the accuracy of the whole accounts for the preceding year, and of the balance sheet prepared (with list of subscriptions and donations, and statement of securities for the annual meeting, shall be certified for the satisfaction of the Governors and Subscribers.
- Quarterly audit for committee** 34. At the other quarterly audits, the Auditors shall report, for the information of the Committee of Management, as to the accord of the Collector's books and receipt-butts with the weekly advertised lists of subscriptions, the bank pass-book, and Collector's acquittance book for the preceding three months; also as to all expenditure being for legitimate objects, and in accordance with the authority of the Committee.
- Erasures and alterations.** 35. They shall specially call attention to erasures or important alterations in any book or document, and shall report to the Subscribers, or to the Committee, on any matters connected with the book-keeping of the Institution, or otherwise within their province.
- Appointment.** 36. They shall be appointed at a general or special meeting of Governors or Subscribers; one to retire by rotation at each annual meeting, but to be eligible for re-election; and, in the event of a vacancy occurring, the next appointed Auditor shall inherit his predecessor's tenure of office.
- Suspension.** 37. It shall be competent for the Committee of Management to suspend any Auditor for incapacity, misbehaviour, or neglect of duty, on the understanding that, within one week of the date of such suspension, they will proceed (under Rule 8) to convene a special meeting for the consideration of the case, and for the election (if necessary) of a successor to such Auditor.
- Remuneration.** 38. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be at the rate of Ten Guineas each per annum.

HONORARY PROFESSIONAL STAFF.

- Appointment.** 39. They shall consist of three legally qualified Medical, and three legally qualified Surgical, Officers, who shall be elected for one year.

40. One of the Honorary Medical, and one of the Honorary Surgical, Officers shall attend the Hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by themselves. Rotation of duty

41. The Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers shall have access to the Institution at all times. Access to Institution.

42. The Honorary Surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the Surgical Staff, except in cases of emergency; and the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers respectively shall regularly consult in all cases of importance, or of protracted continuance in the House. Capital operations.
Consultations.

43. Any Honorary Medical or Surgical Officer neglecting his duty for one month, without reasonable cause, shall, after receiving notice in writing, cease to hold office, and another shall be appointed in his stead. Neglect of duty.

44. The Honorary Medical Officers shall make a daily report, to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose. Daily report.

PATIENTS.

45. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the Committee, and be made by tickets only (to be issued by the Collector, who shall keep a proper record of the same) provided that, whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room, or other cause, the ticket used shall be reclaimable by the issuer. Governors and Subscribers shall also have the privilege, at any time, on application to the Collector, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and *vice versa*; one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to *two* out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; and shall not be valid beyond twelve months from the date of issue. Recommendation.

46. All recommendations must be properly filled up by the issuer, and signed by the applicant, in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the Institution. Proper form.

47. Members of Committee and Honorary Professional Staff shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the Committee. Discretionary power of committee and honorary staff

48. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Honorary Medical or Surgical Officers, or the Resident Surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, on the recommendation of a Governor or Subscriber, shall be restricted to Tuesdays and Thursdays, between the hours of 10 a. m. and 1 p. m. Admission of in-patients.

49. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age, (unless for the purpose of under- Persons not admissible.

going a surgical operation), no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of one of the Medical or Surgical Officers and Resident Surgeon, or of the Committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances; the cause of refusal in all cases to be reported to the next meeting of the House Committee, by the Resident Surgeon.

out-patients. 50. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either) but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients, on producing the recommendation in proper form, of a Governor or Subscriber; such recommendation to be in force for two months only, from the date of issue.

paying patients 51. Any person wishing to be received into the Hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted, with the sanction of the House Committee; he shall be charged 10s. per day, and in the event of any operation being performed, a fee shall be paid by him to the Hospital, the amount of such fee to be decided by the Honorary staff, but in no case shall it exceed five guineas; paying patients shall pay one week in advance. The names of all new in and out-patients shall be read by the Secretary at the fortnightly meetings.

Discharge of patients. 52. No patient shall be discharged by the Resident Surgeon without a reference to the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case,

Voluntary departure. 53. Patients quitting the Hospital at their own desire, shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

Impostors. 54. In the event of any person, in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of ten shillings (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission; or, if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged the sum of ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he shall consult the Resident Surgeon; and the Committee may order the removal of any such person from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

PAID OFFICERS.

Number and appointments 55. The Officers of the Institution shall consist of a Resident Surgeon, Collector, Dispenser, Secretary, and House Steward, and Matron.
