THE THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Ballarat District Hospital.

The retiring Committee of the Ballarat District Hospital, in compliance with customary usage, place before the governors and subscribers the following account of their proceeding, and the progress of the Institution during the past year.

Patients to the number of 1033 have been received into the Hospital during 1869, and 5372 have obtained medical advice and medicine as out-door patients, the visits from the said out-patients numbering 22,286.

It will be observed that a considerable decrease has occurred in the number of patients admitted into the wards, as compared with the previous year, but the resident Surgeon in his report explains that it arises from the closing of the wards for necessary repairs, lime washing, &c., and also from a considerable decrease in the number of mining accidents.

The chief feature of the past year has been the extension of the Hospital by erecting a portion of the Alfred Memorial Wing, as inaugurated by our predecessors in office. The foundation stone of the new wing was laid on 24th May, by Robert Lewis, Esq., president, assisted by the Committee and many of the governors and subscribers to the Institution. The part of the new building

tendered for by Messrs. Deas and Cranston, according to plans and specifications of the architect, Mr. J. H. Jones, is now completed, and has added three spacious wards, each intended for twenty-five beds; the dimensions of the wards give 1620 cubic feet per patient, being above the maximum required for sanitary purposes. The most approved system of ventilation has been adopted and effectively carried out by the architect. The tower, which the Committee deemed advisable to complete, has now reached its full elevation, and will doubtless, when finished according to the original design, with portico, colonnade, &c., prove a handsome addition to the buildings of the town.

The Committee desire to draw general attention to the fact that the friendly societies' contribution of £659 4s. 6d. (proceeds of Boxing-Day Fete for 1868) has this year been supplemented by a sum which will almost make a total of £1000 placed to the credit of the building fund within one the year. The energy displayed on the occasion of these annual gatherings, and the evident determination of all concerned, to make them a financial success to the object chosen, proves not only the kindness and philanthropy of the donors, but more especially their thorough appreciation of the usefulness of this charity.

In the month of June a letter was received from the hon. the Chief Secretary regarding the temporary reception of lunatics into the Hospital, the question having been fully discussed by the Committee and the honorary medical staff; a reply was forwarded urging the unadvisability of having lunatic wards in connection with a general hospital, it is to be hoped that the reasons given upon that occasion, will for the future prevent the temporary reception of lunatics being pressed on the Committee.

During the month of March, Mr. Elliot (whose connection with the Hospital dates from its foundation) tendered his resignation of the honorary offices of treasurer and trustee, the former was accepted, and Mr. E. W. Morrah was elected to the vacancy, but Mr. Elliot's resignation as trustee was referred to the next meeting of

governors and subscribers to the Hospital. It therefore rests with the present meeting to decide as to acceptance or non-acceptance of his resignation of that office.

Some alterations of the rules relating to the qualification of subscribers, and the privileges attached to donations varying from £50 to £1 1s, will be submitted for your approval and adoption.

In December, Mr. F. H. Low resigned as dispenser, and Mr. F. Longmore was appointed in his stead.

The Committee desire to tender their thanks to the honorary medical and surgical staff for the ready response made by them upon all occasions requiring their valuable co-operation, and particularly during the temporary absence (onsick leave) of the resident Surgeon.

A letter has been received from Dr. Nicholson, one of the honorary surgeons to the Institution, absent on leave, stating his anxiety to be re-elected, but doubting if the vessel in which he returns to the colony could arrive in time for him to be present at the annual meeting. The Committee would recommend that his request be acceded to, and that he be nominated one of the honorary surgical staff.

Concerning the paid officers of the Institution, the Committee desire to record their appreciation of the manner in which they have performed the duties of their several departments, it is always a source of gratification to bestow praise where justly due, and such can in the present instance be most conscientiously awarded.

The Committee, in conclusion, would impress upon the minds of the public that an addition of 75 beds to the present hospital accomodation will, as a matter of course, proportionately increase the cost of maintenance. Little cause however, exists for anxiety on that account; past experience justifies the belief that public support will be accorded to the due maintenance of the enlarged Institution in a cheerful and liberal measure.

R U L E S

OF

THE BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

1. The object of the Institution is to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, color, or creed, and for casualties; but no persons who shall meet with casualties, and be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

2. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged at the rate of £2 per week for each week from the date of admission, if an in-patient; or shall pay the Hospital the sum of 10/. for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the Hospital if an out-patient, but the Committee may order the removal of any such person from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

3. The Institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, Treasurer, Governors and Subscribers.

4. The following shall be the qualification and privileges of Governors and Subscribers :—

5. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the Committee, and be made by tickets only (to be issued by the Secretary or Collector) provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to from want of room or other cause, the ticket used shall be reclaimable by the issuer. Governors and Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Collector, of exchanging out-patients tickets for in-patients', and *vice versa*; one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to *two* out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; and they shall only be available for twelve months succeeding the payment.

6. Members of Committee and Honorary Medical Officers, shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the Committee.

7. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

8. No person shall vote as a Governor or Subscriber while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Hospital; nor, any new Governor or Subscriber unless his subscription shall have been paid six months previously.

9. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Governors or Subscriber by a writing under their hands, to require the President, (or in his absence, a Vice-President) to summon at the expiration of seven days, a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting to be called by advertisement in one or more of the newspapers published in Ballarat, at least four days consecutively before the day of meeting.

10. The Institution shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, Treasurer, three Honorary Medical and three Honorary Surgical Officers, and sixteen Members of Committee, who, with the exception of the Trustees and Treasurer, shall be elected annually from the Governors.

11. In the event of any vacancy in the offices of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, or Members

of Committee, the election of a successor or successors shall take place at a meeting of the Committee; but the election of Trustees shall take place at a general meeting of the Governors and Subscribers, to be convened by the Committee of Management, which election shall be according to the Act.

12. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Honorary Medical or Surgical Officers, or the Resident Surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients in ordinary cases on the recommendation of a Governor or Subscriber, shall be restricted to Tuesdays and Thursdays, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, or any person who, in the opinion of one of the Medical or Surgical Officers and Resident Surgeon, or of the Committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances; and the cause of refusal of any patient so refused admittance shall be stated to the next meeting of the House Committee, by the Resident Surgeon.

13. No Patient shall be discharged without a reference to the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case, with the exception of patients guilty of gross misconduct who may be summarily dismissed by the Resident Surgeon, such dismissal to be reported to the House Committee at its next meeting.

14. Previous to the departure of patients who may leave the Hospital at their own desire, they shall sign a declaration to that effect.

15. All recommendations must be in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the Institution.

16. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the institution, shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution. They shall meet on the second Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint, five to form a quorum. They shall have the power to admit patients, and to make regulations respecting them.

17. The President shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees and the Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be members *ex officio* of the Committee of Management.

18. The Committee of Management shall choose from among themselves a House Committee of seven, three to form a quorum, who shall attend to financial, medical, and domestic arrangements and shall meet on such day and hour in each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts, engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the institution. The Honorary Medical and Surgical officers for the week in which a meeting of House Committee is held, shall be members, *ex officio*, of such Committee.

19. The House Committee shall have power to discharge any patient who in their opinion is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution.

20. The Committee of Management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution, together with a duly audited balance sheet at the annual meeting of Governors and subscribers in January of each year.

21. No member of the Committee of Management nor officer of the Hospital, shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly.

22. Any annually elected member of the Committee of Management absenting himself from three successive meetings without showing sufficient cause, on being called upon to do so shall cease to be a member.

23. All monies received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer, and be deposited by him in such Bank as the Committee of Management may from time to time appoint.

24. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the President, or a Vice-President, the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary.

25. Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the Treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

26. The officers of the Institution shall consist of a Resident Surgeon, Collector, Dispenser, Secretary and House Steward, and Matron.

X 27. No new rule, or any repeal, or alteration in the existing rules, shall be valid, unless the same shall have been passed at a general or special meeting of Governors and Subscribers.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

28. They shall consist of three legally qualified Medical, and three legally qualified Surgical Officers, who shall be elected for one year.

29. One of the Honorary Medical, and one of the Honorary Surgical Officers shall attend the Hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by *them*.

30. The Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall have access to the Institution at all times.

31. The Honorary Surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the Surgical Staff, except in cases of emergency; and the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers respectively, shall regularly consult in all cases of importance, or protracted continuance in the house.

32. Any Honorary Medical or Surgical Officer neglecting his duty for one month without reasonable cause, shall, after receiving notice in writing, cease to be a member of the institution, and another officer shall be appointed in his stead.

33. The Honorary Medical Officers shall make a daily report, to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose.

LIBRARY.

The friends of the institution are informed that there is a library for the use of the patients, and the Committee will thankfully receive donations of books, periodicals, &c.
