SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF THE
BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

At the conclusion of a year of peculiar interest in the history of the Ballarat District Hospital, the Committee of Management have the honor to present to the Governors and Subscribers a brief report of their transactions, and avail themselves of the opportunity to congratulate them upon the very satisfactory position of this important local charity.

In the last annual report it was stated that a tender had been accepted for the re-erection of the centre portion of the building, to be constructed with a view to the accommodation of the out-door patients, resident staff, and domestics; as well as to meet the increased demand for storage room, baths, and offices; and, notwithstanding the large outlay incurred, your Committee have every reason to congratulate the Subscribers on the step taken by the late Committee, when they rejected the idea of attempting to patch up an ill-constructed and inconvenient building, preferring to remove it altogether, and substitute a centre corresponding outwardly with the remainder of the front elevation, and fitted up internally to meet the requirements of the departments alluded to above, confident that the generosity of the public would relieve them from a liability for which they had to give their personal guarantee at the time.

A glance at the Resident Surgeon's report will show the steady increase in the demands upon the resources of the charity. During the past year, 722 patients have received in-door relief. Of this

number, 549 have been cured or relieved, 87 have died, and 86 remained in the house on the last day of the year. It is a gratifying fact that the rate of mortality appears to diminish steadily as the various improvements lately effected come into action, a decrease of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per centum being shown by the above figures, as compared with last year's return. In addition to the number treated in the house, 2,673 out-patients (attended to upon 9,336 occasions) have received advice and medicine gratuitously during the same period; making a total of 3,395 cases treated, and showing an increase of 407 on last year's admissions.

Referring to financial matters, your Committee are happy to state that, due allowance being made for the large outlay in building and permanent improvements, the position of the Institution has never been more satisfactory. Assistance has been received from all sides: the members of the Caledonian Society, who generously handed over a sum of £120 0s. 6d., raised at their annual gathering, standing in the foremost rank of contributors. The annexed balance-sheet contains minute details of the receipts and expenditure under each head, and shows that the expenses, including a sum of £1460 passed to the building account, and £171 6s. paid for interest—have amounted to £9328 19s. 9d.; while the receipts have only reached £8297 19s. 1d.; leaving a sum of £1031 0s. 8d. due to the bank. But in noticing this item it must be borne in mind that a sum of £3000 was borrowed from the bank in the month of June, 1862—three years being the limit fixed for its repayment—yet within eighteen months two-thirds of the amount have been refunded; and had the Committee been enabled to complete the arrangements for their lottery within the financial year, the debt would have been reduced to a merely nominal amount, as a clear profit of £915 5s. resulted from the drawing which took place on the 22nd instant.

Passing to other matters, you will doubtless recollect a statement made by the late Committee in their report, commenting on the very defective nature of the drainage of the Institution, and stating that as remedial measures were imperatively demanded, a system in successful operation at the Melbourne Lying-in Hospital, and highly recommended by the Central Board of Health, had

been under their consideration. This plan was carried out by your Committee, unfortunately with anything but a satisfactory result. It has been found necessary, therefore, to carry all the sewage to the Yarrowee Creek, by means of a covered conduit, and your Committee sincerely trust that a nuisance which has existed so long, caused so much anxiety to the Committee, and in the removal of which no expense has been spared, will be thus satisfactorily disposed of.

In addition to the works already referred to, several minor improvements have been effected. The kitchen and main building have been connected by a neat porch and verandah, and the centre gates, ordered from England last year, have been erected, adding materially to the appearance of the building. The patients' library has also received many important additions, and a number of forest trees have been planted in the reserve.

Messrs. M. Campbell and G. Lovitt having resigned their seats on the Committee, and Dr. Hunt his appointment on the honorary surgical staff, a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers was held in the month of May, when Messrs. R. Gibbings and D. M. A. Gray were elected to supply the vacancies in the Committee, and Dr. Rankin to act in lieu of Dr. Hunt.

Before closing their report, your Committee desire to tender their sincere thanks to the honorary medical and surgical staff for their constant attention, and to the members of the House Committee, who have labored incessantly to combine a system of strict economy with the proper conduct of the establishment.

It is also with unfeigned pleasure that your Committee record their high appreciation of the services rendered by their able Secretary, Mr. E. C. Moore, and their great gratification at the efficient manner in which Mr. Whitcombe, the resident surgeon, has conducted his department, also their thanks to the other paid officers of the Institute for the satisfactory way they have performed their duties generally. And now, having reviewed the chief features marking the term of their office, your Committee resign their trust, thankful to those who have assisted them in their exertions by pecuniary contributions, and in many

other ways. In all probability the charitable institutions of the colony will soon be established on a new basis, so far as their support from Government is concerned, but whatever the principle adopted may be, your Committee are assured that in the future, as in the past, this community will ever be ready to extend its sympathy and assistance to all poor sufferers from accident or disease, and prepared to maintain our Local Hospital in the proud position which it has already assumed.

R U L E S
OF THE
BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

OBJECT OF THE INSTITUTION.

1. The object of the Institution is to afford Medical and Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it; irrespective of country, color, or creed, and for casualties, but no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

ABUSE OF THE INSTITUTION.

2. In the event of any person, in a position to pay for Medical or Surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged at the rate of £2 per week for each week from the date of admission, if an in-patient—or shall pay to the Hospital the sum of 10s. for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the Hospital, if an out-patient. But the Committee may order the removal of any such persons from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.

CONSTITUTION.

3. The institution shall be governed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, an Honorary Treasurer, three Honorary Medical and three Honorary Surgical Officers, and sixteen Members of Committee, who, with the exception of the Trustees and Treasurer, shall be elected annually from the Governors.

4. Every benefactor of £20 or upwards shall be a Life Governor, and every Annual Contributor of £2 an Annual Governor, with liberty of voting at all general meetings, and of having one in-patient or one out patient always on the books of the Institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, provided there are vacant beds, and the funds of the Hospital admit of the reception of such patients.

5. Every executor (first named) under any will, paying to the Institution a bequest of £50 or upwards; any minister raising by one or more collections in his church, in any one year, the sum of £50 or upwards, and every other person elected at a general meeting of Governors and Subscribers, at the recommendation of the Committee of Management in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution, shall be respectively Honorary Governors, with all the rights and privileges of Life Governors; any society or company contributing the amount of £30 or upwards in one year, shall have the privilege of appointing one of their

number a Life Governor; and any person (with the exception of the paid collector) collecting by subscriptions in any one year the sum of £20 or upwards, shall have the right and privileges of a Governor for that year only.

6. Every benefactor of £10 or upwards shall be a Life Subscriber, and every contributor of £1 per annum, an Annual Subscriber, with liberty of recommending six out-patients in every year, and voting at all public meetings.

7. The annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

8. No person shall vote as a Governor or Subscriber, while he is a salaried officer, or pupil of the Hospital, nor any new Governor or Subscriber, unless his subscription shall have been paid six months previous.

9. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Governors or Subscribers by a writing under their hands, to require the President to summon, at the expiration of seven days, a special meeting of Governors and Subscribers—the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting to be called by the President by advertisement in one or more of the newspapers published in Ballarat, at least four days before the day of meeting.

10. In the event of any vacancies in the offices of President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Trustees, Honorary Medical or Surgical Officers, or Committee of Management, the election of a successor shall take place at a general meeting of the Governors and Subscribers to be convened by the Committee of Management, which election shall be according to the act.

ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

11. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Honorary Medical or Surgical Officers, or the Resident Surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients in ordinary cases on the recommendation of a Governor or Subscriber, shall be restricted to Mondays and Thursdays, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement, no child under five years of age, no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, or any person who, in the opinion of one of the Medical or Surgical Officers and Resident Surgeon, or House Committee is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any

circumstances; and the cause of the refusal of any patient so refused admittance, shall be stated to the next meeting of the House Committee by the Resident Surgeon.

12. No patient shall be discharged without a reference to the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case, with the exception of patients guilty of gross misconduct, who may be summarily dismissed by the Resident Surgeon, such dismissal to be reported to the House Committee at its next meeting.

13. Previous to the departure of patients who may leave the Hospital at their own desire, they shall sign a declaration to that effect.

14. All recommendations must be in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the institution. [See schedule, page 28.]

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

15. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business of the Institution, shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules, and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the institution. They shall meet on the first Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint. They shall have the power to admit patients and to make regulations respecting them: the Chairman of Committees to have a casting vote but no deliberative vote.

16. The President shall be a member *ex officio* of all committees, and the Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be members *ex officio* of the Committee of Management.

17. The Committee of Management shall choose from among themselves a House Committee of seven, three to form a quorum, who shall meet on such day and hour in each week as they may appoint, and have power to audit the house accounts, engage and discharge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the institution.

18. The House Committee shall, at each of their meetings, examine all recommendations for patients received since their last meeting, and shall have power to discharge any patient, who, in their opinion, is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the institution.

19. The Committee of Management shall present a general report of the affairs of the institution at the annual meeting of Subscribers and Governors, in January of each year.

20. No member of the Committee of Management, or officer of the Hospital, shall become security for any contractor, directly or indirectly.

21. Any annually elected member of the Committee of Manage-

ment neglecting his duty for three successive meetings, without reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member.

TREASURER.

22. All monies received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer, and appropriated by him to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

23. Previously to making any payment, the Treasurer shall require a warrant from the Committee of Management, authorising such payment, which shall be signed by the President, one of the Committee, and countersigned by the Secretary.

PAID OFFICERS.

24. There shall be a Resident Surgeon, Secretary and Collector, Dispenser and House Steward, and Matron.

HONORARY MEDICAL AND SURGICAL OFFICERS.

25. They shall consist of three legally qualified Medical and three legally qualified Surgical Officers, who shall be elected for one year.

26. One of the Honorary Medical and one of the Honorary Surgical Officers shall attend the Hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by those officers respectively.

27. The Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers shall have access to the institution at all times.

28. The Honorary Surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the surgical staff, except in cases of emergency. And the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers respectively shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the house.

29. Any Honorary Medical or Surgical Officer neglecting his duty for one month without reasonable cause shall cease to be a member of the institution, and another officer shall be appointed in his stead.

30. They shall make a daily report, to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose.

LIBRARY.

The friends of the institution are informed that there is a Library forming for the use of the patients, and that the Committee will thankfully receive donations of books, periodicals, &c.

FORM OF BEQUEST TO THE BALLARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL, WHICH MAY BE INTRODUCED INTO A WILL.

I give and bequeath to the Ballarat District Hospital the sum of £ to be applied as the Committee of Management for the time being thereof may direct; for which sum the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said institution shall be a sufficient discharge.

CAUTION.

RULE 2.—“In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the institution, such person shall be charged at the rate of £2 per week for each week, from the date of admission, if an in-patient; or shall pay to the Hospital the sum of 10s. for each occasion upon which advice may have been received at the Hospital, if an out-patient; but the Committee may order the removal of any such persons from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.”
