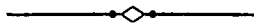

Of the 1065 patients treated in the Hospital during the year ending December 31st, 1871: 77 died; 890 were discharged; and 98 remain under treatment. Three hundred and one persons, suffering from injuries, were admitted, of whom only nine died, being a trifle less than three per cent.

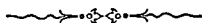

THE FIFTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
OF
The Ballarat District Hospital,
INCORPORATED.



IN reviewing the occurrences of the past year, it is to be regretted that your Committee has, in the first instance, to revert to the serious defalcations of the late collector (Mr. George Moore); and although the circumstances have been fully placed before the public through the columns of the local press, yet they consider it their duty to the contributors to thus place it on record. The first intimation was given by the Auditors, Messrs. Ford and Marshall, on the morning of the 27th January, 1871, and steps were at once taken to ascertain the deficiency—a warrant being obtained for George Moore's apprehension; he was not, however, seen until he surrendered himself to the authorities. The trial then proceeded, and, after many adjournments and delays, he was found guilty and sentenced, subject to certain law points raised in his defence; he did not, however, remain to receive the judgment of the full court on the points reserved, but absconded. The full amount of ascertained defalcations is £689 15s. 4d, against which has been received £422 19s. 7d., viz., £380 16s. 7d., on George Moore's fidelity guarantee policy, £20 3s. salary due to him, and £22 voluntarily returned to the Hospital by Mrs. G. Moore. Disastrous as such a circumstance must necessarily be, when in connection with a public charity, yet it is a matter for congratulation that the Hospital Auditors intelligently brought to light a fraud that might have continued undiscovered in the future, as it unhappily had in the past. Your Committee arranged for a special audit, which proved the defalcations to have commenced in September, 1869, and extending to January, 1871. Your Committee having now given a resume of these painful disclosures, gladly proceed to report on the general affairs of the Institution for the past year.

A glance at the Balance Sheets of maintenance and other accounts (which have been published in the local newspapers)

will show that the finances of the Hospital are in a satisfactory state; the contributions, from all sources, for the past year have amounted to £2366, exclusive of the guarantee society's payment.

1065 patients have been received into the wards during 1871, and 5970 have received medical advice and medicine as out-door patients, the number of their visits being 19,222.

During the year 1864, the then Committee of Management took the necessary steps to incorporate the Institution under the Victorian Hospitals' Act, but doubts having arisen as to the advisability of so doing, they withdrew their petition, with the view of more fully investigating the matter. The events of the past year, however, decided your Committee not to further delay incorporation. This determination had not reference to the late disclosures merely, or to any recurrence of the same, but to all officers and employees of the Hospital generally, and especially in the matter of contracts for necessary supplies; it being possible that complications might occur through any sudden rise in the value of provisions or other merchandise, which, under the then existing circumstances, would have left the Committee comparatively powerless as to enforcing the due fulfilment of any contract entered into. The petition for incorporation, duly signed by contributors, was therefore at once forwarded, and the incorporation of the Hospital, under the 27th Vic., No. 220, has been formally announced in the *Government Gazette*.

In consequence of the incorporation of the Hospital, it is necessary that a new code of By-laws for the management of the Institution should be framed in conformity with the provisions of the Act. Your Committee, after mature deliberation, has drawn up a set of rules, which they believe will meet all requirements, and which will be submitted for your consideration and adoption. Meanwhile, your Committee recommends that the staff of officers be as follows:—President, two vice-presidents, treasurer, three honorary medical and three honorary surgical officers, fifteen members of committee, and two auditors; the committee, medical staff, and auditors to retire from office as provided in section 11 of the act.

The improvements effected during the year include completion of external painting of the Hospital, conversion of the old morgue into a store for medical comforts, and the late pay-patient room into patients' bath-room, the extension of boiler-house and building-in the new boiler, preparing foundations for the machinery purchased, and erecting steam engine, desiccating machine, and circular saw-bench, renewal of faulty ceilings, cleansing and painting wards, and other repairs too numerous to particularise.

The garden Committee having expressed dissatisfaction at the manner in which the Hospital grounds and reserve had been previously kept, engaged the services of Mr. J. Ross, with whose excellent management they have every reason to feel satisfied. The improvements made by him, under the Committee's direction, have received general commendation. The Committee takes this opportunity of thanking the following gentlemen, whose liberal donations of valuable trees and shrubs now adorn the Hospital Gardens:—Messrs. Lang & Co., R. U. Nichols & Co., G. Smith, R. R. Payton, The curator of the Botanical Gardens, and Mr. Brewster, of the Ballarat Benevolent Asylum.

The following changes have taken place in the Committee during the year:—Mr. W. L. Mullen resigned in March, and Mr. E. W. Stephens was elected to the vacancy; Mr. J. F. Usher retired in August, and Mr. F. Everingham was elected in his stead. In April, Mr. A. L. Lynn, whose connection with the Hospital dates from its foundation, resigned as honorary Solicitor to the Institution, and Mr. E. J. Lewis was appointed to the office. Mr. E. C. Moore, Collector, having applied for, and obtained, six months' leave of absence, for the purpose of visiting England, Mr. F. Wheeler was elected his *locum tenens*.

Your Committee cannot too highly appreciate the services rendered by the honorary medical and surgical staff, their valuable assistance having always been freely given apart from their ordinary routine of duty. They are desirous also of expressing their high sense of the ability and efficiency with which the resident surgeon and the other officers of the Institution have discharged their several duties throughout the year. To those ladies and gentlemen who have from time to time forwarded books, magazines, and particularly illustrated papers, for the amusement of the inmates, your Committee tender their grateful acknowledgments; the monotony and weariness of the sick patient is often considerably mitigated by such kindness on the part of the public.

In conclusion, your Committee confidently asserts that although on the occasion of their election to office, the affairs of the Institution were considerably complicated, by the unfortunate circumstances previously alluded to, the Hospital is now placed on so firm a basis in regard to its management and internal economy, and by the fact of incorporation, with a thorough revision of its By-laws, that the contributors may rest satisfied regarding the future of a charity that has, on all occasions, received their earnest sympathy and generous support.

BYE-LAWS

OF

The Ballarat District Hospital.

INCORPORATED UNDER 27 VIC. NO. 220.

Objects of the Institution. 1. The object of the Institution is to afford Medical and Surgical Aid to poor persons requiring it, irrespective of country, colour, or creed, and for casualties; but no persons who shall meet with casualties, and be found able to pay for aid elsewhere, shall receive further than temporary assistance.

Constitution. 2. The Institution shall consist of a President, two Vice-presidents, Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS

3. The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of Governors and Contributors:—

		with the privilege of voting at all general and special meetings of Governors and Subscribers, and with power to recommend patients, according to the undermentioned scale:—	

Life Governor—2 in-patients or 6 out-patients always on the books.
Life Subscriber—1 in-patient or 3 out-patients always on the books.

Governor for one year—10 in-patients and 20 out-patients annually.

Governor—4 in-patients & 8 out-patients annually.

Contributor—2 in-patients & 4 out-patients annually.

*N.B.—Nominations of Governors and Contributors must be made prior to 31st December of each year, and be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management. Firms subscribing may nominate one of their members as a Governor or Contributor, who shall be entitled to vote, and hold office.

4. Annual subscriptions must be paid in advance, for the current year, such year to be computed from the day on which such subscription is paid, and no Governor or Contributor will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid. Subscriptions payable in advance.

5. Life, Honorary, and Annual Governors, Life and Annual Subscribers, all Honorary Officers and other contributors of £1 and upwards per annum, shall be entitled to one vote at all meetings of Governors and Contributors to the Hospital. Voting.

6. No person shall vote as a Governor or Contributor while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Hospital; nor any new Governor or Contributor unless his subscription shall have been paid one month previously. Limitation of voting.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

7. At all meetings of Contributors, the President or one of the Vice-presidents, or the Treasurer, as the case may be, shall take the chair, but in their absence the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a casting vote only.

8. The annual meeting of the Contributors to the Hospital shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January, in every year, for the following purposes:—

1. The election of the President, Vice-presidents, Treasurer, Medical and Surgical Officer, and Auditor for the ensuing year.
2. The election of members of the Committee of Management.
3. The transaction of any other business of which due notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting.

9. At all general meetings of Contributors, twelve shall constitute a quorum, and as soon as a quorum is present the chair will be taken, but if no quorum is present within half-an-hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned for the following week, at the same day and hour.

10. It shall be competent for the Committee of Management, or any twenty or more Contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the Secretary to summon a special meeting of Contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being speci-

fied in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned; every such meeting shall be called by the Secretary.

11. All elections where contested shall be by ballot.

COMMON SEAL.

12. The Common Seal of the Corporation shall be kept in the iron chest at the Hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the President, and the other by the Secretary.

13. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the Committee of Management, at a meeting at which a quorum of members at least are present.

EXTRACTS FROM ACTS, &C.

14. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year, one-third part of the elected members of the Committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.—27 Vic., No. 220, Sec. 11.

15. If any member of Committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the Chairman of Committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the Committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the Committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some Contributor to such Institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the Committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the said Act, are required to go out of office.—27 Vic., No. 220, Sec. 12.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

Constitution &
election.

16. The Institution shall be managed by a President, two Vice-presidents, Treasurer, three Honorary Medical and three Honorary Surgical Officers, and fifteen Members of Committee, who shall be elected from the Governors at the annual meeting.

Notice of candi-
dature

17. No person shall be considered eligible for election at the annual meeting, unless he, or some one duly authorised on his behalf, shall have given notice in writing, to the Secretary, one day before the date of such meeting, of his intention to stand for one or more of the annual offices, but no person shall hold more than one office, whereby a seat at the board may be

vacated. Provided always that, in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent in to supply all the offices, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have been disposed of.

18. The Committee of Management may suspend any Honorary Medical or Surgical Officer, or one or more of its own members, on any well founded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by the majority of the members present at the special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, to be confirmed at a special meeting of Governors and Contributors to be held within fourteen days from the decision of the Committee.

19. The Committee of Management shall direct the general Powers. business of the Institution, frame rules for its internal regulation and appoint and discharge all paid officers of the Institution.

20. They shall meet on the second Wednesday in each month, Days of meeting and on such other days as they may appoint—five to form a quorum. The Chairman of Committee shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting, but no deliberative, vote.

21. The general Committee may depute two or more of their number, who, together with the Resident Surgeon shall have full power to consider any applications, and discharge any patient who in their opinion is not a fit and proper person to receive the benefits of the Institution, reporting in their minutes their reason for refusing any application, or ordering any discharge.

22. No member of the Committee of Management nor officer Pecuniary interest. of the Hospital, shall be a contractor or become security for a contractor, directly or indirectly, nor shall any member of the Committee of Management be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

23. The Committee of Management shall present a general Annual report & balance sheet. report of the affairs of the Institution, together with a duly audited balance sheet, at the annual meeting of Governors and Contributors, in January of each year, such balance sheet to be published in one or more of the local papers, at least three days before such meeting.

24. The President and Vice-presidents shall be members *ex officio* of all Committees, and the Treasurer, and Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers, shall be members *ex officio* of the Committee of Management. Ex officio members.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

25. The Committee of Management shall choose from among Appointment. themselves a House Committee of six, four to form a quorum,

Duties.	who shall attend to the internal management of the House, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts presented for payment, the supervision of the Collector's, Dispenser's, and House Steward's, books, and such other matters (except the final acceptance of tenders) as may be delegated to them by the Committee of Management.
Members retiring in rotation	26. They shall retire in rotation, two at each monthly meeting of the General Committee, and, if not re-elected, their places shall be filled by the appointment of other members of Committee, the arrangements for rotation to be left to the House Committee themselves.
Meetings.	
Honorary staff members pro tem.	27. They shall meet once in each fortnight, or oftener, on such days and at such hours as they may appoint, and the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers for the week shall be members, <i>ex officio</i> , of the House Committee, and if they are not able to attend the reception of out-patients they shall assign a reason for their absence.
Checking Collector.	28. They shall appoint two or more of their number to be a Finance Committee, who shall, at least once in each month, compare the Collector's books and receipt books with the advertised lists of subscriptions and donations for the preceding four weeks, and shall see that the addition of the items is correct in each, entered in ink, and that the totals correspond with each other, as well as with the amounts acknowledged by the Treasurer in the Collector's acquittance book.
Checking House Steward and Dispenser.	29. They shall, also, once at least in each month, audit the house accounts, compare the balances in the Secretary's ledger, with the bank pass book, and examine the books, relating to provisions, wines and spirits, &c., kept by the House Steward, and Dispenser, respectively.
Watching Expenditure.	30. They shall watch the entire expenditure of the Institution, and shall carefully scrutinise the Monthly Analysis of such expenditure, with a due regard to the number of patients in the House, reporting to the Committee of Management any matter of importance.
Supervising receipt and distribution of stores, &c.	31. They shall depute two or more of their number to be present (without notice), once in each fortnight, at the receipt and distribution of stores, wines and spirits, and, twice in each year, shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores, wines and spirits, with the House Steward's and Dispenser's books.
Verifying stock-on-hand.	
Verifying books and vouchers.	32. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by them, the signature of some member of the House Committee shall be appended, with the date of examination, in token of the correctness of such books or vouchers to that date.
Quarterly audit.	33 The Accounts of the Charity shall be verified quarterly, in

AUDITORS.

the months of January, April, July, and October, by two Auditors, appointed for the purpose by the Governors and Contributors.

34. The January audit shall be the yearly audit, at which the accuracy of the whole accounts for the preceeding year, and of the balance sheet prepared (with list of subscriptions and donations, and statement of securities for the annual meeting, shall be certified for the satisfaction of the Governors and Contributors. Yearly audit for governors.

35. At the other quarterly audits, the Auditors shall report, for the information of the Committee of Management, as to the accord of the Collector's books and receipt-butts with the weekly advertised lists of subscriptions, the bank pass-book, and Collector's acquittance book for the preceeding three months; also as to all expenditure being for legitimate objects, and in accordance with the authority of the Committee. Quarterly audit for committee

36. They shall specially call attention to erasures or important alterations in any book or document, and shall report to the Subscribers or to the Committee, on any matters connected with the book-keeping of the Institution, or otherwise within their province. Erasures and alterations.

37. They shall be appointed at a general or special meeting of Governors and Contributors; one to retire by rotation at each annual meeting, but to be eligible for re-election. Appointment.

38. It shall be competent for the Committee of Management to suspend any Auditor for incapacity, misbehaviour, or neglect of duty, on the understanding that, within one week of the date of such suspension, they will proceed to convene a special meeting of contributors for the consideration of the case, and for the election (if necessary) of a successor to such Auditor. Suspension.

39. The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed at the annual meeting. Remuneration.

HONORARY PROFESSIONAL STAFF.

40. They shall consist of three legally qualified Medical, and three legally qualified Surgical, Officers, who shall be elected and retire in the same way as Members of Committee. Appointment.

41. One of the Honorary Medical, and one of the Honorary Surgical, Officers shall attend the Hospital each day, the rotation of duty to be regulated by themselves. Rotation of duty

42. The Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers shall have access to the Institution at all times. Access to Institution.

43. The Honorary Surgeons shall perform all capital surgical operations, but no capital operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the Surgical Staff, except in cases of emergency; and the Honorary Medical and Surgical Officers respectively shall regularly consult in all cases of importance, or of protracted continuance in the House. Capital operations.

44. Any Honorary Medical or Surgical Officer neglecting his duty for one month, without reasonable cause, shall, after recei- Neglect of duty.

ving notice in writing, cease to hold office, and another shall be appointed in his stead:

Daily report. 45. The Honorary Medical Officers shall make a daily report to be inserted in a book kept for that purpose.

TREASURER.

Receipt of monies. 46. All monies received on account of the Hospital shall be paid to the Treasurer, and be deposited by him in such Bank as the Committee of Management may from time to time appoint.

Acquittance to Collector. 47. On receiving any monies from the Collector, he shall sign the Collector's acquittance book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

Payment. 48. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the President (or a Vice-president), the Treasurer, and countersigned by the Secretary.

Authority for payments. 49. Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the Treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

Progress balance sheet. 50. He shall cause to be prepared by the Secretary, for submission to the Committee, at the first meeting in each month, a progress balance sheet, in prescribed form, showing the actual position of the Hospital funds on the previous Monday, with an estimate of the surplus or deficiency at the end of the financial year; such balance sheet to be signed by him, and to be laid on the table by the Secretary, with the bank certificate or pass-book made up to the same date.

PATIENTS.

Recommendation. 51. Recommendations for admission shall be subject to the approval of the Committee, and be made by tickets only (to be issued by the Collector, who shall keep a proper record of the same) provided that, whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room, or other cause, the ticket used shall be reclaimable by the issuer. Governors and Contributors shall also have the privilege, at any time, on application to the Collector, of exchanging out patients' tickets for in-patients', and *vice versa*; one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to *two* out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance; and shall not be valid beyond twelve months from the date of issue.

Proper forms. 52. All recommendations must be properly filled up by the issuer, and signed by the applicant, in accordance with the printed forms supplied by the Institution.

53. Members of Committee and Honorary Professional Staff shall have a discretionary power of recommending both in-patients and out-patients, subject to the approval of the Committee.

Admission of in-patients 54. Accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Honorary Medical or Surgical Officers, or the

Resident Surgeon, shall be received at any time, but the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, on the recommendation of a Governor or Subscriber, shall be restricted to between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., Sundays excepted.

55. In all cases where an application for admission to the Hospital is refused by the Resident Surgeon, he shall endorse his reasons for such refusal on the back of the order presented, and every such case, together with the endorsement, shall be reported to the first meeting of the House Committee.

56. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with syphilis, or any infectious disease, or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who, in the opinion of one of the Medical or Surgical Officers and Resident Surgeon, or of the Committee, is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances. Persons not admissible.

57. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either) but not requiring admission to the house, shall be treated as out-patients. on producing the recommendation in proper form, of a Governor or Subscriber; such recommendation to be in force for two months only, from the date of issue. Out-patients.

58. Any person wishing to be received into the Hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted, with the sanction of the House Committee; he shall be charged 10s. per day, (or a smaller sum if deemed expedient by the Committee) and in the event of any operation being performed, a fee shall be paid by him to the Hospital, the amount of such fee to be decided by the Honorary staff, but in no case shall it exceed five guineas; paying patients shall pay one week in advance. Paying Patients

59. No patient shall be discharged by the Resident Surgeon, without a reference to the Honorary Medical Officer in charge of the case. Discharge of patients.

60. Patients quitting the Hospital at their own desire, shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving. Voluntary departure.

61. In the event of any person, in a position to pay for medical or surgical advice elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person, if an in-patient, shall be liable to be prosecuted, and shall be charged at the rate of ten shillings (10s.) per day for each day from the date of admission, or, if an out-patient, he may also be prosecuted, and shall be charged the sum of ten shillings (10s.) for each occasion upon which he shall consult the Resident Surgeon; and the Committee may order the removal of any such person from the Hospital, provided the case is not one of emergency.
