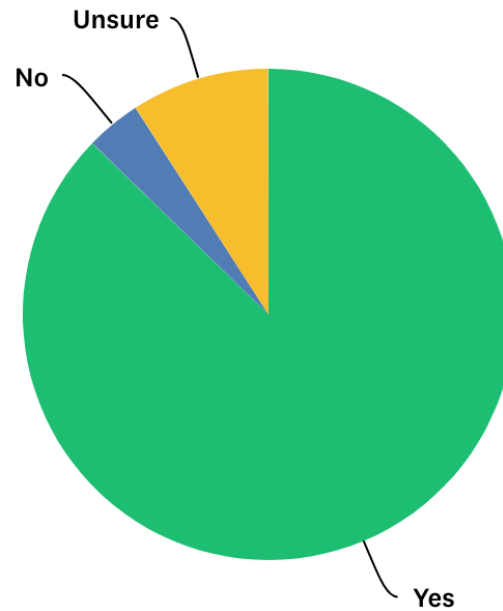

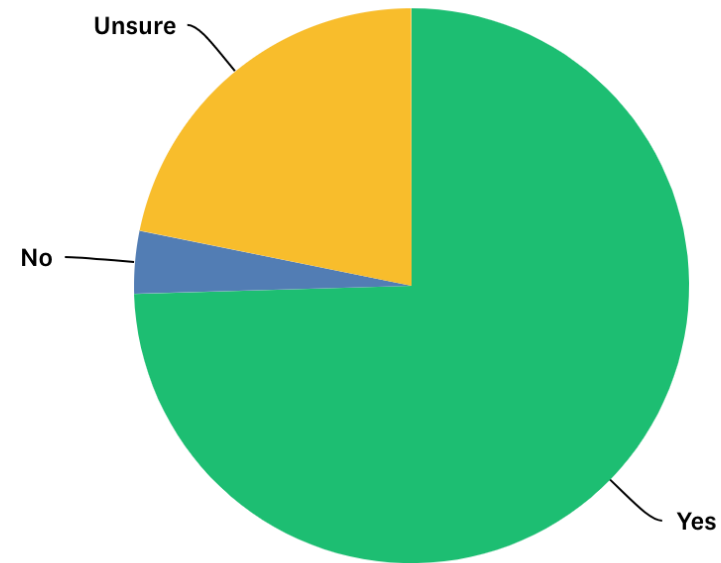

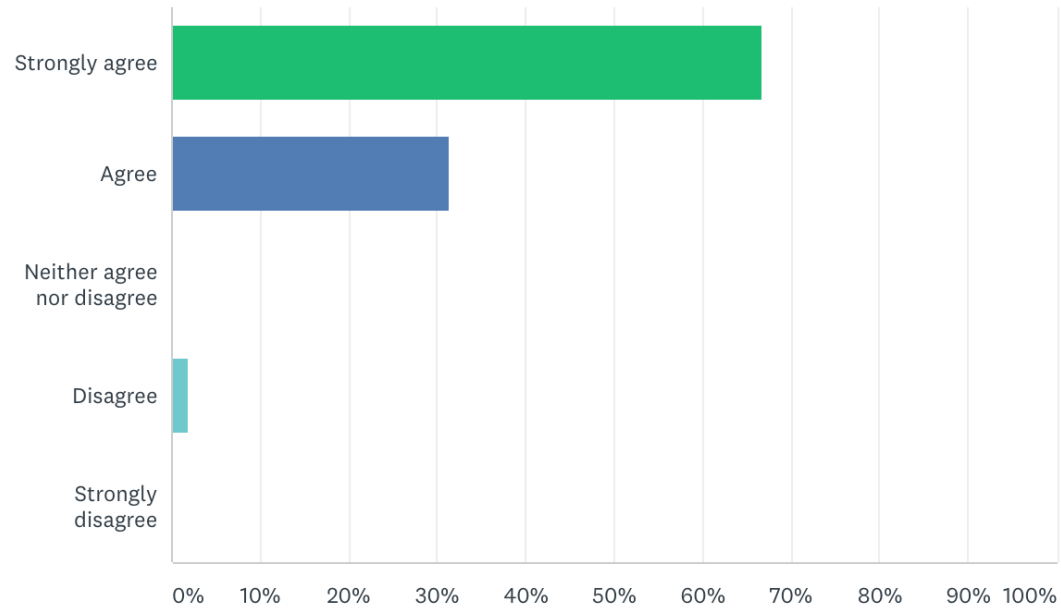

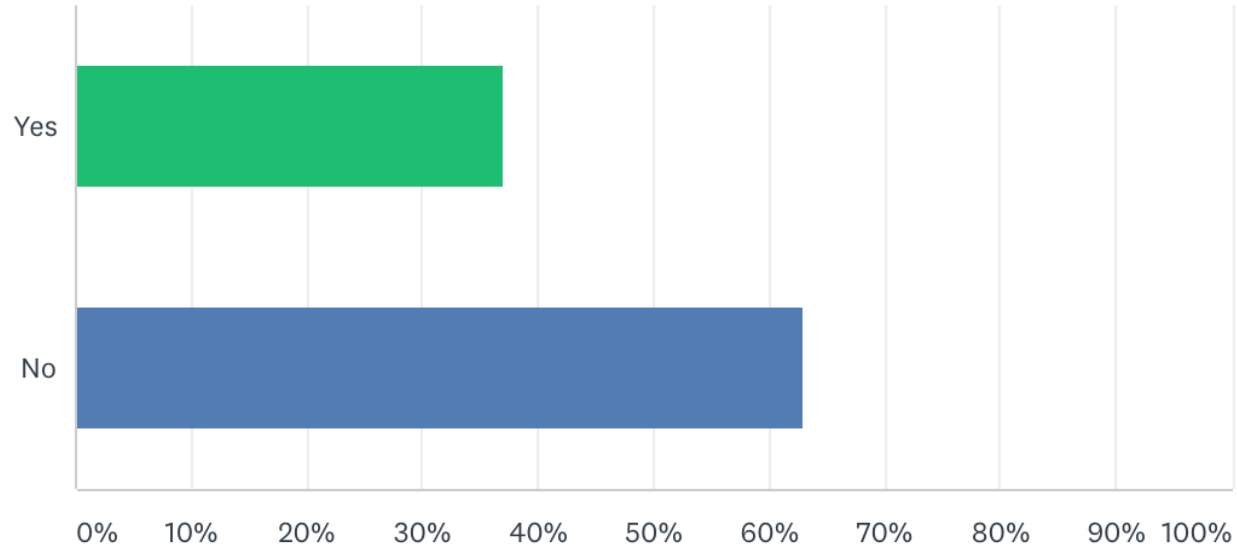

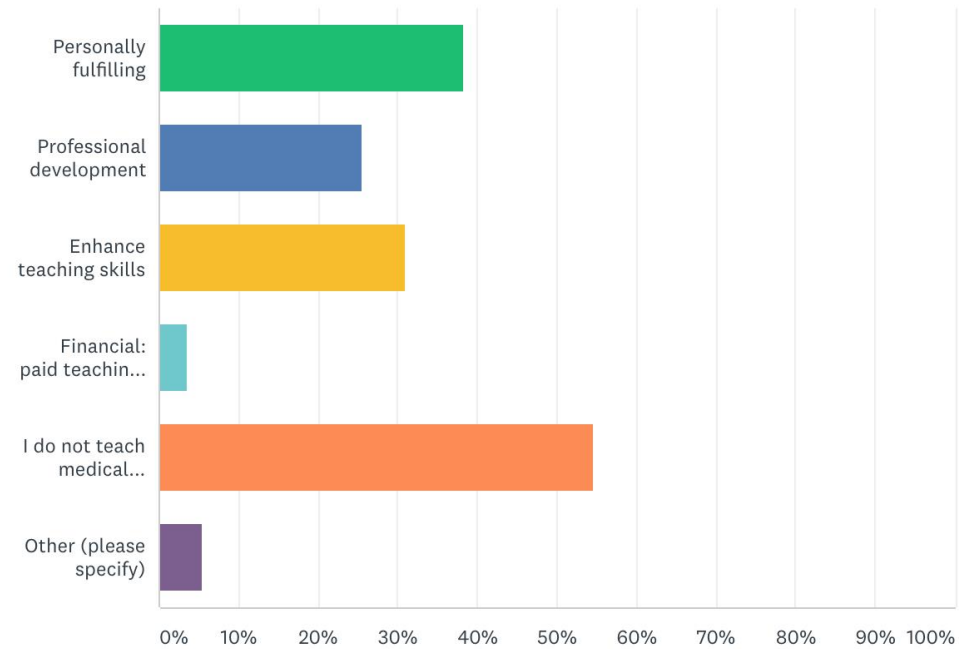

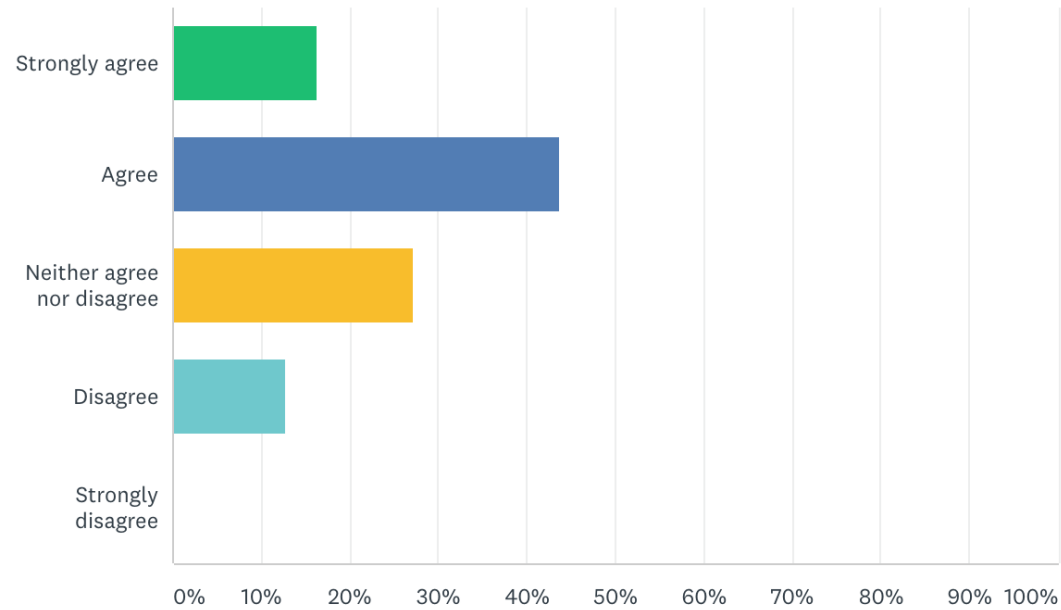

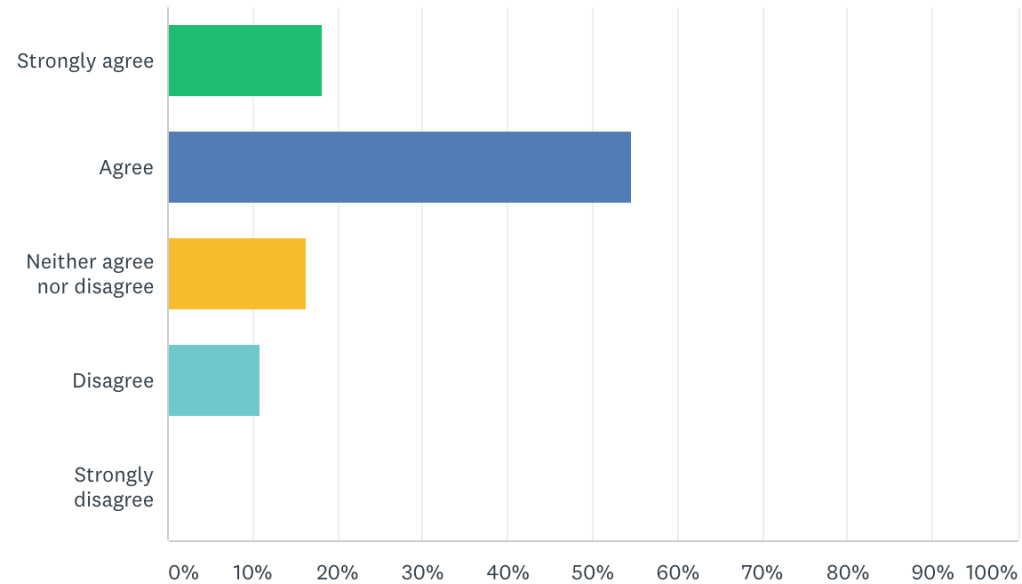

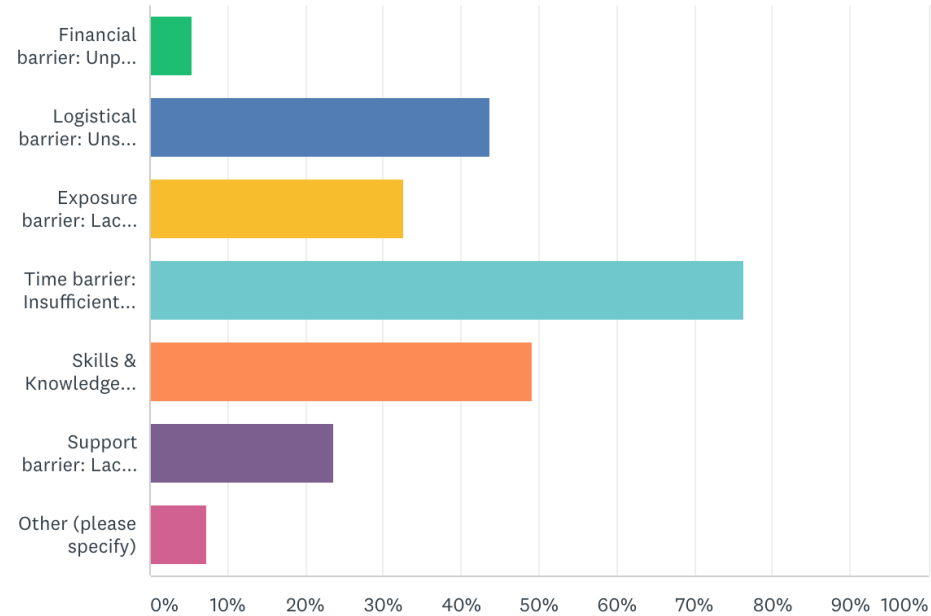

Success thus far (Ballarat Health Services)

As of 21/10/2019

- 67 lessons facilitated
- 430 medical students taught
- 76 hours of teaching
- 130 student feedback responses
- Feedback rates:
 - Per lesson: 1.94
 - Per student: 0.29 (More than 1 in 4 students leave feedback)
