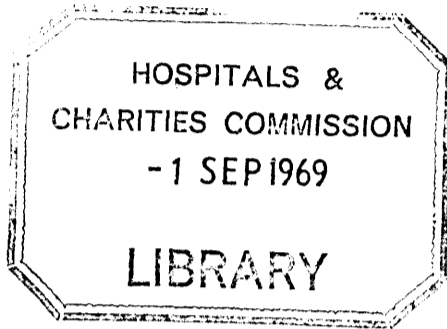

Ladies and Gentlemen,

On behalf of the Committee of Management of your Hospital it is my privilege to present to you the Annual Report for the year ended 30th June, 1969.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:

At the last Annual Meeting Dr. R. W. Bade, Mr. L. C. De Castres Mr. J. Op-de-Coul and Mr. J. Wilson were re-elected to the Committee. This year Mr. J. Harkness, Mr. J. L. Jenkins, Mr. L. G. O'Neill and Mr. C. Wiggins, retire in accordance with the by-laws and offer themselves for re-election.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF:

Dr. Bade has efficiently cared for the Public patients at the Hospital and for this service we thank him.

MATRON AND STAFF:

We wish to thank the entire staff; Nursing, Domestic, and out-door, for their service during the year. We regret having lost Matron Pflugradt, who resigned to be married. All have conscientiously contributed to the well being of the patients and their surroundings.

LADIES AUXILIARY:

We are again indebted to the members of the Edenhope and Charam Auxiliaries for the wonderful support they have given

During the year they have supplied a new iron and ironing board for the Nurses' Home, shower curtains, bath-mats, ward tidies, a sun lounge, laundry trolley and many other items.

FINANCE AND STATISTICS:

The Statement of Income and Expenditure shows a deficit of \$1789 for the year, compared with last years surplus of \$5126. Daily Average decreased from 9.6 to 9.3 causing the daily bed cost to rise from \$15.48 to \$18.00.

BUILDINGS AND EQUIPMENT:

The Committee has continued the policy of maintaining existing equipment and where necessary purchasing new items to ensure the maximum in patient care. The major project carried out this year was the painting of the Nurses' Home under the drought relief employment scheme. Heating alterations to the Nurses' Home have been at a standstill pending the establishment of contact with the electrician, who has left the district. He has recently been contacted and work is expected to go ahead in the near future, under a new contractor. A diathermy machine was purchased with money donated, through their social service contributions, by the pupils of the Edenhope High School, and a new Deutscher Lawn Mower has been added to the out-door equipment.

ANNUAL APPEAL:

The Annual Appeal raised the sum of \$1617. We record our thanks to those people who have again generously supported our Hospital, and to those who have assisted the Committee in door-knocks in town and district. We would like to thank the Edenhope Lions Club for their assistance with the local door-knock.

EDENHOPE AND DISTRICT MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.

REGIONAL SCHEME:

Participation by the Hospital in the Regional Scheme has again proved beneficial. The Regional Engineer has called to service the equipment and the Central Linen Service has given excellent service.

APPRECIATION:

The Committee wishes to place on record sincere thanks to all who have helped the Hospital in any way during the past year. Special thanks are due to the District Clergy who have attended to the spiritual welfare to the patients, pupils of district schools, who conducted egg appeals which resulted in 304 dozen eggs being donated to the Hospital, Mr. Robin Nutall, who organized the painting through drought relief, and the "Kowree Advocate" for providing valuable publicity.

I personally wish to thank Mr. Jones and Mr. Wines for the quality of administration achieved during the year. The cordial relations between Management and Committee have contributed to an outstandingly successful year for the Hospital.

I shall conclude by thanking members of the Committee for their loyal support and help during the last twelve months, and for the compliment of being your president.
