




# President's Report

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I have much pleasure in presenting the 29th Annual Report of the activities of the Hospital for the financial period ending June 30, 1972, together with the Financial Statements and Statistics produced on Pages 7 to 10.

## FINANCE:

The operative surplus of \$18,836 (as compared with the deficit of \$942 for the previous twelve months), was brought about by increased Government grants and fees received.

## STATISTICS:

A total of 558 In-Patients treated; 708 Out-Patient attendances (which includes Physiotherapy, Radiography, Ante-Natal Clinics, etc.); 165 operations performed and 38 births, resulting in a daily average of 18.22 In-Patients.

From the Domestic point of view, the meal production statistics are interesting —30,000 hospital meals, 1,800 meals on wheels and 9,000 Allambi meals were produced.

I refer you to Pages 7 to 10 where you will see the relative comparative statements.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:

Mrs. I. F. McRae resigned from the Committee on February 11, 1972 and we thank her for her keen interest in the affairs of the hospital, particularly as a member of the House Sub-Committee.

## STAFF:

A total of 50 persons was employed, an increase on last year. Due to the opening of the Alister Hinchley Wing, it was necessary to increase the staff complement from 20 to 28.6. The categories of the new appointments were 5.6 nurses, one domestic services assistant, one food services assistant and one junior clerk.

Last year at this time we recorded a welcome to Miss L. L. Kernke to the position of Matron. However, Miss Kernke tendered her resignation on June 1, 1972, and will leave us on September 4. We sincerely record our appreciation of her work during her stay.

We indeed thank all the staff for their loyalty and assistance throughout the year.

## AUXILIARIES:

It is difficult not to repeat oneself when thanking the members of our Auxiliaries, because of their consistent work. I refer, of course, to the Dimboola Ladies Auxiliary, the Dimboola East Ladies Auxiliary and the Men's Auxiliary. You will see on Pages 12, 13 and 14, ample evidence of their efforts.

There are also others worthy of our thanks, namely the librarians of the Red Cross and Medical Loan. For some years the Red Cross Company has, in an honorary capacity, assisted in the hospital kitchen — we are deeply indebted for its assistance.

Members of the Country Women's Association established bi-weekly sessions of hand craft. This is excellent therapy for aged patients as well as a social contact for the patients who are participating.

#### NURSING CADETS:

We offer our congratulations to:- Dianne Bolwell (Dimboola), Shirley Bolwell (Dimboola), Glenda Borgeft (Dimboola), Allison Daggett (Jeparit), Marie DeVaun (Dimboola), Jan Gazelle (Dimboola), Beth Hargreaves (Jeparit), Rosalie Lang (Dimboola), Susan Leyonhjelm (Ge-ang), Anne O'Dwyer (Dimboola), Brenda O'Dwyer (Dimboola), Kerry Thomson (Jeparit) and Bernadette Wright (Dimboola), who successfully completed the 1972 course. Experience has shown that this course is of great benefit to those students who take part, particularly during the early stage of their preliminary nurse training. The Committee of Management wish you every success and thank Matron Kernke and Mr. Golding for their assistance.

#### DR. ALISTER HINCHLEY WING:

The day of the official opening of this wing was a proud moment for your Committee, particularly as it recognised the work of Dr. Hinchley as a medical practitioner and family doctor in Dimboola since 1939, and so on March 10, 1972, the "Alister Hinchley Wing" was declared open. We were honoured that Dr. Lindell was able to be present to perform this ceremony. The plaque commemorating this day reads as follows:-

"The Dr. Alister Hinchley Wing, named in recognition of devoted Medical Service since 1939. Officially opened 10th March, 1972, by Dr. John Lindell, Chairman, Hospitals and Charities Commission."

The scissors used to open the building were presented to Dr. Hinchley, on behalf of the Committee, by Dr. Lindell. The inscription on the scissors reads:-

"In commemoration of the opening of the Dr. Alister Hinchley Wing on the 10th March, 1972, by Dr. J. H. Lindell — Presented to Dr. Hinchley by the Dimboola District Hospital Committee."

#### HONORARY STAFF:

We record our appreciation of the continuing work of our Honorary Staff, consisting of Doctors, Dentists, Chaplains, Lawyers and Nurses. During the year the Reverend Father K. Arundell and the Reverend W. J. Peters resigned; appointed to the Chaplaincy was Reverend B. P. Dawson. Sister H. Gaulke relinquished her position as Nurse Cadet Educator.

We sadly refer to the deaths of two Committee-men who, both in their own way, had much pride in the Dimboola Hospital, and I refer to the late Mr. W. N. Muntz who served in the capacity of Honorary Solicitor, Life Governor, Treasurer and as a member of the Executive Committee; The late Mr. F. G. Klinge was likewise a Life Governor and Committee-man.

#### FACILITIES:

We have had a very busy schedule with regard to services and equipment. The mechanical services contract is nearing completion and will improve atmospheric heating and cooling within the hospital. Food distribution has been improved by means of an electrically heated food trolley. The latest available obstetric bed was provided by the Estate of the late Mr. and Mrs. R. V. Walscott.

Two-way radio communication with the Wimmera Ambulance Service has had a distinct effect on efficiency — so too has the PABX telephone communication throughout the hospital. A water treatment plant was installed and staff car-ports extended.

We would like to thank the Staff Social Club for their donation of lounge chairs and Nativity sets.

## President's Report Continued

Throughout the year we have been asking patients for their comments as to how the hospital service may be improved. We have appreciated patients' suggestions; indeed, the House Sub-Committee has acted on several of the patients' recommendations.

### MEMBERSHIP SCHEME:

A decision was taken during the year to discontinue this benefit, the reason being that the 100 per cent rebate rule of authorised Benefit Societies made the Dimboola scheme redundant and uneconomical. We do ask that you continue your contribution as an annual donation which, of course, carries a taxation rebate.

### CONCLUSION:

Your Committee of Management is fully aware of the support so readily given during the financial year. It is impossible to thank everyone but we assure you that your help and support is appreciated. I know you would like us to record our thanks to Dr. Lindell, Commissioners, Officers and Staff of the Hospitals and Charities Commission; Managers and Staff of all hospitals within our Region, particularly the Wimmera Base Hospital; Wimmera Ambulance Service and Dimboola Ambulance Officer, Mr. Leedham; the Dimboola Shire Councillors and Officers; members of Church Guilds, Red Cross and Country Women's Association — in fact, all those wonderful organisations and individuals who have contributed cash, kind, or hard work.






