THE REPORT

OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL,

For the Year 1859.

To THE GOVERNORS, SUBSCRIBERS, AND CONTRIBUTORS OF THE PLEASANT
CREEK HOSPITAL:—

1.—Your Committee, in submitting their first Annual Report, feel rejoiced in offering you their sincere thanks for the assistance and liberality extended towards the Institution, and to congratulate you on the very satisfactory position which the Institution has attained in the estimation of all classes of society.

2.—Your Committee in pointing out the District which has aided the Hospital, and which they trust it is calculated to benefit, deem it needless to refer to the great utility of an Institution of this nature to places so far removed from any large town, it being so generally acknowledged, or to enter into a long report on the subject, but merely remark that since the opening of the Hospital, on the 26th February last, that patients have been received from every part of the District, which at present includes the Pleasant Creek, Great Western, and Navarre Diggings, the Townships of Horsham, Glenorehy, and Navarre, and all the Stations in a north and west direction, until it reaches the Adelaide Boundary and the Mile (excepting small portions which are more conveniently situated to the Maryborough Hospital, and the Portland Benevolent Asylum), there not being any thing else of the kind further towards the interior of the colony.

3.—Your Committee think it right to inform the public that arrangements have lately been made with the Committee of the Ararat Hospital by which the Districts have been divided in the following manner, viz.:—

4.—Your Committee have to report that during the past nine months 67 patients have been admitted into the Hospital; of this number 42 have been cured or relieved; 11 have died; and 14 remained in the Hospital on the last day of the year, besides 27 persons who have not required to become indoor patients, but have received advice and medicines. The nature of relief afforded will be best seen by referring to the annexed list (see appendix No. 1.)

5.—Your Committee, with a view of placing the Hospital in as complete a state of efficiency as possible, to meet all emergencies, have sent an order to London for a complete equipment of surgical instruments and apparatus, which the objects of the Institution may require.

6.—Your Committee beg to tender their grateful acknowledgments to the medical gentlemen of the District for the gratuitous assistance the Institution has received from them; and with reference to the internal management of the Hospital, your Committee feel it but just, to mention the very satisfactory manner in which the various duties devolving on Mr. and Mrs. Hayes have been performed, and the general satisfaction expressed by the patients in the manner they have been attended to.

7.—Your Committee have to acknowledge the thanks which have been tendered by several of the squatters, and persons on their stations, for the trouble which the mining community have taken in conducting the affairs of the Hospital.

8.—With reference to the financial state of the Institution, your Committee beg to congratulate you on the very satisfactory condition of its exchequer, as will appear by the annexed abstract of the accounts (which, as they have not hitherto been laid fully before the public, commences from the formation of the Institution, on the 7th August, 1858, to the 31st December, 1859)—see appendix No. 2—and further that the Executive Government have placed on the Estimates for 1860, the sum of £1000 for maintenance.

9.—Your Committee have to remark with reference to the money affairs of the Hospital, that the present building is only of a temporary nature, and that it will soon be incumbent on your future Committee to erect a permanent and more extensive building, for which purpose the Executive Government have been applied to for an additional grant of £1,500 for building purposes—the amount of private subscriptions to enable those sums to be received having been already nearly collected during the year 1859, as will be seen by the subscription list annexed. (See appendix No. 3.)

10.—Your Committee beg further to acquaint you that a grant of five acres of land has been made by the Government, in the vicinity of Stawell, but your Committee, pending the long-vexed question of the Township, thought it more advisable to erect the Temporary Hospital on the Doctor's Hill, as being then the most central situation, and beg to remark that the plan adopted of building, in the first instance, a Temporary Hospital, though incurring considerable additional expense, has given general satisfaction, having enabled much suffering to be relieved during the past year, and it must even now be some months before a permanent building can be ready for the reception of patients.

11.—Your Committee are pleased to be able to announce that two legacies have been bequeathed to the Hospital. The first, an amount of £5, which has been paid, and the second (as an instance of the gratitude with which the benefits of the Institution have been received), of £100, of which the donor became possessed while an inmate of the Hospital, but which cannot be realised for some considerable time, owing to the property being in England.

12.—Your Committee tender their most grateful acknowledgments to the following gentlemen for the services they have rendered the Institution, viz.—Mr. Bonwick and Mr. Wilmot for their Lectures, and the gentlemen composing the Reef Amateurs, from which latter your Committee are happy to say they have received further assurances of support, as also from Mr. Wilmot.

13.—Your Committee before resigning, beg to draw your particular attention to the list of cases which have been relieved by this Institution, by which it will be seen that the working miner, from the very nature of his occupation, is a large participator in the benefits it confers, but at the same time, he is the smallest contributor towards the support of the Institution, which may be his home and asylum in sickness and suffering. Your Committee cannot suffer such an anomaly to pass without comment, and they earnestly implore the working miner, as he hopes for sympathy in the hour of need, to come forward and support the Institution, whose aid, by the accident of a moment, he may be compelled to seek.

14.—Your Committee in resigning the trust with which you have honored them, have to thank you for the confidence reposed in them, and to express the pleasure they have had in being able to assist in so desirable an object. Again thanking you—with all good wishes for the prosperity of the Institution—they now beg to resign their charge into your hands.

RULES

OF

THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL.

1.—The Hospital shall afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid to any poor person requiring the same, irrespective of Creed, Country, or Color; but any person who shall be admitted under any circumstances and shall be found able to pay, will be immediately required to do so, and afford temporary relief only.

2.—The Hospital shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, Five Trustees, an Honorary Treasurer, Four Honorary Surgeons, and a Committee of Management, all of whom shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year (except the Trustees), and shall be elected by the Governors and Annual Subscribers for one pound and upwards.

3.—Should any vacancies occur in any of the above offices, the same shall be filled by the Committee of Management until the expiration of the then current year, except the Trustees, who must, in all cases, be elected at a General Meeting of Subscribers.

4.—The above electors shall, at the Annual General Meeting in January in each year, appoint two Auditors not Members of the Board to examine the accounts for the past year, but in case either of such Auditors neglect or refuse to perform the said Audit within one month from the time of their appointment, a Special Meeting of Subscribers shall be called immediately to supply such vacancy.

5.—The Board of Management shall include all the Officers named in the second rule, as also the Resident Surgeon and Secretary for the time being. It shall direct the collection and distribution of the funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the Hospital, present a report to the Annual General Meeting, and conduct the affairs of the Hospital generally.

6.—The Board shall meet for general business once, at least, in each month, at such time and place as it may from time to time appoint; and for special business, at any time or place that may be requisite. At any Meeting, five members shall form a *quorum*, and in the absence of the President or Vice-Presidents one of the members present shall be elected to act as Chairman.

7.—That every Contributor of £25 in one sum shall be a Life Governor, with the privilege of voting at all General or Special Meetings of Subscribers, and of nominating one In-door and four Out-door Patients in each year. And every Contributor of £5 in one sum shall be entitled to the above privileges for the year of such contribution—provided that the funds and accommodation of the Hospital will admit of the reception of such Patient.

8.—That no person (except Life Governors) shall have any right to vote at any meeting, unless they have within a year, and not less than one month previous to such meeting, contributed one pound at least to the funds of the Hospital.

9.—That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Medical Officer in attendance be received at any time, and that in ordinary cases Patients shall be admitted only on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at 12 o'clock, on the recommendation of a Subscriber of at least one pound for the then current year, and also of one of the Committee of Management who shall certify that the said Patient is not capable of providing for medical attendance.

10.—That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, person affected with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who in the opinion of the Medical Officer in attendance is unfit to be an In-door Patient, shall be received under any circumstances, except with the express permission of the Board of Management.

HONORARY TREASURER.

11.—The Treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the Hospital, and invest the same in such Bank or Banks as the Board of Management shall direct, to the credit of the Hospital. He shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the Chairman of the meeting as approved by the Board, by drafts on the Bank or Banks, which shall be countersigned by the President or one of the Vice-Presidents and by the Secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the Board.

HONORARY SURGEONS.

12.—The Honorary Medical Officers shall consist of four legally qualified Medical Practitioners, who shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the Hospital at all times; they shall perform all capital surgical operations, assisted by the Resident Surgeon, but no such operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the medical staff, except in cases of emergency, and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the Hospital.

13.—Two Members of the Committee shall, at least once a fortnight, visit the Hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, and of enquiring of the Patients if they are properly attended to, and report in writing to the next meeting of the Committee any alterations or suggestions they may think necessary; such two visitors to be selected by arrangement amongst themselves.

14.—Any Member of the Committee, Honorary Surgeon, or Officer of the Hospital, who shall neglect his duty for the space of one month is thereby liable to be disqualified, and another may be appointed in his stead if the Committee shall think fit.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

15.—The Resident Surgeon shall be a duly qualified Medical Practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period without the permission of the Managing Committee, but is allowed to practise privately within the limits of the Diggings on Pleasant Creek, provided such private practice does not interfere with his duties as Resident Surgeon.

16.—He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their case, and decide on their fitness for admission either as an In-door or Out-door patient, and shall also discharge all Patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

17.—He shall have charge of all Patients in the Hospital, and their treatment; but in cases of difficulty or danger, or long continuance in the Hospital, he is requested to consult the Honorary Surgeons.

18.—He shall superintend and control all Servants in the Hospital, and in case of neglect of duty or insubordination may suspend any of them, and, if necessary, hire substitutes until the next meeting of the Board, to which he shall report the full particulars of the case.

19.—He shall keep such accounts respecting the Patients as the Board may direct, in Books to be kept for that purpose, and report to the Board such cases as he may think necessary.

20.—He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, and shall carefully examine them both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects in either respect to the Managing Committee, and shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, and keep an account of the receipt and expenditure or loss and breakage of such instruments, drugs, and chemicals. There not being a Dispenser, he must perform such duties as would devolve on that officer.

21.—He shall enter regularly in books, to be kept for that purpose, the names of the Patients as they are admitted or discharged, and note the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment, and shall receive all money and other property belonging to Patients, and shall account for the same to the Committee when required.

22.—He shall accompany the Honorary Surgeons through the Wards, and report to them the state of the Patients. He shall also visit each Patient every morning and evening, and enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and if any cause of complaint exists he shall immediately remove the same or report it to the Committee at its next meeting.

23.—He shall perform all minor operations of surgery, and the *post-mortem* examinations, and shall keep the key of the dead-house. He

shall also give due notice to the Honorary Medical Officers when a consultation is to be held or an operation is to be performed; but in all cases of emergency to act to the best of his judgment.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

24.—The Secretary and Collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the Hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out their resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the Board.

25.—He shall convene the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days previous to the meeting.

26.—He shall convene Special Meetings of Contributors in the same manner, when directed by the Board, or on the written application of ten Contributors of at least £1 each; the object of such Special Meeting to be stated in the advertisement, and he shall also give special notice to each Member of the Board of such meetings.

27.—He shall collect subscriptions and all monies due to the Hospital, and give receipts for the same when required, and pay to the Treasurer, at least once in every month, all monies he may have received, and render an account of the same.

NURSES.

28.—The Nurses shall live in the Hospital, and shall not leave it for any length of time without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; they shall obey the orders of the said Officer, be regular in their attendance, and behave with tenderness to all Patients, and with civility and respect to strangers.

29.—They shall pay great attention to cleanliness, personally, in their respective Wards, and all things entrusted to their charge; particularly to the bedding of the Patients, and have it changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

30.—They shall administer to the Patients the medicines and diet at the time and in the manner directed by the Resident Surgeon, and they shall not permit them to take any which are not prescribed, and shall be careful to explain to the Patients the instructions of the said Officer, and shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the Patients and report the same to the Resident Surgeon.

31.—They shall not permit Patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines or diet, nor any thing to be removed from the Wards by the Patients or Visitors without an order from the Resident Surgeon.

32.—They shall be careful to collect and carry to the Dispensary all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c., and shall attend at the same at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

33.—They shall not admit any stranger without permission of the Resident Surgeon, except during the hours appointed for that purpose.

34.—They shall be obedient to the regulations of the Hospital, and shall report immediately to the Resident Surgeon any impropriety of conduct or infringement of the rules by any patient, visitor, or other person, and if such complaint is not properly attended to, they shall report the same to the Board of Management at its next meeting.

PATIENTS.

35.—The Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the Resident Surgeon and Nurses, take their medicines and diet at the time directed, and shall not take any than those prescribed, neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

36.—They shall not leave their Ward and go into another Ward, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than may be granted, nor introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquors, tobacco, or anything, nor smoke, without the express leave of the Resident Surgeon.

37.—They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, furniture, bedding, or clothing, nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language.

38.—Any Patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to remedy the same, or report it to the Board at its next meeting.

39.—Patients judged by the Resident Surgeon as able to assist in the work of the Hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

40.—Patients shall not sit up after eight o'clock in the Winter or nine o'clock in the Summer, and all Patients considered by the Resident Surgeon as able to do so shall rise at seven o'clock in the Summer and eight o'clock in the Winter.

41.—Out-door Patients must attend at the Hospital on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays, at twelve o'clock, and must observe the rules relating to in-door Patients so far as the same may be applicable.

PATIENTS AND VISITORS.

42.—Patients and Visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or other person connected with the Hospital.

43.—Visitors are admitted daily, between the hours of two and five o'clock in the afternoon, but no Visitors allowed to remain more than one hour, except Officiating Ministers of Religion, who may visit patients at any time; but all Visitors must retire when requested by the Nurses.

44.—Visitors shall not give or leave with any Patient, medicine, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the

permission of the Resident Surgeon; nor interfere with the Nurses, or disturb the Patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

45.—Any Visitor or Patient violating any of the rules of the Hospital, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the Resident Surgeon or Board of Management.

GENERAL.

46.—Any Officer, Nurse, Servant, or other person in any way connected with the Hospital, who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and shall not be permitted to hold any office or appointment in future.

47.—That any Committee Meeting, specially convened for the purpose, may alter, amend, add to, or rescind the rules and regulations herein contained, provided that two-thirds of such meeting concur therein, and that such meeting consist of not less than seventeen members.

LIBRARY.

The Friends of the Institution are informed that there is a Library forming for the use of the Patients, and that donations of Books, Periodicals, &c., will be thankfully received.
