#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE CONTRIBUTORS

#### To the Life Governors and Contributors:

It is again my privilege and pleasure to submit on behalf of the Committee of Management this, the Ninety-third Annual Report and Audited Statements of Accounts covering the Hospital's activities for the year ended 30th June, 1967.

#### Our Service to the Community:

During the year-

- 1. 207 beds were available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.
- 2. A total of 3,362 patients were treated.
- 3. 6,127 physiotherapy treatments were given.
- 4. 8,751 out-patients received treatment, having 17,513 attendances.
- 5. 403 maternity patients were treated.
- 6. 349 babies were born.
- 7. 367 major and 985 minor operations were performed.

#### In order to provide this service-

- 1. 4,676 x-rays were taken.
- 2. 8,286 pathology tests were carried out.
- 3. 6-127 physiotherapy treatments were given.
- 4. 179,804 meals were served.
- 5. 203 persons were employed on the staff.

This year saw a change in pattern of our service in that there were 100 more in-patients treated, 2,500 more out-patient attendances but the daily average decreased from 123 to 118. This is due to a shorter stay per patient in hospital, possibly a reflection of increased fees, and there does seem to be a co-relation between the drop in in-patients' daily average and the increase in the "meals on wheels" served. This is the object of the hospital to provide the service desired when desired.

#### Regional Scheme:

The regional scheme continues to function well in Wimmera and meetings at all levels, matrons, managers and medical, were held regularly and well attended. The regional council meetings with representatives from all hospitals have been highlighted by the guest speakers and in this regard we are all indebted to Miss Janet Thomas, Regional Co-ordinator of the Hospitals and Charities Commission for her enthusiasm and stimulus.

The services provided to the region have been maintained, pathology, radiology and visiting physiotherapy. In the physiotherapy service we had a six months' break whilst Miss Alison Watts travelled overseas. However, she has now returned and resumed the visiting service.

Miss Christine Crouch, occupational therapist, has continued to visit the hospitals in the region to advise on this aspect of patient care.

The Group Laundry has served all hospitals with a very high standard of linen and during the year the Rainbow Bush Nursing Hospital has joined in the group service.

#### Finance:

This has been a year of increasing financial anxiety to most hospital committees throughout the State. The grants from the State Government have not in any way matched the rising costs of hospital administration such as increase in nurses' wages, basic wage increase and the general rise of all commodities associated with the functioning of a hospital. Fees were increased; but this has not resulted in the cash receipts that were anticipated, with the result that although we have a supposedly small deficit the cash position has deteriorated to the situation where we are beholden to the bank for their consideration of our overdraft for the operation of the hospital and short of additional Government grant we can see no alleviation of this situation in the foreseeable future.

This year the total expenditure was \$640,162, an increase of \$64,000 above last year. This was occasioned by an increase in salaries and wages of \$72,000 without any increase in staff which was offset by decreases in expenditure of those items associated with a lower daily average of patients, viz: Food \$4,000, laundry \$3,000 and power and lighting \$1,000.

The total income from all sources was \$632,762, resulting in a deficit for the year of \$7,490. The income from government grants decreased by \$6,000 this year. The amount invoiced for patients' fees increased by \$76,000, but regrettably there is some \$95,000 of fees unpaid which is the cause of our unfortunate situation with the bank. On behalf of the Committee, could I take this opportunity to ask all to give every consideration to joining a hospital benefit organisation so that we may continue giving the hospital service that we all desire with a minimum financial embarrassment to those who wish to give this service.

#### MATRON'S REPORT:

The Annual Graduation Ceremony for 1967 was held in the Nurses' lecture room on Tuesday, March 14th, with Miss M. Long, Dean of the Northern School of Nursing, Bendigo, as guest speaker.

The Ryan Prize was awarded to Sister Fay Ekman. Due to the close competition, two students were awarded a runner-up prize — one being the Past Trainees' prize and one donated. These were awarded to Sister Christine Roberts and Sister Ellen Seery.

#### Equipment:

During the year the Committee's policy of ensuring modern equipment throughout the hospital was maintained and the major items during this period were a replacement of the autoclave in the operating theatre area at a cost of \$4,500 and a new high speed sterilizer was installed in the childrens' ward. Prior to this installation the opportunity was taken to have all existing sterilizers overhauled and modern refinements incorporated so that every ward now has its own unit of up to date design.

For all these works and equipment we received considerable financial government grants and we take this opportunity to thank Dr. Lindell, Chairman of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, the Commissioners and their staff for the assistance given throughout the year and to express our appreciation of the cordial relationship which we enjoy with the Hospitals and Charities Commission at all levels.



#### Buildings :

On the 9th of March this year Dr. John Lindell, Chairman of the Hospitals and Charities Commission officially opened the new extensions on the western side of the hospitals. This area included a new radiogical block complete with the mest modern equipment and patients' facilities, and as we have accepted the principle of a full time Radiologist we feel that in this area an excellent service is available to the people of the Wimmera. The new out-patient and casualty department also fully equipped and with it's own sterilizing area has been designed to meet the present and future needs of the community. Provision has also been made for clinics to be held by visiting specialists and this is adjoining the outpatient department where examinations of treatments, as required can be given.

The extensions also included a new elevator to replace the original one which had given 25 years service. The total cost of these works was \$190.000 (including the heating and cooling of the entire area.

#### ANCILLARY SERVICES:

All our ancillary services continue to provide a high standard of service for the region.

In the Pathology Department the statistics reveal an increase of 1.250 tests for the year. This is a continuation of the pattern of the preceding year and is very gratifying to our Pathologist, Dr. Leyton and his staff.

In the X-Ray Department there was an increase of 675 patients treated and we hope that this service of the full time radiologist Dr. Laidlaw will be availed of by the medical practitioners in the region.

As a follow up to the elementary occupational therapy course held at Mayfield Centre sponsored by the Hospitals and Charities Commission our occupational therapist Miss Crouch has visited hospitals in the region to assist in this regard.

Miss Alison Watts our visiting regional physiotherapist spent six months abroad during this year but is now back with us and this service is in very keen demand throughout the region.

#### HONORARY STAFF:

#### Medical -

Additions to our Honorary Medical Staff this year have been Dr. Abud, Honorary Physician and Dr. Miller, Honorary Obstetrician. We welcome them and express our thanks to all members of the honorary staff for their services to our public patients and for teaching given to our student nurses.

#### Legal —

We thank our Honorary Solicitor for his professional advise which is always available to us.

#### Dental —

We take this opportunity to thank our Honorary Dental Officers for their services to our public patients.

#### Chaplains —

We thank our Honorary Chaplains of all denominations for the spiritual comfort they give to our patients, and your Committee appreciates that spiritual care is very closely allied to medical and nursing care.

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### Auxiliaries and Service Clubs :

During the year our auxiliaries and service clubs were most active on our behalf. The Ladies Auxiliary raised \$3.557 and the Younger Set \$955. The Apex Club donated \$1,650 and the J.C's \$175. We thank them sincerely for their work and their interest in our hospital. We express our thanks to the Trustees Executors and Agency Co. who each year have made available to us a considerable donation from their trust funds.

# Visiting Services:

During the year the number of patients consulting our various visiting clinics has increased considerably and we are deeply appreciative of the services rendered in these specialist fields to the people of the Wimmera. On their behalf we express our thanks to the Peter MacCallum Clinic, the Consultative Council for Poliomyelitis, the Mental Hygiene Authority and the Victorian Society for Crippled Children and Adults.

Our special thanks are due to the ladies of the Red Cross. Their major service to our patients are twofold, firstly in maintaining a regular mobile library service in our wards and secondly for their work in the organisation of the weekly blood taking sessions for the blood bank.

# Committee of Management:

On the 7th February 1967 your committee suffered a profound loss in the death of Mr. J. W. (Taff) Morson.

Mr. Morson was elected to the Committee of Management on 30-8-55 and was chairman of the Building Committee from 1956, he was appointed Junior Vice President in 1961 and Senior Vice President in 1963. He served the Hospital well particularly with his wide knowledge of building principles.

We extend our sympathy to Mrs. Morson and his family.

Mr. Russell Sim resigned on 4-5-67 to go with his family to Melbourne, we thank him for his service on the Committee and as an Honorary Dental Officer.

During the year the Reverend Reford Corr and Mr. David McFarlane were appointed to the Committee of Management. We extend this welcome to them and look forward to along association in the affairs of the hospital.

#### Cenclusion:

On behalf of the Committee of Management. I would like to take this opportunity to convey our thanks, and those of the contributors, to all members of the staff, who through their co-operation, have contributed towards the happy relationship which exists throughout the hospital to the benefit of our patients. We particularly thank Miss Woolley, our Matron, and her assistants, the Tutor Sisters, the Ward Charge Sisters and all nursing staff, trained and in training; the administrative staff, the technical and the lay staff, who together form the team which has given this hospital the very good name which it enjoys as a happy hospital.

On behalf of the Committee of Management and the recruitment officers of the Hospitals and Charities Commission I take this opportunity to thank the Headmasters of the schools and Mother Superior of the convent for their assistance in providing Opportunities for the recruitment of nurses among their pupils.

To the Press, I would like to say on behalf of the Committee of Management, a very sincere thank you for your attendance at meetings of the Committee of Management. We express our appreciation of the cordial relationships which we have had and for the coverage given of our meetings and the way in which they have been presented to their reading public.

To my colleagues on the Committee of Management, I thank them for their support, for the time they have given in a voluntary capacity to the deliberations of the policy of the hospital, and I am sure you will agree that it is moving into the realms of big business. It does require consideration. I thank them for their regular attendance at meetings.

To all who have helped during the year, either by financial assistance or personal effort, I say a very sincere thank you and I trust that we all, the Committee of Management, the Auxiliaries, supporters and the staff may look forward to another year of progress and service to the people of the community, not only of Horsham but also of the Wimmera Region.












