## PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE CONTRIBUTORS

To the Life Governors and Contributors:

It is my privilege to submit on behalf of the Committee of Management this Annual Report and Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1966. This is the Ninety-second Annual Report of the Hospital's activities.

#### Our Service to the Community:

During the year-

1. 207 beds were available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

A total of 3,283 patients were treated.
 There was a daily average of 123.6 in-patients receiving treatment.

4. 8,536 out-patients received treatment, having 14,963 attendances.

5. 422 maternity patients were treated.

6. 373 babies were born.

7. 374 major and 1,079 minor operations were performed.

## In order to provide this service-

1. 4,001 x-rays were taken.

- 2. 7,059 pathology tests were carried out.
- 3. 6,127 physiotherapy treatments were given.

4. 179,007 meals were served.

5. 214 persons were employed on the staff.

This has been a year in which we maintained the growth which was experienced last year and although the daily average showed a decrease of eight patients per day, the same number of patients were treated during the comparable periods. This indicates a shorter stay in hospital. All our services showed a high level of results with the main increase being 30% in physiotherapy treatments.

## Regional Service:

The diagnostic departments, X-ray and Pathology, have continued to give service to the Medical Practitioners throughout the region. The visiting physiotherapy service has been maintained during the year and our qualified Occupational Therapist has made regular visits to other hospitals to assist them in this rapidly developing field of therapy.

The Group Linen Service continues to give excellent service to all the participating hospitals in the region.

## Red Cross Service:

On behalf of patients, not only at this hospital but also throughout the region, we say a very sincere tribute of thanks to the ladies of the Red Cross who for another year have conducted the blood taking sessions for the blood bank. Although the sessions themselves are supervised by our Medical and Nursing staff, it is the members of the Red Cross who arrange the sessions and organise the attendance of donors. During the year 317 pints of blood were used at the Base Hospital and 325 pints were used by other hospitals in the region.

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#### Life Governorships:

The highest honor that the Committee can confer on any person or body of persons in recognition of their efforts for the Hospital is a Life Governorship. This year the Ladies Auxiliary was pleased to nominate Mrs. Alma Anderson to receive this honor. Your Committee was very pleased indeed to accept this nomination and it is interesting to record that Mrs. Anderson's mother was honored by the King with membership of the Order of the British Empire for her charitable works, in particular for this Hospital.

#### FINANCE:

#### Maintenance-

In these days of spiralling costs expenses incurred in maintaining the hospital continue to increase. For the year our total expenditure amounted to \$583,590 while our

income from all sources was \$562,016, resulting in a deficit of \$21,574.

Expenditure increased by \$36,000 the main rise being \$30,000 in salaries and wages which amounted to \$357,000 or 61% of expenditure. The increase was brought about by the cost of living rise, higher award payments and the effect of payments made to persons employed in ancillary medical departments, this being the first year in which we have employed the actual number of staff approved as our establishment by the Hospitals and Charities Commission.

Administrative expenses rose by \$,6000 due to the increase in workers compensation insurance (\$3,000) and increased payments for travelling expenses with the appointment of visiting radiologists (\$1,500). Smaller rises in the cost of superannuation, telephone

charges and printing and stationery costs made up the balance of \$1,500.

Dietary costs were reduced by \$1,000 due to the drop in daily average while power, lighting and heating fell by \$3,000 due mainly to a reduction in the amount of wood used for the year.

Medical and surgical items continue their upward trend with drugs, x-ray films

and diagnostic agents each showing an increase of \$1,000.

Although our income for the year rose by \$9,000, it fell far short of what had

been anticipated and this was the major cause of our loss for the year.

Receipts from Commonwealth Government sources fell by \$23,000 as compared with the previous year. Income on account of T.B. patients was down \$12,000 and with the change in the formula used to calculate pharmaceutical benefits, our income from that area was reduced by \$11,000. Total income from Government sources fell by 4% to 35% of total income.

Invoices for patients' fees rose by \$29,000 to \$357,000 or 63% of income. This was due to the increase in non-public bed rates from October 1st, 1965. Had our daily average been as high as it was in 1964-65 we would have balanced our budget, however, following the fee increase, our daily average dropped suddenly so that for the year our daily average was 8 below the previous year's figure of 131. It is hoped that the latest rise in fees does not have a similar effect on the number of patients admitted to hospital during the coming year.

#### Capital:

During 1965-66 \$117,000 was spent on capital works for the improvement of the hospital of which \$98,000 was for the extensions for our new radiology and out-patients department. The balance of \$18,000 was used in providing additional plant, machinery, furniture and equipment, the main items being the provision of a nurses call system in the non-public section of the hospital and the purchase of two mobile emergency power generators for use at the Base or at other Wimmera hospitals in the event of a power failure.

Capital income included \$9,000 from Government grants, \$13,500 from donations

and \$2,000 interest on funds, making a total of \$104,500 in all.

This opportunity is taken on behalf of your Committee of Management to express our thanks to Commissioners, Dr. Lindell, Mr. McLellan and Mr. Thomas, and through them to their architectural and administrative staff for co-operation and assistance received throughout the year.

#### MATRON'S REPORT:

The Annual Graduation Ceremony for 1966 was held in the Nurses' Lecture Room on Friday, 25th March, with Miss M. Taylor, Matron of Geelong and District Hospital, as guest speaker.

The Ryan Prize for 1965 was awarded to Sister S. Richmond and Past Trainee's

Prize for the runner-up awarded to Sister A. Hancock.

Recruitment for 1967 is at a high level once again with students booking well in advance.

#### Buildings and Equipment:

This year saw the installation of an electrical stand-by plant which has been inspect to negotiation for some years with the Hospital and Charities Commission. The Commission, has now, as a pilot scheme, installed two mobile generators each of 40 K.V.A. which can be transferred to any hospital in the region in the event of a local temporary power failure.

A new nurses-patient call system has been installed with immense benefit to both nursing staff and patients. The old X-ray plant has been completely modernised and with the new unit will provide well balanced equipment for the opening of the new department which we expect to be in October. The lift installation is nearing completion and this will enable the existing one to be brought up to date. Other new major items of equipment installed or ordered during the year were a "Bird" respirator machine for out-patients department, an autoclave for the operating theatre, a steriliser for children's ward at a cost of \$10,000, all of which will provide better patient care which is the sole objective of your Committee.

## ANCILLARY SERVICES:

During the year service has been rendered to the community by our various departments: Pathology, Radiology, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy.

#### Pathology Department-

This year has seen considerable increase in this department primarily due to the dedication of our Pathologist, Dr. Leyton, who has provided the stimulus to the department. He has been ably supported by our Chief Pathological Technician. Mr. John Staniforth, who has arrived from England during the year and has proved a decided acquisition to this department with his knowledge and his personality. We welcome him and hope his stay will be both long and happy. During the year both of our bursary holders have graduated and we now have two science graduates, Miss Lorraine Hutchinson and Miss Margaret Ryan in the department.

#### Radiology Department-

Dr. Vesey, Radiologist, resigned to go to New South Wales in September last year and we were very fortunate indeed that through the good offices of Dr. H. Hardy of Geelong we have been able to maintain a radiological service for this area. We take this opportunity

to express our sincere thanks to Dr. Hardy and his colleagues for the continuity of service they have provided on a visiting basis and as this report goes to press, Dr. D'Arcy Laidlaw has arrived from England and taken up his appointment as full time radiologist at the hospital. We take this opportunity to extend a warm welcome to him and his family and wish them a happy stay in Horsham.

Whilst on the subject of medical staff we welcome Dr. M. Harding and his wife, Dr. P. Eurnett, who have joined our resident medical staff and trust that they will enjoy the stay with us.

#### Occupational Therapy-

Curing the year courses in elementary occupational therapy were conducted at Mayfield Centre sponsored by the Hospitals and Charities Commission with the view of giving basic knowledge to persons who may be interested in this type of work in their local hospital. These courses were attended by some persons in our region and as a follow-up our qualified occupational therapist visits these hospitals concerned to provide additional guidance in this field of therapeutic activity.

#### Physiotherapy-

We are pleased to report that Miss Alison Watts is still with us as regional physiotherapist and it is pleasing to record that the demands on her time are considerable, and that a revision of her itinerary was necessary giving a real indication of the value of this service to the region.

## HCNORARY STAFF:

#### Medical-

On behalf of your Committee of Management, our public patients and our nursing staff, I wish to pay this tribute to our Honorary Medical Staff for the services they have rendered in an honorary capacity to our public patients and for the time, thought and effort they give to our trainee nursing staff in lectures without which their training would not be complete and the benefits are reflected in their highly successful examination results.

#### Chaplains-

To our Honorary Chaplains we say a very sincere thank you for the spiritual comfort they give to our patients. It is a need which they alone can fulfil at a time when it is most needed. We are deeply conscious of the good will which we know exists between our hospital and our clergy.

#### Legal-

Throughout the year we have had recourse to our Honorary Solicitor for his professic; nal advice and we appreciate that his knowledge and advice are at all times readily available. For this we are most grateful.

#### Dental-

On behalf of our public patients, I take this opportunity to sincerely thank you Fionorary Dental Officers for the services they have rendered during the past year.

#### Auxiliaries and Service Clubs-

During the year the Auxiliaries and service clubs were most active on our behalf. The Ladies' Auxiliary raised \$5,324, the Younger Set \$1,040, the Apexians donated \$1,650 for items of equipment and the J.C's donated \$1,250 towards a mobile x-ray unit. To all of these organisations we are indeed indebted not only for their financial assistance but also for their continued interest in our hospital.

## WELFARE SERVICES:

During the year the City of Horsham Welfare Services Committee was formed and with Mr. Butler, Chairman, and Mr. Robinson, Secretary, we have quite an association with this organisation. On its formation it was decided that the Welfare Officer would be jointly appointed by the Welfare Committee and the Base Hospital. We take this opportunity to welcome Miss J. E. Hilliard to this position where she will be responsible for the social welfare needs of our patients. Miss Hilliard has already successfully launched a meals on wheels service and this hospital participates by preparing the meals which in turn are delivered by voluntary workers.

#### CONCLUSION:

On behalf of the Committee of Management, I would like to take this opportunity to convey our thanks, and those of the contributors, to all the members of the staff who, through their co-operation, have contributed towards the happy relationships which exist throughout the hospital to the benefit of our patients. We particularly thank Miss Woolley, our Matron, and her assistants, the Tutor Sisters, the Ward Charge Sisters and all nursing staff, trained and in training; the administrative staff, the technical and the lay staff, who together form the team which has given this hospital the very good name which it enjoys as a happy hospital.

On behalf of the Committee of Management and the recruitment officers of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, I take this opportunity to thank the Headmasters of the Schools and Mother Superior of the Convent for their assistance in providing opportunities for the recruitment of nurses among their pupils.







## WINDERA HOSPITALS' GROUP LINEN SERVICE

On 28th September, 1959, this laundry service to hospitals in the Wimmera region was commenced. It was a pilot scheme for the Hospitals and Charities Commission and was the first central linen service to be established outside the metrolopitan area.

At the inception of the service linen was supplied to the following hospitals:

Wimmera Base Hospital Nhill Hospital Stawell and District Hospital Cimboola and District Hospital Kaniva Hospital Murtoa Annexe Hospital Goroke Annexe Hospital Jeparit Annexe Hospital Wimmera Ambulance Service

The hospitals and institutions listed below have since joined the service:

June, 1960: Rupanyup and District Hospital. July, 1962: Avonlea Old Folks Home, Nhill.

September, 1962: Warracknabeal and District Hospital.

June, 1963: Minyip and District Hospital. November, 1964: Eventide Homes, Stawell. December, 1964: Beulah Bush Nursing Hospital.

A delivery of clean linen is made to each institution twice each week and at the same time soiled linen is collected. A charge at the rate of 10 cents per lb. dry weight is

made for all linen supplied.

At the end of each financial year a rebate is given to all participants. The amount of the rebate is dependant upon the operating cost for the year.

During the period under review, in common with all other enterprise, the Group Linen Service has had to bear many additional costs in wage and commodity prices. However most of these have been absorbed by the efficient conduct of the service. This opportunity is taken to express our appreciation to the Laundry Supervisor and to all his staff for their contribution in making it possible to maintain the very high standard at the comparatively reasonable cost.

There is no doubt in our minds that this is the most economical method of providing a linen service to a number of hospitals in any given area.
