**PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE CONTRIBUTORS**

**To the Life Governors and Contributors:**

It is my privilege and pleasure on behalf of the Committee of Management to submit this eighty-seventh Annual Report and Audited Statements of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1961.

**SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY :**

**During the year—**

1. 186 beds were available for 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
2. A total of 2821 in-patients were treated.
3. There was a daily average of 110 in-patients receiving treatment.
4. 4,422 out-patients received treatment, having 7,761 attendances.
5. 435 maternity patients were treated.
6. 389 babies were born in the hospital during the year.
7. 295 major and 952 minor operations were performed.

**In order to provide this service—**

1. 4,863 X-rays were taken.
2. 4,156 Pathology tests were carried out.
3. 4,552 Physiotherapy treatments were given.
4. 67,345 meals were served.
5. 181 persons were employed on the hospital staff and 19 on the Group Laundry Staff.

This year there was an increase of 105 patients treated, five more babies born and the daily average of in-patients receiving treatment increased from 101 to 110.6. These figures indicate a greater service to the community.

**REGIONAL SERVICE :**

The Group Laundry continues to function most satisfactorily, both from a service and economic point of view. Following the successful operation of this method of laundry, similar installations will be made in other regions in the State. During the year the Rupanyup Hospital entered the scheme and the participants are now Kaniva, Nhill, Dimboola, Jeparit, Goroke, Murtoa, Rupanyup, Stawell and Wimmera Base, and it is anticipated that the service will be able to meet the laundry requirements of the Avonlea Old Folks Home at Nhill. The maximum output reached the unexpected total of 6 tons in one week and the average cost for the year was 9.8d. per lb. This opportunity is taken to congratulate Mr. Norton, Laundry Supervisor and his staff on their efficient economic and co-operative functioning of the Group Laundry.

During the year the Hospitals and Charities Commission convened a conference of representatives of all regions at which the regional scheme, after 5 years operation, was reviewed and a preview of the functions for the future was given. A most stimulating agenda was prepared from suggestions by representatives. On the whole, the Regional scheme was considered a very helpful adjunct to the hospital services of the State.

The regional physiotherapy service continues to benefit patients in hospitals throughout the region. Regional equipment is available and has been used by various hospitals.

## BLOOD BANK :

Weekly blood taking sessions were continued throughout the year. On behalf of all committees in the region, our thanks are due to the Red Cross Ladies and to all blood donors who have continued to make possible this very important service.

The regional council met regularly during the year and a very friendly atmosphere of mutual assistance prevails throughout the region at all levels, namely, management, nursing and administration.

## FINANCE :

### Maintenance—

During the year, the total income from all sources was £203,605 and expenditure £200,819, with a surplus for the period of £2,786.

### Income—

Income for the year increased by £9,000. The main variations were—Government Grant decreased by £13,000, Income from T.B. patients decreased by £6,000, whilst income from patients increased by £25,000 and income from pharmaceutical benefits increased by £2,000.

### Expenditure—

The increase of £9,000 in expenditure represents an increase of 4½%. Whilst the daily average of patients treated increased by 9% all increases are related to the additional service given—Food £2,000, Drugs and dressings £2,500, Domestic items £4,000. Salaries and wages increased by only £500.

### Capital Finance—

Capital expenditure for the year amounted to £51,400, of which £33,450 was spent on new buildings. Units 7 & 8 of the nurses homes were completed. One of these units is for senior staff and the other is a teaching unit for trainee nurses, which also provides accommodation for nurses while they attend the preliminary training school. The new Nurses' Home project is now complete and provides accommodation for 84 members of the nursing staff.

£2,700 was spent on additions and major alterations, £9,800 on machinery and equipment and £5,400 on the Group Laundry. Towards these costs the Hospitals & Charities Commission made available £28,600. During the past seven years the sum of £258,000 has been spent on buildings, renovations and equipment.

The Committee of Management are indeed grateful for the interest and assistance so willingly given at all times by the Commissioners, Dr. Lindell, Mr. McLellan and Mr. Thomas, the administrative and architectural staffs of the Commission.

## MATRONS' REPORT :

The Annual Graduation Ceremony was held on Friday, 24th February, with Miss P. Osborne, Deputy Director of the College of Nursing, Australia, as guest speaker.

The new Training Unit has been in use since January and has proved most satisfactory to the Tutorial Staff.

## NURSES' HOME :

The new Nurses Home project, commenced four years ago, has now been completed and, in a setting of lawns and trees, we now have a nurses home of a very high standard. The principle of dispersed units, rather than a multi-story building has been favourably commended upon both by nursing staff and those who have come to inspect the units.



### **HONORARY STAFF :**

To our Honorary Staff, Consultant, Medical, Dental, Legal and Chaplains, your committee is indeed grateful for the honorary service given to our patients. To the Medical Staff for their lectures to our nurses, to our Dentists for the service to public patients, to our Honorary Solicitor for his advice so freely given to the Committee of Management and to our Chaplains for the spiritual help and assistance given to all our patients.

During the year, Dr Alan Bridge resigned from the Honorary Medical Staff after several years of service as Resident and Honorary Officer and left to practise in Melbourne. The Committee recorded their grateful appreciation of his service to the hospital by a minute of appreciation in the books and also conferred upon him a Life Governorship of the Hospital.

### **VISITING CLINICAL SERVICES :**

During the year, the community was served through this hospital by visiting specialists clinics at regular intervals and the opportunity was taken by Medical Practitioners throughout the region to refer patients requiring specialist consultation to these clinics. On behalf of the medical staff and patients we express our thanks for these services to the Peter McCallum Clinic, the Consultant Council of Poliomyelitis and the Director of the Department of Mental Hygiene.

### **AUXILIARIES :**

Another year of loyal service has been rendered by our Auxiliaries, the Ladies' Auxiliary and the Younger Set Auxiliary. On behalf of the hospital and your committee we express our appreciation of the personal service rendered by the members of these Auxiliaries.

In December of last year, the Committee of Management received a most generous donation of £7,000 from the Horsham Old Folks' Auxiliary and this sum has made possible the erection of the Geriatric Units, which are at present in the course of construction. The sincere thanks and appreciation of all members of the community are extended to this small but hard working body of ladies who by their efforts have made it possible for the committee to embark on this project which will fulfil a long felt need towards the care of the aged of Horsham and district.

### **COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:**

On the 4th of June, the Committee of Management suffered a severe loss in the death of Mr. J. V. S. Ward, who served on the Committee for 26 years. Mr. Gil Le Plastrier of Horsham was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Committee.

### **LIFE GOVERNORSHIP :**

In recognition of outstanding service rendered to the hospital over a number of years, Life Governorships have been conferred upon Mr. Harold Randall (immediate Past President) and Dr. Alan Bridge.

### **CONCLUSION :**

On behalf of the Committee of Management, I take this opportunity to express our appreciation of the services rendered by our Matron, Miss L. Woolley and her assistants, the nursing staff, both trained and student, the Tutor sisters, the administration, technical and lay staff.

On behalf of the patients we thank the Red Cross ladies for their library service, the ladies of visiting guilds and other organisations.

We thank the Head Masters of the schools and Mother Superior of the Convent for the opportunities provided to enable recruitment of nurses and also for the spirit of social service that they foster in their pupils. The Press have been most helpful throughout the year in publicising both our needs and our achievements and I am happy to record the cordial relationships which prevail between the members of the Press and the hospital.

To my colleagues of the Committee of Management, I thank them for their help, their thoughtful deliberation and progressive policy in the structural and administrative aspects of the hospital. To all who have assisted the hospital throughout the year, either by donation or personal service, I say a very sincere thank you and trust that together we may look forward to another year of progressive service to the community.

On 14th April, the Horsham Orchestra presented a concert in the Masonic Hall in aid of our Auxiliary, which resulted in a profit of £24/8/0 to our funds. We thank you all for a lovely program.

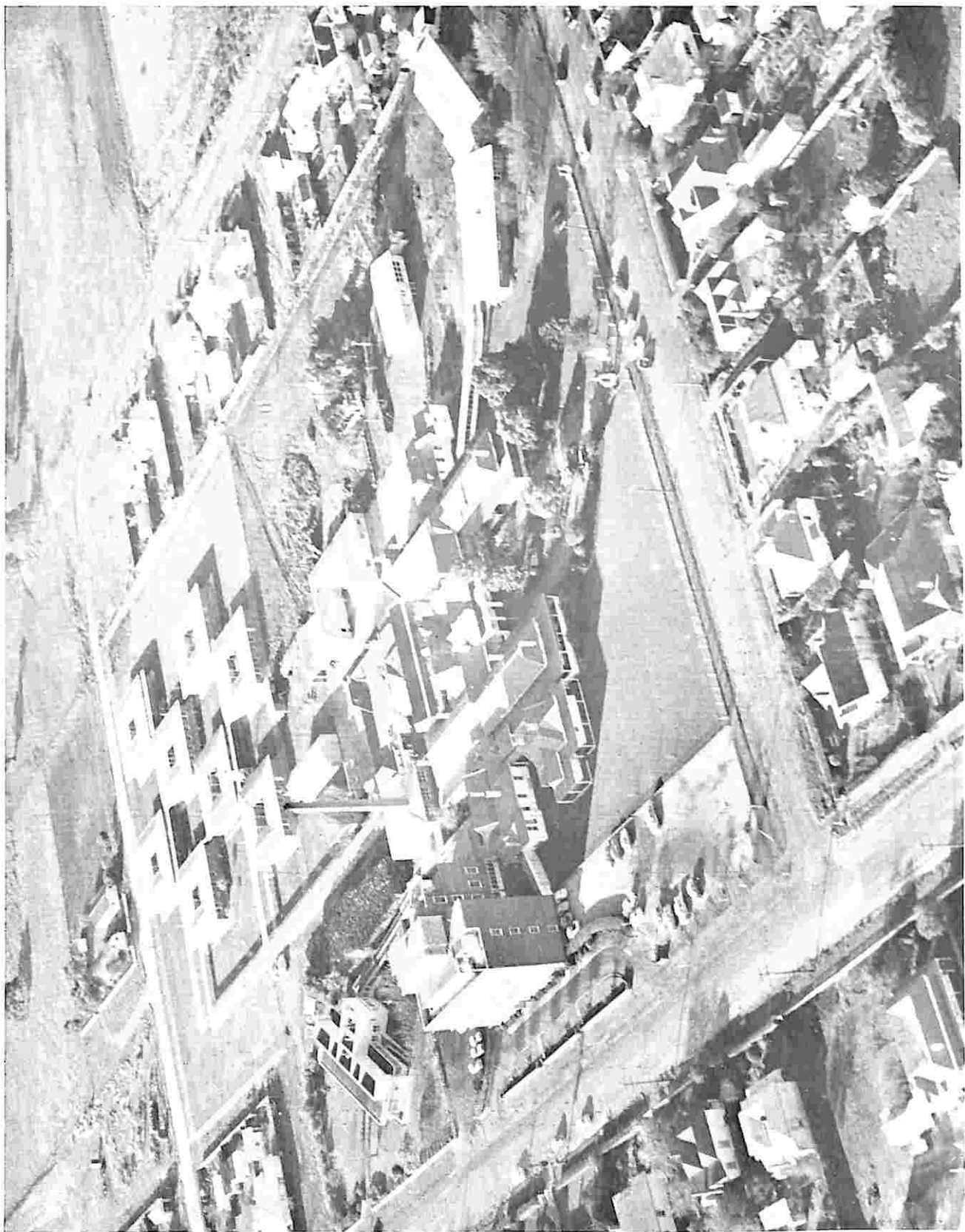

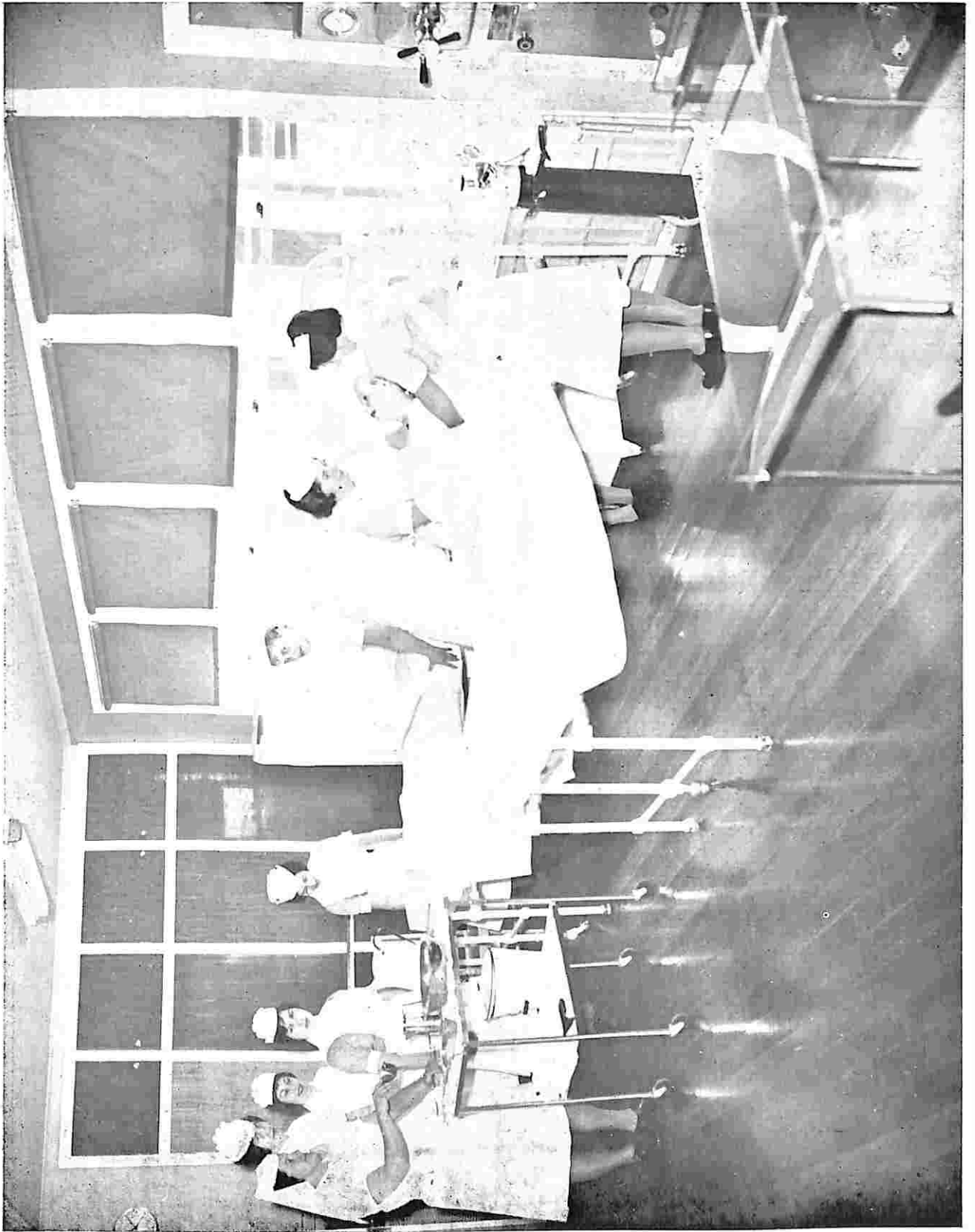

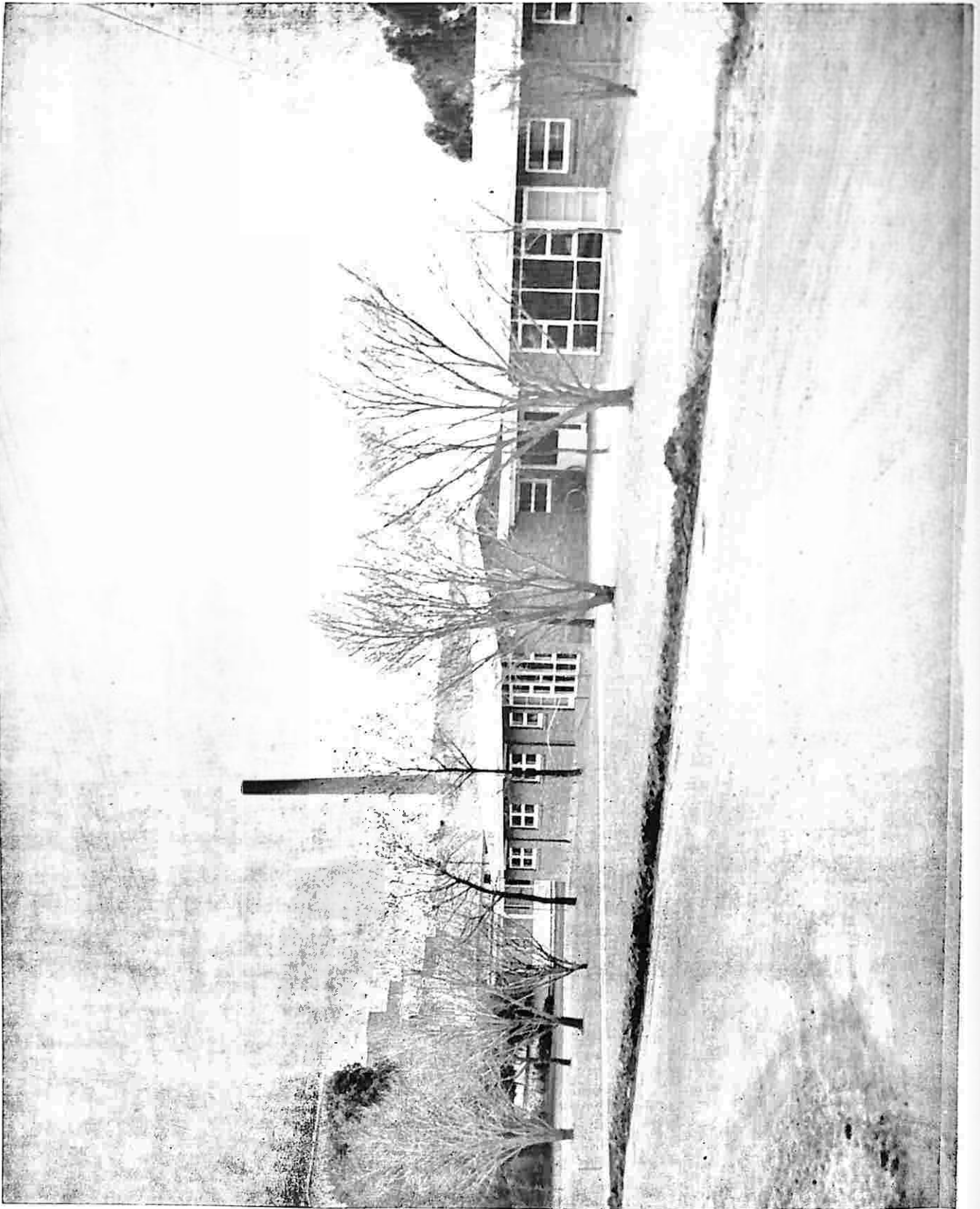

## REGIONAL PHYSIOTHERAPY SERVICE

We were again fortunate in having the services of our Regional Physiotherapist, Miss Madeline Tomlinson.

For the year ended 30th June, 1961, 580 patients were treated having 1737 attendances. This service cost a total of £1,455 half of which was borne by the participating Hospitals, and half by the Wimmera Base Hospital.
