**PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE CONTRIBUTORS**

To the Life Governors and Contributors:

On behalf of the Committee of Management, it is my privilege and pleasure, to report on another year of progress in this, the eighty-sixth Annual Report and Audited Statements of Accounts of the Hospital for the financial year, ended 30th June, 1960.

**SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY:**

During the year—

1. 186 beds were available for 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
2. A total of 2,716 in-patients were treated.
3. There was a daily average of 101 in-patients receiving treatment.
4. 4,698 out-patients received treatment, having 7,996 attendances.
5. 438 maternity patients were treated.
6. 387 babies were born in the hospital during the year.
7. 333 major and 863 minor operations were performed.

In order to provide this service—

1. 4,595 X-rays were taken.
2. 3,917 Pathology tests were carried out.
3. 5,200 Physiotherapy treatments were given.
4. 168,762 meals were served.
5. 180 persons were employed on the staff and 14 on the Group Laundry Staff.

**REGIONAL GROUP LAUNDRY :**

Some 15 months ago, the Hospitals & Charities Commission conceived the idea of projecting the Group Linen Service, as operating for Metropolitan Hospitals, to a regional service and the Wimmera Region was selected as the experiment. Under this system, all linen in the region is pooled and laundered at the Base, by whom it is collected and delivered to the participating hospitals.

After many conferences, standards for items of linen were fixed, additions were made to equipment at this hospital and on 1st October, 1959, the Service was commenced. After overcoming initial teething troubles, it is now an unqualified success with the advantages of being more economical, the average cost to date being nine pence per lb., and it relieves smaller hospitals of both laundry staff and linen supply problems and by centralisation under expert knowledge, provides a high standard of laundry.

In making this possible, our thanks are extended to the Executive Officers of the Melbourne Hospitals Group Linen Service, for their knowledge so freely given to us, the Matrons of the hospitals in the region for their assistance in determining standards for items of laundry and their patience in the initial stages, to the Hospitals & Charities Commission for their Architectural and financial assistance and to our Laundry Supervisor and staff for the difficulties under which they worked during the alteration and change over period. All have contributed to what is now a very real regional service.

**REGIONAL COUNCIL :**

This is a very live body of representatives of all hospitals, who meet regularly to discuss the problems of all the hospitals in the region. During the year, the Regional Co-ordinator, Mrs A. K. Kealy, resigned and to her, we extend our thanks for her help since the formation of the regional plan and extend a welcome to her successor, Miss Janet Thomas.

**PHYSIOTHERAPY SERVICE :**

The regional physiotherapy service has continued to function throughout the region to those patients in need of this treatment. Miss Janet Campbell resigned in February, 1960, to proceed overseas and in her place, Miss Madeline Tomlinson was appointed Regional Physiotherapist.

**BLOOD BANK :**

Blood taking sessions have been carried out every week and this opportunity is taken to thank the Red Cross Ladies and all blood donors, for the practical assistance in this very important work.

**MAINTENANCE :**

Total income for the year was £194,805 and Expenditure £191,600, resulting in a surplus of £3,205.

**INCOME:**

Income for the year showed an increase over last year of £15,257, with the main variations being from Government sources £9,000 and from patients fees of £7,090, this being due to a higher daily average.

**EXPENDITURE :**

Overall expenditure increased by £10,943 and was incurred due to increases in cost of Provisions and Surgery & Dispensary items consistent with a higher daily average, and salaries and wages, following basic wage rise and marginal increases.

**CAPITAL :**

The capital grants received from the Hospitals & Charities Commission this year amounted to £49,791. These monies were spent on the next two units of the Nurses' Home and setting up the Group Linen Service.

**BUILDINGS:**

Your Committee has continued with the rehabilitation program in the public section of the hospital and this year, the Female Ward was completely renovated with new ceilings, services and painting. All verandahs surrounding the whole block have been renewed and Visitors' Toilets have been installed. These works were carried out at a cost of £4,000. This program will be continued on a yearly basis to provide the highest possible standard of patient care and efficiency for our nursing staff.

**EQUIPMENT:**

During the year, several improvements and replacements were made to keep our equipment abreast of modern developments in this field. A new, high speed sterilizer with electronic timing device was installed in female ward. It is our intention to provide these for all wards. Male and Female wards are now equipped, and ultimately all boiling water sterilizers will be superseded. A new type of operating theatre table was purchased, and new theatre lights were installed in both theatres.

**NURSES' HOME :**

There are at present, two units under construction, one for Matron, Deputy Matron and Senior Staff accommodation, and the other a Nurse Training and Lecture Unit. With the completion of these, the whole project will, at least for the foreseeable future, be complete and your hospital will have a Nurses' Home of a very high standard set in pleasant surroundings.

**HONORARY STAFF:**

To our Honorary Staff, we are indeed grateful for another year of service. To the Honorary Medical Staff we are indebted for their services to our public patients, particularly over the very trying period during which we were without Resident Medical Officers and for their time spent in lectures to our trainee nursing staff.

To our Honorary Dentists for their services, given to our public patients, to our Honorary Solicitor for his advice and to our Honorary Chaplains, for their spiritual comfort and help to our patients, we express our sincere thanks.

#### **VISITING CLINICAL SERVICES :**

The specialists from the Peter MacCallum Clinic recommenced visiting this hospital on the 2nd July, 1959 and since then, have made regular monthly visits for consultations with cancer patients. On behalf of the Medical Staff and patients, we express our sincere thanks for this service.

During the year, the representatives of the Consultative Council of Poliomyelitis have continued their regular visits to assist in the follow up treatment and advice to these patients.

Regular clinics have been conducted by the specialists from the Department of Mental Hygiene and for this service, we convey our thanks to the Director and his medical officers.

#### **NURSING STAFF :**

The Annual Graduation Ceremony was held on Friday the 19th February and Miss M. Connor, Secretary of the Victorian College of Nursing was the Guest Speaker. Sister S. G. Gibson was the Ryan Prize winner for the year and the following nurses were congratulated in successfully completing their training—

We look forward to the completion of the Nurse Training Unit in the Nurses' Home project. This unit will provide seven bedrooms for trainees in the Preliminary Training School, all training facilities, the Tutor Sister's office and a library.

#### **AUXILIARIES :**

Once again, the Ladies' Auxiliary has concluded a year of service to the hospital in raising the sum of £1,200. It will be noted in their President's report, which appears elsewhere, that the majority of their money was raised by personal efforts.

The Younger Set Auxiliary has had another successful year in raising £440.

Your committee appreciates all that is done by these voluntary workers for the patients with no thought of reward.

#### **ADMINISTRATION :**

In March of this year, Matron Woolley was awarded a Florence Nightingale Scholarship in Post Graduate Administration and is at present at the College of Nursing of Australia. In her absence, which will continue until December, Miss F. Thomas was appointed relieving Matron.

#### **COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT :**

We record, with regret, the death of Mr. P. L. Bull, Goroke and Mr. A. L. Hutchesson and welcome to the Committee of Management, Mr. A. G. Brook, Goroke and Mr. B. W. Gould.

#### **GERIATRIC UNIT :**

As this report goes to press, we have now called tenders for the erection of two ward units, each to house eleven aged patients and also tenders for the purchase for the removal of the old Nurses' Home. It is hoped that costs will be within a range that will permit us to obtain Hospitals & Charities Commission approval to proceed with these works.

#### **CONCLUSION :**

Reference throughout this report has been made of progress in buildings and equipment and your Committee takes this opportunity to express their sincere thanks to the Hospitals and Charities Commission and their staff for their assistance, both financial and advisory, during the year.

We record with pleasure, our appreciation of the services rendered to our patients by all members of the staff, Nursing Administration, Trained and Trainee Nursing Staff, Tutor Sisters, Administration, Lay and Technical staff.

On behalf of our patients, we extend our thanks to the representatives of Church Guilds and visiting organisations and to the Red Cross Librarians, for all that they have done.

Once again, the Head Masters of the Schools and Mother Superior of the Convent have provided the necessary opportunities for those recruiting nurses amongst their pupils. We do appreciate this ever ready co-operation in this necessary phase of continuing hospital service.

We thank the Press for their interest and publicity given to the affairs of the hospital during the year.

To all who have helped during the year, either by donations or personal efforts, we thank you sincerely and take this opportunity to extend to you, an invitation to visit your hospital.

## WIMMERA BASE HOSPITAL LADIES' AUXILIARY — ANNUAL REPORT

Of our 46 members, 2 resigned during the year through transfer. They were Mrs. R. Kitson to Geelong and Mrs. Doolan to Bendigo. We thank them for their sterling work during their residence here. Our objective this year has been to raise funds for redecorating the Female Wards. Our year ended in November and we commenced duties in March.

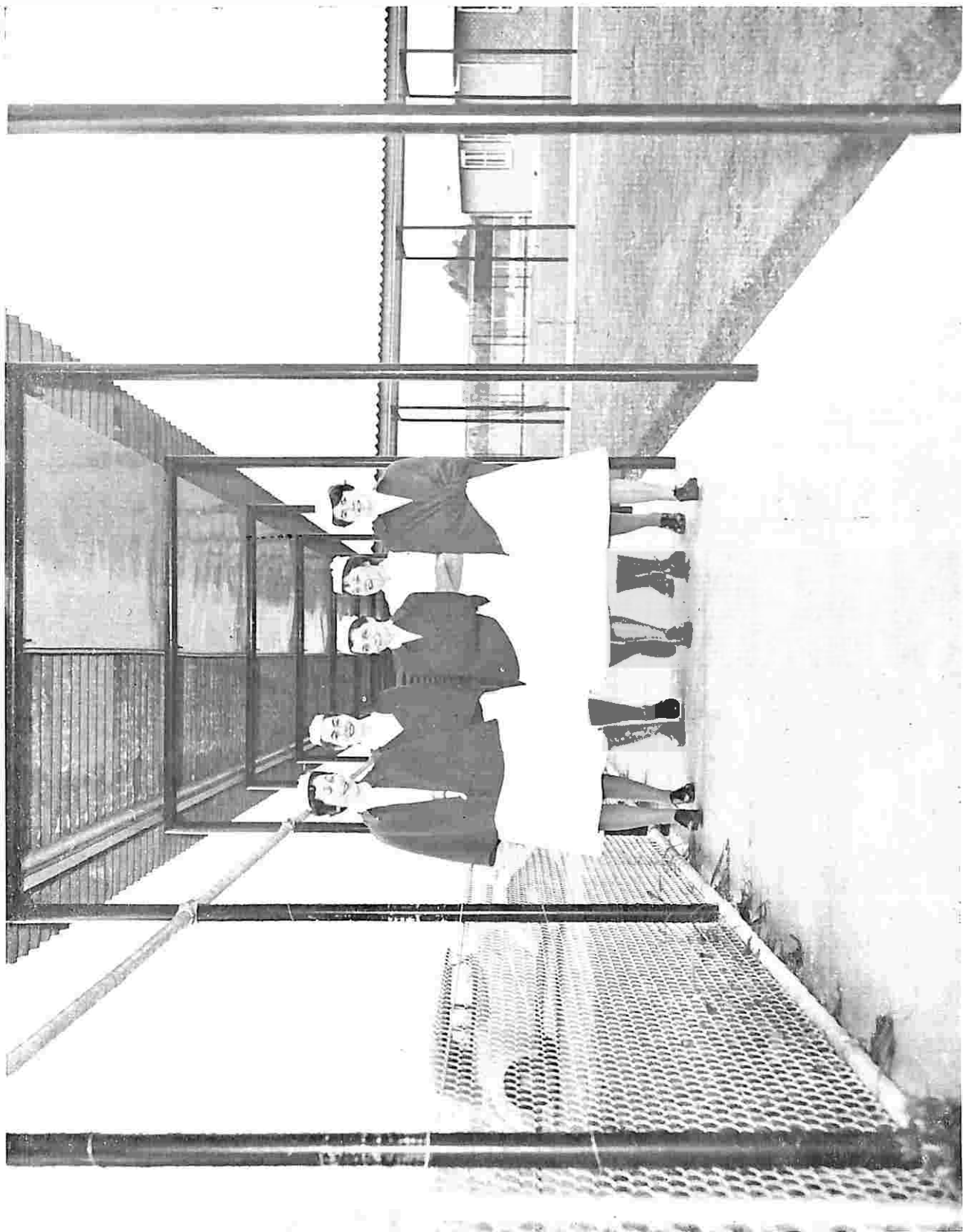
