





HAROLD SMITH

On Wednesday, 14th September, 1955, the Committee of Management suffered a profound loss in the death of Mr. Harold Smith.

The late Mr. Smith was elected to the Committee of Management on April 12, 1932 and held the office of President during the arduous war years 1939-1944. At the time of his death he was Chairman of the Finance Committee and Chairman of the Building Committee. His wide knowledge of all matters pertaining to building, his sound judgment and helpful advice will be sadly missed by his fellow members of the committee.

Wednesday, the 21st September, 1955, brought to a close a long life of charitable works in the death of Mrs. Phoebe Faull Anderson. During this time Mrs. Anderson was personally responsible for raising more than £17,500 for the Wimmera Base Hospital and for many years had been Vice-President of the Ladies' Auxiliary. She will be greatly missed throughout the Wimmera.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO THE CONTRIBUTORS

Another year having been completed, the Hospital has now given eighty-two years of service to the community and it is my privilege on behalf of the Committee of Management to present this Annual Report and financial statements for the year ended 30th June, 1956.

REGIONAL PLAN:

During 1954 the Regional Plan for Hospitals was extended to the Wimmera and during the year under review considerable steps have been taken to co-ordinate the Hospital Services throughout the area. Council meetings with representation of all hospitals have been held each quarter with problems resolved on a regional basis, conferences have been held by Medical Practitioners, Matrons and Administrators from the participating hospitals. The Hospitals and Charities Commission have allocated to the region five insulcots to be strategically placed throughout the region for the treatment of premature babies, thus saving each hospital the expense of purphering this new openative commission area of the meeting for the treatment of premature babies, thus saving each hospital the expense of purchasing this very expensive equipment, a walking machine for the rehabilitation of patients has also been provided to the Base Hospital for use as required by the Hospitals in the region, and further equipment for regional use will be supplied as it becomes available.

SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY

DURING THE YEAR-

- 186 beds were available for 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. 1
- A total of 3,937 in-patients were treated.
- There was a daily average of 105 in-patients receiving treatment. 3.
- 4,880 out-patients received treatment, having 9,403 attendances. 4

- 440 maternity patients were treated. 389 babies were born in the Hospital during the year. 6
- 379 major and 880 minor operations were performed. 7.

IN ORDER TO PROVIDE THIS SERVICE :

- 4,979 X-ray films were taken. 1.
- 3,717 Pathological tests were carried out. 2
- 5.951 Physiotherapy treatments were given. 3.
- 180,940 meals were served. 4.
- 5. 712,192 articles were laundered.
- 198 persons were employed on the staff.

THIS SERVICE COST:

£168,809 for the year. The average cost per day for in-patients—f4/5/4. The average cost per patient treated-£56/4/-.

FINANCE—The activities of the Hospital were carried on during a year of rising costs as evidenced by the increase in the basic wage by cost of living rises of 19/- per week this being 8% of the basic wage of 30/6/55, this has been responsible for an increase of 8.7% in the daily bed cost. The following will show the percentages under respective headings of income and expenditure :

These diagrams serve to emphasise the important part played by the Government in the supply of funds for maintaining the Hospital, and the large proportion of expenditure that is incurred in salaries and wages according to the awards of the present day.

During the year the total income received from all sources was $\pounds 164.090$ and total expenditure $\pounds 168.809$ leaving a deficit for the year of $\pounds 4.719$.

BUILDINGS—An active maintenance program was carried out during the year embracing the painting of all wards in the non-public section, and considerable works in the public female ward which have brought this unit to a modern standard, and it is hoped that the same will be done for the public male ward during the coming year. A pantry has been provided for night nursing staff meals in the public section. Through the generosity and personal effort of members of Apex Club, a room has been painted and furnished for the use of ambulatory patients, especially the aged, where they may sit and read; this has fulfilled a long felt need in the Hospital.

NURSES' HOME—After full consideration of plans and specifications tenders have now been let for the erection of the first two units of the Nurses' Home, the successful tenderer being Mr. R. J. Turnbull of Horsham, who, as this report goes to print, has commenced work on the site. The Committee of Management have decided that the new Nurses' Home will be known as the Felstead Memorial Nurses' Home as a tribute to the late Dr. G. R. Felstead who for so many years served the Wimmera in general, and this Hospital in particular.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF—The Committee of Management takes this opportunity to express their thanks for the services rendered throughout the year by the Medical Staff in an Honorary capacity to the patients in the public sections

of the Hospital, and also for the time they have freely given in lecturing to our student nurses. Our thanks are also due to the members of the Honorary Dental Staff and to our Honorary Solicitor for his advice so readily available.

PETER MCCALLUM CLINIC-It is hoped by the Committee of Management and the Medical Staff that these clinics will be resumed as soon as possible and to restore this specialised service to the Wimmera region.

CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL OF POLIOMYELITIS-The clinics conducted by this Council have been continued throughout the year, providing a most valuable follow-up service for those persons who have been affected by poliomyelitis and our thanks are due to the Council and those who conduct the clinics.

SERVICES:

Pathology—Physiotherapy—a Madray—The work in each of these departments tends to be on the increase as these services are made more use of by medical practitioners throughout the region, and if this Hospital is to play its true role of a Base Hospital, it is essential that the present high standard equipment and efficiency be maintained in these departments.

A Graduation Ceremony was held in the Nurses' Home garden on Feb. 22nd, the Guest Speaker being Miss S. Kirk, Nursing Executive Officer, Hospitals & Charities Commission.

The prizes remain limited to two by common consent of the Ward Sisters.

As the result of a garden fete in December, marred by inclement weather, and a successful Ball, the Nurses have contributed £420 towards their New Nurses' Home.

The establishment of Nursing Aide Training within this region is important. By this means we can provide a planned training for girls wishing to nurse who are not eligible for student nurse training. They make up a useful group who can supply basic nursing needs for the chronic sick. We have at present six Nursing Aide Trainees undertaking the twelve months course.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT-The Committee of Management suffered a profound loss in the death of Mr. Harold Smith on 14th September, 1955. A welcome is extended to Mr. P. L. Bull who joined the committee as a repre-

sentative of our newest Annexe-Goroke Hospital.

ANNEXES:

MURTOA-This hospital continues to give excellent service to the community of Murtoa and district and it is interesting to note from the annual report of the Annexe that 33 babies were born there during the year.

GOROKE—On the 1st November, 1955, the Goroke Hospital, which had previously functioned on lease from the Goroke Benevolent Society, became an annexe of the Wimmera Base Hospital. I am now pleased to report that since that day there have not been any staff worries and also that with the financial assistance of the Hospitals & Charities Commission, new nurses' quarters are now in course of construction, a new operating table has been installed and a complete set of surgical instruments provided. We extend our congratulations to the Sub-Committee of Management and the Goroke Ladies' Auxiliary for their keen interest in the Goroke Annexe Hospital.

LADIES' AUXILIARY—The Ladies' Auxiliary report published later in this report reveals another very successful year of fund raising by means of many and

varied efforts. Your Committee of Management is indeed grateful to the President, Mrs. G. Forsyth, and members of the Auxiliary for their decision to contribute the whole of their efforts towards the building of the New Nurses' Home.

YOUNGER SET AUXILIARY—During the year a new Auxiliary—the Younger Set Auxiliary—was formed with Miss Judy Harfield as their President. Ways and means of raising funds for the Hospital are being explored and we thank these young people for their practical interest in the hospital and wish them a very successful year.

3LK BADIO APPEAL—This year the **3LK** Appeal, so far as this hospital is concerned, is to be for the New Nurses' Home for which it will be necessary for this hospital to raise the sum of £30,000. With this in view it was decided by the Committee of Management that a separate Appeals Committee be formed. Early this year this committee was formed and under the Chairmanship of Mr. G. Leivesley has been meeting regularly devising ways and means of reaching our objective of £30,000. The support given to the appeal by all service clubs and organisations of Horsham has been most gratifying. As this report is being written notification has been received that the **3LK** Radio appeal will be held in Horsham this year on Sunday, November 18th, and we appeal to all our friends and supporters to rally around and make this a memorable and successful appeal.

ADMINISTRATION—To the Members of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman, and Commissioners H. E. Palmer and A. J. McLellan we extend our thanks for their consideration of our problems and assistance during the year.

CONCLUSION—On behalf of the Committee of Management I would thank all the service clubs, Apex, Lions, Rotary and R.S.L. for their efforts on our behalf. I would like to extend to Mrs. W. Henry our appreciation of the service she has given in an Honorary capacity for the past 5 years by resharpening all the hypodermic needles used in the Hospital. The Red Cross Library service has concluded another year of service for which the patients are extremely grateful.

We are grateful for the assistance rendered and interest in the Hospital fostered amongst their pupils by the Head Masters and Teachers of the schools, and the Mother Superior and Teachers of the Convent.

To all those who by personal effort or financial assistance have helped this Hospital during the year we extend a very sincere thank you.

To the press who have made known to the public our problems, our hopes and sometimes our disappointments, we say thank you.

Your committee is appreciative of the co-operation and loyalty shown by the Resident Medical Staff, the Nursing and lay Staff which have continued to create a happy atmosphere within the hospital to the ultimate benefit of our Patients.

Another year of service completed—another year begun.

ANNUAL REPORT

This annual report is really for 16 months ending June 30, 1956 as we have been asked to extend our year to coincide with the Hospitals financial year. Numerous efforts were held during this time results and details of which will be given in the Treasurer's Report.

The total sum raised being $\pounds 1,922/17/11$. At the beginning of 1956 we were extremely sorry to say good-bye to our efficient and popular Secretary, Mrs. Bishop, at a party and presentation given her by Auxiliary Members, also we lost the services of Mrs. Moore as Treasurer. Our thanks to her for her work and hope to have her back again later on.

At our March meeting after recess we were fortunate indeed to have Mrs. Dempster and Mrs. Dodgson elected Secretary and Treasurer respectively and both are extremely capable and willing.

In August, 1955, 2 Younger Set was formed with Miss Judy Harfield as President and this enthusiastic body of young people are proving a wonderful asset to the money raising efforts. No specified equipment was purchased for the Hospital as in other years, as we have been asked by the Committee of Management for full co-operation in the all out effort to raise the money needed for the New Nurses' Home to be called Dr. Felstead Memorial Home, and members of the Auxiliary- were only too pleased to have the privilege of working for a tribute to the memory of one who had done so much for the people of Horsham and district.

At our meeting in May it was decided to abandon all small efforts apart from raffles and adopt a plan of house to house collections and contributions over a period of 6 months and later conduct a Kiosk for the sale of goods each Friday. This structure is to be erected on a block in Pynsent Street. by generous consent of Mr. Jack Bolton, in a position and for a period of time convenient to him. This should be a steady source of income and we are grateful to Mr. Bolton for his co-operation. The amount in to date from house to house collections is f700/9/- in cash, as well as amounts promised in monthly contributions. This, I consider a most gratifying result and though it hasn't been a pleasant task, people have been generous and good humoured, and I must thank all who have given both large and small amounts. Our country members have been most helpful and contributions of money and dinners for the raffle table have been collected by them.

Toall Auxiliary members I extend my grateful thanks for help and support given so happily during my time as President, to Secretary and Treasurer past and present, also to Matron, our Hostess, for afternoon tea, Miss Healey and Miss Milkins. I want them to know how much it is appreciated. Thank you too, to Mr. McIver for advice and guidance in matters connected with the work of the Auxiliary.

I must also include a word of appreciation for the press and the girls that have come along to report our doings and to keep the work of the Auxiliary before the public. This is a most important factor in the success of any undertaking for raising money for the work of the Hospital.




