

TO THE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS:

On behalf of the members of the Committee of Management, I have pleasure in presenting to you the 79th Annual Report of your Hospital.

Once again the year's work presented difficulties, but these have been met and are being overcome.

Our chief problems being :

- 1. Patient accommodation
 - a. More beds are required for all types of Non-Public Patients.
 - b. Temporarily by renovating the old Wards, a better type of accommodation has been provided for Public Patients.
- 2. Staff accommodation—
 - An urgent and ever pressing need is more rooms in which to accommodate members of the Nursing Staff.
 - a. The correct solution would be the drawing up of plans and specifications for a new Nurses' Home.
 - If Government money is available this should be done, but under the present building policy at least 25 per cent. of such cost must be found locally. The preliminary estimated cost of such a Home to meet Hospital needs would be in round figures £200,000. A present start on such a project would mean three years as a minimum before availability
 - b. Consideration must be given to the provision of the extension of present accommodation to meet actual demands now.
 - Our Nurses are now living in five Hospital Sections, in addition to some members living out.
 - This problem is a priority one for 1953-1954.
- 3. Staff acquisitions-
 - The position has eased, particularly regarding Domestic Staff, but until amenities equivalent to other Hospitals are available, difficulty can be expected regarding Nursing Staff.
- 4. Maintenance Services-
 - Consideration will now have to be given to:
 - a. Steam and Hot Water production 24 hours a day.
 - b. Appointment of Mechanical Engineer (during winter months light, power, heat and Steam costs £1,000 per month.)
 - c. Refrigeration and lift maintenance is reasonably and satisfactorily under control at present.
- 5. A lack of storage space for domestic, surgical, mechanical and other bulk stores is needed. Your Committee has this matter in hand.

PROBLEMS affecting patient wellbeing and Hospital policy generally have been given consideration, but no finality has yet been recorded regarding:

1. Medical Superintendent Appointment.

2. Radiologist Appointment.

3. Provision for new set-up of Out-Patients' Department and a new entrance for casualty patients by Ambulance. These are problems which will be considered this year.

These problems are growing pains and are sound, indicating the Hospital's growth. During the last few years our work has expanded tremendously. Briefly the Hospital has apart from all Staff members

Three Resident Medical Officers.

One Dispenser,

Two X-Ray Radiographers,

One Bio-Chemist,

One Physiotherapist.

In addition, the T.B. Chalet is fully occupied, a monthly clinic of the Peter McCallum Institute is held and a quarterly Clinic by the Council on Poliomyelitis. All this work is carried out by your Committee for the good of the people of the Wimmera generally.

There has been a slight falling off in daily average of Patients treated. During the year, though, more Patients were treated this year, 3,106 as against 3,018 last year. Statistical figures are tabled herewith:

FINANCE.—The year has been a satisfactory one because:

1. More Government money has been made available.

2. The charge for Public Beds has helped.

There is a big gap between 18/- per day and 46/7 per day and we expect the Government to help in like ratio to increased Maintenance Costs.

3. Patients' fees have been correspondingly higher.

4. The Commonwealth Grant to Patients who are subscribers to approved Hospital Benefits Societies has been of great help.

At this point might I stress that every person should join up with his Lodge or an approved Hospital Benefits Society and thus help himself and his Hospital.

Last year £23,359 was received from patients' fees—this year £30,265, an increase of just on £7,000.

Total general expenditure on Maintenance Account was £122,353, with receipts showing £128.692 or a surplus on our Income and Expenditure Account of £6,399.

RENOVATIONS—The policy of your Committee has been continued during the year and will be maintained until all those Sections of our old Hospital are placed in good repair. All feel that such cost is far less than interest on Capital for new Buildings and at the present time this policy is warranted instead of embarking on new building projects which would necessitate an appeal to the people for money to meet district quota of the amount needed.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF-We are appreciative of the work of the Honorary Medical Officers which entails co-operation and oversight of work of our Resident Medical Officers, the progressive teaching of our trainee staff, and a general willingness to assist in those matters affecting Patients' welfare.

Our thanks are also extended to the members of our Honorary Dental Staff. We welcome with friendship two new members, Dr. Mark O'Brien as an Honorary Medical Officer and Mr. Desmond V. Kelly as an Honorary Dentist.

PATHOLOGY DEPARTMENT—Mr. Watson left us to go to Geelong during the year. We miss him and regret his departure.

PHYSIOTHERAPY DEPARTMENT—We congratulate Mr. Graham on the great extension of the work of this department during the year.

OBITUARY—It is with regret and a sincere appreciation of services rendered to this Hospital that we record the death of Sister Velma Crafter and Mr. W. L. P. Rielly.

HELPER-Another death we wish to record is that of a staunch, loyal and untiring worker for Hospital Patients, Miss Elsie Davis.

PETER McCALLUM CLINIC—Our thanks are due to the Government for the splendid work this Clinic is doing. Dr. Stoll, visiting Specialist, has the willing co-operation of all medical officers in Horsham and District and this Clinic must prove of inestimable value to the many Patients who need consultative advice.

CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL ON POLIOMYELITIS—This quarterly Clinic is still doing excessive work, and helping many Patients. The Health Department now acting internally and carrying out its own almoners work, instead of as previously through the office of the State Children's Welfare Department.

NURSING STAFF—A break in a link of services to the community. Matron Arthur has left us. She will be missed. Her farewells were many, culminating in a big public farewell, sponsored by HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR, Cr. W. J. Morson. "Matron, the wish of all in Horsham is that you may be spared to enjoy a lovely and happy life's eventide."

Although Matron Cox was not appointed until after the end of our financial year, we do extend to her all good wishes and trust her stay with us will be long and happy. During the hiatus of departure and appointment we thank Sister McIntyre for carrying on at the Hospital as acting Matron.

GRADUATION CEREMONY—This year a splendid address by Mr. J. L. Plummer, Manager of the Ballarat Base Hospital, was given. The topic this year was presented to the Nurses from the angle of an administrative officer.

Certificates were handed out to the Nurses who passed the Nurses' Board Final Examination and the Florence Nightingale Pledge to all our trainee Nurses. We congratulate all those who made the musical side of the ceremony such a success.

The chief prize winners were as follows:

T. F. Ryan Nursing Prize: Nurse Heather McPherson. Most Improved Nurse-Matron's Prize: Nurse Helen Rabl. Best Theoretical Nurse—Tutor Sister's Prize: Nurse Elizabeth Marion King. Best First Year Nurse—President's Prize: Nurse Zenda Fidge.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT—This year Messrs. T. E. Conroy, I. S. Crosthwaite, J. V. S. Ward, H. Smith, D. Anderson and R. W. Shepherd retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election

LADIES' HOSPITAL AUXILIARY—Our thanks are again due to the members of our Auxiliary, which this year did a splendid job under the Presidentship of Mrs. J. J. O'Beirne. A separate report is embodied in this report.

MURTOA ANNEXE HOSPITAL—Our Sub-Committee is doing an excellent work and submits its own Annual Report of the Hospital's activities for the year.

MRS. PHOEBE F. ANDERSON, M.B.E.—Despite a slight disability in movement on account of her accident, Mrs. Anderson still continues to collect assiduously for the Hospital from her many friends.

CITY OF HORSHAM AND OUR SURROUNDING SHIRES—I would like to express thanks for financial help given during the year and also for many other tokens of good will and understanding that are always given even when not requested.

STAFF—On behalf of the Committee of Management, I would like to acknowledge our debt to all staff members for another year of service.

To the many organisations and individuals who help the Hospital, and they are

legion, I say thank you.

I would like to mention the Red Cross Society with its two chief factors of help—co-operation with our Blood Donors' Groupings and the assistance in supply of Library Books.

Further, we thank those Trustee Companies and Solicitor Firms which in the distribution of trust funds help by the very generous donations forwarded.

To Members:

It is my pleasure to present to you my report on our year's activities.

This year in place of our Annual Ball (owing to high cost of running same), we held a fete which included an opportunity shop, with a profit of £156/14/-. A very successful card afternoon was held at the home of Mrs. R. Burgess, an amount of £21 being raised. Penny drives by school children amounted to £122, State School £94/15/-, High School £25/16/3 and Quantong £3/5/-. I wish to sincerely thank Mr. Richards, Mr. Pascall and Mr. Hickey for their assistance in organising the drives in their schools for us, also the children for their wonderful effort. Our musicale held in the Fire Brigade Hall showed a profit of £15/10/-. The use of the hall was kindly given free of charge. Our annual button week was very profitable with £96/1/-. Lucky envelopes of the Show resulted in £159/9/-.

I thank the show committee for their assistance, also the Horsham Trotting Club for their permission to have a lucky envelope table at their meeting when £45 was taken. Throughout the year we kept the competition tables going in the street and this proved our main source of income—over all £415/10/3 profit being the result. Here I desire to thank Mr. J. Winters, of the Exchange Hotel, and Mr. R. Buckley, of Firebrace Street, for the use of their street fronts for our tables. Messrs. Powell & Dixon again donated a lovely doll, the amount raised from this being £60. Mr. Findlay's bedroom chair, £50. Our Christmas stocking was a great success, thanks to the help of Mrs. Sinclair (who makes it each year) and members of the Auxiliary who helped to fill it with gifts. Money raised from the stocking was £70. Thank you to Miss McIntosh, of Diana Lee, who again showed the stocking in her window and sold tickets to the value of £30.

We had a very pleasant surprise in the form of a donation of £48 from the Clear Lake and District Red Cross Association. We are very grateful to them for their generous gift and wish them every success.

We were in the happy position to be able to donate £1,000 to the 3DB/3LK Hospital Appeal. With money still in hand, it makes a total of £1,045 donated since March, a matter of nine months, which I think reflects great credit on the members of the Ladies' Auxiliary. A few of our members have left the district. Our secretary (Mrs. Jefferies) was not with us for long, but I thank her for her assistance. Mr. Lewin, our Auditor, has been replaced by Mr. L.
