FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH, 1952

To the Governors and Contributors.

It is my pleasure on behalf of the Committee of Management to present to you

the 78th Annual Report of your Hospital.

I do so acknowledging our endeavours to make our Hospital what we feel it should be, and at the same time recognising the tremendous amount that has to be done under difficulties that beset all Hospital Committees of Management in their desire to do what is best for the sick of all the people in our Community.

As a country Base Hospital our problems are an ever growing one. We have problems of Staff shortage, insufficient accommodation for patients and nurses, with an ever increasing financial problem to meet our obligations on sound business and economic lines. Our work revolves around the patients from the highly skilled medical officer to the ordinary member of our Domestic staff, each driving a cog of different magnitude in the Hospital machine of patient well being.

This year 3,018 In-Patients were treated—123 less than last year. The statistical

figures published here give such information.

During the year 339 patients were admitted to your Midwifery Ward-over 323 babies being born. These figures are above last year's figures, chiefly because this year Wembley Private Hospital was closed, our Midwifery Block was busier through extra demand on patient accommodation.

The Tuberculosis Chalet beds have been consistently occupied, the number of admis-

sions for the year being 14 with 29 patients receiving treatment.

Today there are very few patients admitted for treatment of infectious diseases.

I would here mention our appreciation of the work done by Mr. John Colquhoun as visiting specialist in our Clinic on Poliomyelitis and allied diseases.

Your Committee willingly agreed to the formation of a "Peter McCallum Clinic" at the Hospital at the direction of the Cancer Institute Board. This clinic will be actively operating during the coming year.

FINANCE-The finances of your Hospital have worried your Committee. I express the opinion that some alternative must be found for financing both the Building aspect and Maintenance side of your Hospital to the present system, if our Hospitals are going to fulfil their complete function. Your Committee believes that unless greater Government money is made available to Committees of Management one of two things might happen-

(a) a curtailment of services or

(b) the patient must pay either by assessment or by the imposition of a Hospital

Briefly, a deficit of £8,323 was shown in the Maintenance Account. £93,297 was required to meet our expenditure accounts, £22,456 more than last year, our income being £84,974. From all Government sources, Commonwealth and State. £57,299 was received leaving £27,675 to be found from fees and donations.

This year your Committee decided to renovate the old Hospital and keep the new Intermediate Block in repair-our overall expenditure for Repairs and Replacements

was £7,991.

NEW PROPERTY-A new Store Room and a Nurses' Lecture Room were built during the year and with other capital expenditure a sum of £9172 was spent.

THE AMBULANCE SERVICE this year was taken over by the Horsham and District Ambulance Service and your Committee handed over the "Dodge" Ambulance car and £260 to the new Service.

In addition a Home and Ambulance Station have been built on Hospital property at a cost of £3,600-a financial Grant from the Hospitals and Charities Commission to recoup 50 per cent of this cost can be expected during the coming year.

FURTHER RENOVATIONS-Your Committee has decided to renovate completely during this year, 1952-1953, the whole of the old Hospital, in addition to the old Nurses' Home-this building is to be used to accommodate the members of our District Nursing Service. The probable cost of this work will be in the vicinity of £13,000.

The bulk of such work will be carried out by Hospital permanent staff members as our own carpenters and painters are now employed on Hospital works.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF-The members of the Honorary Medical Staff have again rendered splendid service at the Hospital by giving of their time and their skill to all Hospital patients. Our thanks are due to them for their work in the Hospital

This year to help with the greater number of students graduating, your Committee willingly agreed to the suggestion of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, and three Medical Officers are now appointed to the Hospital's Resident Medical Staff.

Our thanks are due to the members of our Honorary Dental Staff, who give of their

time and ability willingly at call.

During the year we were fortunate in acquiring the services of Mr. F. W. Graham, who has taken charge of our Physiotherapy Department, an ever growing section of Hospital Patient Treatment.

COMMITTEE-Messrs O. D. Fitzgerald and H. H. Evans retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election to the Committee.

GRADUATION CEREMONY—This year's ceremony was held in the Memorial Hall and to a crowded audience our Guest Speaker, Dr. John Hurley, member of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, gave an inspirational address to a large and appreciative audience.

Certificates were handed to Nurses who had passed their final Nurses Board Examination and Florence Nightingale Pledges to Trainee Nurses who had commenced nursing duties since our last Graduation Ceremony.

We also express our thanks to the members of the 3HA Cheer Box Club for loyal and continued support. This body gives its donations for specific requirements and this year a short wave Diathermy Set and four children's cots were the aim-objective accomplished. Thank you for such help.

CARNIVAL REPORT-I thank the President and members of the Hospital Carnival Committee for help and assistance during the year, when by the efforts of the Carnival Committee a sum of £400 was handed over as a donation to the Hospital through the medium of the 3DB-LK Radio Appeal.

A separate Report and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure is embodied in this

Report.

ANNEXE HOSPITAL, MURTOA-Our Annexe Hospital is working on sound linesdoing good work and will be extending Hospital accommodation this year to meet extra patient demands and accommodation. A separate report is published by the Annexe Sub-Committee.
