of the Committee of Management of

To the Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen :

Your Committee has pleasure in presenting the seventy-seventh Annual Report, together with Financial Statements for the year.

The year presented some difficulties which were overcome, and others which are being tackled and will be overcome; chief problems being finance, staff and accommodation.

So far as finance for maintenance was concerned, the splendid help accorded by the Government to the Hospitals and Charities Commission for allocation to public hospitals was such that finance problems were met. We do add this word of warning though, that with increased costs all round, more money for maintenance will be needed. If the saturation point of public giving has been reached, the only alternative is more Government help if the services of the hospital are to be maintained at full pressure.

STAFF PROBLEMS are always present. This is, perhaps, not so apparent in larger hospitals, but smaller hospitals are continually faced with staff shortage and consequent inability to treat all patients who desire admission to the hospital.

On the nursing side, an increase in salaries has been made, but whether this will solve the problem, is doubtful.

Accommodation is a most acute one, both as regards patients and staff. The amount of money required to complete such work is big, but there is no reason why a big building programme should not be planned and carried out, in sections, over a given period of time. Your committee is already planning such a policy. This year, your hospital cared for 3141 patients; each day of the year over 135 patients were being treated at a daily cost of 28/3. We do want to point out that perhaps such a cost need not be a true reflex of service, but it should reflect internal control and management.

Hospitals, to fulfil a complete function, particularly base hospitals, should treat both in and out-patients admitted. At present your hospital does not completely carry out this function, particularly regarding out-patients department.

Briefly, our Physiotherapy Department is not functioning as it should. At present we have no physiotherapist appointment.

Your committee feels that a medical superintendent should be appointed. Such a staff member would be in control of all hospital medical services. We are faced with accommodation problems in this respect.

The problem of the lack of a radiologist is also now being felt in our X-ray Department.

A permanent qualified tutor sister is required (provision has already been made for the complete equipment of a nurses demonstration room). Here again the accommodation problem confronts us.

These facts are pointed out as "wants" and if such appointments were in existence our daily bed cost would increase —but, a greater service would be given to patients admitted to hospital, and that simply is the reason why our own hospital does exist.

OUR ACTUAL MAINTENANCE ACCOUNT: Yearly costs being £70,841. Receipts amounting to £81,240. Of this amount, Government moneys make up £58,738, our actual Charitable Grant being £39,033. The amount of £6,640 was received from Hospital Benefits' Fund. This is the amount received by the hospital by deductions made on hospital accounts of patients treated in our intermediate and semi-private wards.

£5,694 was paid by the Government for treatment of patients in our Tuberculosis Chalet; payment being made on the basis of daily average bed service cost for the preceding year.

A special Government grant of £7,150 was received during the year.

From these figures it can be seen what splendid help was rendered by the Government last year.

Patients paid £17,355 for services rendered, and £517 was received from ambulance fees.

The public contributed £3,150. These figures do not include 3LK Radio Appeal money, nor carnival moneys. The former amounting to £1,855 not transferred at the end of the year, and the latter not yet received.

In our costs, salaries and wages amounted to £44,742 (this year a big increase can be expected)

The year showed a surplus of £10,399 in our income and expenditure account — such amount being transferred to our maintenance fund account.

BUILDING — REPAIRS AND RENOVATIONS: Matters have been held up regarding repairs and renovations of our public wards, pending consideration by the Hospitals and Charities Commission of reconsidered submissions by your committee. New submissions were necessary, owing to certain vital plan proposals not being accepted by the Health Department. In this scheme:

1. A "Hawksley Prefabricated Building" for a nurses lecture and amenities hall has been purchased at a cost of £2,554. Estimated cost of complete job being around £4,000.

2. A steel frame building has been purchased for a store room at a cost of £670. The erection of this building will allow for expansion in the accommodation of our Pathology Department.

BUILDING APPEAL — NEW BUILDINGS: The people of Horsham and district have responded willingly to this appeal. The amount in hand at 31st March being £12,330 (at time of report going to press, the amount stands at £13,040, and £500 in promises).

The generosity of the people in responding to this appeal will, we feel sure, be the means of commencing the initial steps of our new building programme, which we are confident, every person in Horsham and district would like to see in progress.

ANNEXE HOSPITAL: We report that the work of our Annexe Hospital is valued greatly at Murtoa. We take this opportunity of thanking the members of the sub-committee for a year of splendid service, also the members of the social committee and the ladies' auxiliary, in addition to all the Murtoa and district folk who so loyally subscribe to, and assist in all hospital matters. The people now own a very fine, renovated and equipped ten bed hospital.

A separate and full report is submitted by the Annexe sub-committee.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT: At the end of the financial year, the following committee-men retire, after a period of three years' appointment:

Messrs. A. L. Hutchesson, R. J. Wilmoth, W. J. Thornley. Mr. H. J. Randall, (committee appointment during year).

Your committee is enquiring into the possibility of having all matters relative to hospital control ending at the same time as our financial year. We believe such an alteration would be beneficial.

OBITUARY :

It is with profound regret that we mourn the passing of committee-man, Mr. Frank Langlands, during the year. After a year of leave of absence he was not able to rejoin the Committee of Management and passed on on the 2nd March, 1951.

VICE-REGAL VISIT: As part of the Horsham centenary celebrations, time was allotted for a visit to the hospital by His Excellency, Sir Dallas Brooks, Lady Brooks and Miss Jeanette Brooks.

The Vice-Regal party being met by the President, was shown over the hospital. This visit was greatly appreciated, valued, and will remain a fond memory in the minds of many patients to whom Sir Dallas and Lady Brooks spoke so willingly and graciously, during their passing through the wards.

GRADUATION CEREMONY: Our second ceremony was held in the evening in the Town Hall, Horsham, in December, when an impressive programme was carried out. We feel that such a graduation ceremony is not only one of respect and admiration for the nurses who are the actual participants, but should be an incentive for thought to many young women in our city and district, to take up nursing as a career and a profession.

Our guest speaker for the evening was Miss G. Williams, executive officer of the nursing department of the Hospitals and Charities Commission.

During the year Dr. Felstead tendered his resignation as an honorary medical officer. Your committee appointed Dr. Felstead an honorary consultant surgeon and granted him a life governor certificate of the hospital for signal service rendered for a period of over 30 years.

STAFF, MEDICAL: We express to Doctors Felstead, Henderson, Forsyth, Hutton-Jones, Walpole and Bridge, a sense of appreciation for their services and co-operation; this fact being particularly evident when their services were so urgently needed at the time of the big motor and train accident.

To our resident medical officers, Doctors Lipson, Wilbur-Ham, Sanders, Gilseman, and Good, for their work and co-operation in the internal workings of the hospital, where they are in closer and more intimate contact with staff personnel than are the honorary medical officers, thanks is willingly given.

To Matron Arthur and Sister McIntyre, both loyal staff members of long duration, for another year of service to the patients, and as the leaders of the members of our trained and trainee nursing staff, to whom we also say thank you very much.

To Miss Brown and her assistants, Mr. W. Rielly and his staff, Mr. Sid Hutchinson and his staff, we are grateful for your services during the year.

Likewise, Mr. Watson, Mrs. Wilsher, Miss Thornley and Mr. McMullin, heads of hospital departments for a year of service. We are appreciative of their co-operation.

Our thanks are due to the members of the administrative staff for a year of loyal service. Each year seems to increase the work of the office staff, in having various departmental, Commonwealth and State Government forms to fill in, but work is cheerfully and willingly carried out.

TWO STALWARTS: MRS. PHOEBE ANDERSON—Our appreciation of the splendid work of Mrs. Anderson for the hospital was consummated when the request of the Committee of Management to His Excellency the Governor, through the Government, for recognition of her services was granted.

When it became known that Sir Dallas Brooks advised Mrs. Anderson that His Majesty had bestowed on her the Order of Member of the British Empire, for her years of work for charity, all citizens of Horsham and district were delighted.

MISS ELSIE DAVIS: The Committee of Management passed a resolution congratulating Miss Davis on her great work of visitation of patients in hospital. Fifty years of service—Miss Davis commenced her hospital service on 23rd November, 1900.

CANCER INSTITUTE: Your committee has approved, with the co-operation of the honorary medical officers of the hospital, the formation of a Peter McCallum Clinic at the hospital.

CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL OF POLIO-MYELITIS: It is with pleasure that we record the splendid help given to patients in this district when Mr. John Colquhoun, visiting specialist, holds his quarterly clinic at the hospital. We also appreciated the help of Miss Bethune, acting in the capacity of a State almoner to such clinics.

AUSTRALIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY — BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE: We record our gratitude to the great help given our Pathology Department and Mr. Watson in typing blood donors of our hospital group.

Our thanks go particularly to Dr. Lucy Eryce, Honorary Director, and Dr. Rachel Jakobowicz, Serologist of the service. Matters are now in hand for closer cooperation between the hospital and this great service.

We say thank you to our splendid blood donors and group members who never fail us in our appeals for blood.

HOSPITAL AMBULANCE SERVICE: A separate report of the workings of our service is contained in this report.

We report that your committee has approved the transfer of such a service to a committee which would be termed—The Horsham and District Ambulance Service.

It is hoped this transfer will soon be effected. All ambulance services are now, by act, under the supervision of the Hospitals and Charities Commission. All feel that such a service can be more effectively worked by its own committee than as a department of the hospital under the control of the Committee of Management.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES COMMISSION: It is with pleasure that we record, in this report, our appreciation of the great work the commission is doing and being called to do for our hospitals, and also for the co-operation and assistance received by this hospital when a call for help is made. We thank Mr. McVilly, Mr. Frencham and Dr. Hurley. Further we are appreciative of Mr. Chappell's help and all commission departmental officers for assistance during the year.

AUXILIARIES: Our appreciation is again extended to our Ladies' Hospital Auxiliary for its very willing work. A separate report is embodied in this report. Also to the Hospital Carnival Committee for again holding its annual hospital effort under many difficulties.

SHA CHEER BOX CLUB: HORSHAM BRANCH: To this very loyal band of workers, we say thank you. This year their donation is being used to purchase equipment for our Pathology Department. The last four years help has been utilized as follows: Electric cake mixer (kitchen), surgical cutting unit (theatre), furniture and furnishings (sisters' home), binocular microscope (Pathology Department).

VICTORIAN HOSPITALS' ASSOCIATION: Our thanks are due to our own association for assistance and co-operation given concerning many matters during the year. We mention prompt despatch of all our new award rates, superannuation returns and the courtesy of the manager and Messrs. Halls and Eustace regarding our many business enquiries.

OTHER SUPPLIERS: We would take this opportunity of thanking both metropolitan and local business houses for the numerous ways in which help is accorded the hospital in acquiring goods which, at the end of each year, mean cash.

3LK RADIO APPEAL COMMITTEE: What a splendid means this has developed into for raising money for hospitals. We thank the management of 3DB-LK and the local appeal committee for assistance. It is our hope that our endeavours this year will mean a very large donation for hospital funds.

HELPERS: Centre and Group Entertainments: During the war this method of raising money lapsed a little, but we still thank the folk of Pimpinio, Drung South, Polkemmet East and Longerenong, for efforts held on the hospital's behalf.

Our two bands — the Horsham City Band and the Horsham Pipe Band — ever ready at all times to help. We are grateful and say thank you.

A great and valued feature of our hospital work is the ready response by all ministers of religion, who answer matron's call at all hours and come to the hospital to help and to comfort.

VISITATIONS TO PATIENTS: Patients are helped in this regard by R.S.S. & A.I.L.A. Ladies' Auxiliary, Ladies' Hospital Auxiliary, Ladies' Catholic Guild, Country Women's Association, Methodist Ladies' Guild, Presbyterian Ladies' Guild, Church of Christ Ladies' Guild, Lutheran Ladies' Guild, Church of England Ladies' Guild and BHA Circle Box Club, Women's Section of the Country Party, Miss Elsie Davis and her band of helpers. We do thank the Salvation Army for arranging annually a visit to the hospital of either a metropolitan or an interstate band.

PHARMACEUTICAL BENEFITS ACT. We wish to express our appreciation for bringing in the above act and of its help, not only to hospitals but also to patients who derive tremendous benefit from its operations.

STATE GOVERNMENT: We are grateful to the State Government for making available a fund from which repairs and renovations can be carried out; £50,000 was the sum, and it is hoped that this amount will be drawn on in the very near future.
