

SIXTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT & STATEMENT OF RECEIPTS and EXPENDITURE FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1942-1943

To the Governors and Contributors. Ladies and Gentlemen:

This year, owing to the change in the accounting system inaugurated in all Hospitals of this State on the 1st July, 1942, my Report will be on a different basis at this Annual Meeting.

I will present to you for your information to-day various Hospital Accounts, Auxiliary Accounts, Staff and Statistical Returns, all of which will show the workings of the Hospital for the year ending 30th June. 1943

Our New Building has been opened to patients and is being freely used. I trust that when our Building Appeal closes at the end of September that we will owe very little money on this £60,000 venture for the good of the people of this town and district.

Since our last meeting we have overcome many of the very grave conditions of war that then faced us.

STAFF.—We have to express our thanks and gratitude to our Honorary Medical Staff for performing their duties during the year, frequently under severe conditions of strain, as Dr. Henderson is still away on military duties.

We also extend to our Honorary Dental Staff our appreciation for another year of service on our behalf.

During the year we have had two changes in our Resident Medical Personnel—Doctors T. V. Walpole and J. B. Felstead resigning to take positions with the fighting services. Dr. R. W. E. Manser is now our Resident Medical Officer.

NURSING STAFF.—The members have performed another year of faithful service under the guidance of Matron Arthur, and we tender to her, sisters and trained nurses our sincere thanks. The ranks of traince nurses have been filled as our nurses finish their training. During the year the following nurses completed their training and passed the Nurses Board Examinations: Nurses J. Withell, L. Ingleton, M. East. V. Hallam, E. Petchel, P. Pinnell, F. Briglia, D. Pietsch, O. Ladlow, J. Eastick, N. V. Hallam, E. Banner. The following trainee nurses have passed the first year's Professional Nurses Board Examination: Trainee Nurses G. Dunn, J. Hedditch, B. Holland, B. Boyd, J. Anderson, C. Randall, N. Woods, N. Walsh, M. Craig, R. Marks, N. Rogerson, L. Rowe, M. Baugh, M. Charles, J. Thomson.

New Sisters Appointed During the Year.—Sisters N. Bligh, G. Hopkins.

On the 3rd January this year new salary award rates for the members of the Nursing profession became operative. It is felt that this increase was not only justified, but considerably overdue.

NEW BUILDINGS—Everything is now ready for opening, and before this report goes to press the buildings will have been opened by that great hospital supporter, the Honcrable A. A. Dunstan, M.L.A.

We feel that that with the opening of this section, we will be able to cater for many people in their ill-health a condition of service which we were not previously able to perform. We are proud of our new wards and, with the completion of this section of Hosp tal Buildings, we must resolutely, with a full conception of all the responsibilities involved, set ourselves the task of completing our Hospital in full, for by doing so we will be able to cater for all classes of the community with a minimum of maintenance costs.

DO!VIES TIC STAFF.—Towards the end of the year we appointed Miss Marjoric Powell as Domestic Supervisor, a position well warranted and one that will have valuable repercussions in the domestic side of our Hospital work. During the year staff members co-operated and good service was rendered to the Hospital by all Domestic Staff sections.

FINANCE.—Under the new system of accounting, on our finances are now presented to you in the form of Income and Expenditure Statements, and a Balance Sheet. The figures presented show the correct position of Hospital financing for the first time. We feel the change brought about by the Charities Board of Victoria is a wise one as well as being beneficial from many aspects.

The general financial trend this year was on an up grade of increased costs, against which we had increased receipts.

On the debit side, total £18,168/14/11, factors of depreciation £2,504 and interest payments £1,003 are pointed out. Salaries paid show £7420.

Credit side, total £12.609, of which chief items are total Government Grants £7,269 and Patients' Fees £4,708.

Maintenance Fund Account is in debit £3,759/8/9, including transfer £200 from Maintenance to Capital Account.

The true significance of figures shown this year will be comparatively relevant when the figures for 1943-1944 are made available.

RECEIPTS.—Receipts for the year were £16,244/4/10, and Payments for the year £16,177/13 4, and in this amount is included items (a) £200 transfer to Capital Account, (b) £230/2/6 payment of debit owing on old Hospital sewerage installation.

PATIENTS' FEES.—1941-1942 fees collected were £4,968, for 1942-43 £6.405. Our Income Statement shows fees at £4,708, which is the balance of In-patients' and Out-patients' Fees Ledger Accounts.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT NEW BUILDINGS.—We started the year with a credit balance of £3.408 and finished up with a credit of £136. Amounts paid out were, Contractor £6,126, Furnishings and Equipment £1929, Roadway Construction £78.

We received by way of grant £2000 from the Charities Board, £709 from various donors, £200 transfer from Maintenance Account, £250 Ladies' Auxiliary, and £1700 from the Carnival Committee.

Early in the new financial year it is hoped all payments will be made regarding New Building.

PATIENTS.—The total number of in-patients treated for the year was 2024 with 31.295 in-patient days. Daily average of patients treated 85.72. There were 176 major operations and 765 minor operations. The average daily in-stay of patients was 17.01. There were only 261 out-patients treated, with 677 attendances.

TOWN OF HORSHAM AND SHIRES.—We have again received most valuable help from the Town Council of Horsham and the Shires of Wimmera, Arapiles, Dimboola. Dunmunkle and Kowree, the charitable grants from which are as follow, and to all these bodies we express our very sincere thanks for generous support towards our work. Town of Horsham £300, Wimmera Shire £400, Dimboola Shire £150, Dunmunkle Shire £60, Arapiles Shire £60, Kowree Shire £27. Total £997.

LIFE GOVERNORSHIP CERTIFICATES.—The Committee this year has been pleased to grant Life Governorship Certificates to Mr James Whitty, Mr Frank Mentha and Miss Julia Isbel for specific work done on the Hospital's behalf through the Hospital Carnival Committee.

THE CHARITIES BOARD.—We look to the Board as the Controlling Body of Hospitals in this State for help even as we, as a Committee, endeavor to fulfil our obligations in the country. We are particularly grateful to Mr. McVilly for a sympathetic understanding of our needs during the period of building scheme. We were also pleased to welcome his assistant, Mr Matthews, during his visit to the hospital.

VICTORIAN HOSPITALS' ASSOCIATION.—As a Committee, we value the co-operation of our Association—without its help many of our needs would have gone unfulfilled this year. We would like to express in this report our thanks to Mr. Loughlin and Mr. Halls for many acts of help this financial year.

AUXILIARIES.—Our four main Auxiliaries were very active during the year. The Ladies' Hospital Auxiliary, Hospital Carnival Committee, Murtoa Hospital Auxiliary and Rupanyup Hospital Auxiliary—all of which have their separate statement of Receipts and Expenditure embodied in this Report. We are very grateful for the splendid work done by these bodies, and we feel that it should be possible to have similar organisations working for the Hospital in other parts of our area.

HELPERS.—It is a rare precious species, either individual or organisation, that will not help a public hospital—such is not the case here, for our Hospital has the support of all peoples and bodies.

We think of the Town Band, ever ready to make Christmas Cheer its special function. The Pipers Band, in alignment with its sister band, is also consistant in all public appeals; its special effort goes to Carnival funds.

Weekly, daily, we receive help in kind by donations from The Ladies' Church of Christ Sewing Guild, Methodist Girls' Club, Women's Auxiliary R.S.S. & A.I.L.A. Horsham Branch, Christian Endeavor Society, W.C.T.U., C.W.A., Women's Section United Country Party, The Catholic Women's Guild, The A.W.L., The Girl Guides, Brownies, Pupils of Miss Cox and Miss Norwood, the Pupils from the High School and State School.

The Returned Soldiers, who help with our Carnival and also undertake to help our Ambulance Service in its work against any loss incurred.

It is the co-operation of such helpers that makes the work of this Committee one of pleasure and inspires us with confidence to carry on.

We extend our thanks to the Proprietors of The Horsham Times, Dunmunkle Standard, The Dimboola Banner, Rupanyup Spectator, Kowree Advocate and The Australian Worker for publicity given to Hospital matters and free copies of journal, kindly sent to patients.

We would like to thank the Clergy of the various denominations in the town for their help in those matters which are a part of Hospital life.

Finally to our Manager and Secretary (Mr W. H. Shoebridge) and his Office Staff, we would say "Thank You" for a year of valued service.

National conditions have placed restrictions on some Hospital commodities, but we willingly co-operate with the Government in its decisions regarding these matters. Our inconveniences are small compared with the dire want of many of those peoples who are our Allies, and who are now about to face another winter of starvation, and we sincerely trust, also, salvation by the forward movements of the Allied armies

We close the year, conscious of earnest endeavor, and we trust that during the coming year the dawn of brighter things which now appear to be breaking will have developed to the extent that this year will see victory for our boys, and peace again restored to this world of ours.

The Annual Meeting of the Women's Auxiliary of the Horsham Base Hospital held in the Town Hall on Monday, March 8, was well attended, and the year's activities again revealed the magnificent work the auxiliary is doing in the interests of the Hospital. Much enthusiasm was displayed, and members are determined that their efforts during this year will be equally as successful as the year just past. The President (Mrs A. Colville) handed Mr J. V. S. Ward, a vice-president, a cheque for £674 10/, proceeds of the Auxiliary's effort for the Hospital, which was gratefully acknowledged. Altogether, the Auxiliary handled over £720 during the year and, in view of the many other appeals, this is an outstanding performance.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

REVIEW OF YEAR'S WORK.

The President (Mrs. A. Colville) submitted the following report of the year's activities of the auxiliary :- "We started this year's work conscious of all our national commitments and the heavy going ahead of us. I am glad to say that the spirit of giving to our worthy work is most creditable. Our work and efforts this year resulted in £720/6/3 being raised and, with bank interest of £4/8/10, brings our total receipts for the year to £724/15/1-a splendid result. We started our activities for the year with a delightful garden party at the home of Mrs. Hutton Jones, which brought in £22/10/. We are grateful to Mrs. Hutton Jones for the use of her leautiful garden, tennis court and facilities for sewing, afternoon tea. May I also thank Mrs. Brown for the use of her tennis court. A series of bridge parties were held at the Town Hall supper room, the Memorial Hall and at the residences of Mrs. A. Harston and Mrs. Gordon Forsyth. Many thanks to Mrs. Harston and Mrs. Forsyth, who kindly placed at our disposal the conveniences of their homes, also the ladies who donated the prizes for the efforts. At these parties a roster was drawn up and in keeping with the austerity times a plain afternoon tea was served. As a result of these efforts we gratefully received £38/6/11. A most gratifying donation was received from the Horsham Croquet Club, which held a series of card parties at the homes of Mrs. Pryor, Mrs. Syd Smith and Mrs. Sutherland. As a result we received £10/4/6. Many thanks to Mr. P. Denholm, who conducted special efforts this year. The auxilary women were asked to help with the supper at the dances organised by Mr. Denholm and from a small number of members we were able to hand in £22/1/ as a result of their midnight work. Mr. Denholm organised a hospital ball and handed to us the sum of £64/13/7, and a Christmas Eve ball realised £50. Our funds benefited to the amount of £137/0/7, and much credit is due to Mr. Denholm. We substituted the brick appeal to a button day appeal to be held each year in October and the splendid sum of £89/19/6 was raised. We are very grateful to all who helped on this day. We were rather concerned about our linen day appeal, but once again the public were most generous and linen to the value of £21/7/6 and £17/3/6 in cash were donated to the hospital—a splendid effort. It was with great pleasure that we nominated two of our most energetic workers. Miss Ruby Catheart and Mrs. Shoebridge, as life g overnors. Mrs. James Anderson, a most persevering worker in the interests of the hospital, handed in a cheque for £349/2/3. We have used many words of expression in thanks for her work in the past years, and each year her collection has increased. A truly magnificent achievement.

street collections were again undertaken by the following members: Mrs. Albert Hutchinson, who has the fine sum of £31 13/ to her credit: Mrs. McIntosh, £8/6/6; Mrs. Stewart. £6/10/6; Miss D. Catheart. £4/10/; Miss J. McPherson, £2/12/6; Mrs. D. McLean, £2/5. Many thanks to these women, who brought in the sum of £55/17/6. You will notice we have formed a contingency fund of 1/ a member, which is to be used to pay for any incidental expenses that may arise during the year and to save any personal calls on the members during that year. As an auxiliary we offer our deepest sympathy to Mrs. Tydeman and Miss G. Richards, who during the past 12 months have suffered the bereavement of three of their dear ones : to Mrs. Len. Hutchesson in the sad loss the family has sustained by the passing of her loved son, Clarrie; to the family of the late Mrs. Alan Griffiths, who was at one time a most capable and energetic secretary of this auxiliary, and to Mrs. B. Roe in the passing of her father. Sincere thanks are due to Mr. Shoebridge for one dozen tea towels to add to our capboard of crockery. I would like to refer to Mrs. Taylor's departure from the town as she was a very dependable worker. During the year we have had the untiring co-operation of Matron Arthur and members of the nursing staff and we particularly thank the nurses for the great help given to us during our street appeal and in various other ways. We would like to acknowledge with thanks the help given to us by the hospital management and Mrs. D. McLean, honorary secretary, and Mrs. Shoebridge, our honorary treasurer, who have so ably looked after our finances. The carnival committee was handed £50 at the end of the year. Our effort for the carnival this year was outstanding. I desire to thank all who helped and also those women who kindly arranged such a marvellous collection of sweets and helped to raise the splendid sum of £39/1/9. I thank members and supporters who have so loyally helped me in my position as president of this auxiliary in carrying out another year's splendid work I feel sure the same support will be given to the incoming officebearers. I would also like to thank the auditor, Mr. E. J. Wallis, for his honorary assistance, and the "Horsham Tines" for the publicity given to our functions.

2674 GIVEN TO HOS PITAL.

At the conclusion of her report, Mrs. Colville asked Mr. J. V. Ward, a vicepresident of the Horsham Base Hospital. to accept £674/10/, being the proceeds of the year's effort. It was agreed that £250 of the amount be placed to the Building I mid and the balance to maintenance necontail.

In acknowledging the gift, Mr. Ward apologised for the absence of the president, Mr. Harold Smith, who had been unable to attend, and said it gave him great pleasure, on behalf of the Committee of Management of the Hospital, to accept the magnificent donation. He had listened to the reading of the report and desired to pay a tribute to the ladies for their splendid work throughout the year. He knew that at present with so I any patriotic calls upon the purses of the people, it was harder to raise funds, but the needs of the sick poor in our midst could not be neglected and it was pleasing to his committee to see that the public, also, recognised it was just as much necessary for the hospital to have funds now as before. He heartily thanked the ladies for the gift and congratulated them upon their splendid work.

The manager-secretary, Mr. W. H. Shoebridge, then gave some interesting facts concerning the running of the institution and announced that the committee had decided to appoint a housekeeper to take charge of many dities now the resposibility of the matron and so leave her more transferlevote to the nursing side of the institution. (Applause.) He added his thanks to the ladies for their splendid year of work.
