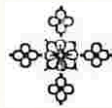

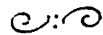

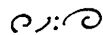


# W.C.BOLTON, Esq. J.P.

## A Few Interesting Facts

---

Mr. Bolton was born at Horsham in 1863, a son of Mr. Stuart Blacker Bolton, a pioneer family of Horsham. He joined, when a young man, the staff of the Colonial Bank of Victoria Ltd., and after a few years in its service away from Horsham, he returned to his home town in 1887 as a member of the local Branch, where he ultimately became Manager.

Mr. Bolton resigned from the Bank's service to join the Auctioneering and Estate Agency firm of Hagelthorn and Bolton, which later became Wilson Bolton and Company, with branches and agencies throughout the Wimmera district and in Geelong.

Three years after his return to Horsham in 1890, he became associated with the local district hospital, as a member of the Committee of Management. Six years later, in 1896, he became Treasurer of the institution, a position he has retained until to-day.

He has watched the growth, and guarded the finances of a Hospital which, to-day, is classed as a "C" Class Base Hospital, which takes £1,000 per month to keep open, and is able to meet its commitments regarding maintenance accounts.

Mr. Bolton's sister, Isabella (later Mrs. Dean, of Ararat), was the first Matron of the Hospital, and was assisted by two Nurses, who to-day are fifty in number.

As well as being Treasurer, Mr. Bolton also occupied the position of President of the Committee of Management in the year 1894-1895.

Further, he was a member of the Town Council and Water Supply Trust for twenty-four years, and during that period, he also officiated as the Mayor of the Town of Horsham.

On his retirement, after fifty years of loyal service to this Hospital, we wish him a long and happy eventide of happy reflective thoughts, and introspective thoughts of even value—because of a truth they should be so.

## SIXTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET FOR THE YEAR 1939-1940.

---

To Governors and Contributors.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

It is with pleasure that I present the 66th report of the Committee of Management of your Hospital.

The work of caring for the sick has been carried out most satisfactorily by all staff concerned.

We have treated 102 more patients this year than last, but the instay days of the patients have been less—a good feature.

The greater amount of the Government Grant allotted this year enabled your Committee to balance its budget without in any way jeopardising the efficiency of the Hospital workings.

During the year discussions in regard to the future New Hospital Buildings have gone as far as having plans and specifications drawn. The carrying out of any Building Scheme is contingent on the Charities Board policy which will be stated some time next October.

A long felt need has been now fulfilled, in that a Resident Medical Officer has been appointed, Dr. H. H. McLennan receiving the appointment.

Financially we finished up this year with a slight increase of receipts over payments. We commenced the year with a debit of £523/11/11, and a debit of £329/8/8 was the position in our books at 30/6/1940. The total receipts were £13,075/14/1, and the total expenditure £12,581/10/10.

This country has been at war since September of last year with the following resultant causes: (a) Increased prices of many goods; (b) Less money available for Charity because the country, through many avenues, must be helped.

**PATIENTS.**—During the year 2003 in-patients were treated and 297 out-patients. Total in-patient days were 34,187 and out-patient attendances 1,371. The in-stay days of patients this year has been less, being 17,067 days.

The cost per occupied bed per annum was £137/4/1—this amount includes the total of the nine sections of Hospital costing. Per day each patient cost a fraction under 7/6.

The daily average of patients treated for the 12 months was 93,407, being 5.5 daily average less than last year.

**HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.**—We have been faithfully served with diligence and hard work under great difficulty by the Honorary Medical Staff. The defence work undertaken by the Staff meant strenuous and close co-operation.

The appointment of a Resident Medical Officer will help the Honorary Staff in their routine Hospital work.

The members of the above are Doctors G. R. Felstead, R. J. A. Henderson, Gordon Forsyth and B. Hulton Jones, and we thank them.

**HONORARY DENTISTS STAFF.**—The Honorary Dentists have again rendered valuable service. Mr. R. Grant resigned and Mr. Dalton has taken his place. The Committee of Management expresses its thanks for work done, and wishes Mr. Grant every happiness in his retirement from professional service.

**HOSPITAL DISPENSARY.**—This work is done in an honorary capacity by the four local chemists, and we are appreciative of their services rendered by Messrs. N. C. McMullin, R. A. Ludbrook, C. W. McCoy and R. Luker.

**HONORARY SOLICITOR.**—The many little queries that crop up in a year's work are always courteously answered by our Honorary Solicitor, Mr. R. J. Wilmoth, and we thank him for his co-operation in those matters.

**SHIRE GRANTS.**—The five Shires and the Town of Horsham have again realised the need of helping the Hospital in the work that is being done, and their Charitable Grants are most helpful, and except for such assistance the Hospital workings would not be in the position they are to-day. **THE CHARITIES BOARD.**—To Committees of Management, the above Board is its Inspector, for it is through him that a personal touch is made.

No one is loth to recognise the splendid work done by Mr. McVilly, in the co-ordination of hospital work throughout the State, and we thank him for his advice and co-operation in matters that are always arising.

**NURSING STAFF.**—Matron Arthur and her staff have again recorded another year of service, full and complete in every manner. The Wages Board Determination is sound regarding salaries paid, but there are points cropping up which will need attention to adjust some conditions satisfactorily.

During the year the following trainees passed the Nurses' Board examination:—Nurses L. Fortington, C. Templeton, C. Uebergang, D. Hair, E. Grigg, V. Carter, P. Hutchinson, A. Smith and V. Weight, and they are offered the congratulations and good wishes of the Committee of Management.

**MATERNITY WARD.**—There were 138 admissions and 133 babies were born. Sister G. Jenkin resigned her position to get married, and Sister L. Turnbull who did her training at the Mooroopna Hospital is now in charge of this ward.

**ISOLATION BLOCK.**—This year this ward has been twice as busy as last year, 71 patients being treated.

The new additions, costing £160, are much appreciated by the Nursing Staff, and we thank the Infectious Diseases Group for prompt co-operation in this regard.

**HOSPITAL HELPERS.**—A host of them—earnest and diligent—all working for a Social Service that is a clear fabric of our national life.

Some help individually and others through various organisations, the latter being—The Methodist Girls' Club, 3HA Cheer Box, Christian Endeavour Members, Women's Auxiliary R.S.S.I.L.A., Local Branch; Women's Christian Temperance Union, Ladies' Guild Church of Christ, Country Women's Association, Horsham; Women's Section United Country Party, Horsham; The Catholic Women's Social Guild, The Horsham Brownies and the Horsham Apex Club.

These organisations are doing splendid social work, and this year Toc H boys are conducting a Hospital Library, and we are very grateful indeed for their help and inspiration.

There are individual givers and anonymous givers, and to all who help our work in any way we express our thanks.

The last two years we have been favoured with a visit from a Metropolitan Salvation Army Band whose music was much appreciated by the patients.

The patients of this Hospital are helped by the frequent visitation of ministers of all denominations and the Salvation Army Adjutant. This assistance is of tremendous comfort to the patients, and is a great help to Matron in her Hospital ministrations.

**THE PRESS.**—Publicity is helpful, and "The Horsham Times" is thanked for this aspect of Hospital Work, and also for copies of "The Horsham Times," and we include in this list "The Dunnmunkle Standard," "The Dimboola Banner," "The Rupanyup Spectator" and "The Australian Worker."

#### ACCIDENT TO OUR MANAGER AND SECRETARY AND PAST PRESIDENT.

—We were grieved when the news of the accident to Mr. W. H. Shoebridge and Mr. R. G. W. Brett became know. We are glad that both are now back again at work with spirit undimmed.

During the absence of Mr. Shoebridge, Mr. E. A. France carried on at the Hospital as Acting Secretary in an efficient manner.

In conclusion I would like to state that our work has been helped considerably by

1. Increased Government Grant.
2. Buying Subsidies as the result of Collective Buying and collective goods at tender price.
3. Sustained Shire efforts.
4. Goodwill and financial help of all people.
5. Recognition of the fact that patients MUST pay for treatment according to their ability to pay.

I feel that particular stress will have to be made in the future to Item No. 5, for else we each, individually, do our share we must fail. Our position at 30/6/40 clearly indicates that the people "of the Wimmera" are cognisant of their responsibilities and accept them. We started the year in debit £523/11/11 and finished the year in debit £329/8/8.

INFANTILE PARALYSIS AFTER-CARE.

The above section of hospital work is gradually reducing as patients are discharged as fit to go home.

Mr. T. U. Ley, Orthopaedist, has visited the Hospital at stated intervals, and Miss Verco has been Masseuse in-charge during the year.

We had 15 patients at 1/7/39, and 7 patients remaining at 30th June last. The daily average of patients treated was 11.22, and this is in addition to out-patients treated during Mr. Ley's visits.

We received £743/15/- from the Infantile Paralysis After-Care Committee in Melbourne as a grant towards Maintenance Cost, and on our costing of cost per day per patient the amount spent in this work was £1545/10/-.

Since the end of the financial year arrangements are being made for the closing of this section of Hospital work.

## Horsham Hospital Carnival, 1940

The 1940 Horsham Hospital Carnival again proved most successful, and as a result an amount of £600 was handed to the Hospital Committee. This ceremony was performed at a Cheerbox Club, Community Singing Session when on behalf of the Carnival Committee, the President, Mr. E. Omant, gave the cheque to Mr. T. Conroy, a vice-president of the Hospital. Mr. Omant eulogised the fine efforts of his Committee and also the many local institutions which contributed so willingly to the eventual success of the venture. Mr. Conroy expressed the appreciation of the Hospital Committee and commended the organisers of the Carnival for the services they had rendered.

The Statement presented by the Carnival Secretary showed a balance of £619, but this included a balance carried forward from the previous year, of £22/8/11.

The Carnival Committee commenced its activities prior to Christmas, and its efforts were sustained until the day of the Carnival, February 24th, 1940. In view, however of the many appeals being launched on behalf of the Red Cross and Comforts Fund, the Committee limited its efforts until the day, which realised support greatly in excess of expectations, over £350 being raised with the various stalls alone. The introduction of a night show proved successful, the receipts being augmented by over £100. The decision to present attractions above the ordinary was most welcome, the Chinese Dragon and pageantry at night drawing a huge crowd. The action of Deane Toseland, the champion cyclist, in travelling from Adelaide, was a fine sporting gesture and the Committee has reason to believe that his appearance added greatly to the afternoon entertainment. His only cost to the Committee was a second-class fare, which the Committee demanded.

Expenses for the Carnival were kept down to a minimum, and the resultant profit was considered highly satisfactory, and by far exceeded earlier estimates. The wind-up concert, when local artists generously gave of their services, and at which the many prize winners were announced, was not largely patronised, but the lack of time allowed for advertising purposes was a contributory factor.

The principal office-bearers were Mr. E. Omant, president; Mr. L. E. Reid and Mr. D. McMillan, vice-presidents; Mr. R. G. W. Brett, treasurer; and Mr. H. A. Roe, secretary.
