Forty-Seventh Annual Report for Year ending June 30th, 1921

To the Governors, Life Members and Other Supporters of the Above-Named Institution.

LADIES and GENTLEMEN.—

Your board of management have the honor to present their report for the year ending June 30th, 1921, showing the general conditions and financial affairs of the hospital, and cordially invite your earnest attention to same; also balance sheet, all of which are submitted for your information and approbation.

## FINANCIAL.

The year began with a credit balance of £349 18/6 to the general account, and £114 3/5 to the current building and improvement account. Total receipts were £2685 17/6, and total expenditure (including extraordinary expenditure) £3024 0/4, leaving to the institution's credit the sum of £125 19/2. The following are some of the special sources from which revenue was derived, and the very satisfactory results are highly appreciated by the board of management.

## BUILDINGS.

These are being maintained in a fairly good state of repair, as both materials and labor are very expensive, so economy is used where possible with efficiency and comfort to the patients. In our 1920-21 report, mention was made of fact that we had been successful in securing the advice of the Acting Chief Architect of the Public Works Department, Mr. Kerr, for the purpose of advising your board of management in connection with the proposed building and improvement scheme. Mr. Kerr's report came to hand and, summed up briefly, states that the hospital is in a dilapidated and insanitary state, and estimates the cost necessary to complete his plan in the vicinity of £4000. Towards this proposed expenditure, your committee has on fixed deposit at the Bank of Victoria a sum of £1443 7/1, in addition to £113 13/5 credit current balance. It will thus be seen that the monies available are not nearly sufficient to carry out the work. Recognising this fact, your board of management appointed a delegation consisting of the President (Mr. G. S. Syarondish), Mr. J. Hoeking and the Secretary (Mr. E. J. Glenister) to wait on the Acting Treasurer, The Hon. R. S. W. Lawson, for the purpose of placing before him our financial difficulties, and requesting that the Government would assist us. We re-

gret to say that the deputation was not successful in its mission. Mr. Lawson said that his sympathies were always with hospitals, but unfortunately the whole of the amount set aside by Parliament for charities had been expended, consequently it would be impossible to accede to the deputation's request. Your board of management, recognising that in order to cope with the increased demand for accommodation for patients, something must be done and that quickly, decided to launch an appeal for funds. We regret to say that the response to date is most disappointing. However, we are hopeful that the people of the district will realise their responsibilities in this matter, and by so doing help us to start and complete this most urgent and necessary work.

#### PATIENTS.

The resources of the hospital in providing accommodation and treatment were again heavily taxed during the past year, and the benefits of the institution were extended to 575 patients. Of this number 483 were admitted as in-patients, including 22 who remained in hospital on 30th June, 1920, whilst 92 were treated as out-patients. The daily average for the year was 23.65. These figures, although constituting a record in the work of the hospital, hardly convey the great difficulty experienced at times in finding room for patients. The number of beds available for treatment of patients at the hospital is 40, and at times all were occupied. The busy periods occurred during the months of January, April and May, with a daily average of 28.25, 30.16, and 29.31 respectively. The following list will show the number of in-patients treated at the hospital during the past six years:— 1915-16, 282; 1916-17, 327; 1917-18, 401; 1918-19, 396; 1919-20, 418; and 1920-21, 461.

#### SPECIAL COLLECTIONS.

Your board of management are once again deeply indebted to Mrs. James Anderson for the great interest she has shown in the hospital. As a result of her untiring efforts and systematic canvassing, a sum of £567 12/- was handed to the treasurer of the institution. To accomplish such a wonderful record must have entailed an immense amount of hard work and worry, and we express to Mrs. Anderson our grateful appreciation of her efforts. A detailed list of contributors to this collection appears in another part of this report. To the members of the committee of the Jung Race Club and their energetic secretary (Mr. Lutze) who organised a race meeting for the benefit of the hospital, and which resulted in a profit of £101 6/6, we extend our very best thanks.

#### HOSPITAL SUNDAYS.

Excellent work was done by the committees associated with the Hospital Sunday movement at Murtoa, Natainuk, and Dimboola. At each place increased collections resulted. We desire to thank the committees and secretaries for the excellent results achieved, and for the kindly interest they take in your institution. Horsham's effort this year was marked with success. In the afternoon an appeal was made by various speakers in May Park, and in the evening, after the church services, a sacred concert was given in the Town Hall, the programme being arranged by Mr. A. Langlands. We are grateful to Mr. Langlands, the Horsham Orchestra,

and the vocalists who assisted at the concert, and to Messdames Hill and Bowden who materially helped to swell the receipts by the sale of badges.

#### **MEDICAL and NURSING STAFF.**

As the increase in the number of patients treated would indicate, the work in the Institution during the past year has been of a strenuous nature, creating much heavier demands on the medical officer, matron, and staff than usual. We are pleased to express our appreciation of the work of the medical officer, Dr. S. D. Read, and the unremitting care and attention bestowed upon patients by the matron (Miss Humphries) and staff. The shortage of nurses through illness added greatly to the anxiety in regard to the management of the nursing side of the hospital; but the matron, by her thoughtful care so arranged that the effect of these difficulties was reduced to a minimum. Since our last report Nurses Ross and Hunter passed their final examination. Nurse Ross retired from the institution, but the services of Nurse Hunter are to be retained for an additional three months. The present staff consists of the Matron (Miss May Humphries), Sister McClophan, Nurses Hunter, Guest and Murphy (third year), Nurses Pearce and Murray (second year), and Nurses Fraser, Burness, Mahoney and West (first year).

#### **HONORARY STAFF.**

To those doctors who have so generously helped the hospital during the year, the committee convey their gratitude and thanks. Especially do we thank Dr. Black, who besides administering anaesthetics, has rendered the hospital very valuable help when necessary.

#### **CHEISTMAS TREE**

On Christmas Eve a Christmas Tree was held. In former years the function was carried out during the afternoon, but this year a departure was made from this custom, and the tree held in the evening. Great enthusiasm was displayed by the nurses, who spent what time they had at their disposal decorating the various wards. The effect was very pleasing, and brought forth expressions of approbation from the many visitors. Special thanks are due to the kind friends who, by the useful and thoughtful gifts, assisted to make the Christmas Tree such an unbounded success.

#### **GIFTS TO HOSPITAL**

Gifts in kind have been numerous during the year. Books, magazines, flowers and provisions have been received consistently from many local citizens. Both the local newspaper proprietors have again donated sufficient copies of the "Times" and "Star" to supply the wards. Copies of the West Wimmera Mail, Dimboola Banner and Dunuckle Standard have also been forwarded to the institution. Your board desires to express its warm thanks to the many friends for their valuable contributions.

#### **EGG APPEAL.**

The egg appeal this year was a very successful one, sufficient eggs being received to tide the hospital over the twelve months. We desire to express to the teachers and scholars of the various schools who contributed our appreciation of their efforts on behalf of the institution.

**NEW  
CHALET.**

There has just been completed at the hospital a new chalet for the purpose of treating patients suffering from tubercular trouble. The chalet was the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Young, of "Sunny-side," Horsham, and was erected to the memory of their late daughter, Elizabeth Annie Young. To Mr. and Mrs. Young we accord our sincere and best thanks for such an excellent gift which we assure them is much appreciated.

**DONATION.**

We acknowledge with many thanks receipt of cheque for £50 from the Estate of the late George Ward, with the request that this money be placed on fixed deposit and the interest therefrom used for maintenance purposes. The condition stipulated has been complied with and the cheque lodged at the Bank of Victoria, Horsham.

**THANKS.**

We again record our appreciation of the efforts of the Horsham Borough Band, who besides assisting in various movements for the hospital's welfare, has made periodical visits to the institution and, with music, done much to give pleasure to the patients, the staff and visitors. To Mr. C. H. Hoskin, for regular visits to the patients, we accord our thanks.

**COMMITTEE.**

Your board regrets to report that during the period under review Mr. Stephen George Knight, whose services had proved of great value to the hospital, passed away. The vacancy caused by the death of the late Mr. Knight will be filled at the annual meeting. Two new members of the committee were elected during the year, Mr. William Lloyd filling the place of Mr. J. J. Hennessy, who left the district, and Mr. John P. Curran that of the late Mr. George Ryan. The members of committee who retire by effluxion of time are Messrs H. Balfour Cathcart, R. Appleton and Wilson C. Bolton. All are eligible for re-election. Before concluding we desire to express appreciation of the valuable services rendered the institution by the Secretary, Mr. E. J. Glenister. The manner in which this officer's duties are performed reflects great credit upon him, and the present satisfactory financial position is due in no small measure to his exertions. 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## Hospital and Charities Act 1915

### RETIREMENT OF COMMITTEEMEN.

#### Section 14.

"On the last Thursday in the month of July in every year one-third part of the elected members of the Committee shall go out of office, but may, nevertheless, be re-elected, and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election; (b) or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot."

### VACANCIES—HOW FILLED.

#### Section 15.

"If any member of the committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the Chairman of the Committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent from four consecutive meetings of the Committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of the Committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next Annual Meeting for the election of the Committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.

# Bye-Laws of the Horsham District Hospital

(Incorporated the 31st August, 1887).

(G.G. 31st August, 1877, p. 1642.)

1. The Bye-Laws of the Horsham District Hospital (hereinafter referred to as "the Hospital") in force up to the date of this Bye-Law are hereby repealed, save as to all rights accrued, acts done, appointments made or liabilities incurred thereunder.

## MANAGEMENT.

2. There shall be a President, two Vice-Presidents, and a Treasurer of the Hospital, who shall hold office for one year.

3. There shall be two Auditors, who shall hold office for one year.

4. The Hospital year shall run from the day for the time being fixed for the retirement of one-third of the Committee to and inclusive of the next such day. All contributions shall be deemed to have been made for the current Hospital year.

5. The Committee shall direct the general business of the Hospital, frame rules for its internal regulation, and appoint, suspend, discharge all paid officers, and arrange the terms of the employment of such.

6. The Committee shall meet on the second Tuesday in each month, at 3.30 p.m. Any three members of the Committee may summon a meeting for any time upon giving twenty-four hours' notice of the hour of the meeting, and stating in such notice the business for which the meeting is summoned.

7. The Medical Officer shall have full power to deal with all urgent applications for admission, recording in writing the reasons for treating the case as urgent.

8. No paid officer of the Hospital shall be a contractor, directly or indirectly; nor shall any member of the Committee be present at the discussion of nor vote upon any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

9. The Books and Accounts of the Hospital shall be audited annually by the Auditors.

10. The Committee shall present a general report of the affairs of the Hospital, together with an audited Balance Sheet, at the Annual Meeting. Such Balance Sheet shall be published in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.

11. The Committee shall appoint a House Committee of three of its members, two to form a quorum, who shall attend to the internal management of the Hospital, the admission and discharge of in-patients, the examination of all accounts passed for payment, the supervision of the Medical Officers', Collectors', Dispenser's, and House Steward's Books, and such other matters as may be delegated to them by the Committee of Management:—

- (a) The House Committee shall retire quarterly, and its members shall be eligible for re-appointment on the next Committee.
- (b) It shall meet once in each week, or oftener, on such days and such hours as it may appoint, and the Honorary Medical Officers shall be members ex-officio of the House Committee.
- (c) It shall also, once at least in each month, audit the House accounts and check the stores books.

- (d) It shall watch the entire expenditure of the Hospital, and shall carefully scrutinise the monthly analysis of such expenditure, with due regard to the number of patients in the House, reporting to the Committee any matter of importance.
  - (e) It shall be present (without notice) once in each fortnight at the receipt and distribution of stores, and once in each quarter shall check the balance remaining on hand of such stores with the House Steward's and Dispenser's Books.
  - (f) It shall have power to employ persons other than the Medical Officer, Secretary, Matron, and Nurses for any work in or about the Hospital, and to discharge the same.
  - (g) It shall define the duties of officers and servants, and such duties shall be incorporated in their several agreements.
12. All contracts may be made by the Committee.
13. The common seal of the Hospital shall be kept by its barker for the time being.

#### **ELECTION AND APPOINTMENTS.**

- 14. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer shall be elected at the Annual Meeting.
- 15. The Auditors shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting.
- 16. Members to fill the vacancies of retiring members of the Committee shall be elected at the Annual Meeting.
- 17. All contesting elections or appointments shall be by ballot only.

#### **VOTES.**

- 18. For voting purposes Members shall be divided into "Members" and "Corporations":—
  - (a) Members contributing £1 per annum shall be entitled to 1 vote.
  - (b) Members contributing £5 per annum shall be entitled to 2 votes.
  - (c) Members contributing £10 per annum shall be entitled to 3 votes.
  - (d) Members contributing £20 (in one sum as a personal contribution during the current year), 3 votes, and thereafter 1 vote for life.
- 19. Corporations shall be entitled to the same votes as members, save that the right to vote shall cease with the expiry of the current year, notwithstanding the amount of the contribution.
- 20. Corporations shall be entitled to vote by any member or officer appointed by the Corporation under seal, or by resolution for that purpose.
- 21. No member shall be entitled to vote while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Hospital.

#### **MEETINGS.**

- 22. There shall be held at the hour of 2.30 on the day for the time being appointed for the retirement of the Committee the Annual Meeting of the Members.
- 23. At all meetings of members ten shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not present within half an hour of the hour of the meeting, or if there shall cease to be a quorum, the meeting shall be adjourned by the President, Vice-Presidents, Chairman, or Treasurer, or in their absence by the Secretary, for one week, and at the adjourned meeting any number shall constitute a quorum.
- 24. Ten or more members may, by requisition signed, require the Secretary to convene a Special Meeting of Members. Such requisition shall specify the business to be dealt with at the meeting, and none other shall be introduced unless the introducer shall have given three days' notice thereof to the Secretary.

25. Notice of Special Meetings shall be given by the Secretary to members seven clear days before the date; and ~~any~~ notice of any business intended to be introduced at a Special Meeting shall be given by the Secretary to members immediately on receipt of such notice.

26. All requisitions and other notices of special business shall be accompanied by a number of copies equal, at least, to the number of members for the time being.

27. The President, Vice-Presidents (in the order of election) or the Treasurer shall take the chair at all meetings, except those to be held under section 7 of the Act incorporating the Hospital; and in the absence of such officers, the meeting shall elect its own Chairman, and by ballot, or demand of any two members. The Chairman shall have a deliberative as well as a casting vote.

28. Minutes shall be kept by the Secretary, and in his absence by the Acting Secretary, to be appointed for the time being by the Chairman.

29. The minutes when confirmed and signed by the Chairman at a subsequent meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of the proceedings of the meeting of which they are a record.

30. At any meeting the Chairman may, and at the request of three members shall, appoint a meeting at not less than seven days nor more than fourteen, at which the minutes of the then meeting shall be brought up for confirmation, and such meeting shall be a Special Meeting.

31. The Secretary shall, on demand, at any time within five days of any meeting, produce for inspection of any member requiring the same the minutes to be brought up for confirmation.

#### OFFICERS.

32. There shall be a Medical Officer, who shall be a duly registered Medical Practitioner.

33. All Medical officers shall be duly registered Medical Practitioners.

34. There shall be a Secretary, Matron, and Nurses, at salaries to be fixed for the time being by the Committee.

#### PATIENTS.

35. Members and Honorary Medical Officers shall be entitled to recommend one in-patient and three out-patients annually, subject to the approval of the House Committee.

36. Any person wishing to be received into the hospital, and being in a position to pay for medical aid, may be admitted with the sanction of the House Committee, provided there be accommodation, and on producing a recommendation signed by a member.

37. No pregnant female (for the purpose of confinement), no child under five years of age (unless suffering from serious injury, or for the purpose of undergoing a surgical operation, or in case of accident), no insane person, no person afflicted with primary syphilis or suffering from chronic paralysis, nor any person who in the opinion of the Medical Officer, Honorary Surgeon or of the Committee of Management is unsuitable to be admitted, shall be received as an in-patient under any circumstances.

38. Patients quitting the Hospital at their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving.

39. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the ~~same~~ known to the Medical Officer, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse of the ward, in a book

kept for the purpose, which book shall be laid before the House Committee at each meeting.

40. Patients not paying full Hospital fees, deemed able by the Medical Officer to assist in the work of the Hospital staff, shall, at his request so employ themselves.

41. The Committee, subject to the approval of the Medical Officer shall from time to time make and alter regulations:—

- (a) For the conduct of patients.
- (b) For the treatment of out-patients.
- (c) For the admission of visitors.
- (d) For the admission of Clergymen and Religious Instructors.

Such regulations shall be posted in the wards and hung on the Hospital door.

#### CLERGYMEN AND RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTORS.

42. Every Clergyman or Religious Instructor who visits at the Hospital shall confine his visits to the sick patients who belong to his religious communion, unless his services are specially requested by any patient of another communion.

43. Every such Clergyman or Religious Instructor shall perform the duties of his office at the bedside of his patients in such a way as to be little overheard as possible by the surrounding patients.

44. No person shall read aloud or conduct public religious service in the sick wards of the Hospital.

45. The operating room of the Hospital shall, as far as practicable be available for public worship among the convalescent patients.

46. Clergymen or other visitors must retire from the bedside if requested to do so by any member of the Medical Staff or Matron.

#### APPENDIX NO. 1.

At the General Meeting of the Contributors of the Horsham District Hospital, held on the 28th July, 1902, it was resolved:—"That the Committee of Management be composed of twenty members, irrespective of the four honorary officers."

#### APPENDIX NO. 2.

At the Annual Meeting of the Governors and contributors to the Horsham District Hospital, held on 28th July, 1904, it was resolved:—

- (a) That these bye-laws may be amended by resolution of a majority of subscribers present at the Annual Meeting, or at a duly-convened meeting, called for the purpose, provided that 14 days' notice in writing, signed by not less than six subscribers of all proposed amendments shall have been given to the Secretary, who shall thereupon give notice by advertisement to the subscribers.

And at a special meeting of contributors, held on the 14th day of May, 1913, it was agreed that—

- (b) Any number of persons formed as a Committee and conducting entertainments or services of a public nature for the funds of the Hospital, and thereby contributing in one sum the amounts hereunder specified, shall have the privilege of nominating Annual Governors as follows:—

If £10 and up to £20 be contributed . . . . .	1 Governor
Over £20 and up to £50 . . . . .	2 Governors
Over £50 and up to £100 . . . . .	3 Governors
And for Amounts over £100 . . . . .	4 Governors

Persons representing a Trust Estate contributing in one sum £10 or over may also nominate one Annual Governor. The year of an Annual Governor's appointment shall be from the date of payment to the Hospital.

#### APPENDIX No. 3.

At the Annual Meeting of the Governors and Contributors to the Horsham District Hospital, held on the 25th July, 1912, it was resolved:—

"That a person who has by personal effort, extending over a term of not less than five years, been instrumental in augmenting the funds of the Institution by a sum of not less, in the aggregate, than £100, may be appointed by the Committee of the Institution a life Governor thereof, and thereafter shall be a Member entitled for the year of appointment to three votes, and thereafter one vote for life."

#### APPENDIX NO. 4.

At the Annual Meeting of the Governors and Contributors to the Horsham District Hospital, held on the 31st July, 1919, it was resolved:—

"That a person or persons, not exceeding two in any one year, who has or have in an official capacity in public efforts during at least two years been instrumental in augmenting the funds of the Institute by a sum of not less than Eight Hundred Pounds, may be appointed by the Committee of the Institution a Life Governor or life Governors thereof, and thereafter shall be Members entitled for the first year of appointment to three votes and thereafter one vote for life."
