## SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

OF Tine
COMMITTEE OFMANAGEMENT
OF THE

## BALLARAT BENEVOLENT ASYIUM, JANUARY, 1860.

The Commitee of Management of the Ballarat Benevolent Abseivis in presenting to the Governors and Subscribers the Report of of their proceedings during the last year, have to congratulate them and the public in general upon the completion of the first portion of the muchzequired Benevolent Asylum, which they hope will, in the course ofsofley weeks, be opened for the reception of the aged, infirm, and destitute.

The foundation stone, as before stated in the last half-yearly Report, waslaid with Masonic honors on the lith day of March, under the auspices of Thomas Francis Gell, Esq, D.P.G.M. Tho portion of the buyldiff at present erected is the South wing: it was completed on the ath of (letpler, and is capable of affording accommodation for eighty inmates exchas ${ }^{4}$ ve of apartments for Master and Matron, and oftices for Medical Officer ${ }^{\circ}$ and Secretary.
The total cost of building this wing has been $£ 3,765$ 4s. 3 d , - particulars of which will be found on referning to the balance sheet appended to this Report.

Although your Committee have to congratulate themselves, and thank the public for the liberal support received at their hands, in the erection of this bulleg, they regret to state the ot oing to theuilding havingost more than was at first ant icipated, they lave beobliged
 meet the liabilities upon it; and your Committee being desirons to make the Inglitute avalable to the poor and infirm as soon as possible, notwithist nuding the pecuniary difficulties under which they labour, have lost no time in furnishing the Asylum for the reception of inmates, relying tipon the sympathy and liberality of the public for the means of puying off the debt, as the funds to meet this furnishing expenditure wras especially raised by the ladies of Ballarat, to whom too much praiso conng e given for their untiring edertwhtis at the Bazaar, held during

The thanks of your Committee are also justly due to the Municipel Councils of Ballarat, for the continued support affiorded by their monthly donations.

Your Committee would also express their achoow bdgement of the services rendered by the Melical pjrostion, in attening the destitate sick when called upon by the Institution.
Your Committee in layiner bfery o u a statement of the relief afforded by this Institution, cannot but exaress thair soriow at the er reat increase in poverty and distress in this district; dyying the past half-year 146 relief, varying from 5 s. to $£ 1$ per week, and for periols from one williok to six months. Tha total mount of expenditure under this head being $£^{1503}$ 2. 7d. for the past vear; and in no case have the Comraiteee administered relief withont fit investig aturg into the circumstances and character of the person applying, bowever arduous the task, or greate the distance to visit them.
The number of destitute persons receiving weekly aid from the Institution at the commeneementf the past hall-year, was 40 ; since, 106 . New cases have been relieved, of whom 36 were casud; 9 have succeeded in procuring suitable employment; 9 have left the district. is were admitted into the hospital, at; 3 have left the district; 3 recovered to provile for thernselv, $2 t$ were discharged as suffixiently and consequently were debarred fes, and 8 were found to be impostors, 57 ramained on the books, of fi fiom any support from the Institution. sion into the Asylum, the remaimon only 20 are fit subjects for admis some cases, familes of 4,5 , and $G 3$ being destitute willows, with, in class, your Conamittee would and 6 chilldren. clothing. Any donations left with the Master at the Asylum, will be thankfully acknowledged.

Your Committee freeling deeply impressed with the heary responsibility devolving on those to be entrusted with the management of the Asylum, desire to impress upon all classes the necessity of giving them their warmest co-operation, in supporting an institution which is not only intended to afford shelter to the agred infirm, and the destitute, but will have to take in hopeless cases of disease and suffering that are not admissable to the hospital or any other institution : also, in the absence of other institutions, it is rery much to be feared that the Asylum will, to some extent, have to be converted into a refuge for orphans and lyigg-in cases, for whom as yet Ballarat has no separate asylum.

In order to meet the requirements of the Institution for the ensuing year, :9 2,500 has been placed on the Estimates for its mainterance, which your Committee considering inadecuate for the purpose (the building being nearly : $: S 00$ in debt, and the present furnishing and maintenance funds not being sufficient to meet their liabilities, ) have applied to the Members of the Legislative Assembly representing this District to hare an additional $\stackrel{\varrho}{〔}, 500$ placed upon the Estimates in aid of the Asylum.

In order to claim the proposed grants from Government, the sum of Qly00 must be raised by voluntary contributions.

An especial appeal is made to the mining community on Ballarat and the outlying districts who have not (with the exception of some ferr companies, among whom the Allied Armies, British Mining, and North Grenville Companies stand foremost) responded in as liberal a mamner as might have been expected to the calls made upon them, particulariy when it is taken into consideration that some of the most distressing. and expensive cases on the books of the Institution are widors and orphans of miners, and miners suff"ering from chronic diseases caused by mining: oprexations.

In June last Mr. Stephen Cooper was appointed Secretary and Collector, in the place of Mr. A. A. Tarte, resigned.

On the loth January Mr. W. H. Boughen was elected as Master, and Mrs. W. H. Boughen as Matron to the Asylum.

In conclusion your Committee would urge upon all classes the necessity of extending their constant support to an Institution which has for its objects the relief of those who cannot help themselves; and aso to impress upon the mind of the public at large the heary responsibti es under which your new Committee take office, to provide for theincreased expenditure consequent upon the opening of the Asylum, and increase of destitution on Ballarat.

## LIFE GOVDENOHS.

1. I*very donor of tho or upwieds; erery person who shall raise by one or mere collece tions in one year the sum of fig or upwards from persons not elaimiag menhership on accunt of their contributions towards such sum. Any person appointed by any Societr, paying the sum of foo. The Executors, or if more than ono, the fust named in any will, fa- which a bequest of exo or upwards shall be paid to the Institution, shall le considered Jifin Gorerams.

## ANSUAL GOTENSORS.

2. Hexy Subseriber of ©l and upwards annully, shall be considered an Anmal Gorenows. to hate fron the time of paying such suluscription and entitied to vote at ably yerk and other special mecting 3 of Governors, provided he slall bare paid his douation or subseription seven days before such meeting.
3. That the Institution slan be poverned by a Cormittee of Mangement, consisting of a Presiient, two Vice Presidents, five Trustecs, a Treasurer, four Honorary Medical Oficers, and sixteen Governors.
4. 'Inat the afforesuil ofteers, except the Tmstees, with the Committee of Management, stanil he elceted ammally by the Govemors in the month of Janury in end gear.
5. That in the cvent of a vacaney occurins in any of the Honorary Offices of the Institntion, the election of a successor shall be at a generill mecting of Governors to be convened for that purpose.
a. That the ammas mecting of the Gopernors of the Instution, slall be hehl in the month of Jannary in cach year, to receive report from the Committee of Manasement, and elect Honorary bificers for the ensump year, and that a halif-yearly meeting of the Governors shan be held in the month of Juy" in each ycar, to reccive a hali-ycaly report of the Institution.
6. That it shall be competent at any time for the President to cal a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition sifned by eightanembers of the Committeo of Mansennent, or twenty four Governons, repuiring him to do so, on ghin seven duys notice in not less than two of the daily Ballarat papers of such meeting and requisition, nom no husiness shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall hare been stummoned.
P98. That -at the anmal, hale-ycarly, or other special meeting of Goremors, ten Govcrnors shall form a quornm; but if atter the expiration of half-an-hour after the fime appointed for sudk meeting, ten Governors shatl mot he present, such meeting shanl stand adjourned to the same loure on the day next following, when if tive Governors be present, they shall form a qourum at such adjoumed meeting.
7. That at the anmaal, hall-5carly and all special meetings of Governors, it shall be karful for any Governor dulp qualified to vote by proxy, provided that such prony shall be in writing, signed by the Governor giving the stume, and the name of the person thereby authorised to vote for such Govemor, inserted thercin.
8. That the Committee of MFanagenent shall mange and direct the general business of the Institution, shall frame Bye-hws for its internal regulations, the sune not being contrary to the general rulcs-appoint and discharge all ollicers and servants of the Institution -shall meet one day in each week, and at other days as they shall appoint-admit and diss churge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting themand their treatment, and shall appoint Sub-Committees for all nece ssary purposes, and Auditors. The Chairman of Committees to lave a castiug but no deliberative rote.
9. That the President nud Vioe President shall be members ax officio of all Committees.
10. That all Sulb-Committees slall have five members, three to form a quorum.
11. THat the Committee of Mangement shall, at each annual, and half-yearly mecting of the Governors, present a general report of the aftiurs of the Iustitution.
12. That the accounts of the Institution bhall lo auditule in the months of July and $J_{\text {an }}$ vary in each year.
13. That no member of the Committee of Management, or officer of the Ingtitetion shah become security for any Contractor, directly or indirectly, or vote in arly contract in whelk he may have any interest wintsocver.
14. That any member of the Commitfee of Wansement absenting himself for whe mone ha without reasonable canse shall cease to be a member of the Committer of Minasement, mati another simell be appounte id in his stead.

TREASURERF,
17. That all monies received on accoum of the Institution shall be paid into the Inank appointed by the Comanittee of Management, to the credit of the Treasarer of the Institation, and be appropriated by him to the parposes of the In titution under direction of the Committoe of 'Hanyement.
18. That no payment shat be made by the Treasurer out of the monies of the Iustitution until ordered by the Committee of Manigement.

## BECTETARY.

10. That the Secretary shall attonl all annual, half-yearly, specha, ani Commitfee meetinge, and fake minates of ail the procedings transacted at such meeting s, ani tran. ecribe them carefully into the trook kept for that purpoge, and carry out all the directions of such meetinn as in all particulars incident to his clepariment.
Eo That the secretary sinall collect sulbseriptions and all monies due to, or receivable by the Inbtitution, and in all cases give receipts for tixe same, ard shall pay over the sume fo the Treagurer once in each week, with an nccount of the sums recerved, and the manes of the perdons from witom receised by hirn since the previous payment.
2l. That the Secretary shall conduct the corvespondence, and the clerical masiness of his department, and keep the accounts of the Inatitution ander the direction of the severad Committees.
11. That the Secretary shall compile all Reports of Committecs, hill the cheruen, amb berform the clerical duties connected with the olice of Preasurer.

## HONOHAKY MPDICAL OPFICER.

23. That the Honorary Medical Ghicerss of the Institution shall lue duly qualified bitedical Practitioners, ithd shall attend daily, the rotation of cluty to be left to themselves.
24. That the Honorary Medien Offieers shall have aceess to the Institution at all times and perform all Surgical operations, and reporit the same in at book kept for that parpose at the Iustifution.
25. That any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty for one month without reamable cause, shall cease to be a member of the In stitation, and another officer ahall be ail hos ined in his stead:

26. The Master shall have the charge, control and Management of the Institution, and of the inmates and hired servants thereof, subjecte to the legulations and Orders of the Committec.

28. He ghall keep an exactinvertory offall the goods belonging to andin che Ansyum, and shall present a Report thercof to the Commitee, the first mecting in January and July of every

33. He sball report all disorder, neglect, and misconduct to the next ensuing Committee.
34. Them tron bhall in lite manner superintond and daily vait the deparmenta lelonging to the Femal of inates and maintain order and cleanliness therein.
35. The Wardsmen and Wrariswomen shall carcfully keep clean their severai Wards, and attend such imates as may become sick, according to the directions of the Master or Medical Ollicers.
36. They shall withdraw when desired from the Ward on the eatry of the Committee, and shall not reveive any kind of gift or rennmeration for anything doue or to be done in virtue of their sit mation, upon pain of peremptory dismissal.
37. Thes shall immediately report ay inlringement of the Ragnations to the Master or Matron, as the case mirght be.

## MISC上LLANEOLS.

38. The Master and Matron simh not both be alsent from the Asylum at the same time, and neither of then shall lee absent from the house from tex pron. to eight ann, nor more than three hours at one time, without permision of the President or Committee.
39. Any inmate behating in a disoriderly maner, or leaving the premises without permission of the Master shall be forthwith requrted to the Comuittee, and be liable to be dismissed.
40. Any inmate entering into any Waril luat his or her own, without permission, or play. int at cands on dice, mambling or smoking tonace in the house, or habitually spitting out the floos, or lucing suilth of other inproper or rude behavione, or using indecent or profane lancuage, or atheition or injuring the property of the Institution, or refusing to obey the directions of the Lonorary Medical Olicers or Master or Matrou, shall be torthwith reported to the Committee and liable to di smissal.
41. All inmates who are judged by the Honorary Medien Officers to be caphble, are to give their serviees ander the direction of the Master or Matron in the work of the house, or in the eultivat ion of the gardenand grounds.
42. The Master and Matron shall respectively preside at the Meal Thables of the Male and Female inmates, and duly sing Grace before and after Meals.
43. 'Ilme inmates shall be at tiberty to receive Relipious Instruction from the Ministers of the Church to which they belong at such times as the Committee shall amwint.
44. That ro applications lixe admission be receised without the usual forms being filled up and by a Governor. And no applicant shall le admitted into the Asshan until one wedd shall have clapsed fiom the date of his or her applieation, in order to afford time for inuuiry, Lut in the event of any urgent cascs arising, the Iresitent and any three members of the Committee shall have the power of dealing with such cases as they shall require.
45. That in electing to any appointment ly the Committee, when there are more appliconts than are regured, the voting shabl take phec ly voting cards, and the lowest on the poll shall be struct off and the voto taken amon for the renaining candidates, until one or more has a majority of the members of Committee then present, and so on with the remainder of the candidates, always striking off the lowest, until the required number have been elected ty such majority.

## BALLARATBENEVOLENTASYLUM STANDING RUEES AND ORDERS. <br> ORDER OF DUSINESS.

1. The business of the Committee shall commence at the hour appointed, or as soon after as a quorum shall be present.

- The presence of five members shall constitute a quorum of the Committea; but if, at the expiration of twenty minutes from the time appointed for the Committee to meet, there is not a quorum, such mectiog shall proceed to business.

3. The minutes of any preceding meetino, not proviously confirmed, shall be read as the first business at all mectuns of the Committee, in order to their conflrmation; a a dodis. cussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proce dirs.
4. The reading of the correspondence unconnected with the orders of the diny, and th ie bringing up of reports of Commitce and Notices of motion, shall have precede aceinth it orders of business, but shall not be introduced during the consideration of the orders of the day.
E. Orders of the duy shall include all matters ariging out of the proceeding of former meetings of the Committee; auy business whith the Chailman may think fit to bring und r consideration; and such ouders shall take precedenco in the rotation in which they stind ina the minate book.

## MOTICES ANV MOTIONG.

6. No menther shall make any motion initiating a sulyect for diseusion, or for re-cofr sidering a motion presionsly disposed of, except in pursumen of a notice given at a previous meeting of the Committee, and such notice mast be given either previous to the Committee entering upou the orders of the chay, or after such orders shath have been disposed of.

7, Every member in giving motice of motion, shall read it afoud, and deliver to the Charman a copy of sucla notice, torether with his ranme, and the day proposed for bringing on such notice of motion.
8. A member may gire notice for any other member not then present, Ig putting the name of the member for whom the notice is $\begin{gathered}\text { wiven } \\ \text { on } \\ \text { the notice of motion. }\end{gathered}$
0. No motion entered on the notice paper whall be procemied with unless the member who has given such notice, or sone one authorised by him, he present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceded with shall lee struck out of the paper.
10. Any motion not seconded shafl not be further delvated, but shati lapse.
17. Any member who has proposed a motion may withdraw the same by leave of the Chaiman, but shoutd such motion be seconded, such lave can ouly be granted provided there is no negative voice.
12. 'ithe Chairman may order at complirated grestion to te divideel.

1:3. So soon as a debate upon a grestion shall be conchaded, the Chairman shall put the question to the Committee in a distinct fun Butible mammer.
14. The question put, flat he resalyed in the allimative or negative by a show of hands.
15. No question or amendment, which is the same in substance as any question which has been resoled in the affirmative or negative. whall be a resolation of the Committee. uniess carried by two-thirds of the members fresent.

ABENDNINTS.
16. A question having been propnset, may bo amended by leaving ent, substituting, of adding words, and such amonfmonts shall ho rescived by atmanority of votes.
17. An amendeent proposed, but not geconded, will not ie ontertained or entered on the mimites.
18. Amendinonts may be proposed to an anendment, at if such amemhent were an origioal question.
19. When arnendments bave heen resolvert, the main fuestion as amontes shall he put.
20. Whon amendinents havo been lost, tho raiginal çuestion sluall bo put.

OHDPFR OF DEDATE.
21. Any member desirous of proposisf at motion of amentiment, of of diseussing any mater under cousideration, must rise furl adiress the Chumban, and menember when speaking shall be interrupted, undess cableri to order, when he shatl sit clown; in wheh case the incmber calling to order shatl lee heard thereon, in jretierence to any other speaker, and the question of order shall ke disposed of idefore the subject is resmed, or any other subject entercel upon.
22. No member moy sureak to nny grestion after the samo las lheen put by the Chuirman, and the woting ins been fiven in tho aflimative or negative tiorem.
23. When two or moro members rive to speak, 4 lo Chaiman shall call on the member who, in his opibion, firse roso in his plice.
24. A motion may lo mado that any menber who bas risen, "shenow heart," or "do now speak".
25. A member nay sicuk to ahy question before the Committee, and unom any amendment proposed therete, and upon a fuestion ar amenthent proposed ly himacff, or upan a question of order arising out of the flelate, lat not otherwiso.
26. That any member proposing of acconding a resolution or ameninent, shat be lek' to bare spoken, and that tho mover shall only have tho right of reply.
27. Whencrer the Chnirmat rises during a debate, any member then qpealsing, or offiging to speak, shall sit down, wo that tho Chaiman may Le heard without interruption.
28. Any member having used objectionable words, furl not expinining or retractuy the same, or offering an apology for the use thercof, to tho satisfaction of tho Commituo, will be censured by tho Committec, and slall not be allowed to hold his scat or vota on any question, until the offensive worlls shall have been retraeted by him, of an aplogy rendered to the satisfaction of the Committee.

## SUAPENSION OP BTANDING ORDEHB.

29. It shall be competent, by a wote of two thirds of the members present, for the Committee to suspend any order herein contaned, provirled the effiect of such sus pension shall not be the rescinding of any resolution previnusly adopted by tho Comnittec.

## SUR-COMEMITTFES.

30. That the foregoing Rules and Orders shall also regulate the [roceodings of all SubCommittees.
