TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS,—

Your Committee have nothing to report but what is pleasing and satisfactory in every respect.

The general expenditure of the Institution shows a reduction of £493 12s. 7d., viz. :—House expenditure, £227 16s. 2d. ; out-door relief, £265 16s. 5d. ; total, £493 12s. 7d. The daily average number of inmates for the year was 240, or four less than the previous year.

Comparisons of out-door relief prove a weekly increase of eight adults, and a weekly decrease of sixty children.

It is somewhat singular, and worthy of some investigation as to the cause, that for the last few years the adult out-door relief has been increasing, while the rations supplied to children have been rapidly decreasing. The figures are as follow:—1879, weekly average, 394 adults, 485 children ; 1880—402 adults, 425 children.

The receipts are very satisfactory, especially considering the great reductions in municipal and shire council grants, and the loss accruing to the Charity Sunday Collection owing to the inclement weather.

The average cost per head of inmates was £16 12s. 6d., against £17 14s. 6d. for 1879. This large decrease is caused principally by the low prices of produce.

The produce of the garden, if sold at market rates, represents a sum of £149 16s. 8d.

Your finances on the 31st December were as follow :—Bank overdraft, £1366 14s. 3d ; due from Government, £1754, leaving a balance of £388 in hand to commence your year with; but it must not be overlooked that against this amount must be placed the sum of £1000, which the Government has cut off from your grant-in-aid.

Reference is made with sincere regret to the death of the late Dr. Nicholson, one of your honorary medical officers, whose valuable services were ever at the disposal of the Benevolent Asylum and other charities of Ballarat.

You are recommended to elect as a life governor of the Institution Mr. Thomas Randall, solicitor, London, in return for his valuable labors in securing (gratuitously) the sum of £90 15s. from the estate of a deceased inmate, against many difficulties, and in the face of strong opposition.

To thank all who during the year have aided the Institution would be a work too elaborate for the space at disposal, but special mention should be made of the labors of the Charity Sunday Committee, through whose exertions the sum of £145 accrued to your finances, in spite of the very unfavorable weather which prevailed on the day appointed.

It is to be regretted that the Government has seen fit to reduce your grant-in-aid £1000. In the present unsatisfactory financial

state of the colony some reduction was to be expected, but that made is altogether too large, and too sudden, and certainly more than the Institution can bear at one blow. Your Secretary has received instructions to correspond with the Government, &c, in remonstrance, and it is to be hoped the result will be that the Hon. the Treasurer will moderate somewhat the sweeping reduction made.

Some voluminous correspondence and questions have been received from the newly-appointed inspector of charities, which pointed apparently to some intended alterations in the endowment and management of the charities. After careful consideration it was recommended that the present system, which has for twenty-three years worked so well, remain unaltered, at least until circumstances shall arise to render some change necessary.

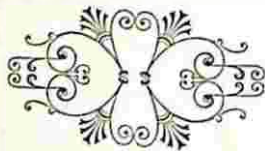
After many years' practical experience, your Committee are of opinion that the voluntary system of receipts and management is at once the most humane and elastic, fitting as it does into all circumstances, and meeting all cases, and that from a moral aspect, a rate would have a downward and lowering tendency, and would weaken that sympathy for the poor which now results from the DIRECT and VOLUNTARY gift of the donor, and which naturally brings him into closer contact with those whom he is relieving, thereby increasing and keeping alive his pity for the poor and suffering.

It is, moreover, greatly to be feared that if the Institution was placed under Government control its general expenditure would be much increased, and that it would become a receptacle for cases of the worst kind, and criminal character—cases, in fact, which are at present dealt with in gaols and reformatory establishments.

At present every possible care is taken to secure that peace and quietness so necessary for the sick, aged, and infirm by the exclusion of the worst prison cases, and those of an insane or semi-insane character.

Your Committee is convinced that the *morale* of the Asylum would be greatly lowered, and the health of the inmates, morally and physically, greatly endangered by a purely Governmental system of management, and they trust that any movement in that direction will meet with your strongest opposition.

In handing over to you this useful Institution in so flourishing a condition in every respect, your Committee desires to express its gratitude to the Almighty for His continued favor and protection, nothing doubting but that the "Giver of all good things" will, if affairs be wisely and humanely managed, likewise equally bless the labors of their successors in office.

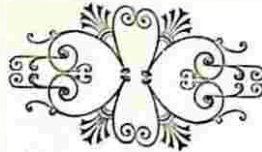

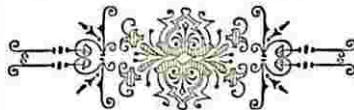

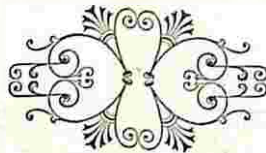

RULES

OF

The Ballarat Benevolent Asylum,

Adopted by the Governors, 24th January, 1867.

OBJECTS:—

TO RELIEVE THE AGED, INFIRM, DISABLED, AND DESTITUTE AND TO MINISTER TO THEIR NECESSITIES, ACCORDING TO THE ABILITY OF THE INSTITUTE.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first name in any will, by which a bequest of £20 or upwards, shall be paid to the Institution shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution, shall be a Life Governor.

ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a Shire Council, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, President, or Chairman of the body donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every subscriber of £1 and upwards, annually, shall be an Annual Governor, to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all the yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided, in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees a Treasurer, three honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen Governors all of whom except the Trustees, shall be elected annually, by and from the Governors, in the month of January in each year.

4. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee of Management, the said Committee shall have the power to fill up the vacancy for the unexpired term, except in the case of a Trustee or Honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a general meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of January in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition, signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so, on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the annual or other special meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of Management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules; appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall appoint Sub-committees for all necessary purposes, and Auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, but not a deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, shall be members, *ex-officio*, of all committees.

10. All Sub-committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of January in each year.

12. Any member of the Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medical Officers) absenting himself for two months, without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution shall be paid into the bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

SECRETARY.

15. The Secretary shall attend all annual, special, and committee meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases giving receipts, and shall, within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each meeting of the General or House Committee an account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department; keep the accounts of the Institution under the direction of the several Committees; compile all reports of the Committees; fill the cheques, and perform all the clerical duties connected with the office of Secretary.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves; shall have access to the Institution at all times; perform all surgical operations, and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the Rules shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
