## To the Governors and Subscribers--

It was not without consilerahle anxiety that your Committec commenced their laturs for the year in re the managennent of this great and connprehensive Institution.

For years its several branches of relief had increased to :un extent that was lecoming very serious, the out door reliof in particular assuming such proportions in numbers and expemiture that, hearing in mind the general depression, and the consequent ukcertainty of $k$ eeping up the revenue, your Committee may lep excused in feeling some misgivings on accepting the heary responsilility placed in their hands.

It is therefore highly gratifying for them to be alde to lay before you so fivorable an account of the position of the Asylum, aud they are glad to reprort that in creyy direction, whether in receipts or expenditure, the sereral items will be fonnd most satisfactory and encourging. It will afford you much pleasure to note:-

1. That the debt has during the year been reduced by E381 7 s 11d.

2nd. That while the number of immates remining in the luouse on the 3lst December shows no increase, being the same as for the previous year, the daily average nmber of inmates was three less for 1875. It is interesting to note that this is the first decrease which has taken place since the Asylum was built, and hats of course caused a corresponding decrease in the expenditure.

3rd. A reduction has also taken place in out-door relief, both in numbers and expenditure. In the former the decrease is six adults and thirty-three children per week, and the Latter is less than for 1874 by the sum of $£ 246 \mathrm{l} 5 \mathrm{~s} 5 \mathrm{~d}$. A reduction of four has also taken place in the number of lying-in cases. The total reduction in the expenditure mounts to $£ 4185 \mathrm{~s} 6 \mathrm{~d}$,

4th That while on the expenditure side there has leen the decrease referred to, the receipts show a considerable increase, the
amount of contributions from all sources-ris, $£ 2778$ ls. $2 \mathrm{~d}-$ beine he far the largest amount ever raised in any one year by the Irustitution. This pleasing state of things has not been effected, however, without endeavors being made by your Committee to econonise in every possible direction, and of the most zealons exertions on the part of the $S$ earetary ind Collector in enteavoring not only to keep up the revenue, but, as hats been slown, to increase it.

There are signs which encourage your ("omnittee to lope that the worst has been passed, and that the inmense pressure which has been felt so heasily by this particular lnstitution during the last few yous, in conseruence chiefly of the collapse in mining, will not be so great as it has been.

The bank overdaft on the 31 st December was $\mathfrak{E P 4} 40$ 7s 1ld. Against this anomit the sum of $£ 1500$ is due: on account of Goverment grant-in-iid, tho sum of $\mathbb{2} 150$ is also due in shire council subscriptions for $187 \%$, leaving in debit bathnee of £ 790 is 11d, it rechuction of $£ 38$ is $11 d$ umen the debt remmining at the end of 187 t.

On the 31st Decenber there remaned in the Asylum 300 males, 27 fienales-totid, 227. Duin of the year there have been achutet leg mates and it femanes (including births) so that in all 40 inmates have been resident in the Asylum. Of these there have been clischarged 127 males and 76 fe maks (incluted in these figures are $\overline{0} 0$ deaths which have tad can place)-total, 203; learime in the Asylum at the cond of the year 200 males and 27 females-total, 227 .

The daily arearge munlser of innates for the year 1875 was 23. , as isgainst 23.5 for 1874 , is reduction of three inmates per
 decrease of las ta per hatad upon 18Tt. This fact will prove the ecomomy that has been exercised, and the eredit which is clue to the master; Mr. W. Boughen, for his carefuness. It is not uncommon for the collector to $l_{x}$ told that some of the inmates are able to work well, and as the publie tue not too well aware of the canses which incapaciate them from earning it living, the following return will prove usaful in exciting sympathy, and will no clonbt assist the collector when canvassing for suldscriptions:-

A brief sprace may be wisely filled in explaining how the Asylum cane to deal with so many hinds of disease. When the Institution was first erected it was intended as a house for the aged, infirm, and disabled, but it was soon found that by fiu the oreater mumber of cases were incurable-some, indend, of a most distressing character, such as ancer, consumption, \&c. These cases were admitted, and soon increas ol to such an extent that, as wil be soen by reference to the above table, out of 227 inmates only 66 belong to the class for whom the Asylum was intended To deal with these cases, so that they could receive the best medical treatment, and their sufferings alleriated as far as possible, was founded the Chronic Hospital.

The subscribers and the public will do well to risit and inspect this interesting portion of the Asylum, for in it they will see much to arouse their almiration and pity. They will find the spacious hospital bright-looking and well-ventilated, and its occupants contented and grateful under their severe aftictions. The visitor will not, as in the case of an ordinary hospital, cane in contact with cases most of whom will recover to re-enter the banks again to fight the battle of life, but the solemn thought will rise in his mind that in the beds around him he gazes upon fellow-mortals upon whose frames death has fixed a stre and certain grip, whose time may be counted by hours, diays or weeks, but for whom in any case no long term of life exists-their distance from eternity prolonged, and their sufferings alleviated, only by the medical sk it and excellent mursing and attention whelh it generons public has $\mathrm{p}^{\text {rovided, and which is so fully met in the management of this }}$ noble lranch of the Asylum's operations. The rivitor will not fail to be surprised at the number of blind men le will meet in every part of the grounds. No less than twenty-sewen suffer from this satdest of anl afflictions; most of whom are in the prime of life, aud certain to remain for many years in the Institution.

Amongst the namy white leanls and lembing forms are to be seen soldiers and sailors, from the veteran who frought at Waterloo to (until just lately) the aged calt of nimety-tive, who fought with Nelson in the Victory it Tratalgar. While a noble Hospital is supported in Ballarat for the tratment of curable complaints, your Committee trust that the publie will bear in mind that another hospital endsts on a large scate in connection with the Bonerolent Asylum, for the reception and trentinent of incurable disease and result of accidents.

The produce of the garden, calculated at marli et rates, amounts to $£ 17414 \mathrm{~s} 10 \mathrm{~d}$. A profit of $£ 109$ ts has been realised on the dairy. The ornamental garden has been kept in excellent order by Mr. J. Brewster, who has also been cnabled to keep the inmates constantly supplied with plenty of fresh vegetables, according to their season.

## THE LYING-IN HOSIPTAI.

The Lyiug-in Hospital has been conducted during the year in the same admirable manner as in past years, and kceps up its reputation as one of the very best manared Institutions of the kind in the colonies. Mrs. Boughen and Mrs. Wearne, the experienced matron and sub-matron, deserve great credit for their excellent manargement of this important part of the Asylum. Your best thanks are due to the ladies who have constantly risited and inspected The Lying-in Hospital.

## OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

It is with great satisfaction that your Committee are enabled at last to report it decrease in this heary and harassing branch. A reduction of six adults and 33 chaldren is shown for 1875 as argainst 1874. While the decrease is not very larre, it is nevertheless significant in this respect, that from couses not necessary to mention here, your Committee are encouraged to believe that the year 1876 will show a still greater veduction. Previous anual reports have dealt so fully with the nature and system of out-door relief; that it is umecessay to mover the old ground again; but as an impression seems to prevail that the work done is limited to the supply of cations, adrantage should be taken of this opportanity to point out that, during the winter soason espechaily, aged and infirm people, sick fitaifies, and in cases also where the father is confined to lis hed from illness aul unizble to work, and many other cases of a similar in inch, lawe been supplied with firewoodas great a necessily in its way as foocl. 'Lhe expenditure on this item amounts to 564 lijs Gd.

The publie should be made :ecqu:intel also with the fact that a great denl of sickness exists on Ballinut, whore the sufferer or sufferers are unable, from weabness, or the nature of their compla int, to attend the Pallarat District Hospital, and as the rules of that Institution prechude it from sonding its officers to deal with sach cases, the Benevolent Asyhun, though never intented for such a pupose, humanely sends its non-resident sugcon and honorary medical officers to the bedside of these aftlicted ones, who are prescribed for, and nourishment and medical comforts supplied. In this way many cases of sickness and decline have been dealt with, inchuding families stricken with malignant diseases such as scarlet fever, dipthexia, dre.

One case will suffice as an example to which the doctor was sent, where the father was ill with consumption, the mother near her: confinement, and several of the chitdren down with scarlet fever. If the Benevolent Asylum did not thus step in to deal with these afflicting cases, many persons, and particularly children, would sink under their ailments for want of that medical skill, nourishment, and prompt attention which the Asylum on behalf of poor humanity so generously supplies.

A great deal is also clone in repairing the miserable dwellin, os inhabited in some instances by the poor of Ballarat. Cases are of ten brought under the notice of the visitor or Committee, where the rain beats through the roof and wall of some dilapidated dwelling even upon the beds of the occupants. A sum of money is at onde roted to repair the phace, and indeed, in some instances, your Committee have purchased cheap and suitable habitations, and removed tile sutfering family from their wretchen hovels. These phaces, of consse, yemain the property of the Asylum.

In some instances, also, where the mother of a young fanily is alve to use a sewing machine. but is unable to procure one, they have been supplied, the result leing that the case no longer recoived relief, being able tor do without.

Cows, also, in some cases lawe been purdiased for reipients of good elamacter aml iulustrions lathits, that they might earn a living by the sale of milk; and, indeed, your Committee have endeavored cunesty to encourage : spinit of push and independence on the prate of the out-rloor recipients.

It shouhl the understood, however, that in ciscs where the means of procuring a living are supphlied, that the recipients are bound down to repay the outlay in small instalments.

Thus does the fir-stretching hant of the Asylum reach on all sides every species of suffiering, and it mity be consilered a great blessing that its working is so elastic; an it is in no spirit of selflandation whatever that yone Committer beliere the Benerolent Asylam to lee, in than variety of its worlings, the most compehensive Institution to be found :nywhere.

As the yem prog rowset, it was fonuad that the delat was not being reatheel ; and, desirous of ending theil year of office with as small a delet as possilhe, it was determined hy the Committee to trake a great offort to effect a reduction. A Miouster Soiree was given at the Asylum in October, consisting of tea and a great varicty of entertanments, including at preession and performance by the Chinese, in the splendid dresses kindly lent by their countrymen at Beechworth for the occasion. The weather, unfortunately, proved very inclement, and thong-1 some 7000 persons attended, and an :monnt exceeding $£ 100$ was realised as net profit, and, thas fin, the aftair was a financial suceess, yet your Committee were, compratively speaking, disappointed, confilent as they were that with faromble wenther the sum of $£ 800$ at least would have been realisel. They beg to tender their wamest thanks to the Ballarat Hammonic Society, the Ballarat Amateur Christy Min$s$ trels, and to all the ladies and gentlemen who so kindly gave their assistance; and especially to the Chinese, who not only turned out willingly to form an imposing procession, but also collected anongst themselves the sum of £180 towards the expenses of the same. Also to Mr. R. Ward, who gave his valuable assistance in inducing the Chinese to take putt in the aftair. It is a
matter of great regret that, in consequence of the sudhen setting in of wet weather, the plan of managenent for the soirce was completely upset; and that in the continsion cons equent upon so harge an attendance great inconvenience was sustamed by many, who conld not be attended to, and their wants supplied.

For special services rendered on the ocation, your Committee have much pleas ure in reconmending that the following gentlemen be appointed Life Governors of the Institution, viz:- - Vr. A T. Tumer and Mr. J. Curtis, for the Baliarat hamonic Society; Mr. 'L, Ellis, for the Band of the B.Y.R. Fhugers, ; See Gee and Chum Kee, for the Chinese Cominttee; Mr. W. G. Wright and Mr. Jas. Uren, for the Ballarat Amatem Chisty Minstrels.

Dhring the year, Mr. J. A. Doanc, one of the oldest and most respected members of the Conmitiee of Mimatoment, resigned, in consequence of lis leavines the colomy. Mr. .f. A. Doanc's great services on behalf of the Inestitntion are too well Fonown to make it necessary to enlarge upon them here; everything possilhe, however, was done in recognition of his valuable habors. A large company of members and ex-members of Committce met at the Linstitution at a social gathering, to bid Mr. Doano farewell. An illmminated adress, setting forth his great uscfuhess during his seventeren years' service, was presented to him. A most enfovable crening was spent, tempered on the part of your Commitece by the reflection that they were about to lose die services of so experienced and earnest a coaldjutor: Mr: J. Russell was appointor in the place enf Mr. J. A Doane. To Mr. IR. Alhen (Bumpons), Mr. I. Strkelemd, and Mr. R. W. 'Tanner (Mont Jigerton), and othergentlemen who so kindly act as visiting agents in places att ia distinued, and whose
 conermed in the welfiae of the Institution is dus. Ther: Honomary Medical Officers-. Messers Wlitcombe, Usher, and Butler-mare abne all they could to assist the nou-resident surgeon when required; and have most readily, when rerpuested ly your Committee, visited and treated many cases of sickness in comection with the out-door relief, and in ercry way are rleserving of the highest credit at your hauds.

It would be uagrateful on the part of your Commiltee to close this report withont hearing testimony to the liberal response made firm every direction to the appead made to the public: thonght the subscription-lists issued churing the year. Huadreds of rlonations have leeen given by parties who never gave before, :und it is a matter for rejoicing that the public are beginning to comprehend and appreciate the grand work done by the Institution. Your Committee use the word begiming, as they believe that a system of contribution has but just commenced which will bye-and-bye result in everyone who is able giving something to swell the Asylum's contribution lists, and it is quite probable that ere long the claims of the Benevolent Asylum will be discussed, and more
or less sympathised with, in every chimney corner in the district; and where not only the old folks at home and their employees will put their names to the lists, but will see that the names of their boys and girls are there too. It will be a matter of pricle with Alice and Mary, Thomas or John, to see their names down for a donation, however small; and the parents will do well to remember that, if from an early age their little ones are allowed to give, and it is explained to them why, and for what they are giving, the result will prove both humanising and elevating.

A genuine feeling of sympathy for the poor, the widow and orphan, will grow with their growth, and liberal as their parents have been in their diay, their sons and daughters will surpass them in love to their fellow-creatures, and in noble deeds of chatity.

Your Committec therefore urges upon all parents, who are in a position so to do, to see that each of their children is represented on the Asylum lists, reminding them at the same tinue of the Sariour's significant and gracious words:-
"Inasmich as ye have done it unto the least of these, ny brethren, ye have done it unto Me."

In conclusion, there is reason to believe that the Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum will be well supported churing the present year. The foundation-stone for public sympathy has been well and truly laid, and the lively interest shown in the welfare of the Institution, proved by the splendid contributions received from all parts of the district; and, indecd, it cannot well be otherwise when the Asylum has such claims on every class of thecommunity. There is not a borough or shine council in the district but has had patetical proof of the usefulness of the Institution, and scarcely a station in the wide expanse, but has contributed inmates to $b_{\text {e }}$. clothed and fecl. From farms and from workshops ome the haborer and broken-down mechanic. The miner, too, may be called upon to reffect that twenty-cight of his finternity have been hurried into eterniby in the thish of health and stren ioth by accidents in the mines, and that their twenty-eight. widows and 108 little ones receive their bread from the institution, and that many of his inethren, broken down prematurely in constitution, are, with their wives and fimilies, kept from starvation. It matters not, in fact, in which direction we look at the Asylum's work ings; on all sides it must be owned that it wields an immense power for good.

No institntion in the colony deserves a lavger meed of support, and your committee pray that the Author of all Good will greatly bless the libors of their successors in office, that poverty will decrease, and work become more plentiful, and that from every source will How in the most liberal contributions, so that for 1876 it shall be said that it was a year of uncxampled prosperity for the Ballarat District Benevolent Asytum and Lying-in Hospital.

Thle Comathe of Managentent shall manage and dixect that Gencral hasiness of the bustitution; shall frame by-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contray to the general mules; :upoint and dischavge atl sillinial oftiecrs aul servints of the Tristitution ; shall neect one day in each month, and at other bays as they shath appoint; ablunt and discharge patients, and malie rules imul regulations respecting thom and their treatment; and shath aproint sub-comitteres for all necessiry purposes, and atulitors. The Chaiman of Committees to bave a casting, lyut no lefiborative rote.
9. The: President, Viec-Presidents, whd Treasurer, shatl be members ex ofticio of all committees.
10. All sub-comnitters shail hate at least five members, three to form a quorvin.
11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of Janurers in each year.
12. Any mentier of the Committee of Nanagement (except the Trustees and Honoury Medical Officers) alsenting himself for two months, without as signing a reasomble cause, shall cense to he a member of the Comuittee, and amother shall be appointed in his stead.
13. No menner of Comitee shall vote on any question in which he shall hwo a pectutary interest.

## TRESSCFRR.

14. All moneys recemed on account of the Institntion, shall be pain into the bank appointel by the Comantee of Manarement, to the credit of the 'Treastrer" of the Tnstitution, iend shall be appopriated to the puproses of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Manaremont.

## SE CHETKAF.

1.
