TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS—

It was not without considerable anxiety that your Committee commenced their labors for the year *in re* the management of this great and comprehensive Institution.

For years its several branches of relief had increased to an extent that was becoming very serious, the out door relief in particular assuming such proportions in numbers and expenditure that, bearing in mind the general depression, and the consequent uncertainty of keeping up the revenue, your Committee may be excused in feeling some misgivings on accepting the heavy responsibility placed in their hands.

It is therefore highly gratifying for them to be able to lay before you so favorable an account of the position of the Asylum, and they are glad to report that in every direction, whether in receipts or expenditure, the several items will be found most satisfactory and encouraging. It will afford you much pleasure to note:—

1. That the debt has during the year been reduced by £381 7s 11d.

2nd. That while the number of inmates remaining in the house on the 31st December shows no increase, being the same as for the previous year, the daily average number of inmates was three less for 1875. It is interesting to note that this is the first decrease which has taken place since the Asylum was built, and has of course caused a corresponding decrease in the expenditure.

3rd. A reduction has also taken place in out-door relief, both in numbers and expenditure. In the former the decrease is six adults and thirty-three children per week, and the latter is less than for 1874 by the sum of £246 15s 5d. A reduction of four has also taken place in the number of lying-in cases. The total reduction in the expenditure amounts to £418 5s 6d.

4th. That while on the expenditure side there has been the decrease referred to, the receipts show a considerable increase, the

amount of contributions from all sources—viz, £2778 1s 2d—being by far the largest amount ever raised in any one year by the Institution. This pleasing state of things has not been effected, however, without endeavors being made by your Committee to economise in every possible direction, and of the most zealous exertions on the part of the Secretary and Collector in endeavoring not only to keep up the revenue, but, as has been shown, to increase it.

There are signs which encourage your Committee to hope that the worst has been passed, and that the immense pressure which has been felt so heavily by this particular Institution during the last few years, in consequence chiefly of the collapse in mining, will not be so great as it has been.

The bank overdraft on the 31st December was £2440 7s 11d. Against this amount the sum of £1500 is due on account of Government grant-in-aid, the sum of £150 is also due in shire council subscriptions for 1875, leaving a debit balance of £790 5s 11d, a reduction of £381 7s 11d upon the debt remaining at the end of 1874.

On the 31st December there remained in the Asylum 200 males, 27 females—total, 227. During the year there have been admitted 129 males and 74 females (including births) so that in all 430 inmates have been resident in the Asylum. Of these there have been discharged 127 males and 76 females (included in these figures are 50 deaths which have taken place)—total, 203; leaving in the Asylum at the end of the year 200 males and 27 females—total, 227.

The daily average number of inmates for the year 1875 was 232, as against 235 for 1874, a reduction of three inmates per diem. The average cost per head of inmates was £17 3s 10d, a decrease of 14s 4d per head upon 1874. This fact will prove the economy that has been exercised, and the credit which is due to the master, Mr. W. Boughen, for his carefulness. It is not uncommon for the collector to be told that some of the inmates are able to work well, and as the public are not too well aware of the causes which incapacitate them from earning a living, the following return will prove useful in exciting sympathy, and will no doubt assist the collector when canvassing for subscriptions:—

A brief space may be wisely filled in explaining how the Asylum came to deal with so many kinds of disease. When the Institution was first erected it was intended as a house for the aged, infirm, and disabled, but it was soon found that by far the greater number of cases were incurable—some, indeed, of a most distressing character, such as cancer, consumption, &c. These cases were admitted, and soon increased to such an extent that, as will be seen by reference to the above table, out of 227 inmates only 66 belong to the class for whom the Asylum was intended. To deal with these cases, so that they could receive the best medical treatment, and their sufferings alleviated as far as possible, was founded the Chronic Hospital.

The subscribers and the public will do well to visit and inspect this interesting portion of the Asylum, for in it they will see much to arouse their admiration and pity. They will find the spacious hospital bright-looking and well-ventilated, and its occupants contented and grateful under their severe afflictions. The visitor will not, as in the case of an ordinary hospital, come in contact with cases most of whom will recover to re-enter the ranks again to fight the battle of life, but the solemn thought will rise in his mind that in the beds around him he gazes upon fellow-mortals upon whose frames death has fixed a sure and certain grip, whose time may be counted by hours, days or weeks, but for whom in any case no long term of life exists—their distance from eternity prolonged, and their sufferings alleviated, only by the medical skill and excellent nursing and attention which a generous public has provided, and which is so fully met in the management of this noble branch of the Asylum's operations. The visitor will not fail to be surprised at the number of blind men he will meet in every part of the grounds. No less than twenty-seven suffer from this saddest of all afflictions; most of whom are in the prime of life, and certain to remain for many years in the Institution.

Amongst the many white heads and bending forms are to be seen soldiers and sailors, from the veteran who fought at Waterloo to (until just lately) the aged salt of ninety-five, who fought with Nelson in the *Victory* at Trafalgar. While a noble Hospital is supported in Ballarat for the treatment of curable complaints, your Committee trust that the public will bear in mind that *another* hospital exists on a large scale in connection with the Benevolent Asylum, for the reception and treatment of incurable disease and result of accidents.

The produce of the garden, calculated at market rates, amounts to £174 14s 10d. A profit of £109 4s has been realised on the dairy. The ornamental garden has been kept in excellent order by Mr. J. Brewster, who has also been enabled to keep the inmates constantly supplied with plenty of fresh vegetables, according to their season.

## THE LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The Lying-in Hospital has been conducted during the year in the same admirable manner as in past years, and keeps up its reputation as one of the very best managed Institutions of the kind in the colonies. Mrs. Boughen and Mrs. Wearne, the experienced matron and sub-matron, deserve great credit for their excellent management of this important part of the Asylum. Your best thanks are due to the ladies who have constantly visited and inspected The Lying-in Hospital.

## OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

It is with great satisfaction that your Committee are enabled at last to report a decrease in this heavy and harassing branch. A reduction of six adults and 33 children is shown for 1875 as against 1874. While the decrease is not very large, it is nevertheless significant in this respect, that from causes not necessary to mention here, your Committee are encouraged to believe that the year 1876 will show a still greater reduction. Previous annual reports have dealt so fully with the nature and system of out-door relief; that it is unnecessary to go over the old ground again; but as an impression seems to prevail that the work done is limited to the supply of rations, advantage should be taken of this opportunity to point out that, during the winter season especially, aged and infirm people, sick families, and in cases also where the father is confined to his bed from illness and unable to work, and many other cases of a similar kind, have been supplied with firewood—as great a necessity in its way as food. The expenditure on this item amounts to £64 15s 6d.

The public should be made acquainted also with the fact that a great deal of sickness exists on Ballarat, where the sufferer or sufferers are unable, from weakness, or the nature of their complaint, to attend the Ballarat District Hospital, and as the rules of that Institution preclude it from sending its officers to deal with such cases, the Benevolent Asylum, though never intended for such a purpose, humanely sends its non-resident surgeon and honorary medical officers to the bedside of these afflicted ones, who are prescribed for, and nourishment and medical comforts supplied. In this way many cases of sickness and decline have been dealt with, including families stricken with malignant diseases such as scarlet fever, diphtheria, &c.

One case will suffice as an example to which the doctor was sent, where the father was ill with consumption, the mother near her confinement, and several of the children down with scarlet fever. If the Benevolent Asylum did not thus step in to deal with these afflicting cases, many persons, and particularly children, would sink under their ailments for want of that medical skill, nourishment, and prompt attention which the Asylum on behalf of poor humanity so generously supplies.



A great deal is also done in repairing the miserable dwellings inhabited in some instances by the poor of Ballarat. Cases are often brought under the notice of the visitor or Committee, where the rain heats through the roof and wall of some dilapidated dwelling, even upon the beds of the occupants. A sum of money is at once voted to repair the place, and indeed, in some instances, your Committee have purchased cheap and suitable habitations, and removed the suffering family from their wretched hovels. These places, of course, remain the property of the Asylum.

In some instances, also, where the mother of a young family is able to use a sewing machine, but is unable to procure one, they have been supplied, the result being that the case no longer received relief, being able to do without.

Cows, also, in some cases have been purchased for recipients of good character and industrious habits, that they might earn a living by the sale of milk; and, indeed, your Committee have endeavored earnestly to encourage a spirit of push and independence on the part of the out-door recipients.

It should be understood, however, that in cases where the means of procuring a living are supplied, that the recipients are bound down to repay the outlay in small instalments.

Thus does the far-stretching hand of the Asylum reach on all sides every species of suffering; and it may be considered a great blessing that its working is so elastic; and it is in no spirit of self-laudation whatever that your Committee believe the Benevolent Asylum to be, in the variety of its workings, the most comprehensive Institution to be found anywhere.

As the year progressed, it was found that the debt was not being reduced; and, desirous of ending their year of office with as small a debt as possible, it was determined by the Committee to make a great effort to effect a reduction. A *Monster Soiree* was given at the Asylum in October, consisting of tea and a great variety of entertainments, including a procession and performance by the Chinese, in the splendid dresses kindly lent by their countrymen at Beechworth for the occasion. The weather, unfortunately, proved very inclement, and though some 7000 persons attended, and an amount exceeding £400 was realised as net profit, and, thus far, the affair was a financial success, yet your Committee were, comparatively speaking, disappointed, confident as they were that with favorable weather the sum of £800 at least would have been realised. They beg to tender their warmest thanks to the Ballarat Harmonic Society, the Ballarat Amateur Christy Minstrels, and to all the ladies and gentlemen who so kindly gave their assistance; and especially to the Chinese, who not only turned out willingly to form an imposing procession, but also collected amongst themselves the sum of £180 towards the expenses of the same. Also to Mr. R. Ward, who gave his valuable assistance in inducing the Chinese to take part in the affair. It is a

matter of great regret that, in consequence of the sudden setting in of wet weather, the plan of management for the soiree was completely upset; and that in the confusion consequent upon so large an attendance great inconvenience was sustained by many, who could not be attended to, and their wants supplied.

For special services rendered on the occasion, your Committee have much pleasure in recommending that the following gentlemen be appointed Life Governors of the Institution, viz.:—Mr. A. T. Turner and Mr. J. Curtis, for the Ballarat Harmonic Society; Mr. T. Ellis, for the Band of the B.V.R. Rangers; Yee Gee and Chun Kee, for the Chinese Committee; Mr. W. G. Wright and Mr. Jas. Uren, for the Ballarat Amateur Christy Minstrels.

During the year, Mr. J. A. Doane, one of the oldest and most respected members of the Committee of Management, resigned, in consequence of his leaving the colony. Mr. J. A. Doane's great services on behalf of the Institution are too well known to make it necessary to enlarge upon them here; everything possible, however, was done in recognition of his valuable labors. A large company of members and ex-members of Committee met at the Institution at a social gathering, to bid Mr. Doane farewell. An illuminated address, setting forth his great usefulness during his seventeen years' service, was presented to him. A most enjoyable evening was spent, tempered on the part of your Committee by the reflection that they were about to lose the services of so experienced and earnest a coadjutor. Mr. J. Russell was appointed in the place of Mr. J. A. Doane. To Mr. R. Allan (Bumyong), Mr. J. Strickland, and Mr. R. W. Tanner (Mount Egerton), and other gentlemen who so kindly act as visiting agents in places at a distance, and whose assistance is so valuable and necessary, the best thanks of all concerned in the welfare of the Institution is due. The Honorary Medical Officers—Messrs Whitcombe, Usher, and Butler—have done all they could to assist the non-resident surgeon when required; and have most readily, when requested by your Committee, visited and treated many cases of sickness in connection with the out-door relief, and in every way are deserving of the highest credit at your hands.

It would be ungrateful on the part of your Committee to close this report without bearing testimony to the liberal response made from every direction to the appeal made to the public through the subscription-lists issued during the year. Hundreds of donations have been given by parties who never gave before, and it is a matter for rejoicing that the public are beginning to comprehend and appreciate the grand work done by the Institution. Your Committee use the word beginning, as they believe that a system of contribution has but just commenced which will bye-and-bye result in everyone who is able giving something to swell the Asylum's contribution lists, and it is quite probable that ere long the claims of the Benevolent Asylum will be discussed, and more

or less sympathised with, in every chimney corner in the district; and where not only the old folks at home and their employees will put their names to the lists, but will see that the names of their boys and girls are there too. It will be a matter of pride with Alice and Mary, Thomas or John, to see their names down for a donation, however small; and the parents will do well to remember that, if from an early age their little ones are allowed to give, and it is explained to them why, and for what they are giving, the result will prove both humanising and elevating.

A genuine feeling of sympathy for the poor, the widow and orphan, will grow with their growth, and liberal as their parents have been in their day, their sons and daughters will surpass them in love to their fellow-creatures, and in noble deeds of charity.

Your Committee therefore urges upon all parents, who are in a position so to do, to see that each of their children is represented on the Asylum lists, reminding them at the same time of the Saviour's significant and gracious words:—

“Inasmuch as ye have done it unto the least of these, my brethren, ye have done it unto Me.”

In conclusion, there is reason to believe that the Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum will be well supported during the present year. The foundation-stone for public sympathy has been well and truly laid, and the lively interest shown in the welfare of the Institution, proved by the splendid contributions received from all parts of the district; and, indeed, it cannot well be otherwise when the Asylum has such claims on every class of the community. There is not a borough or shire council in the district but has had practical proof of the usefulness of the Institution, and scarcely a station in the wide expanse, but has contributed inmates to be clothed and fed. From farms and from workshops come the laborer and broken-down mechanic. The miner, too, may be called upon to reflect that twenty-eight of his fraternity have been hurried into eternity in the flush of health and strength by accidents in the mines, and that their twenty-eight widows and 108 little ones receive their bread from the institution, and that many of his brethren, broken down prematurely in constitution, are, with their wives and families, kept from starvation. It matters not, in fact, in which direction we look at the Asylum's workings; on all sides it must be owned that it wields an immense power for good.

No institution in the colony deserves a larger meed of support, and your committee pray that the Author of all Good will greatly bless the labors of their successors in office, that poverty will decrease, and work become more plentiful, and that from every source will flow in the most liberal contributions, so that for 1876 it shall be said that it was a year of unexampled prosperity for the Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital.

# R U L E S

OF

## THE BALLARAT BENEVOLENT ASYLUM,

ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNORS, JAN. 24, 1867.

---

### OBJECTS:-

TO RELIEVE THE AGED, INFIRM, DISABLED, AND DESTITUTE, AND TO MINISTER TO THEIR NECESSITIES, ACCORDING TO THE ABILITY OF THE INSTITUTION.

---

### LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first named in any will, by which a bequest of £20 or upwards, shall be paid to the Institution, shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution, shall be a Life Governor.

### ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a shire council, road board, or municipal council, shall entitle the mayor, president, or chairman of the body donating to be an Annual Governor. Every subscriber of £1 and upwards, annually, shall be an Annual Governor, to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all the yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided, in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such a meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, three Honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen

Governors, all of whom, except the Trustees, shall be elected annually, by and from the Governors, in the month of January in each year.

4. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee of Management, the said Committee shall have the power to fill up the vacancy for the unexpired term, except in the case of a Trustee, or Honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a general meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of January in each year; when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition, signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the annual or other special meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time, within seven days, when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of Management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame by-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules; appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall appoint sub-committees for all necessary purposes, and auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, but no deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, shall be members *ex officio* of all committees.

10. All sub-committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of January in each year.

12. Any member of the Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medical Officers) absenting himself for two months, without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

#### TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution, shall be paid into the bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

#### SECRETARY.

15. The Secretary shall attend all annual, special, and committee meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases giving receipts, and shall, within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each meeting of the General or House Committee an account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department; keep the accounts of the Institution under the direction of the several Committees, compile all reports of the Committees, fill the cheques; and perform all the clerical duties connected with the office of Treasurer.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves; shall have access to the Institution at all times; perform all surgical operations, and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause, shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the rules, shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
