TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS,—

Your Committee's year of office has proved in every sense, most prosperous and successful.

The Contributions received are considerably in excess of previous years, in spite of the general depression said to have prevailed on all sides, and there remained but a small debit balance of £125 8s 4d at the close of the year.

While there has been a slight increase on the House expenditure of £48, that of the out-door Relief shows a reduction of £75

A considerable amount has had to be expended in repairs, owing more particularly to the ruinous condition of the cement facings of the Building, which had to be removed, re-done afresh, and the whole of the Institution re-painted.

The old low Fence in front of the centre portion of the Asylum being rotten and worn out, and a new Fence necessary, it was considered more economical in the long run, to erect an open iron fence of sufficient height to prevent Trespassers from climbing over to rob and damage the Garden.

A contract was therefore taken up for the present iron fence, which it must be admitted is an immense improvement on the old one, and gives to the Grounds and general aspect, a bright, pleasing, and cheerful effect.

The average cost per head of Inmates, was £17 14s,—being 3s 9d in excess of the previous year; this is accounted for by the heavy purchases of Clothing for the Inmates,—an item you will be free from for 1880.

392 Cases have been resident during the year, or two more than for 1878; but on the other hand, the daily average number of Inmates was 244, or 2 less than the previous year. This decrease is owing to the large number of deaths which took place, viz—56, as against 38 for 1878.

The weekly average of out-door Recipients was.—394 Adults, and 484 Children; for 1878, it was 385 Adults and 495 Children,—an increase of 9 Adults, and a decrease of 11 Children per week.

The produce of the Garden, sold at market rates, amounts to £147 0s 2d, and the Dairy realised a net profit of £129 16s 5d.

Your Committee with great regret, accepted the resignation of Mr. R. Ward, in consequence of his leaving Ballarat, and in recognition of his long and useful services, presented him with an engrossed testimonial setting forth their desire for his welfare and prosperity. Mr. T. Taylor was elected to the vacant seat.

It is greatly to be deplored that the Ballarat Town Council has reduced its donation to the Institution by one half. It is certain that before long, the loss of this money will make itself severely felt, and there is every probability of your in-coming Committee being unable to draw the Government Grant-in-Aid, from want of the necessary Funds. Your Committee cannot but feel grieved and disappointed when they consider the time and labor they bestow in visiting the poor, and in directing the affairs of this great Institution, to find how little Municipal and Shire Bodies—in some cases— appreciate their efforts, and seem even to take a pleasure in reducing the means by which the good and noble work is carried on.

If this kind of thing is to continue, you will ere long find it impossible to induce Citizens of repute and standing to become members of your Committee, and give the time and labor required to properly administer the affairs of this particular Institution with its large number of Inmates, and immense out-door Relief. Your Committee look for and expect no other reward, than the encouragement afforded by a sound and reasonable financial support from the Shires and Borough Councils in the District who are so deeply indebted to this Institution for the great work it does for them.

Grateful mention must be made of the kind efforts of the Gentlemen forming the Charity Sunday Committee. The result of the collections amounted to £174 3s, or £31 in excess of the previous year. This gratifying result was owing, partly to the exertions of the Hon. Sec., Mr Henry Davies, and partly to the valuable assistance he received from the Secretaries of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.

Special mention should also be made of the kind offer of Miss Alice Rees to give a Benefit in aid of one or all of the Ballarat

Charities. The Concert realised the large net profit of £103 4s., of which, the Benevolent Asylum, received £34 6s. As some slight recognition of Miss Rees' kindness, your Committee placed her name on the list of Life Governors. Before leaving this subject, it is only fair that you should be made aware that it was owing to the exertions of Mr. Cazaly, that this benefit took place, and we draw your attention to this fact, because we consider that your Secretary has not received that amount of credit in reference to this successful concert, to which he is justly entitled.

It was considered necessary that a Crown Grant of the land upon which the Asylum stands should be applied for; this was done, and the Deed received in due course. On perusal, however, it was found to contain provisions so utterly in conflict with the Rules and Bye-laws of the Institution, and provided for its management in a way so different to that at present existing, that your Committee not only refused to accept it, but applied to the Government to issue a Crown Grant drawn up by their instructions, by the Asylum Solicitor, and which was in harmony with the rules. This was declined by the Government, on the pleas, that the Grant proposed was illegal, and that any alteration would involve the sanction of an Act of Parliament. Upon this, your Committee sought Counsel's opinion upon the objectionable Clauses. Counsel's opinion fully bore out the objections taken to the Crown Grant, one clause of which stated that the Rules and Regulations for the management of the Institution were to be made by the Governor-in-Council, but that until these were made, the Trustees are to make the Regulations; this, as you are of course aware, gave all power completely into the hands of the full Trustees, instead of, as stated in the Rules, the Committee of Management which is appointed annually by you.

The following questions submitted to Counsel and the replies thereto, will explain clearly the dubious position in which not only your Committee was placed; but also, the Life Governors and Subscribers of the Institution:—

Copy of opinions given by C. B. Finlayson Esq., Counsel, RE the effect of the Crown Grant issued by the Government to the Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum.

QUESTION 1st—If it is illegal for the Government to issue to the Asylum, Crown Grant in terms of the one as asked by the Asylum, or if it is only a question of discretion?

REPLY—The former can issue a Grant of the land to the Trustees for the Asylum without any conditions being inserted therein, except that the land shall be used for no other purpose but that of an Asylum. Any other conditions as to the power to make Bye-laws for the government of the Institution are in the discretion of the Governors.

QUESTION 2nd (answered with Question 3)—Is the Crown Grant, as issued to the Asylum, applicable to the Asylum, regard being had to the Rules thereof printed and sent herewith; or if it only applies to a Trust where the Trust

is carried out by the Trustees named in Grant, as in the case of a Cemetery Trust or Racecourse Trust, where Trustees make the Regulations and carry on the operations of the Trust, and not as in the case of this Asylum, where the Institution is managed by a Committee elected annually by the Governors of the Institution (see Rules 3, 8, etc)?

QUESTION 3rd—Can the Institution be carried on as heretofore while the present Crown Grant as issued is in force?

REPLY TO QUESTIONS 2nd and 3rd—The Grant as framed is inapplicable to such Institution as the Asylum. Under the present Regulations, the Government is invested in a moveable Committee, who are annually elected by the Subscribers, who have power to make Bye-laws and, generally, to regulate the management. The Trustees, though not annually elected, are *ex-officio* members of the Committee. If the Grant be accepted as at present framed, the power of making Bye-laws will be vested solely in the Trustees, an alteration which will virtually remove the government of the Institution from the control of the Subscribers and vest it in the hands of the Trustees—an irresponsible body. Such a change would necessitate the passing of new Regulations, and the carrying on of the Institution on different principles from which it is at present directed. It is a well-known fact that the public will not subscribe freely to Charitable Institutions over which they have no control; and, therefore I think the present Grant will injuriously affect the interests of the Asylum.

Upon receipt of Counsel's opinion, the Crown Grant Sub-Committee was instructed to wait on the Hon. the Minister of Lands to protest against the anomalous position in which your Committee of Management was placed, and to point out that every act performed by it under the Crown grant was illegal.

The Deputation was most kindly received by Mr. Longmore, and Mr. Sutherland, the head of the Crown Law Department. The legal aspect of the question was most lucidly explained by your Hon. Solicitor, Mr. C. Salter, who accompanied the Deputation, the result, after considerable discussion, being that the Department consented to add supplementary clauses providing:—

1st—"That the powers of the Trustees should be confined to conserving the land and building;"

2nd—"That the Rules and Bye-laws for the regulation of the Institution should be made and carried out by the Committee of Management as provided for in the Rules."

Thus satisfactorily ended this protracted and vexatious question, which has caused so great an expenditure of time and labor. Your best thanks are due to Mr. J. Oddie, Mr. C. C. Shoppee, the Hon. Solicitor, Mr. C. Salter, and the Members for Ballarat, for their persevering efforts to bring the business to a satisfactory conclusion.

Nothing now remains but for your Committee to express their thankfulness to the Almighty giver of all good things for the success attending their season of labor, and heartily to wish God speed to their successors in office.

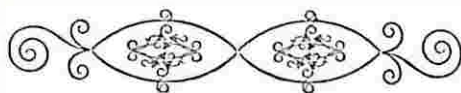

R U L E S

OF

THE BALLARAT BENEVOLENT ASYLUM,

Adopted by the Governors, January 24, 1867.

OBJECTS:—

TO RELIEVE THE AGED, INFIRM, DISABLED, AND DESTITUTE AND TO MINISTER TO THEIR NECESSITIES, ACCORDING TO THE ABILITY OF THE INSTITUTE.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first name in any will, by which a bequest of £20 or upwards, shall be paid to the Institution shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution, shall be a Life Governor.

ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a Shire Council, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, President, or Chairman of the body donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every subscriber of £1 and upwards, annually, shall be an Annual Governor, to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all the yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided, in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, two Vice-presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, three honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen Governors, all of whom, except the Trustees, shall be elected annually, by and from the Governors, in the month of January in each year.

4. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee of Management, the said Committee shall have the power to fill up the vacancy for the unexpired term, except in the case of a Trustee or honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a general meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of January in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition, signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so, on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the annual or other special meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of Management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame by-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules: appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall appoint Sub-committees for all necessary purposes, and auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, but not a deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, shall be members *ex officio* of all committees.

10. All Sub-committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of January in each year.

12. Any member of the Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Hon. Medical Officers) absenting himself for two months, without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution, shall be paid into the bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

SECRETARY.

15. The Treasurer shall attend all annual, special and committee meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases, giving receipts, and shall, within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each meeting of the General or House Committee an account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department; keep the accounts of the Institution under the direction of the several Committees; compile all reports of the Committees; fill the cheques, and perform all the clerical duties connected with the office of Treasurer.

HON. MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves; shall have access to the Institution at all times; perform all surgical operations, and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause, shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the rules, shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
