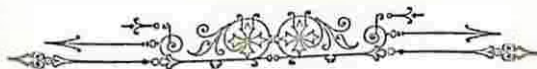

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS,—

Your Committee feel highly gratified in being enabled to render so pleasant and favorable an account of their stewardship over the splendid Institution committed by you to their care.

You will heartily share in our pleasure, when we inform you that in every direction the Asylum has prospered, that we have nothing but what is bright and hopeful to report, and that our experience generally points to the agreeable fact that the Ballarat District has entered upon a career of prosperity, and abundance of labor, which has, and will still further decrease the heavy demands upon the Institution for aid.

Not only are your receipts larger for 1881, than for the year previous, and every item of expenditure less for the same period, but for the first time for many years we have the pleasant duty of recording a considerable fall in the number of Out-Door Recipients, a reduction of no less than 23 adults and 86 children per week for 1881, the relief for that year being 379 adults and 334 children per week, against 402 adults and 425 children for 1880.

The general expenditure shows the following reductions. In Out-Door Relief £180; House expenditure, £235; making a total of £575.

The average cost per head of inmates for the year was £16 4s 7d, a reduction of 8s per head on the previous year.

Your Bank overdraft on the 31st December was £778 7s 6d, but against this you have £1750 to draw on account of Government Grant-in-Aid, so that you start upon your expenditure for 1882 with the sum of £972 12s 6d in hand, but it must be borne in mind that this amount will be required to meet the current expenditure to the end of the Government Year, 30th June, following. You perceive, therefore, that we have excellent reasons in offering you our hearty congratulations upon the prosperous and satisfactory condition of the Institution.

The produce of the garden, if sold at market rates, represents a sum of £138 8s 10d.

The Dairy realised a profit of £107 17s 6d; and the sum of £93 7s 3d was raised by the sale of fat and refuse.

At the end of 1880 there remained in the Asylum 236 inmates, and there were admitted during the year 190 cases; in all 426 resident.

192 cases have been discharged or died during the period, leaving in the Asylum on the 31st December, 1881, 234 inmates.

We gratefully thank all who during the year have assisted the Asylum in any form, especially the Charity Sunday Committee, by whose exertions we received the handsome sum of £170, the largest collection yet made on this annual effort.

Your warmest thanks are also due to the Very Rev. Dean Moore and the congregation of St. Patricks Church for the handsome collection made by them on Good Friday, of £46 4s 7d. This collection is outside of, and has nothing to do with the Charity Sunday collection, and is given annually to the Institution on account of its superior claims in connection with expenditure and extent of relief.

We must commend to your favorable notice your excellent honorary medical officers, Drs. Whitecombe, Radcliffe, and Usher, as

ever ready for this charity to give freely of their time, labor and talents.

One dark spot only there is on our otherwise bright report. We allude to the decease of the late respected Matron, Mrs. C. Wearne, an old and valued officer of the Asylum.

The best and most touching tribute to her worth was to be seen in the grief of the inmates, during her illness and demise. She was at all times unwearied in her efforts to mitigate the sufferings and to soften the last hours of the aged and dying inmates committed to her care, and in return was greatly beloved by them.

The election for the office of Matron resulted in the appointment of Mrs. H. Walsh.

During the year the institution was visited by the Inspector of Charities.

To save time and space, we may explain that Mr. Neal has since published his reports and recommendations, and that as far as the Asylum is concerned, the result of his labors may be considered under two heads—

FIRST—His general report, in which he summarises his experience, and not only recommends certain propositions for the future support and management of the Institutions, but suggests the passing of an Act for the same, which may be found fully drawn up in his report.

As we have examined exhaustively into his proposals, and the result of our labors is now in the hands of the printer, and will be fully circulated in a day or two, we shall in this place merely state that we disagree with most of the Inspector's propositions. We consider some of them impracticable and unsuitable, and we feel confident that when he shall have had more experience, Mr. Neal will find it necessary to modify many of the views and opinions expressed by him.

SECOND—The result of Mr Neal's personal inspection of the Institution.

As we have drawn up at length our replies to the Inspector's criticisms, which document will be sent to the local press for their examination and comment, we shall here briefly state that Mr.

Neal's report is generally very favorable. He refers in high terms to the general cleanliness and order, and especially commends the female side as being in admirable condition. The Inspector alludes to the economical expenditure on wines and spirits, and refers in very laudatory terms to the excellent and well-kept books and accounts in the Secretary's department.

Although we are at variance with the Inspector in some of his criticisms, we are not surprised at their crudeness, and the want of experience displayed in connection with them.

When you consider that it takes a considerable period even for a member of your committee to master the various details of the varied relief given by this Institution, it is really not a matter for surprise that the smartest Inspector should, in a flying visit of two days, fail to master the many points of view surrounding out-door relief cases, for instance, and especially lying-in cases, which take years of experience to understand and manage. On one or two points we are in accord with Mr. Neal. For instance, we think a store book is necessary for the master to keep. Such a book was kept for years, and entered up weekly, but owing to the great increase of the Asylum, the work was found too great. We have directed that such a book be kept and entered up monthly to lessen the work.

We also agree that the Ward referred to by Mr. Neal as smelling unpleasantly, is at times unsatisfactory in that respect, but the Inspector omitted in his criticism to add that this Ward is devoted to cases of the worst kind which absolutely require isolation, cases of gangrene, ulcers, cancer, &c., which under the most favorable conditions, emit unpleasant odors. We are endeavoring to amend the ventilation as far as we possibly can.

We quite dissent from Mr. Neal's idea that the parents of Lying-in cases should be made to pay for their maintenance. It has been found impracticable, and in most cases undesirable. We have, however, gone fully into this matter in our report to be supplied to the Press.

Mr. Neal's proposition that the Out-door Relief is too widely extended, and should be dealt with by local societies is also im-

practicable. The cases are dotted over a wild expanse of country, including bush and bad roads, such as would prevent, for instance, ladies' societies from visiting them; and then it is notorious that, owing to want of proper Government support, the local societies have no funds for the purpose, and in the cause of humanity, your Committee, to prevent starvation, has to come to the rescue. The various points in Mr. Neal's inspection are so fully ventilated in the reports heretofore referred to, that we shall simply conclude our notice of them by referring you to them for perusal.

In conclusion, every friend and well-wisher of this grand and useful Institution, will be gratified at its prosperous condition.

We accepted the onerous trust reposed in us with pleasure, and it is with feelings of pardonable pride and gratification that we hand over our important charge to you again.

For the success which has crowned our labors, we are indeed thankful to him who is the "Giver of all good things," and trust that he will equally bless the efforts of our successors, so that the ensuing year may be one of peace and prosperity for the

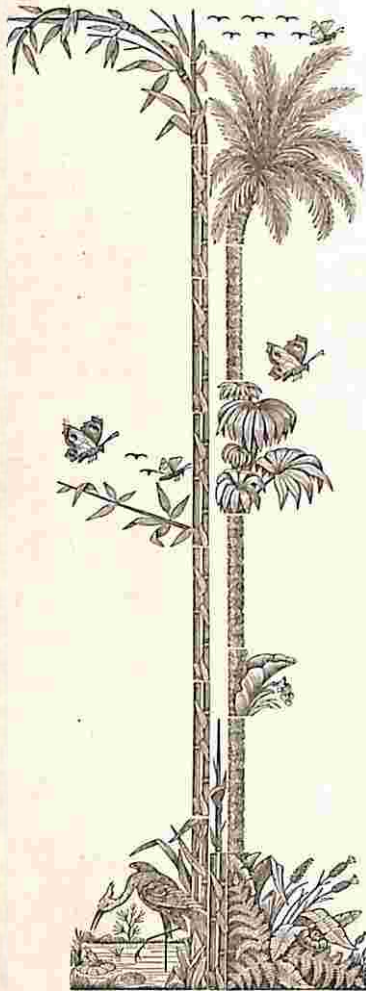

RULES

OF

The Ballarat Benevolent Asylum,

Adopted by the Governors, 24th January, 1867.

OBJECTS:—

TO RELIEVE THE AGED, INFIRM, DISABLED, AND DESTITUTE, AND
TO MINISTER TO THEIR NECESSITIES, ACCORDING TO THE
ABILITY OF THE INSTITUTE.

LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first named in any will, by which a bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the Institution, shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution, shall be a Life Governor.

ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a Shire Council, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, President, or Chairman of the body donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every

subscriber of £1 and upwards, annually, shall be an Annual Governor, to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided, in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, three honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen Governors, all of whom except the Trustees, shall be elected annually, by and from the Governors, in the month of January in each year.

4. In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee of Management, the said Committee shall have the power to fill up the vacancy for the unexpired term, except in the case of a Trustee, or Honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a general meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of January in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition, signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so, on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the annual or other special meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules;

appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall appoint Sub-Committees for all necessary purposes, and Auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, but not a deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, shall be members, *ex-officio*, of all committees.

10. All Sub-committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of January in each year.

12. Any member of the Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medical Officers) absenting himself for two months, without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution shall be paid into the bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

SECRETARY.

15. The Secretary shall attend all annual, special, and committee meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases giving receipts, and

shall, within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each meeting of the General or House Committee an account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department; keep the accounts of the Institution under the direction of the several Committees; compile all reports of the Committees; fill the cheques, and perform all the clerical duties connected with the office of Secretary.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves; shall have access to the Institution at all times; perform all surgical operations, and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the Rules shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
