Fon will heartily share in our pleasure, when we intom you that in erery direction the Asylum las prospered, that we have nothing layt what is bright and hopeful to report, aud that our experience gencrally points to the agreeable fact that the Ballarat District has entered upon a carcer of prosperity, and abunlance of labor, which has, aum will still further decrease the heary demands tupon the Institution for aid.

Not only are your receints Iarger for 1881, than for the yrar previmes, and crery item of expenditure less for the sume perion, but for the first tiune for many years wo have the pleasant cluty of recorling a considerable fall in the number of Out-Don Recipients, a reduction of no less than 23 adults and 8 children wer week for 1881, the reliff for that year being 379 actults and 894 chideren per

ever realy for this chanty to give frem of their tine, labor and talents.

One dark spot ouly there is on one ot herwise bright report. We allude to the decease of the late respected Matrm. Mrs. C. Wearne, an old and ralued officer of the A sylum.

The best aul most touching tribute to her worth was to be sem in the grief of the inmates, cluring her illness and dentize. She was at all times unwearied in her efforts to mitigate the sufferings ant to solten the last hours of the aged and dying inmates commited to her care, and in return wats greatly belowed 1 g therm.

The election for the office of Matron resulted in the appointment. of Mrs. H. Walsh.

During the year the instifution wals visitech by the Inspector of Charities.

To sare time and space, we may explain that Mr. Noal has since problished his reports and recommentations, and that as tar as the Asylum is concerned, the result of his labors may be considered muder two heals-

Fust-His general report, in which he sumnarises his experience, and not only recommends certain propositions for the future support aul management of the Institufions, but suggests the passimg on an Act for the same, which may be fomal fully drawn up in his report.

As we have examined exhaustively into his proposals, and the result of our lators is now in the hands of the printer, and will he fully circulated in a day or two, we shall in this place merdy state that we disagree with most of the Inspeetor's propositions. We consider some of them inuracticalble and masuitable, and we ferd confilent that when he shall haye had more expertence, Mr. Neal will find it necessary to modify many of the riews ant opinions expressed ly him.

Second-The result of Mr Neal's personal inspection of the Institution.

As we have drawn up at length our rephies io the Inspector's criticisms, which document will he sent to the beal press for their examination and comment, wo shall here lreetly state that Mr.

Neal's report is generally rery lavarable. He refers in high terms to the general cleanliness aud order, and especially commends the fentale side as being in admiralte condition. The Inspector allules to the economical expenditure on wines and spirits, and refers in very landatory terms to the excellent and well-kept books ancl accoments in the Secretary's department.

Although we are at rarience with the Inspector in some of his criticisms, we are not surnised at their cruleness, and the want of experience displayed in comection with them.

When yon consider that it takes a consilerable period even for a member of your committee to master the rarions details of the varied relief given by this Institution, it is really not a matter for surpris that the smartest Inspector should, in a flying risit oi two days, fail to master the many points of view surrounding ont door relief cases, for instance, and especially lying-in cases, which take years of experience to uuderstand aul manage. On one or two points'we are in aceord with Mr. Neal. F'or instance, we think a store book is necessary for the master to keep. Such a book was kept for years, and entered up weekly, but owingto the great increase of the Asylum, the work was found too great. We have directed that such a book be kept and entered up monthly to lessen the rook.

We also agree that the Ward roferred to In Mr. Neal as smelling unpleasantly, is at times unsatisfactory in that respect, but the Inspector omitted in his criticism to add that this Ward is devoted to eases of the worst kind which absolutely require isolation, cases of gangrene, ulcers, cancer, \&e., whichl umder the most favorable conditions, emit unpleasant odors. We are endeavoring to amend the rentilation as far as we possibly can.

We quite dissent from Mr. Neal's idea that the parents of Lying-in cases should be made to pay for their maintenance. It has heen found impracticable, and in most cases undesirable. We have, howerer, gone fully into this matter in our report to be supplied to the Press.

Mr. Neal's proposition that the Out-door Reliet is too widely extended, and should be dealt with lyy local societies is also im-
practicable. The cases are dotted over a will expanse of country inchading bush and bad roads, such as would prevent, for instance, ladies' societies from visiting them; and then it is notorions that, owiug to want of proper Government support, the local societies lave no funds for the purpose, and in the calase of humanity, your Conmittee, to prevent starration, has to cone to the rescue. The rarious points in Mr. Neal's inspection are so fully ventilated in the reports heretofore referred to, that we shall simply conclute our notice of them by refering you to them for permsal.

In conclusion, every friend and well-wisher of this grand and useful Institution, will be gratified at its prosperons comdition.

We accepted the onerons trust reposed in us with pleasure, and it is with feclings of pardonable pride and gratifieation that we hand over our important charge to you again.

For tho success which has crowned our labors, we are indeal thankful to him who is the "Giver of all good things," and trust that he will equally bless the efforts of our stecessors, so that the cusuing year may be one of peace and prosperity for the

Adopted by the Governors, 24 th January, 1887.

## OB.TEOTS:-

To Relifeve the Aged, Infirm, Disabled, and Destitete, and to Minister to their Negessitirs, according to tie Ability of tie Institute.

## thife govennons.

I. Every donor of $£ 10$ and upwards; every person not leeing a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of $\mathcal{E z O}$ or upwarts from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; my person appointed by any society paying the sum of $\mathfrak{f e} 20$; the execntor, or, if more than one, the first named in any will, by which a lrequest of $£ 20$ or upwards shall be paid to the Institution, shall to Lite Governors, and any other person clected at a meeting of Governors, on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institntion, shall be a Life Governor.

ANNUAI GOVERNORS.
2. A donation of not less than $£ 20$ from a Shire Coumcil, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, Pres ident, or Chairman of the loody donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every
subscriber of fil ated upwards, ampally, whall he an Ammat Governor, to date from the time of paying such sulscipiption, and entitled to rote at all yearly and other special meetings of Gowmors; provided, in the case of a new subsertber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seren days before such meeting.
3. The Institution shall be gorerned by a Commitee of Manarement, consisting of a President, iwn Vice-Presidents, five Trustere, a Treasurer, three homorary Medical offiers, inn sixteen (ioxernurs, all of whom except the Trustees, shall be elected amually, by and from the Governors, in the month of Jannary in each year.
4. In the event of any vacancy ocentring in the Committere of Management, the said Committee shatl have the power to fill up the vacancy for the unexpired term, except in the case of a 'lrustere, w Honorary Medical Ofticer, who must be electen at a general meeting of the Goveruors.
5. The Amual Meeting of the Gowermors of the Institution shall be held in the month of Sannary in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committer of Management, shall be submitted for comsideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.
6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a special meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition, signed ly eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring lim to do so, on giving seven days' motice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be trimsacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.
7. At the amual or other special meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall fom $n$ quorum; but if after the expiration of half :an hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present, shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.
8. The Committee of management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary the the general rules;
alpount and discharge all salajed officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules aud regulations respecting them and their treatment; aul shall appoint Sub-Committece for all necessary purposes, and Aulitors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, hut mot it he liberative rote.
9. The President, Vice-Presitents, and Treasurer, shall be members, ex-af/icio, of all comuittees.
10. All Sub-committees shall have at leart five members, three in fom a quorum.
11. The aceounts of the Institution shall be andited in the month of Jinuary in each year.
12. Any member of the Committec of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medieal Officers) ahsenting himself for two months, without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to lo a member of the Committee, and another shall be uppointed in lis stead.
13. No memher of Committee shall rote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

## TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution shall be paid into the bank appointed by the Conmittee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the proposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committce of Management.

## SECRETARY.

15. The secretary shall attend all annual, special, and committee mectings; take minutes of all the proecenings transacted at such meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and cary out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.
16. The Sceretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to or reccivable ly the Institution, in all cases giring receipts, ant
shall, within fonteen days of the time of receipt of monerys, pay over the same into the bank to the credit of the 'Treasurer, submitting at each meeting of the General or Honse Committee atm account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.
17. The Secretary shall combet the correspondence and the elerical business of his department; keep the aceounts of the Institution under the direction of the several Committees; compile all reports of the Committees; fill the cheques, ant perfinm all the elerical duties connected with the offiee of Secretary.

## 

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institatifin shatl hxo duly qualified medical practitioners, and shall atteml when arequired, the rotation of cluty to le left to themselves; shitl have aceress wo the Institution at all times; perform all surgienl operations, and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Jinstitution.
19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting lis duty without reasonable cause shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the Rules shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of suich intenti on to the Governors.
