# THIRTY-EIGHTH REPORT

OF THE

*Committee of Management*

OF THE

**Ballararat District Benevolent Asylum**

AND

LYING-IN HOSPITAL,

∴ FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30th JUNE, 1895. ∴

*To the Governors and Subscribers,*

The Committee of Management beg leave to submit the following report of the Asylum for the year ending 30th June, 1895.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was  $330\frac{1}{2}$ , being 20 more than that of the preceding year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1894, was 244 males and 75 females; total, 319. Admitted during the year, 136 males and 132 females; total, 268; total of all, 587. Of these, 74 males and 106 females were discharged, 45 males and 17 females died, leaving in the Asylum at the end of the year 261 males and 84 females; total, 345; being an increase as compared with the former year of 17 males and 9 females; total, 26. The average cost of maintenance per head has been £13 8s. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ d., as against £15 1s. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ d. for the year ending 30th June, 1894.

The want of a supply of hot and cold water for the laundry, and also for bathing purposes having long been felt, the Committee erected during the year a steam boiler, by which a copious supply is now available. The result is that the washing can now be done efficiently while ample provision is made for the old people of both sexes obtaining a hot or cold bath, thereby adding to their health and cleanliness. Moreover the work can be carried on more economically, as a great saving will necessarily be effected in fuel.

The rooms used by the servants have been made into one large sewing-room for the women, which will enable them to carry on their work uninterruptedly, which was impossible when it had to be done in the dining-room.

The house has been painted where required, and all necessary repairs effected, while the asphaltting of the alleys has been done free of cost by the inmates, so that the buildings and premises are in excellent condition. The greatest cleanliness and order prevail throughout the Institution, and the inmates are contented and happy. All this is attributable, in a great measure, to the care and attention of the Superintendent, Matron, and their assistants.

#### LYING-IN-HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 69; 3 adults and 1 infant remaining from the previous year, total 72 adults and 1 child. 58 children were born (30 males and 28 females, and 4 stillborn); 62 adults and 54 infants were discharged, and 1 infant died leaving in the Institution 10 adults and 4 infants on the 30th June, 1895. The average period spent by each patient in the Institution was 39.98 days against 31.88 the previous year. The Committee desires again to express its appreciation of the admirable manner in which the nurse, Mrs. Sheldrick, has discharged the important duties entrusted to her. A considerable number of the children born being illegitimate, the Committee is of opinion that the Authorities should be moved to take action in the matter with the view of compelling those who have led the mothers astray to contribute to their support. There is a Ladies' Visiting Committee in connection with the Lying-in-Hospital who visit the patients and give them advice and counsel.

#### OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in out-door relief was £2379 10s. 11d., showing an increase of £32 3s. 2d. as compared with the

previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1894, was 481·82 adults and 235·85 children; total, 717·67, and for the year ending 30th June, 1895, 551·11 adults and 280·31 children; total, 831·42; being an increase of 69·29 adults and 44·46 children. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £2 17s. 2½d., and per week is. 1 1-5d., against £3 5s. 5d., and is 3 1-10d. respectively the previous year. The number of persons actually receiving relief, including inmates and outdoor recipients, on the 30th June, 1895, was 1212, or 51 more persons than at the close of the year ending 30th June, 1894.

Considering there has been no special effort made during the year, as in 1893-94, to relieve the distress consequent upon the general stagnation and scarcity of employment, this increase is not large. Although the demands on the Institution have been thus increased, and that in the face of a reduced Government grant, it is highly satisfactory to be able to report that relief has been afforded to every deserving applicant. The Committee is glad to notice that steps are about being taken by the Miners' Association to render help to those miners who are working on a tribute that does not give subsistence. The Committee has felt bound to give temporary relief to a number of cases of this kind during the year.

There is a class of cases that has been a source of embarrassment to the Committee, namely the destitute wandering cases. The Committee regrets, while anxious to make provision for such, that owing to insufficient accommodation and funds, it has been obliged to defer their admission until beds were vacant, the unfortunate men being sent to gaol by the Authorities in the meantime. This is deeply to be lamented. The Committee would strongly urge on the Government and Subscribers to supply it with funds towards erecting a small ward with a number of beds to meet this special class of cases; the expense would be less than keeping them in gaol, and would be more humane. Poverty is no crime, and it is a blot on our civilisation and humanity to incarcerate in gaol, in their declining old age and infirmity, poor fellows who have helped to build up the colony.

### FINANCIAL.

Bank overdraft, £86 2s. od.; liabilities at the close of the year for salaries, wages, and trade accounts, deposits, and contracts, £731 15s. od.; amount taken from Reserve Fund, £774 3s. 4d.; total, with bank overdraft, £1592 os. 4d.

We commenced the year with £669 18s. 6d. in hand, and close with an overdraft of £86 2s.

The Government Grant-in-Aid having been further reduced by £150, making a total reduction in three years of £1,550, we confidently rely upon the generosity of the people of Ballarat and the surrounding districts to assist the Committee to make up the deficiency.

## REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Government Inspector made his annual visit on the 25th February, 1895, and was highly pleased with the general condition. The following extract is transcribed:—"I went over the whole range of buildings and was well pleased with the condition of the Institution and the good order, cleanliness and tidiness which prevailed."

The Committee deeply regrets the loss of two valued members who have died, the late Mr. Daniel Brophy, K.G.G., and Mr. James J. Fitzgerald, J.P. The former was, for a number of years, a trustee of the Institution, and the latter a member of the Committee for a great many years, and formerly held the office of President and Vice-President. The Institution, by their demise, has lost useful and warm-hearted members. The Committee also regrets the death of Sir Samuel Wilson, Mr. Martin Loughlin, J.P., and Mr. E. Rowlands, all of whom have been liberal donors to the Asylum.

The best thanks of the Committee are accorded to the ladies and all who have contributed to the comfort and welfare of the inmates.

The Committee again cordially thank the local Press for the publicity given to its proceedings.

The best thanks of the Committee are due to the hon.

oculist, Dr. E. Gutheil, for his attention to the inmates. The Committee desires also to acknowledge the zealous and efficient manner in which the Secretary, the Doctor, and the Assistant-Secretary have discharged their respective duties.

The Rev. Father Rogers having resigned his seat on the Committee, the Rev. Father Guilfoyle was elected in his place.

It will be the business of the meeting to elect a President, 2 Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, 1 Trustee, and 5 members of Committee in place of those retiring by effluxion of time, viz, Messrs. G. Lovitt, M. C. Carey, the Rev. T. R. Cairns, and the Rev. Father Guilfoyle, who are, however, eligible for re-election.

#### GENERAL.

The Committee regrets to say that a number of cases come before the visitors, from time to time, where grown-up sons, especially those that are married, neglect to give any help to their parents in their old age, thus throwing them on the bounty of the Asylum. That they should be so dead to parental affection is greatly to be deplored. In some countries, and also in South Australia and New Zealand the support of parents by their children is made compulsory by law.

Another, and a still more glaring evil, is the desertion of wives by their husbands. Some of these go to the other colonies leaving their children a burden on the Institution. Owing to the want of an Intercolonial law these delinquents are allowed to go unpunished. If the desertion, however, takes place in this colony, the relief is only granted on condition of the wife's taking out a warrant for her husband. The conduct of such heartless and inhuman fathers who so far forget the natural instinct implanted in their breasts as to desert their own offspring, cannot be too strongly reprobated.

The Committee notices that some changes are contemplated by the Legislature in respect to the management and support of our Charitable Institutions. As to the wisdom or otherwise of this the Committee offers no opinion further than remarking that it feels convinced from long experience in the working of the Ballarat Benevolent Asylum, that no system can be introduced that will be so economically managed, and at the same time so humanely administered.

In conclusion, the Committee expresses the hope that Almighty God will be pleased to grant that this noble Institution may continue, as in the past, the good work which it has so long carried on—the relieving of His suffering poor—and that the coming year may be a prosperous one.

# RULES

OF THE

## Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum,

Adopted by the Governors, 24th January, 1867.

### OBJECTS:

TO RELIEVE THE AGED, INFIRM, DISABLED, AND DESTITUTE,  
AND TO MINISTER TO THEIR NECESSITIES, ACCORDING TO  
THE ABILITY OF THE INSTITUTE.

### LIFE GOVERNORS.

1. Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person not being a paid collector, who shall raise in one or more collections, in one year, the sum of £20 or upward from persons not claiming membership on account of their contributions towards such sum; any person appointed by any society paying the sum of £20; the executor, or, if more than one, the first named in any will, by which bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the Institution, shall be Life Governors, and any other person elected at a meeting of Governors on the recommendation of the Committee, in consideration of special services rendered to the Institution shall be a Life Governor and entitled to vote.

### ANNUAL GOVERNORS.

2. A donation of not less than £20 from a Shire Council, Road Board, or Municipal Council, shall entitle the Mayor, President, or Chairman of the body donating, to be an Annual Governor. Every subscriber of £1 and upwards annually, shall be an Annual Governor, to date from the time of paying such subscription, and entitled to vote at all yearly and other special meetings of Governors; provided in the case of a new subscriber he shall have paid his donation or subscription seven days before such meeting.

3. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee of Management, consisting of a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, three Honorary Medical Officers, and sixteen Governors. In the month of July in every year, one-third part of the elected members of the Committee shall go out of office, except the Trustees (but may, nevertheless, be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been longest in office without re-election; or when two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.

4. If any member of Committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the President of the Asylum, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or become convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanour, or be absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of the Committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of Committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto a qualified contributor to the Asylum until the next Annual Meeting for the election of the Committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire, in addition to those herein before provided for, except in the case of a Trustee or Honorary Medical Officer, who must be elected at a General Meeting of the Governors.

5. The Annual Meeting of the Governors of the Institution shall be held in the month of July in each year, when a general report of the affairs of the Institution, from the Committee of Management, shall be submitted for consideration, and the necessary elections proceeded with.

6. It shall be competent, at any time, for the President to call a Special Meeting of Governors, on receiving a requisition signed by eight members of the Committee of Management, or twenty-four Governors, requiring him to do so, on giving seven days' notice in one or more of the Ballarat daily papers of such meeting and requisition, and no business shall be transacted at such Special Meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

7. At the Annual or other Special Meeting of Governors, ten Governors shall form a quorum; but if after the expiration of half-an-hour after the time appointed for such meeting, a quorum be not present, the Governors then present shall have the power to adjourn such meeting, and to appoint a time within seven days when such adjourned meeting shall be held.

8. The Committee of Management shall manage and direct the general business of the Institution; shall frame bye-laws for its internal regulation, the same not being contrary to the general rules; appoint and discharge all salaried officers and servants of the Institution; shall meet one day in each month, and at other days as they shall appoint; admit and discharge patients, and make rules and regulations respecting them and their treatment; and shall appoint Sub-Committees for all necessary purposes, and Auditors. The Chairman of Committees to have a casting, but not a deliberative vote.

9. The President, Vice-President, and Treasurer shall be members *ex-officio* of all Committees.

10. All Sub-Committees shall have at least five members, three to form a quorum.

11. The Accounts of the Institution shall be audited in the month of July in each year.

12. Any Member of Committee of Management (except the Trustees and Honorary Medical Officers) absents himself for two months without assigning a reasonable cause, shall cease to be a member of the Committee, and another shall be appointed in his stead.

13. No Member of Committee shall vote on any question in which he shall have a pecuniary interest.

#### TREASURER.

14. All moneys received on account of the Institution shall be paid into the Bank appointed by the Committee of Management, to the credit of the Treasurer of the Institution, and shall be appropriated to the purposes of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

#### SECRETARY.

15. The Secretary shall attend all Annual, Special, and Committee Meetings; take minutes of all the proceedings transacted at such Meetings, and transcribe them carefully into the books kept for that purpose; and carry out all the directions of such meetings in all particulars incident to his department.

16. The Secretary shall collect subscriptions and all moneys to or receivable by the Institution, in all cases giving receipts,

and shall within fourteen days of the time of receipt of moneys, pay over the same into the Bank to the credit of the Treasurer, submitting at each meeting to the General or Executive Committee an account of the sums and names of the persons from whom the same have been received.

17. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence and the clerical business of his department; keep the accounts of the Institution, under the direction of the several Committees; compile all reports of the Committees; fill the cheques, and perform all the clerical duties connected with the office of Secretary.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

18. The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution shall be duly qualified Medical Practitioners, and shall attend when required, the rotation of duty to be left to themselves; shall have access to the Institution at all times; perform all surgical operations and record the same in a book kept for that purpose at the Institution.

19. Any Honorary Medical Officer neglecting his duty without reasonable cause shall cease to hold office.

Any five Governors wishing to make any alteration in the Rules, shall give the Secretary at least fourteen days' notice, requesting him to give due notice of such intention to the Governors.
