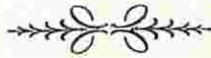

# THE THIRTY-NINTH REPORT

OF THE

Committee of Management

## The Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum

AND

### LYING-IN HOSPITAL

(INCORPORATED).

*For the Year ending 30th June, 1896.*

*To the Governors and Subscribers,*

The Committee of Management begs leave to submit the following report of the Asylum for the year ending 30th June, 1896.

The daily average number of inmates for the year has been 341.60, being 11 more than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1895, was 261 males and 84 females; total, 345. Admitted during the year, 98 males and 96 females; total, 194; total of all, 539. Of these, 98 males and 106 females were discharged, 48 males and 9 females died, leaving in the Asylum at the end of the year, 261 males and 74 females; total, 335, being a decrease as compared with the number remaining in the Asylum at the close of last year of 10 females. The average cost of maintenance per head has been £14 7s 2½d, as against £13 8s 7¼d for the year ending 30th June, 1895. The increase is explained by the rise in the price of stores during the year.

The Committee invites Subscribers and the general public to visit the Institution and see for themselves the manner in which the wants of the inmates are attended to. A steam cooking table has been introduced during the year, and is expected to be a very great improvement on the old method. The neatness apparent, both in the buildings and in the grounds, reflect the greatest credit on the Superintendent, Matron and their assistants, and makes it a pleasure to visit the Asylum.

### LYING IN HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 55; 10 adults and 4 infants remaining from the previous year, making a total of 65 adults and 4 children. 48 children were born (24 males and 24 females) and 8 still-born. 61 adults and 50 infants were discharged and 1 infant died, leaving in the Institution 4 adults and 1 infant on the 30th June 1896. The average period spent in the Institution by each patient was 38·34 days, as against 39·98 days in the previous year. The Committee would again express its great appreciation of the excellent manner in which the Nurse discharges her duties; duties delicate and difficult, requiring both patience and professional knowledge, which are always at the disposal of those requiring them. This department of the Institution is deeply indebted to the Ladies Visiting Committee, who not only visit regularly, but tender kind and christian counsel to many of those who sorely need it.

### OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in out-door relief was £2544 11s 6d, showing an increase of £165 0s 7d as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1896, was 583·88 adults and 288·86 children; total, 872·74, as against 551·11 adults and 280·31 children; total, 831·42 for the previous year, being an increase of 32·77 adults and 8·55 children. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £2 18s 3½d, and per week 1s 1½d, as against £2 17s 2½d, and 1s 1½d respectively for the previous year. The number of persons actually receiving relief, including both in-door and out-door recipients, on the 30th June, 1896, was 1207, or 5 persons less than at the close of last year. The district served by the Asylum extends from Blackwood in the east to Donald in the north-west, covering a distance of 150 miles, and including 14 Shires and 9 Broughs, containing a population equal to about one-sixth of that of the whole Colony.

## FINANCIAL.

At the beginning of the year the bank overdraft was £86 2s 0d, and at its close it is £938 17s 1d, showing that the liabilities were increased by the sum of £852 15s 1d. This amount, added to £774 3s 4d taken from the reserve fund with £572 14s 1d, amount due for salaries, wages and trade accounts, and contractors' deposits in hand, makes a total liability of £2298 14s 6d.

## REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Government Inspector made his annual visit on the 24th January, 1896, and expressed himself as highly pleased with the general condition of the Institution. The following extract is taken from his report:—"I went over the whole of the buildings and was well pleased with the condition of the Institution and the improvements made since my last visit of inspection."

## SPECIAL EFFORTS.

The Committee desire to acknowledge with thanks the following liberal donations:—Ballarat Football Association, per Mr. A. B. Berry, £89 15s 0d; Carnival at the Asylum, 25th May, 1896, per Messrs. Hill, Walker and Saunders, £199 10s 6d; Chinese Special Donation, £50, per Lie Ping and James Wong Kem Sing; Mr. Wm. Edgerton, per Messrs. Brokenshire and Coltman, £30 12s 7d; Dramatic and Musical Entertainment, per Mr. W. L. Paine, £20 5s 0d; Mr. David McNaught, J.P., £26; Smythesdale Athletic Club Sports, per Mr. Peter Dalton, £20; United Masonic Choral Service, per Messrs. E. Verey and W. H. Kingsbury, £16 2s 4d; Ballarat Liedertafel, per Mr. Geo. Crocker, £15. The special collections made in the various Churches are also gratefully acknowledged, and the warmest thanks of the Committee are tendered to all who have shown their interest in the Institution by getting up entertainments, or in any way assisting to augment the funds. The Committee also desire to thank the members of the Ladies' Visiting Committee for the deep interest taken by them in the patients specially under their care; the local Press for the publicity given to its proceedings; the Hon. Physicians and the Hon. Oculist for their attention to the inmates; the Hon. Solicitor for professional services rendered; and all who have in any way contributed to the comfort of the inmates during the year. The Committee desire also as on previous occasions to evince its entire satisfaction with the zeal and efficiency manifested by the Doctor, the Secretary, and the Assistant-Secretary in the discharge of their respective duties.

It will be the business of the meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and seven members of Committee in place of those who retire, viz., Messrs. Wm. Scott, H. Josephs, G. K. Coutts, O. E. Edwards, J. L. Archer, E. Murphy and Rev. Father Guilfoyle, but who are eligible for re-election; also three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor and two Auditors.

The Committee recommend that the following gentlemen be appointed Life Governors of the Institution, viz., Messrs. Peter Matthews and C. B. Retallack for services rendered in connection with the steam apparatus; Messrs. D. Walker, W. D. Hill, Jas. Pearce, Theo. Sergeant and Colonel Williams for services rendered in connection with the Carnival held on the 25th May; and Messrs. Owen Thomas, Wm. Thos. Humphreys, Joseph W. Kirton and Wm. Boustead in consideration of the bequest of the late Mr. W. O. Elder.

#### INCORPORATION OF THE ASYLUM.

In accordance with Part I. of the Hospital and Charities Act, 1890, the Asylum was incorporated on 18th November, 1895, and it is hoped that the change will conduce to the best interests of the Institution.

#### GENERAL.

In closing the report the Committee would call the special attention of the subscribers and the citizens generally to the fact that, notwithstanding a number of special efforts, the liability is gradually increasing. This arises from the fact that a large number of citizens who ought to subscribe decline to do so, and if persisted in, this will no doubt lead to the imposition of a rate for the maintenance of all our Institutions. It would be greatly to be regretted if the poor rate system of the old countries should be introduced into the colony, and it is very earnestly hoped that during the coming year all who are in a position to do so will generously come to the aid of the Committee. The young people of the city and town, as well as the rural district, who are in regular employment, and all who are earning money, ought to give something to the relief of the poor. If this were done the Committee is assured that there would be no occasion to depart from a system which has worked very satisfactorily for the last 39 years.
