

To the Governors and Subscribers,

Your Committee have the honor to place before you their Forty-first Report and Balance Sheet, duly audited for the year ending 30th June, 1898. By reference to the Balance Sheet, you will see that the Income from all sources amounts to £6887 6s 5d, and the Expenditure to £7882 15s, thus showing a deficiency on the year of £995 8s 7d. Foreseeing a great deficiency facing us, we early in the year prepared for it by drawing on our Reserve Fund to the extent of £2000, but later in the year we re-transferred £1000 of this to that Fund, the end of the year thus leaving us with a small credit balance of £1 1s.

This continually recurring deficiency has been going on since the year 1892, when the Government, under the stress of the financial depression, cut down our grant in aid very considerably, with the result that our Reserve Fund has been brought down to very moderate dimensions. The gravity of our situation led us recently to wait on the Hon.

the Premier, to urge an increased grant being given us, and this appeal of ours, with others of a like kind, has resulted in a promise of the annual grant in aid to the Charities being increased from £100,000 to £120,000, which will result, we are led to believe, in an additional £1000 a year falling to our share. This, with the continued favours of our many subscribers and helpers, will enable us to do our work free from the anxiety and worry which has been our experience for some years past.

The daily average number of inmates for the year has been 341.5, being 2.34 less than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1897, was 267 males and 82 females; total, 349. Admitted during the year, 85 males and 104 females; total, 189; total of all, 538. Of these 63 males and 87 females were discharged, 44 males and 17 females died, leaving in the Asylum at the end of the year 245 males and 82 females, total, 327; being a decrease, as compared with the number remaining in the Asylum at the close of last year, of 22 males.

The average cost of maintenance per head has been £13 19s 2½d as against £14 1s 5½d for the year ending 30th June, 1897.

LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 52, seven adults and two infants remaining from the previous year; total, 59 adults and 2 infants. 47 children were born, viz., 29 males and 18 females, (also 4 still-born). 53 adults and 47 infants were discharged, and 2 adults died, leaving in this Hospital 4 adults and 2 infants on the 30th June, 1898. The average period spent in this Hospital by each patient was 29.18, as against 36 days in the previous year. Mrs. Davey resigned her position as nurse early in the year, owing to having determined to return to her friends in England. Mrs. Freestone was selected from a number of applicants for the vacant post, and we are glad to report that she is carrying out her onerous and responsible duties most satisfactorily.

OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in this department was £2855 1s 3d, showing a decrease of £132 1s 3d, as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1898, was 520.54 adults and 169.73 children; total, 690.27, as against 551.78 adults and 221.49 children; total, 773.27 for the previous year, being a

decrease of 31·24 adults and 51·76 children. The average cost per head per annum for adult and child was £4 2s 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ d, and per week 1s 7d, as against £3 17s 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ d, and 1s 5 4-5d respectively for the previous year.

REPORT OF INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Inspector of Public Charities paid his annual visit on the 21st April, 1898. After a thorough inspection he reported that the buildings and grounds were in first-class order and reflected credit on all concerned. "That the books were well and neatly kept, and were duly audited and certified to as correct, by the Auditors. That he had examined the receipts and expenditure return with the book and bank page book, and had found everything correctly set forth." That accommodation is provided in the Institution for 336 persons; and, as at the beginning of the year we had 349 inmates, this shows that we were at that time overcrowded. This has since been remedied, as at the time of the Inspector's visit we had 330 inmates, and on the 30th June, 327, thus keeping us somewhat within our proper cubic space accommodation.

SPECIAL EFFORTS AND THEIR RECOGNITION.

The Committee again desire to acknowledge with cordial thanks the following liberal donations and special efforts on behalf of the funds of the Institution:—Chinese Easter Carnival, per The Chinese Soy Woy Committee, £300; The Queen's Birthday Carnival, per Mr. T. Saunders, £145 0s 7d; from sale of Jubilee Stamps, per the Under-Treasurer, £130 3s 6d; Lady Clarke, £40; The Grand Duchess Opera, per Messrs. G. Herbert and R. L. Nicholl, £30; The Butchers' Employees' Association, per Mr. W. Brooks, £20; A Friend, £20; The United Masonic Choral Service, per Messrs. A. Miller and W. H. Kingsbury, £12 15s 6d.

The thanks of the Committee are due and very heartily given to Mr. Theo. Saunders, Mr. and Mrs. Atkinson, and many others, both ladies and gentlemen, who again so successfully carried through the Queen's Birthday Celebration; not forgetting the inmates, who did splendid service in disposing of tickets, thus helping very materially to ensure its success; to the Chinese Soy Woy Committee, who, aided by Senior-Constable Barrett as Manager, and Mr. W. Stephens as Secretary, conducted the Easter Carnival to a phenomenally successful issue, enabling them to divide no less a sum than

£450 between the three principal charities, £300 of which fell to our share; to many, too numerous to single out, who have got up successful entertainments in our aid; to many in both town and country, who with subscription lists have secured numerous small sums which have reached a very satisfactory total, thus setting a right good example to others with equal opportunities and advantages who have as yet failed to respond to our appeals for the putting forth by them of like energy. Some of our visitors connected with the police and also the Managers of some of our mines, and others, having the oversight of men, have by their efforts in bringing our claims and needs before them, rendered us substantial service, as our subscription list will readily show. This kind of help might be taken up by very many more who have influence with those with whom they are brought into daily association, and thus secure small gifts lost to us for the want of asking for, which would raise a total throughout our far-reaching district that would place us in a good financial position, and enable us to carry out our extensive and very necessary relief work in a much more effective and satisfactory manner. We have also to acknowledge with thanks the favorable response to our appeal for increased help from some of our Shire and Municipal Councils, who have thus recognized the great work we are doing in looking after the poor and needy in their extensive areas. The Churches have ever recognized our claims by their practical help in connection with the Charity Sunday movement. We trust that the coming Charity Sunday will result even more successfully than any of its predecessors. Could not the Saturday immediately preceding our annual Charity Sunday be utilized, as in Melbourne, to advantage in securing collections in our business establishments and among classes of people not otherwise reached.

RECOGNITION OF GOOD WORK.

A number of Entertainments have been given during the year in the Institution to the inmates, to their great delight and satisfaction, for which those who have thus given help and real service deserve our warmest thanks.

Gifts of books, newspapers and magazines, also tobacco and other luxuries from many thoughtful and kind friends for the use of our inmates, we gladly acknowledge, and have only, we trust, to remind many more able to contribute in like welcome ways, how such tokens of thoughtfulness are appreciated and fully availed of.

The Ladies' Visiting Committee for the interest they take

in the inmates coming under their notice, the Honorary Physicians and the Honorary Oculist for their unremitting attention, the Honorary Solicitor for valuable services freely rendered, the local Press for their faithful and correct reports, and for their warm and telling advocacy of our claims, and to all who have in any way contributed to our help, we tender our sincere thanks.

We also desire to place on record our high appreciation of the able services rendered by the Superintendent, Matron, Doctor, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the entire staff of employees.

We hail with pleasure the many visitors to our Institution, who are thus enabled to see and judge for themselves of the quality of the work that is being done. Such visits, we feel sure, cannot fail to have a beneficial effect in opening and causing to flow the springs of charity, and thus result in increase to our funds as their ability enables them.

The Ministers and others from the different Churches who conduct the religious services, and the young people who regularly assist in services of sacred song for the benefit and pleasure of the inmates, deserve our best thanks.

Your Committee have special pleasure in acknowledging the valuable help readily and cheerfully given them in the time of their financial need by your bankers, "The Colonial Bank of Australasia"; the Local Manager, Mr Smythe, and the General Manager and his Board of Directors, alike manifesting the greatest courtesy and kindness, and giving us practical proof of their desire to render every assistance possible to such a deserving charity as they recognise ours to be.

GENERAL.

During the year we received with regret the resignation of Mr. C. B. Retallack as a member of our Committee, who felt compelled to take this step in consequence of ill-health. Mr. Retallack, during the time he has held a seat on your Board, has been a very valuable member, and his practical knowledge has frequently been of great service to the Institution. We hope that under the Divine blessing he will speedily recover his wonted health, and be able to give the benefit of his experience to various public organizations as formerly. Mr. C. E. Grainger, the well-known Manager of the Ballarat Woollen Mills, has been elected by your Committee to the vacant seat, and has already proved his value and worth.

The business of the meeting will be to elect a President,

two Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, and eight members of Committee in place of those who retire, viz., Messrs. J. L. Archer, J. Coghlan, W. Dimsey, C. E. Grainger, D. Ham, E. Murphy, J. T. Phillips, and J. Showman, but who are eligible for re-election, also three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors.

In bringing our report to a close, we ask the continued help of the many who have cheerfully contributed to us year after year. To those who have for various reasons best known to themselves discontinued their subscriptions, we urge a consideration of our claims, and trust to find their names restored to our list during the coming year. To many who might contribute, but who have persistently put off our Collector when he has called upon them again and again, or else have positively refused to render any help, we ask them simply to bear their fair share of the burden of supporting the poor and needy who are always with us, and who appeal to us to make their lot as easy as possible. To many whose earnings prevent them doing much we ask for their mites, and urge them not to withhold these their small gifts with the idea that they are too small, as we feel sure that such Institutions as ours will not receive their proper share of financial support, until all, rich and poor alike, make it a matter of conscience to give as God has prospered them and rendered them able. With full consideration to our claims from all thus appealed to, with the additional grant definitely promised us by the Hon. the Premier, and no relaxation in the getting up of special efforts in our aid, we may confidently look forward to the coming year bringing us in sufficient to meet our necessarily heavy expenditure, instead of, as during the year just ended, finding us no less than £995 8s 7d to the bad.
