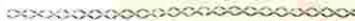

The Committee of Management of the Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum have the honour to lay before you their Forty-second Report, together with the Balance-sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1899.

I.—THE ASYLUM.

Number of
Inmates.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 337·13, being 4·37 less than that of the previous year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1899, was 262 males and 90 females, total 352, being an increase as compared with the former year of 17 males and 8 females, as follows:—

The average cost of maintenance per head was £14 16s. 4½d., as against £13 19s. 2¾d. for the previous year.

The cleanliness and order which prevailed the Institution cannot fail to strike every visitor, and reflect the greatest credit on the Superintendent and Matron and their assistants.

II.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number of cases admitted during the year was 39; 4 adults and 2 infants remaining from the previous year; total, 43 adults and 2 infants. Thirty-three children were born, viz., 24 males and 9 females (also 1 still-born); 36 adults and 31 infants were discharged, and 2 infants died, leaving in this Hospital 7 adults and 2 infants on the 30th June, 1899. The average period spent there was 35.11 days. The nurse (Mrs Freestone) is efficiently discharging the onerous duties devolving upon her, and is giving general satisfaction.

III.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended in Out-door Relief during the year was £2257 13s. 3d., showing a decrease of £597 8s. as compared with the previous year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1899, was 482.75 adults, 139 children, total 621.75; and for the preceding year, 520.54 adults and 169.73 children, total 690.27, being a decrease of 37.79 adults and 30.27 children. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £3 12s. 7½d., and per week 1s. 4¾d., as against £4 2s. 8¾d. and 1s. 7d. respectively for the previous year. The total number of persons actually receiving relief, both in-door and out-door, on the 30th June, 1899, was 1019. In addition to the relief thus afforded, a number of destitute persons travelling (about 4 daily) have been provided with meals.

IV.—THE FARM.

The small farm and poultry-yard of 7½ acres belonging to the Institution at the Brown Hill is cultivated by a number of the old men who can do light work. An outlay in

building, fencing, and other improvements had necessarily to be made at first, but this is gradually being wiped off, as it has now become a source of profit to the Institution, last year's transactions showing a margin of profit. It also affords healthful exercise to the old men employed. The farm is under the careful management of Messrs. W. Scott, W. Gale, and J. Long.

V.—FINANCIAL.

Receipts and
Expenditure.

A statement of the Receipts and Expenditure of the Asylum from the 1st July, 1898, to the 30th June, 1899, duly audited, is submitted. It will be noticed with regret that, notwithstanding the splendid results consequent on extraordinary efforts in many directions, as well as a special grant from Government of £600, there is a deficiency on the 30th June, 1899, of £95 12s. 7d., as the following explanation and glance at the Balance-sheet will show :—

VI.—REPORT OF THE INSPECTOR OF PUBLIC CHARITIES.

The Government Inspector visited the Asylum on the 10th October, 1898, and reported favourably of the Institution. A suggestion was made that water should be laid on to the Morgue, which has since been carried out.

The Committee earnestly trust that this lady's noble example will have the effect of inducing others in affluent circumstances, like those in the old country who have so richly endowed Charitable Institutions, to remember the claims of the Asylum when making their wills; and that even during their lives they will give of their abundance to God's poor.

Bequests.

The following are the other Bequests made during the year:—Thos. Kennedy, £10; Wm. Ryan, Yendon, £16 13s. 4d.; Jens. Christenson, £48 8s.; Richard Butler, £25; Geo. Harvey, £276 6s. 10d.; Jas. Donnelly, £5; Geo. Gray, £1 12s. 6d.; Patrick Hassett, £33 9s. 11d.

VIII.—OFFICE-BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

It will be the business of this meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and eight members of Committee, in place of those who retire by effluxion of time, viz.:—Messrs. H. Josephs, W. Scott, G. K. Coutts, O.E. Edwards,

D. Cooke, M. C. Carey, Jas. Oddie, and the Hon. J. Y. McDonald, but who are eligible for re-election; also, three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors.

IX.—GENERAL.

Death of Mr. D. McNaught.

The Committee desire to express their deep sense of the loss sustained by the Institution by the death of the late Mr. D. McNaught, who was for several years a member of the Committee and an ex-President of the Institution.

Election of the Hon. J. Y. McDonald.

The Hon. J. Y. McDonald, M.L.C., was selected by the Committee to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term.

Recommendation for Life Governorship.

The Committee recommend that Constable William Priest be appointed a Life Governor of the Institution for services rendered in connection with the bequest of the late Mr. George Harvey.

Services Rendered by Ministers of Religion, &c.

The thanks of the Committee are tendered to the Ministers of several denominations for attending to the spiritual wants of the inmates; the Hon. Physicians and Oculists for their attention to the old people; the Hon. Solicitor for professional services; Mr. James Long and the other visitors of out-door recipients in the country districts; the Press for the publicity given to its proceedings; and to all who have in any way contributed to the comfort of the inmates.

Officers.

They wish also to place on record their great satisfaction at the efficient manner in which the Secretary, Superintendent, Maron, Doctor, and the Assistant Secretary have discharged their respective duties.

Necessity for Increased Local Aid.

In view of the deficiency referred to in this report, and seeing that the number of subscribers of £1 and upwards is so small, having been only 388 for the past year, the Committee earnestly hope that this number will be largely increased during the ensuing year, and that those who cannot afford to give even a pound will contribute whatever they can towards the relief of God's poor.

In conclusion, your Committee trust that under the beneficent care of Divine Providence this noble Institution will continue the good work which it has so long carried on, and that the coming year will be a prosperous one.
