To the Governors and Subscribers,—

The Committee of Management beg to submit the following Report of the Asylum for the year ending 30th June, 1909.

1.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 287.76, being 14.67 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June, 1909, was 201 males, 80 females; total 281; being a decrease of 21 males, and 4 females as compared with the previous year.

The daily average of inmates during the year was 287.76, as against 302.43 for the previous year. The average cost of maintenance per head was £18 128 123d, as against £16 168 934d last year.

2.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-In Hospital during the year was 50 adults, 4 adults and one child remaining from last year. Total, 54 adults. 44 children were born. viz., 20 males and 24 females. 49 adults and 42 children were discharged. The number remaining in the hospital on 30th June, 1909, was five adults and four children. The average period which adults spent there was 36.68 days.

3—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on Out-Door Relief during the year was £977 8s 6d, showing an increase of £137 8s 6d as compared with last year. The average number of recipients per week for the year ending 30th June, 1909, was 138.42 adults and 107.17 children, total 245.60; and for the previous year was 135.11 adults and 81.96 children, total 217.07, being an increase of 3.31 adults and 25.21 children Total increase of adults and children 28.53. The average cost per head per annum for each adult and child was £3.19s.7½d, and per week 1s.63%d, as against £3.17s.5½d, and per week 1s.63 for the previous year. The total number of persons on the books in door and out-door on the 30th June, 1909, was 563, as against 520 for 1908.

4.—FINANCIAL.

Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from the 1st July, 1908, to 30th June, 1909, has been duly audited and found correct

The year commenced with an overdraft of £1248 16s, and closed with less than half that amount, viz., £601 14s 9d.

5.—SPECIAL DONATIONS AND EFFORTS

The Committee acknowledge with cordial thanks the continued liberal donations and special efforts put forth, viz:—The Birthday Carnival, per Mr. Thoe Saunders. £64 10s; the Chinese Gardeners and Hawkers £25; the Ballarat Grocers' Association, £25; the Edward Wilson Charatable Fund, £50.

6.—BEQUESTS.

The bequests received during the year total the sum of £3924 12s 8d.

7.—OFFICE-BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

The meeting will have to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, I reasurer, and seven Members of Committee, viz — Messrs. William Coltman, A. W. Hager, J. S. Douglas, J. M. Kline, R. Hall, C. H. Eyres and I. Pearce, who retire by effluxion of time. Mr. William White (the retiring President) and Rev. Father Shiel who was appointed by the Committee to the vacancy caused by the death of the late Very Rev. Father Guilfoyle. The above-named gentlemen are all eligible, and offer themselves for re-election. The three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors also retire and offer themselves for re-election.

8.-GENERAL.

The Committee deeply regrets the removal by death of the Reverend Father Guilfo, le, who had filled the office of President and given valuable service to the Institution as a member of its Managing Committee for a period of 13 years.

Our thanks are due to the Ministers and many workers in connection with the various churches for their attention and devoted service to the spiritual needs of the inmates, to the many kindly and thoughtful ones who have given frequent donations of books, magazines, papers, and Creature comforts which have been much appreciated, to those who have got up Concerts and Entertainments which have been a delight to the old folks, to the Press for their able advocacy of our claims, and to many others who have in various ways given us valuable and ready assistance in our much needed work.

With pleasure we recognise the faithful and ready service rendered by the whole of our staff, viz:—The Hon. Medical Officers, the Hon. Oculist, the Hon. Solicitor, the Non-Resident Surgeon, Secretary, Superintendent, Matron, Collector, Gardener, Maternity Ward and other Nurses, Wardsmen, and others, who have each and all taken a pride in bringing up the Institution into its present state of efficiency.

As President I have to express my personal appreciation of the ready assistance at all times extended to me throughout the year by my colleagues on the Board of Management, as also by the various Officers with whom I have necessarily been brought so much in contact. The result has been to materially lighten my task, and make my term of office, though arduous, yet a very pleasant one.
