TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS,—

The Committee of Management have the pleasure of submitting for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1912.

FINANCIAL.

Receipts from all sources amount to £6,034 17s. 2d., Expenditure, £5,849 9s. 8d., Bank Overdraft from previous year £1,114 16s. 8d., reduced by £185 7s. 6d., thus leaving a debit balance of £929 8s. 11d. on the 30th June, 1912.

1.—THE ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 216·92, being 18·05 more than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on the 30th June 1912, was 128 males and 95 females—total 223, being a decrease of 1 male, and an increase of 6 females, as compared with the previous year.

The daily average number of inmates during the year was 216·92 as against 198·87 for the previous year. The average cost per head for maintenance was £23 18s. 9¼d., as against £23 9s. 0½d. last year.

## 2.—LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital during the year was 50 adults, 6 adults and 3 children remaining from last year—total 56 adults. Forty children were born, viz. : 21 males and 19 females. Fifty-two adults and 40 children were discharged. One adult died. The number remaining in the Hospital on the 30th June, 1912, was 3 adults and 3 children. The average period of time spent by the adults in the Asylum was 28·89 days.

## 3.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The Out-Door Relief Expenditure for the year was £462 14s., showing a decrease of £314 12s. 4d. The average number of recipients weekly for the year was 129·63, the previous year being 185·48, being a decrease of 55·85. The average cost per head per annum was £3 11s. 5d. as against £4 3s. 9½d, for the previous year. The total number on the books receiving out-door relief on the 30th June was 110.

## 7.—OFFICE BEARERS AND MEMBERS OF COMMITTEE RETIRING.

It will be the business of the meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and seven members of Committee, viz. —Rev. Father Shiel, and Messrs. Hager, White, Hall, and Drummond, who retire by effluxion of time; also two gentlemen to the vacancies caused by the death of Mr. C. E. Grainger and Mr. T. H. Lawn, likewise the retiring President; the three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors, who offer themselves for re-election.

### GENERAL REPORT.

The past year has been an eventful one in the history of the Institution, marked as it has been by the death in April last of our late esteemed Superintendent, Mr. C. C. Shoppee, who has been closely connected with the Institution for nearly 50 years. He held the office of Treasurer for 20 years, was also one of its Presidents, and for the last seven years its valued Superintendent. In whatever position he was placed he always showed the keenest interest in the welfare of the Asylum, and the Committee deplore the great loss sustained by his demise.

During the year further losses were sustained by the death of two members of Committee, Mr. C. E. Grainger and Mr. T. H. Lawn. Mr. Grainger was a member since 1899, and his valuable advice and assistance was always greatly appreciated. Mr. Lawn was elected in 1909, and rendered good service during his short term of office.

In November last the Committee was very sorry to receive the resignation of Mrs. Atkinson, who has served the Institution faithfully and well as matron, for some 20 years. In leaving she carried with her the best wishes of the Committee.

The position of Superintendent and Matron having become vacant, applications were called for to fill these important positions, and after a very careful selection, Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Burrow were appointed. The Committee have every reason to believe they have made a wise choice, and that Mr. and Mrs. Burrow will carry out their duties to the entire satisfaction of the subscribers.

It was hoped that during the year a Septic Tank would have been installed, and thus have greatly improved upon the present system of sanitation in use, and trust this work may be completed at an early date.

In compliance with the Board of Health requirements a fire escape stairway has been fixed to the wing of the Lying-in Hospital, and greatly adds to the safety of the inmates in this portion of the Institution.

The Xmas Tobacco Fund inaugurated by the late Mr. G. Lovett, has again had special attention by his successors in this work, Messrs Hager and Lederman, and is greatly appreciated by the inmates.

The thanks of the Subscribers are due to the Hon. Medical Staff who have cheerfully given their valuable services when required, also to Dr. McGowan, the non-resident surgeon, who has given the best of attention to the inmates, also to the Hon. Solicitor, Mr. F. Pinkerton.

The Committee further desire to express their appreciation to the Secretary, Superintendent, Matron, Nurses, and Staff, for the way in which their various duties has been carried out.

An impression being held by the public that the Asylum reaps a monetary benefit from the pensions of Old Age Pensioners at present in the Asylum, the Committee desire to point out that such is not the case, as any monies received from the Federal Government for such pensions has to be returned to the State Treasurer.

To the Press also thanks are due for assistance rendered during the year in furtherance of the interests of the Institution.

Specially also are thanks due to those who have assisted in providing entertainments for the pleasure of the inmates. To the Ministers and Laymen of various denominations for their attention to the Spiritual welfare of the inmates, and to those who have so kindly and liberally donated reading matter, clothing, and other needed comforts.

Personally I desire to express my sincere thanks to the Committee for their unvarying kindness and assistance to me during my term of office.
