FIFTY-SEVENTH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE
OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum
and Lying-in Hospital

(INCORPORATED),

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1914.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In accordance with the annual custom, your Committee have the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1914.

FINANCIAL.

The income for the year was £5712 12s., and the expenditure £5847, 9s. 8d., being £131 17s. 8d. more than the receipts, thus leaving an overdraft of £645 0s. 10d., as compared with the overdraft of 30th June, 1913 of £510 3s. 2d.

1.—ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 209·75, being 10·50 less than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on 30th June, 1914, was 204, being a decrease of 10 as compared with the previous year.

The daily average number of inmates was 209·75, as against 220·25 for the previous year. The average cost per head for maintenance was £20 12s. 11 $\frac{3}{4}$ d., as against £23 13s. 4·65d. last year.

2.—LYING IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital during the year was 34 adults (4 adults remaining from last year)—total, 38. Thirty-two children were born. Thirty adults and 30 children were discharged. One adult and 2 children died; the number remaining in the Hospital on June 30, 1914, being 4 adults. The average period of time spent by the adults in the Hospital was 31³³ days.

3.—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on Out-door Relief during the year was £542 4s. 11d., an increase of £45 5s. 9d., as compared with last year, in consequence of the higher price of provisions. The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June, 1914, was 97.96, being a decrease of 31.44. The average cost per head per annum was £5 10s. 7³d.

In addition, 295 free meals were supplied to travellers, at a value of 4d. per head.

The total number of persons on the books, in-door and out-door, on 30th June, 1914, was 457.

7.—OFFICE-BEARERS.

It will be the business of the Meeting to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and six Members of Committee, viz., Messrs. J. N. Dunn, I. Pearce, T. O'Loughlin, S. Marks, C. Growcott, and C. H. Eyres, who retire by effluxion of time.

Owing to the resignation of Mr. A. Ronaldson, it will be necessary to elect one member in his place.

Mr. E. H. Price was elected during the year by the Committee, and, together with the retiring President, the three Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Dentist, Hon. Solicitor, and two Auditors, offer themselves for re-election.

GENERAL.

Several items of extraordinary expenditure have been incurred during the year in renovating the Victoria Ward ; purchasing a number of improved bedsteads ; refurnishing the entrance hall and the visitors' room ; providing matting for the dormitories ; and asphalting the main pathways.

In addition to these, all the wards and passages on the male side have been painted. This work was done by the stewards, and reflects the greatest credit upon them. By their efforts in this direction the funds of the Institution have been saved to a considerable extent. The Committee recognised the services rendered in a practical way.

It has been felt for some time past that in the event of an alarm of fire at night the probable congestion of inmates on the old stone stairway constituted an element of danger. To overcome this two new fire-escape stairways have been built. The advantage of these extra means of exit from the first floor is shown by the fact that the inmates now use one of the new stairways regularly in preference to the old stone stairs.

The contract has been let for the installing of electric lights in the main buildings. It is expected that this will be the means of reducing expenses in lighting, and, at the same time, provide the Superintendent with a more complete control of the lighting of this portion of the Asylum.

The old wooden room at the end of the covered way, which is used by the male inmates as a smoking and sitting room during the wet weather, is insanitary and too distant from the dining hall.

On the occasion of the visit to Ballarat recently, of the (at the time) Premier and Treasurer, Mr. Watt, advantage was taken of his presence in this city to show him the condition of the smoking room. Mr. Watt promptly acknowledged that the accommodation was unsuitable and unwholesome. A promise was given that the Government would assist this Committee to the extent of at least half the cost of building a suitable room in brick.

The Committee had previously appointed a sub-committee, consisting of Messrs. A. W. Hager, W. White, and J. Tulloch, with power to arrange for the raising of money to build a new smoking room.

These gentlemen purchased a handsome rubber-tyre gig, harness, and horse, which will be disposed of by art union.

Mr. Adam Ronaldson, a highly respected ex-president, tendered his resignation from the Committee recently, owing to leaving Ballarat. Mr. E. H. Price was appointed to the vacancy.

We have to record the death of Mr. W. Scott, J.P., one of the oldest members of this Committee. Mr. Scott had been twice a President of the Asylum, and joined the Committee in 1859, two years after its inception.

During the year we lost two old inmates in James Cowdery and William Penny, both of whom had been for many years loyal and useful servants. James Cowdery had been attendant at the Board Room for over twenty years, and William Penny was a familiar figure as hall porter at the Asylum for over fifteen years. In consideration of the valued services rendered by these two inmates they were buried in a private allotment of ground, and a suitable headstone has been erected out of the funds of the Institution.

Owing to the resignation of the Collector (Mr. E. D. Glenn), applications were called for the position, and out of some 34 applicants the Committee appointed Mr. W. Palmer.

The Christmas Tobacco Fund, collected by Messrs. Hager and Lederman, has been greatly appreciated by the inmates. Extra rations of tobacco have been served out at Xmas, New Year's Day, Easter, and King's Birthday.

The great services rendered by Mr. C. H. Burrow in supplying all the inmates with vegetables throughout the year, at absolutely no cost to the funds of the Institution, deserve very special recognition. This work appears to be a labor of love on the part of our genial Superintendent and Secretary. When it is remembered that at one time the work of this department amounted to £200 per year, the value of Mr. Burrow's efforts can be appreciated.

In addition to growing all the vegetables on our own ground, Mr. Burrow has set up a range of poultry houses, and expects, in the near future, to supply the inmates with fresh eggs from our own poultry run.

On behalf of the inmates, I desire to tender sincere thanks to the reverend and lay gentlemen who have ministered to their spiritual needs. I must also thank the many good people whose regular visits, enjoyable entertainments, and on many occasions, generous gifts, both in the way of creature comforts and reading matter, help to make our old folks' lives brighter and their declining days happier.

In thanking the Honorary Officers of the Asylum, I wish to emphasize the valued services rendered by our Hon. Solicitor, Mr. F. Pinkerton.

The Secretary and Superintendent and the Matron (Mr. and Mrs. Burrow) have now established themselves in the good graces of the inmates, the Committee, and the visitors; and I desire to record my indebtedness to them, and also to the Medical Officer (Dr. A. G. McGowan), and all the members of the staff.

The considerate attention of the Press in helping to bring our efforts before the public is also appreciated.

There are several important matters waiting consideration of the Committee. In regard to the internal arrangements on the domestic side of the Institution, it must be recognised that the kitchen and the hot water service are old and wasteful. The demand for a septic tank and cognate sanitary service is also urgent. These are subjects which must receive the earnest consideration of this Committee at an early date.

In conclusion, I desire to thank the Committee for their invariable courtesy and helpfulness during my term of office.
