SIXTY-FIRST REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-in Hospital (Incorporated).

For the Year ending 30th June, 1918.

TO THE GOVERNERS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In accordance with the annual custom, your Committee have the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1918.

FINANCIAL.

The income for the year was £5778 5s., and the expenditure £5150 9s. 8d., being £627 15s. 4d. less than the receipts. The overdraft now amounts to £602 5s., as compared with the overdraft of 30th June, 1917, of £1213 13s. 10d.

1—ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 192.46, being 1.15 more than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on 30th June, 1918, was 185, an increase of 3 as compared with the previous year.

The average cost per head for maintenance was £24 1s. 5½d., as against £24 17s. 10d. for the previous year.

2—LYING-IN-HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in-Hospital was 31 (3 remaining in from previous year. Total, 34. Children were born (10 males, 16 females).

3—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on Out-Door Relief during the year was £334 5s. 9d., a decrease of £161 8s. 3d. as compared with last year.

The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June was 71.78.

The average cost per head was £4 13s. 2d., as against £6 6s. the previous year. 186 meals were supplied to travellers at the value of 6d. per head.

Total number of people on the books, in-door and out-door, on 30th June, 1918, was 275, a decrease of 25.

9—GENERAL.

In reviewing the year's work I find that our funds have been depleted to the extent of some £350 owing to the loss by fire of the stables and store rooms. The newly-erected brick stables and store rooms improve the appearance of the establishment and provide increased security.

A handsome donation was received from the Defence Department, through the activity of the Superintendent, whereby the inmates were supplied with a considerable quantity of clothing, etc.

The retirement of Nurse Freestone, who had charge of the Maternity Wards for 21 years, severed a valued connection. Nurse Freestone's resignation was regretted by the Committee, and her services to the Institution were suitably recognised.

Owing to the street fencing becoming dilapidated, the Committee undertook the re-erection of same, with satisfactory results to the appearance of the grounds. In this connection it is necessary to remind the Subscribers that the whole of the building is in need of a complete overhauling. I trust that ways and means will be found during the ensuing year whereby this necessary work may be taken in hand.

The Garden continues to give very practical proof of the energy and care of Mr. Burrow, the Superintendent and Secretary. The inmates have had a splendid supply of vegetables at no expense to the funds of the Institution.

I desire to express my regret that Mrs. Burrow's health has been indifferent, and am pleased to report that she is now improving.

The visiting clergy and laymen who undertake the spiritual care of the inmates have, as usual, been very attentive.

Many kind friends supply comforts and entertainment to the inmates, chief among these are Miss Wotherspoon, the Ladies' Entertainment Committee, who give annually a splendid tea and concert, and several other good folk who assist in making our inmates lives brighter by their generous attentions.

Due acknowledgment must be given to the local Press for their courteous and helpful reports.

I wish to acknowledge the assistance so willingly given for many years by our Honorary Solicitor, Mr. F. Pinkerton, also the other members of the Honorary Staff.

To Mr., Mrs. and Miss Burrow our best thanks are due for unremitting care in the discharge of their onerous duties. The Staff generally is a loyal and active one, and this materially assists in the economical management of the Institution.

Finally, permit me to express my appreciation of the kindly assistance which I have received from the Members of the General Committee.
