SIXTY-SECOND REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Ballarat District Benevolent Asylum and Lying-In Hospital

(Incorporated).

For the Year ending 30th June, 1919.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

In accordance with the annual custom, your Committee have the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 30th June, 1919.

FINANCIAL.

The income for the year was £7743 16s 9d, and the expenditure £7538 14s 11d, being £205 1s 10d less than the receipts. The overdraft now amounts to £385 4s 8d, as compared with the overdraft of 30th June, 1918, of £602 5s.

1—ASYLUM.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 193.54 being .99 more than last year. The number of inmates in the Asylum on 30th June, 1919, was 190, as against 185 last year, being an increase of 5.

The average annual cost per head for maintenance was £27 3s 1¾d, as against £24 1s 5d for the previous year, an increase of £3 1s 7¾d.

2 LYING-IN HOSPITAL.

The number admitted to the Lying-in Hospital was 38 (6 remaining from last year). Total, 44. Thirty-nine children were born (23 males and 16 females. There were two still-born and no deaths.

3—OUT-DOOR RELIEF.

The amount expended on Out-Door Relief during the year was £426 12s 3d, an increase of £92 6s 6d, as compared with last year. The average number of recipients weekly for the year ended 30th June, 1919, was 96.11, as against 71.78 last year, an increase of 24.33.

The average cost per head was £4 8s 9d, as against £4 13s 2d the previous year. 127 meals were supplied to travellers at the value of 6d per head.

Total number of people on the books, in-door and out-door on 30th June, 1919, was 301, an increase of 25 on last year.

Walker, who has been Auditor to the Institution for many years, will not seek re-election.

GENERAL.

It is with pleasure and pride that I am able to report that during my year as President of this Institution we have been able to see the Great World War brought to its conclusion by the complete victory of Great Britain and her Allies.

My term of office has been rendered agreeable by the loyal service of the whole of the staff, and I desire to especially acknowledge the ready assistance given at all times by our Secretary and Superintendent, Mr C. H. Burrow.

A remarkable testimony to the efficiency of the management of the Institution, is that while the influenza outbreak was prevalent in Ballarat, in common with all parts of the State, our inmates have been kept completely free from attack.

After mature consideration it was decided that the remuneration of our staff should be increased in conformity with the general advances made in all departments of official and commercial life.

The Defence Department again came to our assistance by supplying our inmates with 150 Military Overcoats. These are greatly appreciated by the old men.

Owing to the decay of the older parts of the building it has been found necessary to spend a considerable sum in repairs. Attention has been given to the Maternity Ward and the Female and Male Hospital Wards. This, with other necessary repairs, entailed an outlay of over £700. There is still a great deal more renovating to be done, and I suggest that this work be continued until our Institution can be said to be in a satisfactory condition.

Our thanks are due to the visiting clergy and others for their kindly, spiritual ministrations to our old folk.

The Entertainment Committee have continued the valuable services which they have rendered now for 20 years. In consideration of this it is recommended that two of their number be given Life Governorships, and the names of Mrs C. Taylor and Mr A. Greenwood have been submitted for that honor.

The local press have been helpful at all times, and I desire to tender my appreciation of their services.

In thanking Mr and Mrs Burrow, our Secretary and Superintendent and Matron, I am able to repeat the many cordial appreciations which my predecessors have made. In the output of the garden Mr Burrow has been able to save the committee a considerable sum as well as providing the inmates with beautiful vegetables.

Mrs Burrow's kindly and sympathetic control assists largely in the smooth working of the Institution, and I desire to tender her my sincere thanks.

We have been greatly assisted, as heretofore, by our Hon. Solicitor, Mr F. Pinkerton, and the thanks of the committee are due to him, also the Hon. Oculist, Dr. Affleck Scott, and Hon. Dentist, Mr T. P. Wilson.

In conclusion, I desire to thank the committee for their unflinching co-operation and consideration to me throughout my term of office.
