

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

Your Board has the honor to lay before you for your consideration the Report and Balance Sheet for the year ended 30th June, 1925.

FINANCIAL.

The Income for the year was £12,198/9/1, and the Expenditure £12,009/10/10. The overdraft now amounts to £551/1/3-, as compared with the overdraft of £540/1/3 on 30th June, 1924.

1—HOME.

The daily average number of inmates for the year was 201.30. The number of inmates in the Home on 30th June, 1925, is 215, as against 193 last year.

8.—GENERAL :

IMPROVEMENTS TO THE HOME.

A number of necessary works for the upkeep of the buildings, and also providing additional comfort for the inmates were done during the year. The front elevation of the main building was painted, and the Ration Store was practically rebuilt. The assistance in these matters rendered by Cr. Nicholson and Mr. H. Wardle was of great value.

ENTERTAINMENTS.

The inmates were treated to a number of entertainments by local artists throughout the year. A Christmas tree was erected, and each of the inmates received several useful presents. The ladies who organised this treat, headed by Mrs. Hoare, the wife of our President, and ably assisted by Mrs. John Fraser and Mrs. Cole, deserve our hearty thanks for their successful efforts.

SPIRITUAL HELP.

We have to thank the Ministers of the various denominations and lay preachers for their kindly attentions to the inmates.

HIGH TEA.

The 24th Annual High Tea was supplied by a Committee of ladies, who have always been zealous in their efforts to make the inmates comfortable. My heartiest thanks are accorded to them.

HONORARY STAFF.

Whenever called upon, our Honorary Officers have willingly responded by giving their services for the old folks benefit. Special thanks is, as always, due to our esteemed Honorary Solicitor, Mr. F. Pinkerton, for valuable advice and work absolutely free of charge.

THE STAFF.

We are extremely fortunate in our Staff, from the Superintendent and Secretary (Mr. Con. H. Burrow), and Matron (Sister Gent), down to the latest addition to the staff; everyone works with enthusiasm and zeal. In consequence, the internal management of the Home works like well-oiled machinery, without friction, and yet with kindly interest in the well-being of the aged and infirm entrusted to our care. The vegetable garden, which is one of Mr. Burrow's particular interests, has again supplied the Home with all the vegetables required.

THE PRESS.

I must thank the Press of Ballarat for giving great publicity to all our work at the Institution, and together with "The Age" and "The Argus," for free copies of papers for the use of the inmates.

The deaths during the year of Doctor Affleck Scott, Hon. Oculist; Dr. W. Barker, Honorary Consultant in mental cases; and Mr. John Blight, Auditor, were greatly regretted.

In concluding my year as President, I desire to express my grateful thanks to all who have so generously assisted me in my efforts to make the old folk happy and contented. I look back on my year of office as a pleasure to both Mrs. Hoare and myself, and wish to record my appreciation of the cordial help given by this Board of Management.




