FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30th JUNE, 1936.

TO THE CONTRIBUTORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen.—

The Committee has pleasure in presenting its seventy-ninth Annual Report and Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the year ended 30th June, 1936.

FINANCE. — The total receipts and income for the year were £12,830/15/6 and the total expenditure, including the bank overdraft brought forward, was £13,308/10/6, leaving a debit balance at the bank of £477/15/- as against an overdraft of £483/19/10 brought into the account on the 1st July, 1935.

HOME. — The daily average of indoor relief for the year was 290.357, and the number of inmates in the Institution on 30th June, 1936, was 288, an increase of 6 on last year's figures.

AVERAGE ANNUAL COST. — The average Annual Cost per head for maintenance was £33/13/2, against £32/19/5 on the previous year, an increase of 13/9.

OFFICE-BEARERS.—Mr. F. Davies was elected by the Committee to fill the vacancy caused by the death of the late Mr. G. H. Ballhausen. It will be necessary at the Annual Meeting to elect the President, two Vice-Presidents, Hon. Treasurer, and five members of Committee in the places of Messrs. W. White, J. Oliver, W. J. Hoare, C. W. Growcott and F. Davies, who now retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election. You will be called upon to elect also the Hon. Medical Officers, Hon. Oculist, Hon. Dentist and Hon. Solicitor and two Auditors.

OUT-DOOR RELIEF.—Applications for relief by persons who are in difficult circumstances are continuously made upon our Home. These out-door recipients of food, etc. are granted orders by Mr. John Keith on behalf of the Committee whose work in this department merits our warm commendation. The number of adults thus supplied during the year was 489, and children 611. In addition 493 travellers were given relief, making a total of 1573 persons, at a cost of £111.

ALTERATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO BUILDINGS.—Your Building Committee has been engaged during the year in considering plans to remedy the congestion in our male hospital wards. After many conferences with our Honorary Architects, Messrs. P. S. and G. S. Richards, it has been decided to recommend that the most satisfactory means whereby our male bed cases may be comfortably accommodated would be by installing a lift. This will give access to the first and second floors and thus enable some fifty male ambulatory inmates to be transferred from the ground floor. The Victoria Ward would under this re-arrangement, be used as a Hospital Ward for which it is well suited. The plans, which provide for many consequential alterations, are at present under consideration of the Charities Board which, it is anticipated, will approve of the considered opinion of your Committee of Management.

LADIES AUXILIARY.—The comfort of our patients and inmates, both male and female, has been admirably watched over by the splendid body of ladies who form our Ladies Auxiliary under the presidency of Mrs. John Keith, who has associated with her as Hon. Secretary, Mrs. J. Cole, J.P., and Honorary Treasurer, Mrs. J. Fraser. On Sunday afternoon, the 5th inst., in the presence of a large gathering of friends and workers for the Home, the Auxiliary presented for use in the hospital wards twenty-six bed tables and three bed screens, all of the latest approved design, and which, I am pleased to state, were manufactured in Ballarat. A dozen hot water bags accompanied this very welcome gift. At the same time the Ballarat Ladies' Croquet As-

sociation, through the Auxiliary, presented two similar tables and one ward bed to supplement the gift of the Auxiliary. It was my pleasure, to accept on your behalf, these very valuable and most useful additions to the equipment of the hospital wards. I would like to refer again to the untiring and self-sacrificing work done throughout the year by the Ladies Auxiliary for the comfort of all the old folk who are compelled to seek the protection of our noble Institution.

LAUNDRY EQUIPMENT, ETC. — The new washing machine has been in use for several months. The old machine has been re-conditioned and is in use for special work. This expenditure, together with the remodelling of one of the wash-houses, has been fully justified and has made for increased efficiency. In this connection I beg to suggest that at an early date consideration be given to the purchase of a new boiler to replace one of the boilers which is worn out. Also I would suggest you consider the purchase of a new steam ironing machine to replace the present machine which does not now meet our requirements and is quite out of date.

NEW BENEVOLENT HOMES ASSOCIATION. — In view of the special character of the demands upon Benevolent Homes, as distinguished from Hospitals, a conference of representatives of the Benevolent Homes of the State was held on 6th March, 1936, at the Victoria Homes, Royal Park, Melbourne, when it was resolved to form an Association with the object of enabling Institutions similar to ours to consider and deal with matters of mutual concern. The Hon. H. H. Olney, M.L.C., was elected President, with Major R. L. Elliott as Honorary Secretary.

It is with deep regret that I have to record the death on 2nd February, 1936, of our valued colleague, Mr. G. H. Ballhausen. This gentleman was an indefatigable and most zealous member of the Committee. In an unostentatious way he gave valuable personal service to this Home as well as to many other Charitable Institutions in Ballarat.

The death of Mrs. W. J. Hoare, after a lengthy illness, borne with great fortitude, is a severe loss to our Home. This lady was unremitting in personal service to our old folk. So highly did we value Mrs. Hoare's work in her capacity as wife of our former President, Mr. W. J. Hoare, and as President for a number of years of the Ladies Auxiliary that this Committee, in 1927, determined to perpetuate her name in our Home by naming one of the hospital wards used for permanently bed-ridden women, the "Margaret Hoare" Ward. I extend, on your behalf, the sympathy of this Committee to our fellow committee man, Mr. W. J. Hoare, and to the bereaved relatives.

RELIGIOUS MINISTRATIONS.—The spiritual welfare of our charges has been attended to by the Clergy and lay-members of the various Churches. This is a service which brings consolation to our old folk and is much appreciated by this Committee.

VISITORS.—Many formal and informal visits to our Home have been made by individuals and representative bodies. I had pleasure in extending a welcome to many of them, and noted with satisfaction the expressions of approval of our work by the visitors.

HONORARY STAFF.—The home is happy in possessing in the several departments an honorary staff all of whom give valuable service willingly and promptly.

STAFF.—You are indebted to all the members of our staff for efficient service. In Mr. Gale, our Secretary and Superintendent, and the Matron, Sister Gent, the Home is fortunate in possessing capable and conscientious officers who are at all times in attendance for the varied and continuous duties devolving upon them. They are ably assisted by the Sub-Matron, Sister Bull, and the large staff of nurses and stewards. Miss Jopling, our Assistant Secretary, is invaluable in the office and most attentive to her responsible duties.

The whole-hearted and at all times willing co-operation of our Medical Officer, Dr. E. A. H. Guymer, is greatly appreciated by our old folk.

It is only by helpfulness on the part of the honorary and paid staff that the business of this important charitable institution can be satisfactorily carried on. On your behalf I tender to them all our deepest thanks.

CONCLUSION.—This, my second year as your President, has been extremely interesting and I feel I must express my personal thanks to the members of the Committee of Management for their loyal assistance and willingness to undertake any responsible duties entrusted to them. Without enlarging upon the duties of the members of the Committee, I am able to say that one and all assist in the responsible work involved in caring for nearly 300 Aged and Infirm deserving men and women whose declining years need the comfort and care of this Home.
