



# THE SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE

## PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL,

FOR THE YEAR 1864.

---

TO THE GOVERNORS, SUBSCRIBERS, AND CONTRIBUTORS  
OF THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL.

ON retiring from office, according to the rules of the institution, your Committee feel pleasure in laying before you a statement showing the present condition of the Hospital, financial and otherwise. The records submitted for your consideration will show that the institution has been the medium for relieving a great amount of suffering during the past year; and the support still so liberally given by all classes residing in the district is a sufficient proof, that its value to the public is fully understood, and that confidence in its efficiency, as a means of relief to those requiring aid, remains unshaken.

There have been, during the Committee's year of office, the following cases received and treated:—201 in-door patients have been admitted, and 290 out-door patients have been treated, and received 1740 attendances. The deaths during the year have been 17 only: this is below the average rate of mortality usually found in connection with the statistical returns of similar institutions. The daily average of patients in the Hospital throughout the year has been 23.

The balance-sheet for the year will be laid before you. It shows a total expenditure of £2,850 18s. 7d. as against £2,869 15s. 7d. last year. In most of the items of expenditure a small diminution has taken place. There will be found an increase under the head of furniture; this arises from the fact that the new ward, built last year, to ensure the better classification of patients, required to be entirely furnished for the reception of patients: this has been done on the most economical

scale consistent with efficiency and with the comfort of the patients. The addition of this ward has proved highly useful during the present summer.

A large increase of expenditure has taken place in consequence of laying out and partially planting the Hospital Reserve with trees and flowers. This course was suggested to the Committee by the tenor of the report presented to the subscribers at the last annual meeting. Although the amount expended has been large, the improvements made will considerably add to the cheerful appearance of the Hospital and grounds, and increase the comfort of the patients. The sum expended on these improvements was a special requirement, and in future years a comparatively small amount will be sufficient for maintaining them in good order.

Several valuable donations have been received of plants, trees, and flowers, which greatly reduced the cost of planting the reserve. The Committee, in justice to the donors, feel called upon to mention specially the donations from Messrs. John Little, of Eversley; John Lamont, of Ararat; Ayrey & Nicoll, of Warranooke; George Smith, nurseymen, Ballarat; and Dr. Mueller, Botanic Gardens, Melbourne.

The Committee have also to acknowledge very valuable contributions of books from Messrs. W. Fenwick, formerly Warden at Pleasant Creek; Frederick Quain, the former Clerk of Petty Sessions; Ayrey & Nicoll, of Warranooke; and John Holt, of Ledcourt. These have proved a most welcome addition to the Hospital Library, and a source of much comfort to the patients. The Committee have also to acknowledge the receipt of a donation of ten sheep for the use of the Hospital, contributed by Messrs. Ronald Campbell and George Lamont.

It is with heartfelt gratification that your Committee have to thank you for your liberality on behalf of the charity, for on referring to the annexed subscription list, it will be seen that the contributions, both in the pastoral and mining districts, are each slightly in excess of the previous year, making the total collections the largest yet on record, viz., £1,000 11s. 3d.

A balance of £168 10d. surplus of expenditure over receipts has to be carried against next year's account; this though not on the whole a satisfactory financial position, need not cause uneasiness. The expenditure under the several heads, which have been unavoidably large this year, will be considerably lower during next year, in consequence of the heavy outlay that has already taken place; and it is hoped that in addition to the ordinary Government endowment, a sum will also be voted to the institution for such buildings as may be required during next year.

Every effort has been made during the year to encourage the greatest possible amount of competition when receiving tenders

for supplies or work required, and the prices paid will prove, on the most minute examination, that the expenditure has been made on the most economical basis possible.

The collector has found some who were former subscribers to the Hospital, raising objections to continue their contributions, because they or their friends have been denied the medical aid which is available to those unable to secure it by payments. It must be remembered that the Hospital is a charitable institution, and as such is only available to those whose position in life prevents them from obtaining medical advice in the ordinary way, and it is hoped that no more instances will be met with of persons withholding their donations for the causes stated. The Hospital can only relieve distress in cases where the sufferers are needy or destitute, or in cases of severe accident, or emergency, and it must be evident to all, on fair consideration, that the Committee would be stepping out of their province to relieve or assist cases of a different nature.

Your Committee submit for the consideration of the subscribers a proposition that there be established in connection with the Pleasant Creek Hospital, a Benevolent Ward, as the nucleus of a future Benevolent Asylum. There was paid last year a sum of £21, as a subscription to the Benevolent Asylum at Ballarat, which gave the right to this Committee to nominate patients for that institution; the cost of their transit was also paid from the funds of the Hospital.

The experience of the past years prove that amongst our population there is a large number of aged and afflicted persons, who are more fitted for a Benevolent Asylum, than to be continual inmates of an Hospital; and in this district there is no established institution provided for the reception of such cases. Your Committee, therefore, recommend that a Ward be at once opened in your Hospital, for the reception of this class of cases. Such a course will, unquestionably, cause an increase to the yearly subscriptions to the institution, and will, in all probability, entitle the future Board of Management to obtain a liberal endowment from the Government to aid these efforts.

Your Committee have already commenced the erection of a surgeon's residence, a part of which, the kitchen and servants' room, are complete, and designs have been accepted for the whole building, which, when constructed, will render several additional rooms available in the main building for the purposes above indicated, without any material increased cost to the institution for building; and the Committee feel sure that if the subscribers act upon this suggestion, that it will add to the stability of the Hospital, besides providing a want that has long been felt throughout the whole district.

To increase the usefulness of the institution, the Committee recommend that the words, "or syphilis," in Rule No. 10, be

repealed, so as to remove the prohibition against this class of disease being treated, they believe this course will remove some causes of complaint which have arisen in consequence of the existence of this portion of the rule. As a further argument in favour of the alteration, they draw attention to the fact that though stringently worded it has failed to exclude from the Hospital patients suffering from the particular disease mentioned.

The Committee also suggest the alteration of Rule 2, by increasing the number "eighteen" to twenty-one, and "six" to nine, in order that extra members may be appointed at the Great Western, Glenorchy, and Barkly.

In electing a new Committee, it is strongly recommended that none undertake the duties as members of the local Board, who cannot undertake to bear their full proportion of the duties devolving upon the Committee, great inconvenience results from members not being punctual in attendance at the meetings of the Board, and on the Visiting Committees for the Hospital.

In rendering back to the subscribers the trust reposed in them, your Committee earnestly hope that the residents of the entire district will still continue to give their liberal support to the Pleasant Creek Hospital, and thereby enable the new Board of Management to increase the field for usefulness, that the labours and sacrifices of previous years have opened to a benevolent public.

## ADDENDA.

---

WITH reference to that portion of the Report relating to a Benevolent Ward:

Two public meetings of the subscribers were held, on the 27th January and 24th February; and during the interval between these meetings, inquiries were made of the Government, the members of Committee for the outlying districts, and various subscribers, as to the probable increase of pecuniary aid which might be expected. It was ultimately decided that it was not advisable at present to appropriate any portion of the Hospital for the reception of Benevolent Asylum cases.

# RULES

OF

## THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL,

FOR 1865.

---

1. The Hospital will afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid to any poor person requiring them, irrespective of creed, country, or colour; but any person who shall be admitted under any circumstances and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so, and will receive temporary relief only.

2. The Hospital shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, an Honorary Treasurer, the Honorary Surgeons, and a Committee of Management not exceeding twenty-one, nine of whom shall be residents of up-country districts. The above-named officers, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, by duly qualified subscribers.

3. Should a vacancy occur in any of the above-named offices, it shall be filled at the then or next ensuing General Meeting of Subscribers; but in all cases, except those of Treasurer or Trustees, the Board is empowered to temporarily fill the vacancy.

4. The duly qualified electors shall, at the Annual General Meeting in January, in each year, appoint two Auditors, not members of the Board, to examine the accounts of the past year, but in case either of such Auditors neglect or refuse to perform the said audit for the space of one month from the time of his appointment, a Special Meeting of duly qualified subscribers shall be called immediately to elect a new Auditor, or Auditors, to supply such place; and also, it shall be competent for the President, or, in his absence, a Vice-President, at the request of not less than ten duly qualified Subscribers, to convene, by advertisement, a public meeting, at any time, for the purpose of electing Auditors, if any emergency arise to warrant the Board of Management in having the accounts audited.

5. The Board of Management shall include all the officers named in the second rule, it shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the Hospital, present a report to the Annual General Meeting, and conduct the affairs of the Hospital generally; and may, from among themselves, from time to time, appoint committees for any purposes.

which in their opinion would be better regulated and managed by means of such committees; and it may fix the quorum of such committees; and may continue, alter, or discontinue such committees.

6. The Board shall meet for general business once, at least, in each month, and for special business whenever requisite; such meetings to be convened by the Secretary at any time or place that may be ordered by the Board, the President, a Vice-President, or upon the requisition of not less than three members of the Board. At any meeting, nine members shall form a quorum, and in the absence of the President or Vice-Presidents, one of the members present shall be elected to act as chairman.

7. That every contributor of £25 in one sum shall be a Life Governor, with the privilege of voting at all meetings of subscribers, and of nominating five in-door and five out-door patients in each year. And every contributor of £1 and upwards to £5, shall be entitled to nominate one in-door and one out-door patient for each pound subscribed during the year of such contribution: provided that the funds and accommodation of the Hospital will admit of the reception and treatment of such patients. The Board shall also have power to add to the list of Life Governors such persons as by their eminent services may have added within one year the sum of £25 to the funds of the Hospital; and members of the Board are not to be limited in the number of patients they may recommend. Life Governors alone shall be entitled to vote by proxy.

8. That no person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of subscribers, unless he shall have been a subscriber of at least £1 sterling to this Hospital for the space of six months previous to such meeting; provided always that where a subscriber shall have paid his subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place, the payment of his subscription for the then current year at any time before such meeting shall entitle such subscriber to vote.

9. That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance be received at any time, and that in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) at such hours as may be from time to time appointed by the Board, on the recommendation of a subscriber of at least £1 sterling for the then current year, countersigned by a member of the Board, who shall certify that such patient is not capable of providing for medical attendance; but patients shall be admitted at any time on a special order signed by the House Committee and one of the Honorary Surgeons.

10. That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, or one affected with any infectious disease, or any person who in the opinion of the medical officer in attendance is unfit to be an in-door patient, shall be

received under any circumstances, except with the express permission of the Board.

11. The House Committee shall, at least once a week, visit the Hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, and of inquiring of the patients if they are properly attended to, and shall report in writing to the next meeting of the Board any alterations or suggestions they may think necessary; such Committee to be selected by agreement amongst the members during the sitting of the Board.

12. If any member of the Board shall neglect his duty for the space of two months (the Trustees excepted) he shall suffer disqualification (unless upon well-founded excuse) and another shall be appointed in his stead if the Board think fit; and any contractor to the Hospital, being a member of the Board, shall absent himself from its sittings while any subject relating to his contract is under consideration.

13. The Board shall have power from time to time to make, rescind, alter, or amend any Bye-laws for the due management of the affairs of the Hospital. But no such Bye-laws shall be made, rescinded, altered, or amended, unless upon seven days' notice thereof being given to each member, and only upon being carried by a majority of two-thirds of a meeting, consisting of not less than fifteen members of the Board.

14. That no alteration or rescinding of Rules shall be made except by duly qualified contributors, in public meeting assembled, of which the Secretary shall have given at least seven days' notice by public advertisement, stating the business for which such meeting shall be convened.

#### HONORARY TREASURER.

15. The Honorary Treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the Hospital, and invest the same in such bank or banks as the Board shall direct, to the credit of the Hospital. He shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the Chairman of the meeting as having been approved by the Board, by drafts on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, and by the Secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the Board.

#### HONORARY SURGEONS.

16. The Honorary Medical Officers shall consist of legally qualified Medical Practitioners, who shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the Hospital at all times; they shall assist the Resident Surgeon in the performance of all capital surgical operations; but no such operation shall be performed without previous consultations of the medical staff; and they

shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or of protracted continuance in the Hospital.

#### RESIDENT SURGEON.

17. The Resident Surgeon shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period, without the permission of the Board. He shall not engage in private practice under any circumstances, except in cases of consultation at the request of other surgeons; provided such consultations will not interfere with his duties as Resident Surgeon.

#### SECRETARY.

18. The Secretary shall convene the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days previous to the meeting.

19. He shall convene Special Meetings of duly qualified Subscribers in the same manner, when directed by the Board, or on the written application of ten duly qualified Subscribers of at least £1 each; the object of such meeting to be stated in the advertisement, and shall give special notice to each member of the Board of such meetings.

## Bye-Laws of the Pleasant Creek Hospital.

---

#### RESIDENT SURGEON.

1. The Resident Surgeon shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, and decide on their fitness for admission, either as in-door or out-door patients, subject to the approval of the House Committee; and he shall discharge all patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

2. He shall have charge of patients in the Hospital, and of their treatment; but in all cases of difficulty or danger, or long continuance in the Hospital, he is requested to consult the Honorary Surgeons.

3. He shall superintend and control all servants of the Hospital, and in case of neglect of duty, or insubordination, may suspend any of them, and report thereon to the House Committee.

4. He shall keep such accounts respecting the patients as the Board of Management may direct, in books to be kept for that

purpose, and report to the Board such cases as he may think necessary.

5. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs and chemicals, carefully examine them, both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects, in either respect to the Board; make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, and keep an account of the receipts and expenditure, or loss and breakage, of all such instruments, drugs, and chemicals. And he must, in the absence of a Dispenser, perform such duties as would devolve upon that officer.

6. He shall enter regularly, in books to be kept for that purpose, the names of patients as they are admitted or discharged, together with the nature and history of their diseases, while under treatment. He shall receive all money and other property belonging to patients, and account for the same to the Board when required.

7. He shall accompany the Honorary Surgeons through the Wards, and report to them the state of the patients, Visit each patient every morning and evening, and inquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to; and if any cause of complaint exist immediately remove the same, or report it to the Board at its next meeting.

8. He shall perform all surgical operations, and *post mortem* examinations, keep the key of the dead house, and give due notice to the Honorary Medical Officers, when a consultation is to be held, or an operation to be performed; but in all cases of emergency to act to the best of his judgment.

#### SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

9. The Secretary and Collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the Hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out their resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the Board.

10. He shall collect subscriptions and all money due to the Hospital, in all cases give receipts for the same, and pay to the Treasurer, at least once in every month, all money he may have received, and render an account of the same to the Board.

#### NURSES.

11. The Nurses shall live in the Hospital, and shall not leave it for any length of time without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; they shall obey the orders of the said officer, be regular in their attendance, behave with tenderness to all patients, and with civility and respect to strangers.

12. They shall pay great attention to cleanliness, personally, in their respective Wards, and in all things entrusted to their charge; particularly to the bedding of the patients, and have it

changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

13. They shall administer to the patients the medicines and diet at the time and in the manner directed by the Resident Surgeon, and not permit them to take any which have not been prescribed, they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the said officer; and watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients, and report the same to the Resident Surgeon.

14. They shall not permit patients to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines or diet, nor anything to be removed from the Wards by the patients or visitors, without an order from the Resident Surgeon.

15. They shall be careful to collect and carry all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c., to the Dispensary, at which they shall attend at the time appointed, to receive medicines and instructions.

16. They shall not admit any stranger without permission from the Resident Surgeon, except during the hours appointed for that purpose.

17. They shall be obedient to the regulations of the Hospital, and report immediately to the Resident Surgeon any impropriety of conduct, or infringement of the rules, by any patient, visitor, or other person; and if such complaint is not properly attended to, report the same to the Board at its next meeting.

#### PATIENTS.

18. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, strictly observe all the directions of the Resident Surgeon and Nurses, take their medicines and diet at the time directed and not take any other than those prescribed; neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

19. They shall not leave their Ward and go into another Ward, leave the House, or remain out for a longer time than may be granted, or introduce visitors, or receive medicines, victuals, liquors, tobacco, nor anything, without the express leave of the Resident Surgeon.

20. They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, deface or injure any part of the Ward, furniture, bedding or clothing; nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language, neither shall they smoke without permission from the Resident Surgeon.

21. Any patient having any cause of complaint, shall make the same known to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to remedy the same; if not remedied, the said complaint may be made to the Official Visitors, or to the Board at its next meeting; but if complaints are not made before a patient leaves the Hospital, or within two days after leaving, they cannot be entertained.

22. Patients deemed able by the Resident Surgeon to assist in the work of the Hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

23. Patients shall not sit up after 8 p.m. in Winter, or 9 o'clock in Summer; and all patients considered by the Resident Surgeon able to do so, shall rise at 7 a.m. in the Summer, and 8 o'clock in Winter.

24. Out-door patients shall attend at the Hospital between 9 and 12 o'clock a.m., on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, and must observe the rules relating to in-door patients, so far as may be practicable. In-door patients, in ordinary cases, shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of 10 and 12 a.m.

#### PATIENTS AND VISITORS.

25. Patients and Visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or other person connected with the Hospital.

26. Visitors are admitted daily, between the hours of 2 and 5 o'clock in the afternoon, except persons from a distance, who may be admitted at any time by permission of the Resident Surgeon; but no visitor will be allowed to remain more than one hour, except ministers of religion, who may visit the patients at any time; but all visitors must retire when requested by the nurses.

27. Visitors shall not give to, or leave with any patient, medicine, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; nor interfere with the nurses, nor disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

28. Any visitor or patient violating any of the rules of the Hospital, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the Resident Surgeon or the Board.

#### GENERAL.

29. Any officer, nurse, servant, or other person in any way connected with the Hospital, who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and not be permitted in future to hold any office or appointment belonging to this Hospital.

#### MEMORANDA.

THE friends of the Institution are informed there is a Library for the use of the patients, and that donations of Books, Periodicals, &c., will be thankfully received; as also, OLD CLEAN LINEN, Calico, and Blankets.

Each patient should, if possible, be provided with a change of clean clothing, particularly with cotton and flannel shirts and stockings.
