# THE FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE

## PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL,

FOR THE YEAR 1863.

---

TO THE GOVERNORS, SUBSCRIBERS, AND CONTRIBUTORS  
OF THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL:

THE Committee have great pleasure in being able to report upon the continued efficiency and prosperity of this valuable institution. Its benefits are felt, not alone by the inhabitants in the immediate neighborhood, but also by those requiring aid who are scattered through a large pastoral district.

During the past year, 221 in-door patients were received into the Hospital, and 287 out-door patients were treated.

During the same period, 19 deaths occurred. This number shows a rate of mortality that will compare favorably with the statistics furnished by similar institutions in the colony.

A large outlay has been found necessary, during the past year, upon works at the Hospital, the completion of which will prove of permanent benefit to the institution, and some of which will have the effect of lessening current expenditure in future years.

The whole of the Hospital reserve has been substantially fenced in, preparatory to its being planted with trees and otherwise ornamented; the completion of this work will be attended with comfort to the inmates, as well as benefit to the management, in so much as convalescent patients will be able to take necessary exercise without leaving the Hospital grounds.

An additional ward has been erected, as much for the purpose of classifying patients as for affording accommodation to a greater number. The nature of some diseases treated in the Hospital, makes it desirable that the patient afflicted should be

isolated from other patients for a time; and it is principally to meet cases of this description that the new ward has been built.

A reservoir has been formed, from which an abundant supply of water for domestic purposes may be obtained. The completion of this work, at a small cost, will give the Hospital a better water supply in future.

Appliances for hot, cold, and shower baths have been provided, and the bath-room fittings have been completed efficiently.

The Balance Sheet appended hereto shows that the total expenditure for the year has been £2,869 15s. 7d., against £2,701 12s. last year. It will be seen, on comparison, that there is no material difference under the various heads of expenditure in the statements for the two years, with the exception of buildings and furniture.

Under the head "Buildings and repairs" is included the cost of the new ward, fencing the reserve, &c.: making an increase over last year's expenditure, on these items, of £531 5s. The cost of furniture and bedding has been less by £200 19s. 8d. than it was during the preceding year.

Every precaution has been taken by the Board to secure supplies from the cheapest market, and every possible encouragement has been given to tenderers; and they are happy to report that there has been no lack of competition whenever tenders have been invited for supplies, and they confidently believe that, taking into account the distance of this locality from Melbourne, and the consequently increased price of many articles of consumption, the cost of maintenance will show that due economy has been exercised.

The Board regret that they are unable to show but a slight balance to their credit on retirement from office. It will be observed that the completion of the new works, before referred to, has absorbed all the funds at their disposal, and does not leave the institution in so favorable a position, financially speaking, as it occupied at the close of last year. But as they have every reason to expect that the Government grant will be increased for the ensuing year in consequence of the favorable report they are able to give of this year's collection, this fact need not cause uneasiness.

It is satisfactory to report that an application made to the Government for an addition to the Hospital reserve, at the back of the building, was promptly acceded to, as also the granting of such extra ground in front of the building, required to secure the frontage to the surveyed line of road.

They have to recommend that some changes should be made in the Rules; experience having proved that the harmonious management of the institution will be facilitated by rescinding from the General Rules all those which define the duties of the

paid officers, and that such duties should be defined by Bye-laws, which may be modified from time to time by the Board of Management. They consider a change of this kind desirable, because under the present Rules the officials may sometimes be doubtful whether they are justified in conforming to special directions from the Board or the House Committee, when general rules are laid down by the subscribers for their guidance; and thus, if the Board vary any regulations the power to do so may at times be questioned.

They also recommend the appointment of certain gentlemen occupying positions of importance at Horsham and other outlying portions of the Hospital district, as members of the Board of Management.

The subscription list shows the collections (*see Appendix No. 4*) to continue about the same as those of last year, but the omission of some names arises from circumstances of which the Board feel bound to make special mention:—Two gentlemen of the neighborhood, who were in good circumstances, applied for treatment, and were informed of the regulations prohibiting their receiving aid. In the one case (and the two circumstances were nearly identical) the gentleman applied for treatment as an out-door patient, and after his application had been laid before the House Committee the Resident Surgeon was directed to discontinue entertaining the case, as the applicant was known to be in circumstances that would debar him from receiving aid from the Hospital. The applicant offered afterwards to pay for advice or medicines which he might receive, but was told that the only way in which he could obtain the professional services of the Resident Surgeon was mentioned in the Rules, from which no departure could be allowed. In consequence of this refusal, the applicant, as well as a number of his partners and their friends discontinued their yearly subscription; but, notwithstanding these drawbacks, the collection list shows that the benefits of the institution are widely felt and appreciated.

Your thanks are due to the Reef Dramatic Amateurs and the members of the Pleasant Creek Amateur Brass Band for an entertainment given for the benefit of the Hospital; the proceeds of which (handed in since the Balance Sheet was made up) amounted to £53 3s. 6d. As also, for a further sum of £33 5s., added to the funds of the institution in the following manner, viz.:—£10, presented by Mr. Lloyd, of Dimboola, and Mr. Alexander Brown, of Pleasant Creek, being the stakes of a disputed race at the last race meeting; and £14 5s., from Mr. Andrew Stewart, Jun., of Concongella, the amount of a stake won by him on that occasion.

Your thanks are also again due to the Parliamentary representatives of the district, Messrs. Wilson, Houston, and Woods,

for their prompt and valuable assistance on all occasions when the interest of the Hospital require their care.

The Committee, in giving up the trust reposed in them for the past year, would remind the subscribers and the general public that continued exertions and liberality are necessary to maintain the usefulness of this institution. They believe the time is approaching when this and other Hospitals must depend more upon local contributions than on Government aid ; and far from holding out any encouragement that smaller donations in future will suffice, they fully believe that all must be prepared to do even more than has hitherto been done by private subscriptions, for the relief of the afflicted who require a helping hand.

# RULES

OF

## THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL,

FOR 1864.

---

1. The Hospital will afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid to any poor person requiring them, irrespective of creed, country, or color; but any person who shall be admitted under any circumstances and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so, and will receive temporary relief only.

2. The Hospital shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, an Honorary Treasurer, the Honorary Surgeons, and a Committee of Management not exceeding eighteen, six of whom shall be residents of up-country Districts. The above-named officers, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, by duly qualified Subscribers

3. Should a vacancy occur in any of the above-named offices, it shall be filled at the then or next ensuing General Meeting of Subscribers; but in all cases, except those of Treasurer or Trustees, the Board is empowered to temporarily fill the vacancy.

4. The duly qualified electors shall, at the Annual General Meeting in January, in each year, appoint two Auditors, not members of the Board, to examine the accounts of the past year, but in case either of such Auditors neglect or refuse to perform the said audit for the space of one month from the time of his appointment, a Special Meeting of duly qualified subscribers shall be called immediately to elect a new Auditor, or Auditors, to supply such place; and also, it shall be competent for the President, or, in his absence, a Vice-President, at the request of not less than ten duly qualified Subscribers, to convene, by advertisement, a public meeting, at any time, for the purpose of electing Auditors, if any emergency arise to warrant the Board of Management in having the accounts audited.

5. The Board of Management shall include all the officers named in the second Rule, it shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the Hospital, present a report to the Annual General Meeting, and conduct the affairs of the Hospital generally; and may, from among themselves, from time to time, appoint committees for any purposes

which in their opinion would be better regulated and managed by means of such committees; and it may fix the quorum of such committees; and may continue, alter, or discontinue such committees.

6. The Board shall meet for general business once, at least, in each month, and for special business whenever requisite; such meetings to be convened by the Secretary at any time or place that may be ordered by the Board, the President, a Vice-President, or upon the requisition of not less than three members of the Board. At any meeting, nine members shall form a quorum, and in the absence of the President or Vice-Presidents, one of the members present shall be elected to act as chairman.

7. That every contributor of £25 in one sum shall be a Life Governor, with the privilege of voting at all meetings of subscribers, and of nominating five in-door and five out-door patients in each year. And every contributor of £1 and upwards to £5, shall be entitled to nominate one in-door and one out-door patient for each pound subscribed during the year of such contribution; provided that the funds and accommodation of the Hospital will admit of the reception and treatment of such patients. The Board shall also have power to add to the list of Life Governors such persons as by their eminent services may have added within one year the sum of £25 to the funds of the Hospital; and members of the Board are not to be limited in the number of patients they may recommend. Life Governors alone shall be entitled to vote by proxy.

8. That no person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of subscribers, unless he shall have been a subscriber of at least £1 sterling to this Hospital for the space of six months previous to such meeting; provided always that where a subscriber shall have paid his subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place, the payment of his subscription for the then current year at any time before such meeting shall entitle such subscriber to vote.

9. That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance be received at any time, and that in ordinary cases patients shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) at such hours as may be from time to time appointed by the Board, on the recommendation of a subscriber of at least £1 sterling for the then current year, countersigned by a member of the Board, who shall certify that such patient is not capable of providing for medical attendance; but patients shall be admitted at any time on a special order signed by the House Committee and one of the Honorary Surgeons.

10. That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, or one affected with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who in the opinion of the medical officer in attendance is unfit to be an

in-door patient, shall be received under any circumstances, except with the express permission of the Board.

11. The House Committee shall, at least once a week, visit the Hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof and of inquiring of the patients if they are properly attended to, and shall report in writing to the next meeting of the Board any alterations or suggestions they may think necessary; such Committee to be selected by agreement amongst the members during the sitting of the Board.

12. If any member of the Board shall neglect his duty for the space of two months (the Trustees excepted) he shall suffer disqualification (unless upon well-founded excuse) and another shall be appointed in his stead if the Board think fit; and any contractor to the Hospital, being a member of the Board, shall absent himself from its sittings while any subject relating to his contract is under consideration.

13. The Board shall have power from time to time to make, rescind, alter, or amend any Bye-laws for the due management of the affairs of the Hospital. But no such Bye-laws shall be made, rescinded, altered, or amended, unless upon seven days' notice thereof being given to each member, and only upon being carried by a majority of two-thirds of a meeting, consisting of not less than fifteen members of the Board.

14. That no alteration or rescinding of Rules shall be made except by duly qualified contributors, in public meeting assembled, of which the Secretary shall have given at least seven days' notice by public advertisement, stating the business for which such meeting shall be convened.

#### HONORARY TREASURER.

15. The Honorary Treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the Hospital, and invest the same in such bank or banks as the Board shall direct, to the credit of the Hospital. He shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the Chairman of the meeting as having been approved by the Board, by drafts on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, and by the Secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the Board.

#### HONORARY SURGEONS.

16. The Honorary Medical Officers shall consist of legally qualified Medical Practitioners, who shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the Hospital at all times; they shall assist the Resident Surgeon in the performance of all capital surgical operations; but no such operation shall be per-

formed without previous consultations of the medical staff; and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or of protracted continuance in the Hospital.

#### RESIDENT SURGEON.

17. The Resident Surgeon shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period, without the permission of the Board. He shall not engage in private practice under any circumstances, except in cases of consultation at the request of other surgeons; provided such consultations will not interfere with his duties as Resident Surgeon.

#### SECRETARY.

18. The Secretary shall convene the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days previous to the meeting.

19. He shall convene Special Meetings of duly qualified Subscribers in the same manner, when directed by the Board, or on the written application of ten duly qualified Subscribers of at least £1 each; the object of such meeting to be stated in the advertisement, and shall give special notice to each member of the Board of such meetings.

## Bye-Laws of the Pleasant Creek Hospital.

---

#### RESIDENT SURGEON.

1. The Resident Surgeon shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, and decide on their fitness for admission, either as In-door or Out-door Patients, subject to the approval of the House Committee; and he shall discharge all Patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

2. He shall have charge of Patients in the Hospital, and of their treatment; but in all cases of difficulty or danger, or long continuance in the Hospital, he is requested to consult the Honorary Surgeons.

3. He shall superintend and control all Servants in the Hospital, and in case of neglect of duty, or insubordination, may suspend any of them, and report thereon to the House Committee.

4. He shall keep such accounts respecting the Patients as the Board of Management may direct, in books to be kept for that

purpose, and report to the Board such cases as he may think necessary.

5. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs and chemicals, carefully examine them, both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects, in either respect, to the Board; make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, and keep an account of the receipts and expenditure, or loss and breakage, of all such instruments, drugs, and chemicals. And he must, in the absence of a Dispenser, perform such duties as would devolve upon that officer.

6. He shall enter regularly, in books to be kept for that purpose, the names of Patients as they are admitted or discharged, together with the nature and history of their diseases, while under treatment. He shall receive all money and other property belonging to Patients, and account for the same to the Board when required.

7. He shall accompany the Honorary Surgeons through the Wards and report to them the state of the Patients. Visit each Patient every morning and evening, and enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to; and if any cause of complaint exist immediately remove the same, or report it to the Board at it at its next meeting.

8. He shall perform all surgical operations, and *post mortem* examinations, keep the key of the dead house, and give due notice to the Honorary Medical Officers when a consultation is to be held, or an operation to be performed; but in all cases of emergency to act to the best of his judgement.

#### SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR

9. The Secretary and Collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the Hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out their resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the Board.

10. He shall collect subscriptions and all money due to the Hospital, in all cases give receipts for the same, and pay to the Treasurer, at least once in every month, all money he may have received, and render an account of the same to the Board.

#### NURSES.

11. The Nurses shall live in the Hospital, and shall not leave it for any length of time without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; they shall obey the orders of the said officer, be regular in their attendance, behave with tenderness to all patients, and with civility and respect to strangers.

12. They shall pay great attention to cleanliness, personally, in their respective Wards, and in all things entrusted to their charge; particularly to the bedding of the Patients, and have it

changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

13. They shall administer to the Patients the medicines and diet at the time and in the manner directed by the Resident Surgeon, and not permit them to take any which have not been prescribed, they shall be careful to explain to the Patients the instructions of the said officer; and watch attentively the state and symptoms of the Patients, and report the same to the Resident Surgeon.

14. They shall not permit Patients to receive from visitors, medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines or diet, nor any thing to be removed from the Wards by the patients or visitors without an order from the Resident Surgeon.

15. They shall be careful to collect and carry all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c., to the Dispensary, at which they shall attend at the time appointed, to receive medicines and instructions

16. They shall not admit any stranger without permission from the Resident Surgeon, except during the hours appointed for that purpose.

17. They shall be obedient to the regulations of the Hospital, and report immediately to the Resident Surgeon any impropriety of conduct, or infringement of the rules, by any patient, visitor, or other person; and if such complaint is not properly attended to, report the same to the Board at its next meeting.

#### PATIENTS.

18. The Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, strictly observe all the directions of the Resident Surgeon and Nurses, take their medicines and diet at the time directed and not take any other than those prescribed; neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

19. They shall not leave their Ward and go into another Ward, leave the House, or remain out for a longer time than may be granted, or introduce visitors, or receive medicines, victuals, liquors, tobacco, nor anything; without the express leave of the Resident Surgeon.

20. They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, deface or injure any part of the ward, furniture, bedding or clothing; nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language, neither shall they smoke without permission from the Resident Surgeon.

21. Any patient having any cause of complaint, shall make the same known to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to remedy the same; if not remedied, the said complaint may be made to the Official Visitors, or to the Board at its next meeting; but if complaints are not made before a Patient leaves the Hospital or within two days after leaving, they cannot be entertained.

22. Patients deemed able by the Resident Surgeon to assist in the work of the Hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

23. Patients shall not sit up after 8 p.m., in Winter, or 9 o'clock in Summer; and all Patients considered by the Resident Surgeon able to do so, shall rise at 7 a.m. in the summer and 8 o'clock in winter.

24. Out-door Patients shall attend at the Hospital between 9 and 12 o'clock a.m., on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, and must observe the rules relating to In-door Patients, so far as may be practicable. In-door Patients, in ordinary cases, shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of 10 and 12 a.m.

#### PATIENTS AND VISITORS.

25. Patients and Visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or other person connected with the Hospital.

26. Visitors are admitted daily, between the hours of two and five o'clock in the Afternoon, except persons from a distance, who may be admitted at any time by permission of the Resident Surgeon; but no visitor will be allowed to remain more than one hour, except Ministers of Religion, who may visit the Patients at any time; but all visitors must retire when requested by the Nurses.

27. Visitors shall not give to, or leave with any Patient, medicine, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; nor interfere with the Nurses, nor disturb the Patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

28. Any Visitor or Patient violating any of the rules of the Hospital, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the Resident Surgeon or the Board.

#### GENERAL.

29. Any Officer, Nurse, Servant, or other person in any way connected with the Hospital, who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and not be permitted in future to hold any office or appointment belonging to this Hospital.

#### *Memoranda.*

The friends of the Institution are informed there is a Library for the use of the Patients, and that donations of Books, Periodicals, &c., will be thankfully received; as also OLD CLEAN LINEN, Calico, and Blankets.

Each Patient should, if possible, be provided with a change of clean clothing, particularly with cotton and flannel shirts and stockings.
