### THE REPORT

# OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL.

For the Year 1862.

TO THE GOVERNORS, SUBSCRIBERS, AND CONTRIBUTORS OF THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL:-

The advent of another year, and the expiration of the term of office of the Committee of your Hospital for the year 1862, render it incumbent on them to submit you an account of the stewardship with which they have been honored, together with a statement of the affairs of the Institution, which they trust you will deem satisfactory and encouraging. In rendering their report they will endeavour to be as concise as possible, but as many of the subscribers reside at a distance and have but slight means of becoming acquainted with the working of the charity, and the mode in which their money is expended, it is deemed desirable to enter into many details that would otherwise be unnecessary.

First, as to the finances of the Institution, your Committee beg to call your attention to the abstract account (see Appendix No. 3) from which it will be seen that the balance at the end of the year is in excess of that in 1861, that the subscriptions on Pleasant Creek have increased, while the population has diminished, and although there is an absence of some of the larger contributions, there are many who have increased their subscription, thereby showing the appreciation in which the Hospital is held by a large majority of the inhabitants of the neighbourhood, who are best acquainted with the management

and utility of the Institution.

The Committee regret that there is a slight diminution in the contributions from the pastoral district, which is presumed to be attributable, more than to any other cause, to the number of charitable collections that were being made just before and at the time the collector was making his annual tour. There is also another cause, which to the charitably disposed will afford ground for congratulation, viz., the coming into existence of a sister charity, the Hospital at Hamilton. This newly formed Institution has received contributions hitherto given, with no parsimonious hand, by the residents of Mount Talbot and Fulham to your Hospital. While on this subject, it is

suggested that it would much aid the Hospital and facilitate collection, if the shepherds and other residents at outstations would voluntarily authorise the owners of each station to pay their contributions when the collector calls. This authority might be given in August or September, or better still, we would strongly urge them to give a standing order to their respective employers for the payment of so

much each year while they remain on the station.

We are glad to announce that we have been enabled, through the exertions of our Members in Parliament, to obtain the liberal and necessary grant of £2000 from the Government. But it is with regret that we have to record the loss of all aid from amateur or professional benefits, sources from whence have hitherto sprung considerable monetary assistance. As these adjuncts to the labors of your collectors nave heretofore proved so beneficial, and are at the same time ever appreciated as a means of enjoyment, your Committee trust they will once more obtain a prominent place in the reports of future Committees, when enumerating the various sources of financial

support.

With reference to the expenditure, we trust you will find it has been both judicious and economical. It may be remarked that the chief increase is in provisions, furniture, extra bedding, and such other items as an increase of patients necessarily demanded. We have also provided an additional room for servants, a stable, galvanic battery, and suitably fitted up and furnished the Committee Room and Surgeon's Apartments. There is however, we note, unfortunately, an item of £43 7s. 6d. for interest paid on the overdrawn account at the Bank, owing to the late period at which the major part of the Government grant was paid (whereas in the previous year more than half that amount was received as interest from deposit receipts). unfortunate circumstance, together with the expense attending the increase of patients, has diminished funds which would have been devoted to building purposes, still leaving the expense to be defrayed of fitting up the bath room, which has been too long delayed (but is now, we are happy to say, under contract), whitewashing the interior of the Hospital, which has just been completed, and a water bed, expected in a few days.

The system of management (as mentioned in last report) by a House Committee, has been carried on throughout the year, and has been found to work well, namely, that of delegating to three members of the Board, for a limited period, much of the power vested in the General Board of Management, whereby more frequent meetings are ensured, with closer supervision, together with the prompt despatch of business, and this without fear of excessive expenditure, their power in this respect being limited to £10 per month, for items not

previously sanctioned by the Board of Management.

We may mention that the experiment of baking bread at the Hospital has been attempted during the past year, but your Committee

cannot recommend its permanent adoption, either on the ground of economy, or the production uniformly of a better quality of this important article of consumption, than can be obtained from the trades-

men of the neighbourhood.

There are several important undertakings which it has been found necessary through want of funds to postpone, and which should engage the attention of your new Committee, viz.:—Fencing in the Hospital grounds and the cultivation of some portion thereof for ornamental, recreative and domestic purposes, combined with which should be the formation of a reservoir. The erection of two or three small rooms, for one patient each, for such persons as from the nature of their complaints cause annoyance to other suffering inmates. We may here state we have lately made another room available for patients, by taking away one of two rooms hitherto occupied by the late wardsman and matron, but this curtailment is only justified by the necessity of the case, and only serves to show how much the rooms already alluded to are required.

Although the grant of land for the Hospital has been liberal, the building itself is so placed, that your Committee suggest, first the purchase of an additional five acres, immediately at the rear of the out offices, so that when fenced in it may enjoy a perfect immunity from that which might be the disagreeable proximity of unpleasant neighbours—this it will be seen is necessary, from the fact that the boundary of the present reserve runs within a few feet of the kitchen and other offices; secondly, and with respect to the ground in front of the building, the Committee suggest that application be made to the Government, that the ground now vacant and unappropriated, lying between the reserve and the main road from Stawell to Glenorchy. should be witheld from alienation from the Crown; by these means the excellent site which is occupied by the Hospital would preserve its intrinsic value for all the purposes for which it was granted, -without some such step be taken, the danger may arise that the best public building of which the district can boast, may be crowded out of sight,

There are also other matters to which it is right we should direct the attention of Subscribers, inasmuch as they would necessitate the alteration of Rules, a power solely vested in them. We would recommend first, that the 13th Rule be so changed as to admit of a private and responsible person being Treasurer, instead of the Manager of the local Bank where the Hospital account is kept, inasmuch as in his double capacity he would stand in an anomalous position, the Act requiring him to be registered as the person to sue and be sued on behalf of the Hospital. We therefore recommend that the rule be altered, and that you appoint a local gentlemen of good standing, who will have the interest of the Institution at heart, and who will subject himself to the responsibilities, while you invest him with the honor of

and lose the prominence to which it is justly entitled.

We also recommend the 41st Rule to be altered for the attendance of out-door patients, the present hours of attendance—from 12 to 2 o'clock—proving inconvenient, from continual interruption at meals. It is also right your attention should be drawn to the absence of some of the Trustees from Pleasant Creek, and to submit for your consideration the necessity of calling on those gentlemen who hold, or may yet hold these positions of importance, to resign, when they have ceased to have their residence in the locality of their trust.

While engaged to the best of their ability in the present management of the affairs of the Hospital, your Committee have not been neglectful of its future permanence and prosperity; with this end in view, they have submitted a suggestion to the Commission appointed to enquire into the working of Municipal and Cha itable Institutions

on the subject of endowment.

Starting with what they believe to be a well grounded objection to the present system of annual grants-in-aid, from the public purse for charitable purposes, which in its application is generally tardy, and not unfrequently partial-they ventured to propose-that the system of endowment by land should be gradually substituted, - that this and kindred charities, while receiving each year the aid necessary for their well being should, after the lapse of a time to be determined on, find themselves, as they ought to be, independent of the Annual Parliamentary vote; for example, assuming that the annual income from the State for this charity is £2000—it was proposed that as a beginning, a grant of land of the present annual value of £100 should be made to the Trustees, the income derivable from which should be deducted from the amount of the grant for the succeeding year, and so on in like manner; each year seeing the increase of the endowment, and the decrease of the annual monies grant, until according to this (admittedly crude) suggestion, the end of twenty years would place the Hospital in an entirely self-dependent position. It must not be supposed that this system is suggested in any way to absolve the inhabitants of the district from the duty of supporting the sick and helpless out of their own pockets, by means of the ordinary voluntrary subscriptions; and it must be borne in mind that with the prosperity of the district the value of the land, and the amount of voluntary local aid would increase also; so that the time roughly computed wherein the endowment should supersede the annual money grant, would be reduced considerably below that already quoted. It is owing to means akin to these, that the grand charities of the mother country are now able to dispense relief to the incalculable extent they do, and it is no unworthy ambition, even though many of us may not be here to witness its achievement, to endeavour in our degree to emulate an example that has been the source of healing and comfort to thousands.

The following subjects should also, we consider, engage your particular attention:—lst. The reception of patients who might afford to pay their expenses in Hospital, though not able to pay the expense of

a private medical man; next, the reception of such persons as could afford to pay both, but who—from the peculiar circumstances of the colony—cannot obtain proper nursing in their frequently friendless and

isolated dwellings.

It is also desirable that you should consider whether you will increase your subscriptions, and whether others might not be induced to become subscribers, for the purpose of augmenting the usefulness of your Institution by adding fever and syphilitic wards, and suitable accommodation for temporary treatment and accommodation in cases of lunacy. And also whether you should make yours a more kindred Institution to those at Portland, Warnambool, and other up-country establishments, to relieve the many cases existing within the extensive district wherein your Collector canvasses subscriptions of persons who, painfully decrepid through age or other infirmaties, require the aid of public charity to aleviate their sufferings and prevent starvation. Such cases require your charitable but cautious consideration, as they might prove a charge on the Institution for several years. But before arriving at a decision on these important subjects, it might be well to await the report of the Municipal and Charitable Institutions Commission, and the decision of the Government thereon; as it is possible it might desire material alteration in the original basis of the Institution.

Your Committee have a second time found it necessary to exercise the power vested in them by the 10th Rule; and, under special circumstances, have granted admission temporarily to a lady affected with insanity, her husband paying the Institution such extra expenses as may be incurred above that an ordinary patient would entail. There has been also a case of emergency, where it was deemed proper to charge the person relieved the sum of five guineas; and a case of ordinary admission, where it was found the patient had means, has

been charged £10 towards his expenses.

There have also been other cases which should not have had the aid of a charity, and your Committee beg strongly to impress both upon the subscribers and members of the new Committee the necessity of exercising great care in seeing that their recommendations extend only to those really in need, and who cannot provide for their private medical treatment.

We now beg to call your attention to the appendix No. 1, showing the nature and number of the cases relieved, by which you will see an increase of 60 in-door patients as compared with 1861—making the daily average 25\frac{3}{3} instead of 17\frac{1}{2}; and that the out-door patients have increased to 212, many of whom have received frequent advice and medicines for a considerable period. We have much pleasure in drawing your attention to the slight mortality—the surest proof of medical skill, proper diet, and careful and attentive nursing. With reference to the diet much trouble has been taken in making comparisons with other institutions, and a general scale has been fixed; which, without limiting the discretion of the Doctor, is believed to be ample, and gives satisfaction to the patients—while it prevents waste or extravagance.

Your Committee have to inform you that the late wardsman and matron (Mr. and Mrs. Manwaring) have resigned their offices, and that an experienced couple from the Melbourne Hospital have been engaged on more economical terms—who, there is every reason to think will prove useful and efficient attendants. While referring to these changes, we feel it a pleasurable duty to bear well merited testimony to the zeal and efficiency of the paid officers of your Institution, and perceive

herein the earnest of its continued popularity and worth.

We have much pleasure in requesting your thanks to Messrs. Wilson, Houston, and Woods, for the kind, prompt and energetic attention they have exhibited as Members of the Assembly in promoting the interests of the Institution. Your thanks are also due to Mr. Doyle, not only for the exhaustive reply prepared by him in answer to the queries propounded by the Commission of Enquiry into the working of Municipal and Charitable Institutions, but also for the comprehensive system of bookkeeping which he has submitted, and of which the Board of Management have recommended the adoption as soon as practicable. We have likewise to note the reduction made by the Stawell Road Board of the assessment on the Hospital from £3 15s. per annuam to the nominal sum of one shilling.

It is but right that we should remark on the small amount contributed in the mining district of Landsborough. This is owing to the Collector having been instructed to discontinue collecting at that place, as it was found, from its situation and the various means of convey-

ance, to be more convenient to the Ararat Hospital.

We have also to mention a communication from the Dunolly Hospital, to try and establish a uniform system of admission tickets; which, after mature consideration, was not thought practicable or advisable.

In conclusion, your Committee have to call your attention to appendix No. 4, showing the subscriptions, &c., contributed for the present year; which are amply sufficient to entitle the receipt of a grant-in-aid of £2500 for the year 1863. And to appendix No. 2, showing the meetings and attendances of the several members of your Committee, which they hope will abundantly show they have faithfully and zealously discharged the duties entrusted to them, and which they now resign into your hands, in the earnest hope that the usefulness of your noble Institution may not alone be long perpetuated for the relief of the sick and indigent, but also, through your increased liberality, its eleemosynary assistance may be extended to cases yet excluded from its portals. The Committee thank you for the confidence reposed in them.

#### RULES

OF

### THE PLEASANT CREEK HOSPITAL,

FOR 1863.

1.—The Hospital will afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid to any poor person requiring them, irrespective of creed, country, or color; but any person who shall be admitted under any circumstances and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so, and will

receive temporary relief only.

2.—The Hospital shall be managed by a President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, an Honorary Treasurer, four Honorary Surgeons and a Committee of Management not exceeding twelve; all of whom, with the exception of the Trustees, shall be elected annually, at the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, by duly qualified Subscribers.

3.—Should any vacancy occur in either of the above-named offices, the same shall be filled at the then or next ensuing General Meeting of Subscribers; but in all cases, except those of Treasurer or Trustees,

the Board is empowered to temporarily fill the vacancy.

4.—The above duly qualified electors shall, at the Annual General Meeting in January, in each year, appoint two Auditors, not Members of the Board, to examine the accounts of the past year, but in case either of such Auditors neglect or refuse to perform the said Audit for the space of one month from the time of their appointment, a Special Meeting of duly qualified Subscribers shall be called immediately to elect new Auditors to supply their place; and also, it shall be competent for the President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President, at the request of not less than ten duly qualified Subscribers, to convene, by advertisement, a Public Meeting, at any time, for the purpose of elecing Auditors, if any emergency arise to warrant the Board of Management in having the accounts audited.

5.—The Board of Management shall include all the officers named in the second Rule, it shall direct the collection and distribution of funds, appoint and dismiss all paid officers and servants, frame regulations for the management of the Hospital, present a report to Annual General Meeting, and conduct the affairs of the Hospital generally; and may from among themselves, from time to time, appoint Committees for any purposes which in their opinion would be better regulated and managed by means of such Committees; and it may fix the quorum of such Committees; and may continue, alter, or dis-

continue such Committees.

6.—The Board shall meet for general business once, at least, in each month, at such time and place as it may from time to time appoint, and for special business at any time or place that may be requisite. Special Meetings may be convened by the President, or by the two Vice-Presidents, or by either of these officers, upon the requisition of not less than three members of the Board of Management. At any Meeting, nine members shall form a quorum, and in the absence of the President or Vice-Presidents one of the Members present shall be elected to act as Chairman.

7.—That every contributor of £25 in one sum shall be a Life Governor, with the privilege of voting at all meetings of Subscribers, and of nominating five In-door and five Out-door Patients in each year. And every Contributor of £1 and upwards to £5, shall be entitled to nominate one In-door and one Out-door Patient for each pound subscribed during the year of such contribution; provided that the funds and accommodation of the Hospital will admit of the reception and treatment of such Patients. The Board of Management shall also have power to add to the list of Life Governors such persons as by their eminent services may have added within one year the sum of £25 to the funds of the Hospital; and Members of the Board are not to be limited in the number of Patients they may recommend. Life Governors alone shall be entitled to vote by proxy.

8.—That no person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any Meeting of Subscribers to this Hospital unless he shall have been a Subscriber of at least £1 sterling to this Hospital for the space of six months previous to such meeting; provided always that where a subscriber shall have paid his subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any Public Meeting shall take place, the payment of his subscription for the then current year at any time

before such meeting shall entitle such subscriber to vote.

9.—That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the Medical officer in attendance be received at any time, and that in ordinary cases Patients shall be admitted daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of 12 and 1 p.m., on the recommendation of a Subscriber of at least £1 sterling for the then current year, and also of one of the Committee of Management, who shall certify that the said Patient is not capable of providing for medical attendance.

10.—That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, or one affected with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who in the opinion of the Medical Officer in attendance is unfit to be an In-door Patient, shall be received under any circumstances, except with the express permission of the Board of Management.

11.—The House Committee shall, at least once a week, visit the Hospital for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof and of enquiring of the Patients if they are properly attended to, and re-

port in writing to the next meeting of the Board any alterations or suggestions they may think necessary; such House Committee to be selected by agreement amongst the Members during the sitting of the

Board.

12.—If any Member of the Board of Management shall neglect his duty for the space of one month (the Trustees excepted) he shall suffer disqualification (unless upon well founded excuse) and another shall be appointed in his stead if the Board think fit; and that all contractors with the Hospital shall be disqualified from being a Member of Committee.

#### HONORARY TREASURER.

13.—He shall receive all monies on behalf of the Hospital, and invest the same in such Bank or Banks as the Board of Management shall direct, to the credit of the Hospital. He shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the Chairman of the Meeting as having been approved by the Board, by drafts on the Bank or Banks, which shall be countersigned by the President, or one of the Vice-Presidents, and by the Secretary. He shall also keep an account of all monies received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a Meeting of the Board.

#### HONORARY SURGEONS.

14.—The Honorary Medical Officers shall consist of four legally qualified Medical Practitioners, who shall be elected for one year. They shall have access to the Hospital at all times; they shall assist the Resident Surgeon in the performance of all capital surgical operations—but no such operation shall be performed without previous consultation of the medical staff; and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or of protracted continuance in the Hospital.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

15.—The Resident Surgeon shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period, without the permission of the Board of Management. He shall not engage in private practice under any circumstances, except in cases of consultation at the request of other Surgeons; provided such consultations will not interfere with his duties as Resident Surgeon.

16.—He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, and decide on their fitness for admission, either as In-door or Out-door Patients, subject to the approval of the House Committee; and he shall discharge all Patients

as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

17.—He shall have charge of Patients in the Hospital, and of their treatment; but in all cases of difficulty or danger, or long continuance in the Hospital, he is requested to consult the Honorary Surgeons.

18.—He shall superintend and control all Servants in the Hospital, and in case of neglect of duty, or insubordination, may suspend any of them, and report thereon to the House Committee.

19.—He shall keep such accounts respecting the Patients as the Board may direct, in books to be kept for that purpose, and report to

the Board such cases as he may think necessary.

20.—He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs and chemicals, and shall carefully examine them, both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects, in either respect, to the Board of Management; and he shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, and keep an account of the receipt and expenditure, or loss and breakage, of all such instrments, drugs and chemicals. And he must, in the absence of a Dispenser, perform such duties as would devolve upon that officer.

21—He shall enter regularly, in books to be kept for that purpose, the names of Patients, as they are admitted or discharged, together with the nature and history of their diseases, while under treatment. He shall receive all money and other property belonging to Patients, and shall account for the same to the Board of Management when

required

22.—He shall accompany the Honorary Surgeons through the Wards and report to them the state of the Patients. He shall also visit each Patient every morning and evening, and enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to; and if any cause of complaint exist he shall immediately remove the same, or report it to the Board at its next meeting.

23.—He shall perform all surgical operations, and post morten examinations, and shall keep the key of the dead-house. He shall also give due notice to the Honorary Medical Officers when a consultation is to be held, or an operation performed; but in all cases of emergency

to act to the best of his judgment.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

24.—The Secretary and Collector shall keep the minutes, accounts and records of the Hospital, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out their resolutions, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the Board.

25.—He shall convene the Annual General Meeting in the month of January in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the Board, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days

previous to the meeting

26.—He shall convene Special Meetings of duly qualified Subscribers in the same manner, when directed by the Board, or on the written application of ten duly qualified Subscribers of at least £1 each; the object of such Special Meeting to be stated in the advertisement, and he shall also give special notice to each Member of the Board of such meetings.

27.—He shall collect subscriptions and all monies due to the Hospital, in all cases give receipts for the same, and pay to the Treasurer, at least once in every month, all monies he may have received, and

render an account of the same to the Board of Management.

#### NURSES.

28.—The Nurses shall live in the Hospital, and shall not leave it for any length of time without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; they shall obey the orders of the said officer, be regular in their attendance, behave with tenderness to all patients, and with civility and respect to strangers,

29.—They shall pay great attention to cleanliness, personally, in their respective Wards, and in all things entrusted to their charge; particularly to the bedding of the Patients, and have it changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

30.—They shall administer to the Patients the medicines and diet at the time and in the manner directed by the Resident Surgeon, and they shall not permit them to take any which have not been prescribed they shall be careful to explain to the Patients the instructions of the said officer; and shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the Patients, and report the same to the Resident Surgeon.

31.—They shall not permit Patients to receive from visitors, medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines or diet, nor any thing to be removed from the Wards by the Patients or Visitors without an order from the Resident Surgeon.

32.—They shall be careful to collect and carry all empty phials, gallipots bandages, &c., to the Dispensary, at which they shall attend at the time appointed, to receive medicines and instructions.

33 —They shall not admit any stranger without permission from the Resident Surgeon, except during the hours appointed for that

purpose.

34.—They shall be obedient to the regulations of the Hospital, and shall report immediately to the Resident Surgeon any impropriety of conduct, or infringement of the rules, by any patient, visitor, or other person; and if such complaint is not properly attended to, they shall report the same to the Board of Managemement at its next meeting.

PATIENTS.

35.—The Patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and strictly observe all the directions of the Resident Surgeon and Nurses, take their medicines and diet at the time directed, and not take any other than those prescribed; neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

36.—They shall not leave their Ward and go into another Ward, or leave the House, or remain out for a longer time than may be granted, or introduce visitors, or receive medicines, victuals, liquors, tobacco, nor anything; and not smoke, without the express leave of the

Resident Surgeon.

37.—They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, deface or injure any part of the ward, furniture, bedding, or clothing; nor sing, blaspheme,

or use rude or indecent language.

38.—Any Patient having any cause of complaint, shall make the same known to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to remedy the same; if not remedied, the said complaint may be made to the Official Visitors, or to the Board of Management at its next meeting;

but if complaints are not made before a Patient leaves the Hospital or within two days after leaving, they cannot be entertained.

39.—Patients deemed able by the Resident Surgeon to assist in the work of the Hospital shall, at his request, so employ themselves,

40.—Patients shall not sit up after 8 p.m. in Winter or 9 o'clock in Summer; and all Patients considered by the Resident Surgeon as able to do so, shall rise at 7 a.m. in the Summer and 8 o'clock in Winter.

41.—Out-door Patients shall attend at the Hospital between 9 and 12 o'clock a.m., on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays, and must observe the rules relating to In-door Patients, so far as may be practicable.

ticable.

#### PATIENTS AND VISITORS.

42.—Patients and Visitors are requested not to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any officer, nurse, or other person connected

with the Hospital.

48.—Visitors are admitted daily, between the hours of two and five o'clock in the Afternoon, except persons from a distance, who may be admitted at any time by permission of the Resident Surgeon; but no Visitor will be allowed to remain more than one hour, except Ministers of Religion, who may visit the Patients at any time; but all visitors must retire when requested by the Nurses.

44.—Visitors shall not give to or leave with any Patient, medicine, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the permission of the Resident Surgeon; nor interfere with the Nurses,

nor disturb the Patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

45.—Any Visitor or Patient violating any of the rules of the Hospital, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the Resident Surgeon or Board of Management.

GENERAL.

46.—Any Officer, Nurse, Servant, or other person in any way connected with the Hospital, who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and shall not be permitted in future to hold any office or appointment belonging to this Hospital.

47.—That no alteration or rescinding of Rules shall be made except by duly qualified Contributors, in public meeting assembled, of which the Secretary shall have given at least seven days notice by public advertisement, stating the business for which such meeting shall be

convened.

#### Memoranda.

The friends of the Institution are informed that there is a Library forming for the use of the Patients, and that donations of Books, Periodicals, &c., will be thankfully received; as also old clean linen, calico, and blankets.

Each Patient should, if possible, be provided with a change of clean clothing, particularly with cotton and flannel shirts, and stockings.
