

TO THE GOVERNORS, SUBSCRIBERS AND CONTRIBUTOROS OF THE
STAWELL HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

NON submitting the report and statement of accounts for the Year ended 30th June, 1901, your Committee gladly acknowledge the continued valuable assistance you have rendered to the institution during the past year. Largely through your warm interest in the hospital and your generous contributions to its support its highly important work has been done with an efficiency so admirable as to gain for it a high rank amongst the similar institutions in the State. The attached schedules indicate clearly the magnitude of the work that has been accomplished during the year, and show how largely the public have availed themselves of the skilled medical care which the hospital provides for applicants of whatever creed and nationality.

During the year the in-patients numbered 328 as compared with 348 the previous year, the daily average being 47.3, that of 1899-1900 being 47.6. The out-patients for the year were 325 as compared with 389 the year before. Twenty-eight deaths took place during the year, the record for the previous year being thirty-nine. The smaller number of in and out patients is largely explained by the fact that the year was a particularly healthy one, and free from epidemics.

The actual expenditure for the year was £1771 19s 6d, the outlay for the previous year being £2292 14s 1d, a difference of £520 14s 7d. This large difference is partly owing to fact that extensive repairs, etc., were carried out in the year 1899-1900, amounting in all to £437 11s. During the year just ended only £80 7s 6d has been expended in this way. The expenditure for fuel and light has also been much smaller, £111 3s 7d less than the year before, but this is to be accounted for by the fact that the year's wood will most of it be charged to the year following.

The annual average cost of in-patients being only £33 19s as compared with £37 19s 10d the year before, has also had an appreciable effect in lessening the expenditure. This lessened expenditure has enabled us to end the financial year with a credit balance of £853 19s 6d, as compared with £452 6s 1d for the previous year.

This year again special thanks are due to the Government for its grant to the maintenance fund ; to the trustees of the Edward Wilson Estate for £40 ; to the Stawell Borough Council, the Stawell, Dunmunkle, and Avoca Shire Councils for their generous grants to the funds of the Hospital ; to the members of the Stawell Brass Band and the members of the Stawell Fire Brigade for contributing so much to the exceptional success to the two Hospital Sundays of the year ; the honorary surgeons for their professional assistance ; and to the many others who in various ways have done much to foster the noble work of the institution.

You will now, in the usual way, proceed to the election of a president, two vice-presidents, and a treasurer for the current year. In addition you will elect 15 members of committee, eight to represent the country district and 7 to represent the local centre. Five of the local members retire from effluxion of time, and in addition to these two of those gentlemen appointed last year, to be appointed by ballot, will also retire.

Your committee would not conclude their report without referring to the continued efficiency of the entire official staff of the hospital. Most of them have served on the House Committee during the year, and they have invariably been impressed with the zeal and conscientious devotion to duty of the surgeon and the skilled ladies who compose the nursing staff.

They feel that in asking for your continued interest and support they are asking you to help in an enterprise which is not only entirely philanthropic in spirit but is also being conducted in the way which conduces most to the great end in view in connection with all such institutions.



EXTRACTS OF

SECTION 25 " HOSPITAL & CHARITIES ACT, 1890."

"Any person who either before or after his admission * * makes a statement to the effect that he is in destitute circumstances and unable to pay for his maintenance, attendance or relief, and who in consequence of having made such statement is admitted or maintained by or receives medical attendance or relief * * * shall be liable to contribute towards the same according to his means * * * and such sum shall on demand therefore be a debt due by such person and may be recovered from him * * * and in addition * * * shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds * * *

" POLICE OFFENCES ACT, 1890."

Section 41, Sub-section 3.

"Any person who shall commit any of the following offences shall be deemed a rogue and a vagabond within the meaning of this part and be liable to the punishment next hereinafter specified :

Any person imposing or endeavouring to impose upon any charitable institution or private individual by any false or fraudulent representations either verbally or in writing with a view to obtain money or any other benefit or advantage shall be liable to imprisonment in any goal with hard labour for any time [not exceeding two years.]"
