The Forty-Third Annual Report

To the Governors, Subscribers, and Contributors.

WE have pleasure in submitting the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1902. Your Committee are glad to acknowledge the aid that has been so freely given to the Hospital by its many generous friends. Through their help the good work done in previous years has been continued, and we are enabled to present a report as encouraging as that of any presented during the now fairly long history of the institution.

The following figures will show in brief the magnitude of the work accomplished during the year. As compared with the previous year the number of in-patients was somewhat larger; there being 356, in 1900-1901 316, the daily average being 46·7, that of the previous year 47·3, thus showing that though the number of patients was greater for the year the time of their stay in the Hospital was less. There were 349 out-patients for the year, as compared with 325 the year before. During the year 31 patients died, including two inmates of the Benevolent Ward.

During the year the outlay in connection with the institution amounted in all to £2082 4s 7d, as compared with £1767 19s 2d the previous year, a difference of £314 8s 5d, and to be accounted for by the facts that the increased costs of provisions were considerable, that firewood for the greater part of two years is included, and that £100 was added to the Endowment Fund. The annual average cost of in-patients has been £37 11s 2d as compared with £33 19s 0d the previous year, and £37 19s 10d the year before that.

We end the financial year with a credit balance of £885 6s 9d, that of the previous year being £853 19s 6d, showing an increase of £31 7s 3d, and this notwithstanding the fact that £100 has been added to the Endowment Fund during the year.

We have again to record our special thanks for the Government grant to maintenance fund; to the Edward Wilson Estate Trustees for £40, £20 of which was passed as a special Coronation bequest, but too late to appear in the balance sheet; to the Stawell Borough Council, the Stawell, Dunmunkle, and Avoca Shire Councils for their usual grants to the Hospital funds; to the Stawell Brass Band and the Stawell Fire Brigade for their efficient help in connection with the two Hospital Sundays of the year; and to the very many private contributors to the Hospital, the amount received from this source alone being no less than £377 10s od for the year.

The Hospital funds have also benefitted by bequests from several old friends, who have passed away during the year. The will of the late Richard Williams bequeathed £50; that of the late Mrs. Stokes £10; and the executors of the late Samuel Hamilton paid over £25—all of which sums have been duly acknowledged.

During the year affiliation with the Victorian Trained Nurses' Association has taken place, and we have thus, we believe secured an improved status for the nurses trained in our own Institution. We would again accord our sincere thanks to the two honorary surgeons (Dr. Fox and Dr. Napthine) for the skilled assistance so generously given during the year.

The Committee would feel their report to be incomplete did they not also record their appreciation of the work done during the year by the Resident Staff of the Hospital. In no previous year, in their opinion, has there been more effective services rendered by the surgeon and nurses. They have been much impressed with the admirable way in which the work of the institution in every department is carried on.

This year has witnessed the severance of the connection between the Institution and Mr Charles B. Playford, who has been the Secretary ever since the foundation of your charity in 1858. His services during this long period were ever appreciated by the successive Boards of Management and by the long series of subscribers who have supported the Hospital from its earliest days. On behalf of the subscribers as well as that of the Board we had pleasure in presenting Mr Playford with an illuminated address expressive of the high appreciation of his long and able services.

We have to report that during the year we have sustained the loss by death of our colleague, Mr Wilkinson Wayman, who was a member of the Board for a very long period and was one of the earliest Presidents of your Institution; his services as an expert were always at command of the committee and he never wearied in his efforts for the benefit of your charity.

Amongst those of your Board of Management of past years one of the most indefatigable was Mr J. J. Pawsey, whose services for the efficient management of the Institution and personal interest in the welfare of the inmates were ever conspicuous. The severance of his connection with the Board by removal from the district was felt as a great loss.

Your Committee would also draw your attention to the new admission tickets, which are much simpler than the old ones without being less effective. Members of the Committee and subscribers generally will, we feel sure, regard these tickets as a very decided improvement.

A new system (Burdett's) of book- keeping has been introduced by the Government and will take effect from the 1st instant, the beginning of the present financial year.

In lieu of Mr J. J. Pawsey, resigned, and through the death of Mr Wayman, two vacancies occurred in the Board of Management. These seats were filled by the election of Mr Anthony Bone and Mr Bernard Cunningham, and both appointments will now require your confirmation. You will be asked to elect a President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, eight members of Committee, and two Auditors. Those gentlemen who now retire are eligible for re-election.

We cannot conclude without mentioning the deep interest taken in the Hospital by a very large section of the public. In a great variety of ways much kindness has been shown during the year to patients, and to the inmates of Benevolent Ward; and we feel that there never has been a time when the Hospital and its inmates had a larger place in the affections of the public than at the present. We gladly welcome this spirit and we hope that the coming years will advance still further developments of deepened interest in a noble and truly philanthropic Institution.

Extracts of Section 25 "Hospital and Charities Act 1890."

"Any person who either before or after his admission * * makes a statement to the effect that he is in destitute circumstances and unable to pay for his maintenance, attendance or relief, and who in consequence of having made such statement is admitted or maintained by or receives medical attendance or relief * * * shall be liable to contribute towards the same according to his means * * * and such sum shall on demand therefor be a debt due by such person and may be recovered from him * * and in addition * * * shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds."

"Police Offences Act 1890."

Section 41. Sub-Section 3.

"Any person who shall commit any of the following offences shall be deemed a rogue and a vagabond within the meaning of this part and shall be liable to the punishment next hereinafter specified :—

"Any person imposing or endeavoring to impose upon any charitable institution or private individual by any false or fraudulent representations either verbally or in writing with a view to obtain money or any other benefit or advantage shall be liable to imprisonment in any gaol with hard labour for any time not exceeding two years."
